Exceptions for Closed Meetings

A board may conduct a closed meeting for the purposes described in the following provisions.

Attorney Consultation

A board may conduct a private consultation with its attorney only when it seeks the attorney's advice about pending or contemplated litigation or a settlement offer or on a matter in which the duty of the attorney to the board under the Texas Disciplinary Rules of Professional Conduct of the State Bar of Texas clearly conflicts with the requirement for open meetings. *Gov't Code 551.071* [See BE for permissible methods of communication for attorney consultations]

Real Property

A board may conduct a closed meeting to deliberate the purchase, exchange, lease, or value of real property if deliberation in an open meeting would have a detrimental effect on the board's position in negotiations with a third person. *Gov't Code 551.072*

Prospective Gift

A board may conduct a closed meeting to deliberate a negotiated contract for a prospective gift or donation to a district if deliberation in an open meeting would have a detrimental effect on the board's position in negotiations with a third person. *Gov't Code 551.073*

Personnel Matters

A board is not required to conduct an open meeting to deliberate the appointment, employment, evaluation, reassignment, duties, discipline, or dismissal of a public officer or employee or to hear a complaint or charge against an officer or employee. However, a board may not conduct a closed meeting for these purposes if the officer or employee who is the subject of the deliberation or hearing requests a public hearing. *Gov't Code 551.074*

The closed meeting exception for personnel matters does not apply when a board discusses an independent contractor who is not a school employee, such as an engineering, architectural, or consultant firm, or when a board discusses a class or group of employees, not a particular employee. *Atty. Gen. Op. MW-129 (1980), Atty. Gen. Op. H-496 (1975)*

Employee-Employee Complaints A board is not required to conduct an open meeting to deliberate in a case in which a complaint or charge is brought against a district employee by another employee and the complaint or charge directly results in the need for a hearing. However, a board may not conduct a closed meeting for this purpose if the employee against whom the complaint or charge is brought makes a written request for an open hearing. *Gov't Code 551.082*

Student Discipline A board is not required to conduct an open meeting to deliberate in a case in which a complaint or charge is brought against a district employee by another employee and the complaint or charge directly results in the need for a hearing. However, a board may not conduct a closed meeting for this purpose if the employee against whom the complaint or charge is brought makes a written request for an open hearing. *Gov't Code 551.082*

Personally Identifiable Student Information

A board is not required to conduct an open meeting to deliberate a matter regarding a student if personally identifiable information about the student will necessarily be revealed by the deliberation.

Directory information about a public school student is considered to be personally identifiable information about the student for this purpose only if a parent or guardian of the student, or the student if the student has attained 18 years of age, has informed a district that the directory information should not be released without prior consent. [See FL]

This exception does not apply if an open meeting about the matter is requested in writing by a parent or guardian of the student or by the student if the student has attained 18 years of age.

Gov't Code 551.0821

Medical or Psychiatric Records

A board that administers a public insurance, health, or retirement plan is not required to conduct an open meeting to deliberate

1. The medical records or psychiatric records of an individual applicant for a benefit from the plan; or
2. A matter that includes a consideration of information in the medical or psychiatric records of an individual applicant for a benefit from the plan.

Gov't Code 551.0785

Security

A board is not required to conduct an open meeting to deliberate:

1. The deployment, or specific occasions for implementation, of security personnel or devices, or
2. A security audit

Gov't Code 551.076

A board is not required to conduct an open meeting to deliberate:

1. Security assessments or deployments relating to information resources technology;
2. Network security information as described by Government Code 2059.055(b); or
3. The deployment, or specific occasions for implementation, of security personnel, critical infrastructure, or security devices.

Gov't Code 551.089

Assessment Instruments

A board shall conduct a closed meeting to discuss or adopt individual assessment instruments or assessment instrument items. *Education Code 39.030(a)*

Emergency Management

A board is not required to conduct an open meeting to deliberate information confidential under Government Code 418.175–418.182, Management relating to Homeland Security. However, a board must make a tape recording of the proceedings of a closed meeting held to deliberate the information. *Gov't Code 418.183(f)*

Economic Development Negotiations

A board is not required to conduct an open meeting:

1. To discuss or deliberate regarding commercial or financial information that the board has received from a business prospect that the board seeks to have locate, stay, or expand in or near a district and with which the board is conducting economic development negotiations; or
2. To deliberate the offer of a financial or other incentive to such a business prospect.

Procedures for Closed Meetings

If a closed meeting is allowed, a board shall not conduct the closed meeting unless a quorum of the board first convenes in an open meeting for which proper notice has been given [see BE] and the presiding officer has publicly announced that a closed meeting will be held and has identified the section or sections of the Open Meetings Act or other applicable law under which the closed meeting is held. *Gov't Code 551.101*

Vote or Final Action

A final action, decision, or vote on a matter deliberated in a closed meeting shall be made only in an open meeting for which proper notice has been given. *Gov't Code 551.102* [See BE]

Certified Agenda or Recording

A board shall either keep a certified agenda or make a recording of the proceedings of each closed meeting, except for private consultation with a district's attorney. The certified agenda must include a statement of the subject matter of each deliberation, a record of any further action taken, and an announcement by the presiding officer at the beginning and end of the closed meeting indicating the date and time. A presiding officer shall certify that a certified agenda is a true and correct record of the proceedings. If a recording is made, it must include announcements by the presiding officer at the beginning and end of the meeting indicating the date and time. *Gov't Code 551.103*

"Recording" means a tangible medium on which audio or a combination of audio and video is recorded, including a disc, tape, wire, film, electronic storage drive, or other medium now existing or later developed. *Gov't Code 551.001(7)*

Closed meetings may not be recorded by an individual trustee against the wishes of a majority of a board. *Zamora v. Edgewood Indep. Sch. Dist., 592 S.W.2d 649 (Tex. App.—San Antonio, 1979, writ ref'd n.r.e.)*

Preservation

A board shall preserve the certified agenda or recording of a closed meeting for at least two years after the date of the meeting. If a legal action involving the meeting is brought within that period, the board shall preserve the certified agenda or recording while the action is pending. *Gov't Code 551.104(a)*

Public Access

A certified agenda or recording of a closed meeting is available for public inspection and copying only under a court order issued as a result of litigation involving an alleged violation of the Open Meetings Act. *Gov't Code 551.104(b), (c)*

Prohibitions

No board member shall participate in a closed meeting knowing that neither a certified agenda nor a recording of the closed meeting is being made. *Gov't Code 551.145*

No individual, corporation, or partnership shall without lawful authority disclose to a member of the public the certified agenda or recording of a meeting that was lawfully closed to the public. *Gov't Code 551.146*

No board member shall knowingly call or aid in calling or organizing a closed meeting that is not permitted under the Open Meetings Act, close or aid in closing a regular meeting to the public except as permitted under the Open Meetings Act, or participate in a closed meeting that is not permitted under the Open Meetings Act. *Gov't Code 551.144(a)*

Affirmative Defense

It is an affirmative defense to prosecution under Subsection 551.144(a) that a board member acted in reasonable reliance on a court order or a written interpretation of the open meetings law contained in an opinion of a court of record, the attorney general, or the board's attorney. *Gov't Code 551.144(c)*

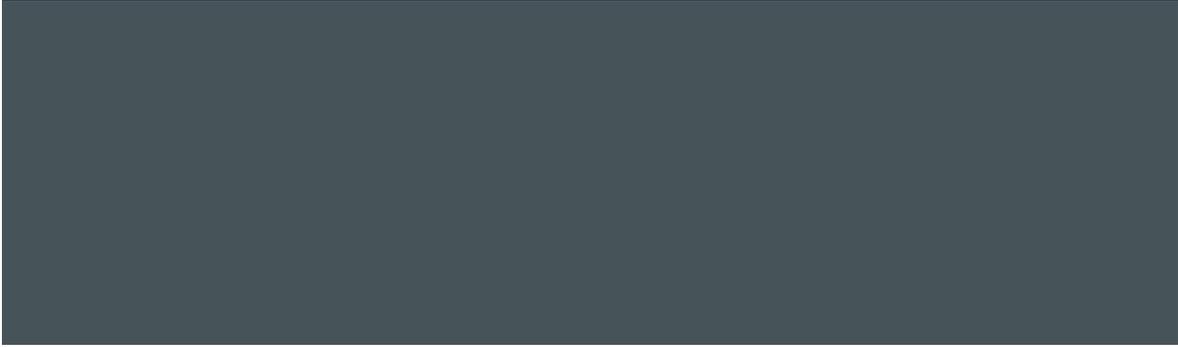

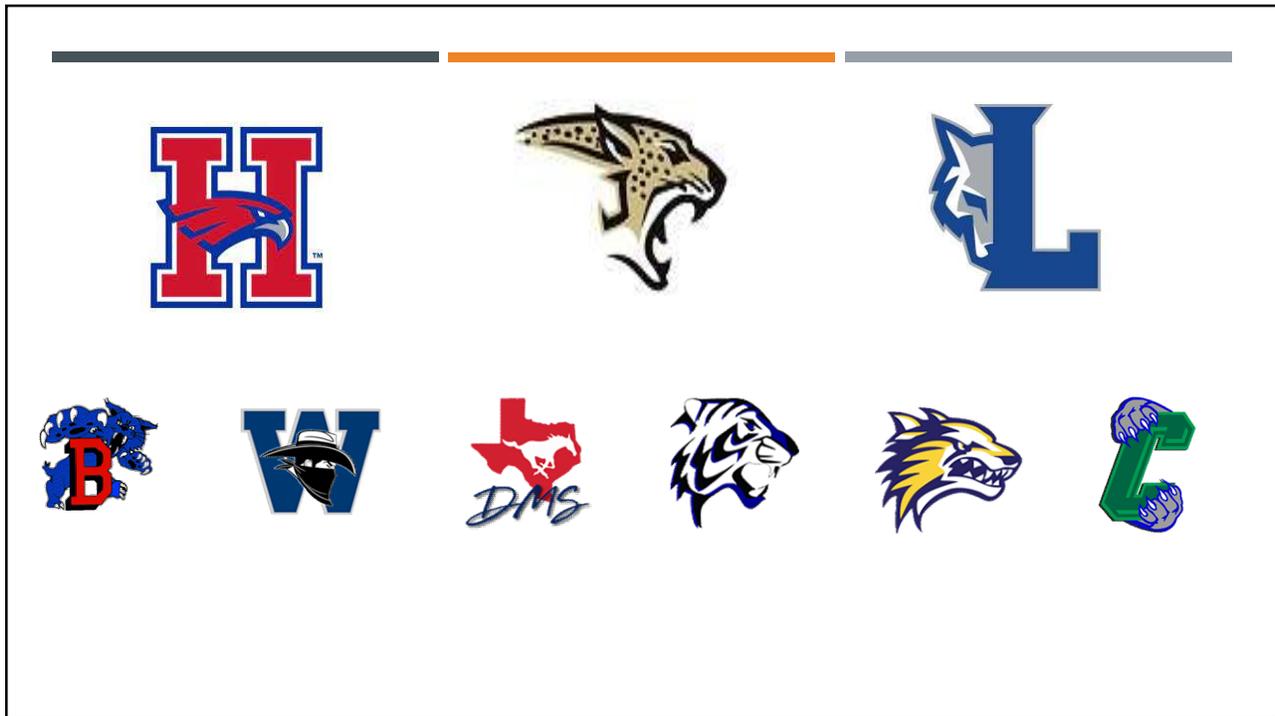

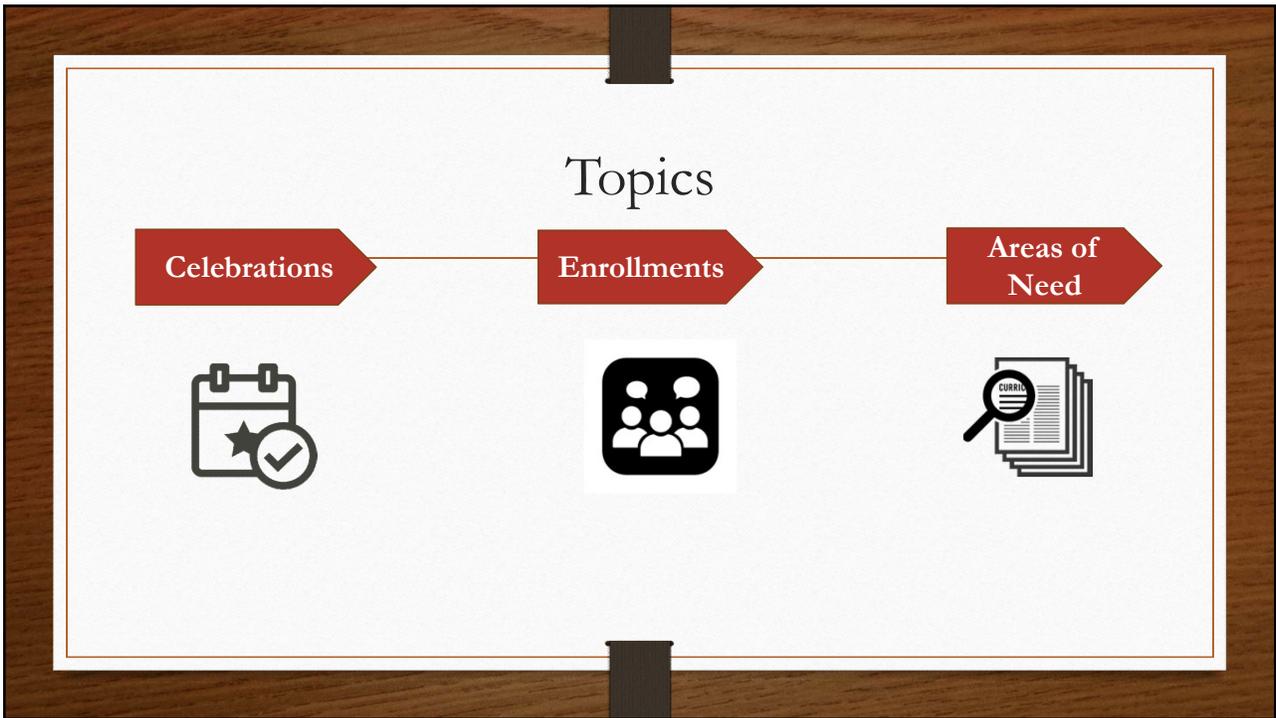

Mrs. Keller moved and Mr. McManus seconded the motion that the Board approve the purchase of technology infrastructure needs from Integration Partners for a total cost of \$200,000 as presented. The motion passed with a 7-0 vote.

Consideration and possible approval of purchase of wireless infrastructure for new construction from Layer 3

Mr. McManus moved and Mrs. Runkle seconded the motion that the Board approve the purchase of wireless infrastructure from Layer 3 Communications for a total cost of \$175,000 as presented. The motion passed with a 7-0 vote.

Consideration and possible approval of purchase of telecom infrastructure for new construction from Affiliated Communication

Mr. McManus moved and Mrs. Runkle seconded the motion that the Board approve the purchase of telecom equipment from Affiliated Communications for a total cost of \$150,000 as presented. The motion passed with a 7-0 vote.

Consideration and possible approval of the purchase of FF&E for Elementary School #15

Rigorous discussion ensued regarding the purchase of furniture and equipment for Elementary School #15. Mrs. McManus moved and Mrs. Runkle seconded the motion that the Board approve the purchase of school furniture and equipment from Worthington Contract Furniture in the amount of \$880,158 plus 3% contingency, as discussed. The motion passed with a 7-0 vote.

Consideration and possible approval of the purchase of cafeteria tables for Tom Green Elementary - Worthington Contract Furniture

Max Cleaver presented information to the Board regarding the purchase of cafeteria tables for Tom Green Elementary. Rigorous discussion ensued regarding the existing tables and other campuses who might have those same type of tables that may need to be replaced. Discussion was also had regarding the funding source for the purchase. It was agreed that General Funds would be used to purchase the tables for Tom Green. Mrs. Runkle moved and Mr. Vela seconded the motion that the Board approve the purchase of cafeteria tables for Tom Green Elementary School in the amount of \$59,120 from Worthington Contract Furniture, as discussed. The motion passed with a 7-0 vote.

2021 Bond: Consideration and possible approval of design documents for Hays High School improvements (Bond Package 8) and GMP 1 for the purchase of bleacher materials for Bales Gym – this item was moved up on the agenda

2021 Bond: Consideration and possible approval of Lehman High School 50% Construction Documents (CD) and Guaranteed Maximum Price (GMP) 1 for the purchase of HVAC equipment – this item was moved up on the agenda

Consideration and possible approval of a Utility Easement and Underground Agreement for the Pedernales Electrical Cooperative (PEC) at the elementary school located in the Sunfield Subdivision

Mrs. Keller moved and Mrs. Orosco seconded the motion that the Board grant a utility easement to Pedernales Electric Cooperative at the elementary school located in the Sunfield Subdivision, as presented. The motion passed with a 7-0 vote.

Facilities and Bond Oversight Committee recommendation regarding a potential May 2022 bond election – this item was moved up on the agenda

Consideration and possible adoption of the Trustee Single-Member-District Election Map

The Hays CISD Board of Trustees is comprised of seven members, five of whom are elected in single-member-districts and two who are elected at-large. Following the release of the 2020 United States Census data, school districts with single-member trustee districts are required by state and federal law to review the populations of current trustee single-member-districts and redraw election district lines (if necessary) to ensure that the single-member-districts are as nearly as practicable of equal population. The population of the most populous single-member-district cannot exceed the population of the least populous single-member-district by more than ten percent. On August 23, 2021, the Hays CISD Board voted to empanel an election Redistricting Advisory Committee comprised of seven citizens to advise and assist the Board in the redistricting process. The committee met in October 2021.

At the October 20, 2021, meeting, the committee voted unanimously (7 to 0) to recommend PLAN 2. The map balances voting age populations within the required deferential and it preserves single-member-districts one, two, and three, as minority-majority districts. Additionally, the committee voted to include the

following non-binding caveats with the map recommendation: (1) that the district continue to operate a polling location in each single-member-district on election days during the May school district elections; (2) that the single-member district 2 polling location for May elections be centrally located at Simon Middle School; and (3) that the district should be commended for its efforts to support voter access by offering polling locations and working closely with county election officials during all elections - March, May, and November. Mrs. Keller moved and Mr. Vela seconded the motion that the Board adopt the Single-Member-District election map resolution and the separate, accompanying proclamation from the committee, as presented. The motion passed with a 7-0 vote.

Consideration and possible adoption of Committee Attendance Zone Recommendation for Elementary School #15

In May 2021, Hays CISD voters approved a bond measure that included the construction of the district's 15th elementary school. When it opens in August 2022, it will need an attendance zone. On August 23, 2021, the Hays CISD Board voted to empanel an Attendance Boundary Rezoning Committee comprised of seven citizens to advise and assist the Board in the process of creating an attendance zone for the new school. The committee met in October and held the first public forum on October 28, 2021, regarding a map the committee developed (known as Map Plan C). On November 2, 2021, the committee voted 11 out of 11 members in attendance to recommend Map Plan C for the Board's consideration, along with the caveats that: (1) affected students entering 5th grade be grandfathered and allowed to stay at their current schools should they choose to do so and (2) remaining affected students be given first priority for transfers to remain at their existing campuses if they do not wish to attend school at their new campus. The second public forum was held embedded in the Board meeting on November 15, 2021.

The committee developed Map C Plan to address member considerations that differentiate Map C from the policy-required starter maps presented by administration (Maps A & B). Map C succeeds by: Limiting the number of students that have to be moved, allowing additional space at Elementary #15 for potential growth faster than expected, allowing Elementary #15 (as a new prototype school floor plan) to open with a smaller population to work out the best building movement and traffic patterns, and troubleshoot any other issues that may arise prior to it hosting a full student body, arresting the projected population explosion at both Tom Green and Camino Real Elementary Schools. Mrs. Runkle moved and Mr. McManus seconded the motion that the Board adopt the changes to the district's elementary school attendance zone map as presented. The motion passed with a 7-0 vote.

Consideration and possible approval of Elementary School Site Donation in the Anthem Subdivision

The developer of the Anthem Subdivision wishes to donate 13.074 acres of land to Hays CISD for the construction of a future elementary school.

The Special Warranty Deed contemplates that the construction of an elementary school will commence no later than November 2023 and be completed by August 2025. If a school is not constructed within that timeframe, the developer has the option to reclaim the site.

This site contains golden cheek warbler habitat, and the District will be required to pay the Hays County habitat mitigation fee for the school site.

If favorably considered, the Superintendent or designee will coordinate all parties to close the transaction in December 2021.

Mrs. Keller moved and Mrs. Orosco seconded the motion that the Board accept the donation of the school site in the Anthem Subdivision and authorize the Board President and Superintendent to execute additional documents necessary or convenient to complete the transaction, as presented. The motion passed with a 7-0 vote.

The Board voted 7-0 to adopt the listed policies, with the exception of policy DFE, as presented.

In accordance with the TEA budget and accounting procedures and guidelines, the District’s official budget includes the General Fund, Food Service Fund, and the Debt Service Fund. The Board of Trustees should approve the adoption of the budgets associated with these funds, and subsequent amendments, at the *Fund Function* level. Other funds such as Special Revenue Funds for grants and capital projects are approved on a *Project Basis*; and consequently, *are* not required to be approved with the same level of detail.

JOINT ELECTION AGREEMENT BETWEEN HAYS COUNTY AND THE LPS OF HAYS CISD

This Joint Election Agreement (“Agreement”) is entered into on January 31, 2022, between the **Hays CISD**, (the "LPS") **21003 IH 35, Kyle, Texas 78640**, and Hays County (the "County"), 712 S. Stagecoach Trail, Suite 1012, San Marcos, Texas 78666, collectively referred to as the Parties.

This Agreement is authorized by Chapter 31 of the Texas Election Code, Chapter 791 of the Texas Government Code and Section 271.002 and 271.003 of the Texas Election Code. The Parties to the Agreement agree as follows:

Section 1. *Scope of Agreement.* The LPS enters into this Agreement for the conduct of the elections to be held from January 2022 through July 2023.

Section 2. *Appointment of Election Officer.* The LPS appoints the Hays County Elections Administrator to serve as the Election Officer (the “Officer”) in order to perform and supervise the duties and responsibilities of the Election Officer for any election from January 2022 through July 2023.

Section 3. *Early Voting Polling Locations.* To facilitate the administration of elections, and as a convenience to the voters, during the early voting period established by statute, the LPS agrees to designate the Hays County Election Administrator's Office, 712 South Stagecoach Trail, Suite 1012, San Marcos, Texas 78666 as the main early voting polling place for the LPS. Furthermore, the LPS agrees to designate temporary branch early polling places in accordance with Section 85.062, Election Code, V.T.C.A. as called out in the latest Election Orders.

Section 4. *Voting by Mail Ballot.* The LPS and County agree that early voting by mail ballot shall be conducted in accordance with the applicable provisions of the Texas Election Code and that 712 South Stagecoach Trail, Suite 1012 San Marcos, Texas 78666 is the early voting clerk's mailing address to which ballot applications and ballots voted by mail shall be sent for the LPS.

Section 5. *Election Day Polling Locations.* Election Day voting shall be held in approved vote centers where appropriate at the dates, times, and locations recommended by the Election Officer and authorized and ordered by the governing body of the LPS.

Section 6. *Election Day.* On Election Day, all forms used in the conduct of the election, including but not limited to the poll list, signature roster, ballot registers, expense accounts, and all oaths and certificates will be used jointly by the two agencies. All forms will be returned to the Hays County Election Administrator who shall keep them in her custody for the period of time prescribed by the Texas Election Code. The County agrees to furnish the LPS with copies of any election documents upon the LPS's request at no charge.

Section 7. *Use of Common Ballot.* It is agreed by the parties to this Agreement that a common ballot will be used for joint elections. The USB ("USB") containing the voted ballots

for an election will be delivered by the Election Judges to the Hays County Election Administrator's office at 712 South Stagecoach Trail, Suite 1012, San Marcos, Texas and the USB'S will remain in the Hays County Election Administrator's custody, except that the County agrees to provide the LPS with the necessary documentation, if requested, for canvass of an election or in the event the voted ballots are required for a recount or any court proceedings in which the LPS may be a party. The County agrees to maintain custody of the USB'S containing the voted ballots for the period of time prescribed by the Texas Election Code. All USB'S that are not placed in active voting equipment will remain locked in the Officers' office. USBS will not be replaced without being logged out and checked out by the Officer at any time during an election. An audit shall be conducted to ensure that all USBS are present and accounted for. A spreadsheet shall be completed at the end of Early Voting and Election Day returns that will identify the number of signatures on the Combination Log and the Number of Cancelled booths, for a representation of voter totals. All replaced equipment will remain secured until after tabulation to ensure that all checks and balances have been satisfied.

Section 8. Reporting of Returns. The Officer shall prepare the unofficial and official tabulation of precinct results under Section 66.056(a) of the Texas Election Code. The unofficial tabulation of Early Voting precinct results and Election Day precinct results shall be made available to the LPS via email as soon as they are prepared and may be released under law, but no earlier than 7:00 p.m. on Election Day. The Officer or their designee will use their best efforts to post all reports for public review on the Hays County Elections website at www.co.hays.tx.us/elections as soon as reasonably possible.

Section 9. Cost Sharing. The LPS agrees to the cost sharing provisions below. This includes Hays County, the school districts of the county, the cities of the county, and the water districts and all other entities contracting for election services. The costs incurred with Early Voting locations and Early Voting Clerks will be shared only by entities utilizing the polling location for their individual election contest.

The formula is as follows:

Example:

Registered Voters in County -	135,000	$135,000/255,000=$	52.94% of total cost
Registered Voters in Joint Entity A -	100,000	$100,000/255,000=$	39.23% of total cost
Registered Voters in Joint Entity B -	20,000	$20,000/255,000=$	7.84% of total cost

\$1,000 dollar minimum cost for elections that don't exceed that total. Since programming and supplies would exceed the cost of elections with very small voter registration populations. Equipment Rental Fees allocated separately.

Section 10. Amendments. This Agreement may not be amended or modified except in writing and executed by both the LPS and the County. Neither party may assign this Agreement without the written consent of the other party. However, the Officer may assign deputies to perform any of the contracted services and may contract with third persons for election services and supplies.

Section 11. Effective Date. This Agreement contains the entire agreement between the parties and supersedes all prior understandings and agreements between the parties regarding such matters. The term of this Agreement will commence on January 31, 2022, through July 31, 2023.

Section 12. Force Majeure. Either of the parties to this Agreement shall be excused from any delays and/or failures in the performance of the terms and conditions of this Contract, to the extent that such delays and/or failures result from causes beyond the delaying/failing party's reasonable control, including but not limited to war (whether declared or not), armed conflict or the serious threat of the same (including but not limited to hostile attack, blockade, military embargo), hostilities, invasion, act of a foreign enemy, extensive military mobilization, civil war, riot, rebellion, revolution, military or usurped power, insurrection, civil commotion or disorder, mob violence, act of civil disobedience, act of terrorism, sabotage or piracy; plague, epidemic, pandemic, outbreaks of infectious disease or any other public health crisis, including quarantine, social distancing, isolation or other behavioral restrictions; act of authority whether lawful or unlawful, compliance with any law or governmental order, rule, regulation or direction, curfew restriction, expropriation, compulsory acquisition, seizure of works, requisition, nationalization; act of God or natural disaster such as but not limited to violent storm, cyclone, typhoon, hurricane, tornado, earthquake, landslide, flood, damage or destruction by lightning, drought; explosion, fire, destruction of machines, equipment and of any kind of installation, prolonged breakdown of transport, telecommunication or electric current; shortage or inability to obtain critical material or supplies to the extent not subject to the reasonable control of the subject party ("force majeure event ") whether foreseeable or unforeseeable by the parties at the time of the execution of this Agreement. Any delaying/failing party shall, with all reasonable diligence, attempt to remedy the cause of delay and/or failure and shall recommence all remaining duties under this Agreement within a reasonable time of such remedy, or, when applicable, on the next available dates under the Texas Election Code.

Section 13. Should any provision in this Agreement be found or deemed to be invalid, this Agreement will be construed as not containing the provision and all other provisions which are otherwise lawful will remain in full force and effect, and to this end the provisions of this Agreement are declared to be severable. In case any one or more of the provisions contained in this Agreement are for any reason held to be invalid, illegal or unenforceable in any respect, such invalidity, illegality, or unenforceability will not affect any other provision thereof, and this Agreement will be construed as if such invalid, illegal, or unenforceable provision had never been contained herein.

Nothing contained in this Agreement will authorize or permit a change in the office with whom or the place at which any document or record relating to the Election(s) is to be filed, or place at which any function of the canvass of the election returns is to be performed, or the officer to serve as custodian of voted ballots or other election records.

Section 16. This Agreement shall take effect immediately upon execution by both parties hereof and shall inure to the benefit and be binding upon the administrators, successors and assigns of the Parties hereto.

CONTRACT FOR ELECTION SERVICES

This **Contract for Election Services** (“Contract”) is made and entered into by and between the **Elections Administrator of Hays County, Texas (“Contracting Officer”)** and the Hays Consolidated Independent School District (“**District**”) pursuant to the authority under Section 31.092(a) of the Texas Election Code.

RECITALS

GENERAL PROVISIONS.

- A. The purpose of this Contract is to maintain consistency and accessibility in voting practices, polling places, and election procedures to best assist the voters of the District. For purposes of this Contract the term “Election” will include any resulting recount or election contest. It will also apply to any election to resolve a tie.
 - B. The Contracting Officer is hereby appointed to serve as the District’s Election Day Officer and Early Voting Clerk to conduct the Election for those areas of the District located within the contracting jurisdiction. As Election Officer and Early Voting Clerk, the Contracting Officer will coordinate, supervise and conduct all aspects of administering voting in connection with the Election in compliance with all applicable laws.
 - C. The District agrees to commit the funds necessary to pay for Election-related expenses for the District’s Election.
 - D. The Contracting Officer has the right to enter into agreements with other entities at any time and may require that authorities of District’s holding elections on the same day in all or part of the same territory to enter into a joint election agreement as authorized in Chapter 271 of the Teas Election Code. The District agrees to enter into a joint election agreement required by Hays County.
- I. **RESPONSIBILITIES OF CONTRACTING OFFICER.** The Contracting Officer shall be responsible for performing the following services and furnishing the following material and equipment in connection with the Election:
- A. **Nomination of Presiding Judges and Alternate Judges.** The Contracting Officer shall recommend appointment of Election Day presiding and alternate judges,

central accumulation station judges, and the Early Voting Ballot Board (EVBB) presiding judge, all of whom shall meet the eligibility requirements in Subchapter C of Chapter 32 of the Texas Election Code.

B. Notification to District. The Contracting Officer shall provide the District with the most up-to-date list of presiding and alternate judges at least three weeks before the statutory deadline to order the Election.

C. Notification to Presiding and Alternate Judges; Appointment of Clerks.

1. The Contracting Officer shall notify each presiding and alternate judge of his or her appointment. The notification will also include the assigned polling station, the date of the election training(s), the date and time of the Election, the rate of compensation, the number of clerks the judge may appoint, the eligibility requirements for Election workers, and the name of the presiding or alternate judge as appropriate.

2. The election judge will make the clerk appointments in consultation with the Contracting Officer. If a presiding judge or the alternate judge does not speak both English and Spanish, and the election precinct is one subject to Section 272.002 and 272.009 of the Texas Election Code, the Contracting Officer shall ensure that a bilingual election clerk is appointed. The Contracting Officer shall notify the clerks of the same information that the judges receive under this section.

D. Election Training. The Contracting Officer shall be responsible for conducting Election training for the presiding judges, alternate judges, clerks, and early voting deputies in the operation and troubleshooting of the Verity Duo Hybrid voting system and the conduct of elections, including qualifying voters, issuing ballot style codes, maintaining order at the polling location, and conducting provisional voting.

E. Logic and Accuracy Testing. In advance of Early Voting (including the sending of any mail ballots), the Contracting Officer, the tabulation supervisor, and the other members the Contracting Officer designates for the testing board shall conduct all logic and accuracy testing in accordance with the procedures set forth by the Texas Election Code and under guidelines provided by the Secretary of State's office. The Contracting Officer shall also be responsible for the publication of the required notice of such testing.

- F. **Election Supplies.** The Contracting Officer shall procure, prepare, and distribute to the presiding judges for use at the polling locations on Election Day (and to the Early Voting clerks during Early Voting) the following Election supplies: election and early voting kits (including the appropriate envelopes, lists, forms, name tags, posters, and signage described in Chapters 51, 61, and 62, and subchapter B of chapter 66 of the Texas Election Code) seals, sample ballots, thermal paper rolls for use in the Verity Controllers, batteries for use in the voting system equipment, supplies for the electronic poll books, and all consumable type office supplies necessary to hold an Election.
- G. **Registered Voters List.** The Contracting Officer shall provide lists of registered voters required by law for use on Election Day and for the Early Voting period.
- H. **Notice of Previous Polling Place.** The Contracting Officer shall post notices of a change in a polling place at the entrance to the previous polling location. Section 43.062 of the Texas Election Code provides that the notice shall state the location has changed and give the location of the new polling place. The Interim District Clerk will ensure that Public Notice is also provided via published notice, on the District's website and on all District social media outlets.
- I. **Election Equipment.** The Contracting Officer shall prepare and distribute the Verity Duo Hybrid Voting System components from Hart Intercivic, Inc. ("Hart") for the Election. This voting System includes the equipment referred to as "Duo" and Verity Controllers". Each polling location will have at least one voting machine that is accessible to disabled voters to provide a practical and effective means for voters with disabilities to cast a secret ballot.
- J. **Ballots.** The Contracting Officer or designee shall be responsible for the preparation, printing, programming and distribution of English and Spanish ballots and sample ballots, including the mail ballots, based on the information provided by the District, including the names of the candidates, names of the offices sought, order of names on the ballot, propositions on the ballot, and the Spanish translation of the offices and any propositions. The ballot will be prepared in these formats: Verity Duo Hybrid Voting System, paper, and auditory.
- K. **Applications for Mail Ballots.** The District and Contracting Officer agree that early voting by mail ballots shall be processed in accordance with the applicable provisions of the Texas Election Code and that 712 South Stagecoach Trail, Suite 1012, San Marcos, Texas 78666 is the early voting clerk's mailing address to which ballot applications and ballots voted by mail shall be sent for the District.

L. **Early Voting.** In accordance with Sections 31.096 and 32.097(b) of the Texas Election Code, the Contracting Officer shall serve as the Early Voting Clerk for the Election.

1. The Contracting Officer shall supervise and conduct the early voting by mail and by personal appearance and shall secure personnel to serve as Early Voting Deputies.
2. The Contracting Officer shall receive mail ballot applications on behalf of the District. All applications for mail ballots shall be processed in accordance with Title 7 of the Texas Election Code by the Contracting Officer or deputies at the Records Building located at the Hays County Government Center at 712 S. Stagecoach Trail, San Marcos, Texas 78666. Applications for mail ballots sent to the District shall be promptly faxed to the Contracting Officer at (512) 878-6699, or emailed to elections@co.hays.tx.us for timely processing and then the original sent application forwarded to the Contracting Officer for proper retention.
3. Early voting ballots shall be secured and maintained at the Records Office at 712 S. Stagecoach Trail, San Marcos, Texas 78666. In accordance with Chapter 87 of the Texas Election Code. The Early Voting Ballot Board shall meet at the same location unless posted differently.
4. Early Voting by personal appearance for the Election shall be conducted during the hours and time period and at the locations as determined by the Contracting Officer in consultation with the District and in accordance with the Texas Election Code.

M. **Election Day Activities.**

1. The Contracting Officer and staff shall be available from 6:00 am until the completion of the vote counting on Election Day to render technical support and assistance to voters and Election workers.
2. The Contracting Officer and staff shall prepare and conduct Election Night intake of election equipment, supplies, and records.

3. The Contacting Officer and designee shall serve as central counting station manager and tabulation supervisor, counting the votes in conjunction with the Early Voting Ballot Board and the Central Counting Station judges.
 4. Election Day polling locations are determined by the Contracting Officer in consultation with the District and in accordance with the Texas Election Code. The Contracting Officer shall arrange for the use of all polling places and shall arrange for the setting up of the polling location including tables, chairs and voting booths.
- N. **Election Night Reports.** The Contracting Officer shall prepare the unofficial and official tabulation of precinct results under Section 66.056(a) of the Texas Election Code. The unofficial tabulation of Early Voting precinct results and Election Day precinct results shall be made available to the District via email as soon as they are prepared and may be released under law, but no earlier than 7:00 pm on Election Day. The tabulation reports may also be provided to other counties as necessary for the Election. As soon as reasonably possible, the Contracting Officer will post all reports for public review on the Hays County Elections website at www.co.hays.tx.us/elections.
- O. **Provisional Votes/ Determination of Mail Ballots Timely Received under Section 86.007(d) of the Texas Election Code.** The Contracting Officer, serving as the Voter Registrar, shall retain the provisional voting affidavits and shall provide the factual information on each of the voters' status. The Contracting Officer shall reconvene the EVBB after the Election within the time set forth in Section 65.051 of the Texas Election Code for the purpose of determining the disposition of the provisional votes. At the same time, the EVBB will review mail ballots timely received under Section 86.007(d) of the Texas Election Code to determine whether such will be counted and to resolve any issues with such ballots.
- P. **Canvass Material Preparation.** Promptly after determination of the provisional votes and resolution of any mail ballots, the Contracting Officer shall work with the EVBB and tabulation supervisor to tally the accepted provisional votes and resolved mail ballots, amend the unofficial tabulations, and submit new official tabulations to the District. These reports will serve as the canvass materials for the District.
- Q. **Custodian of Election Records.** The Election records will be submitted to the District except for those records that must be maintained by the Contracting Officer as Voter Registrar in accordance with Section 66.051 of the Texas Election Code.

The Contracting Officer is hereby appointed the custodian of voted ballots (which in the case of the ballots cast on the Verity Duo Hybrid voting system consist of the paper backup) and shall preserve them in accordance with Chapter 66 of the Texas Election Code and other applicable law. The Contracting Officer shall also maintain custody of the records pertaining to the operation of the Verity Controllers and Duo.

R. Recount.

1. The District shall advise the Contracting Officer if a recount is required by law or requested and the Contracting Officer and the District shall discuss how such recount is to be conducted. The District shall reimburse the Contracting Officer for the cost of such recount which is not included in the original cost estimate.

S. Schedule for Performance of Services. The Contracting Officer shall perform all Election services in accordance with and in compliance with the time requirements set out in the Texas Election Code.

T. Contracting with Third Parties. In accordance with Section 31.098 of the Texas Election Code, the Contracting Officer is authorized to contract with third parties for Election services and supplies. The cost of such third-party services and supplies will be paid by the Contracting Officer and reimbursed by the District.

U. Department of Justice Preclearance for General Elections. If required by law, any changes to the general conduct of voting in Hays County will be precleared through the United States Department of Justice by the Contracting Officer with copies of the submission and response e-mailed to the District.

II. RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE DISTRICT. The District shall perform the following responsibilities:

A. Election Orders, Election Notices, and Canvass. The District shall be responsible for the preparing, adopting, publishing, and posting of all required election orders, resolutions, notices and other documents, including bilingual materials, evidencing action by the District of all actions necessary to call the Election. The District shall be responsible for conducting the official canvass of the Election.

- B. **Map/Annexations.** The District shall provide the Contracting Officer with an updated map and street index (including address numbers) of its jurisdiction in and electronic or printed format and shall advise the Contracting Officer in writing of any new developments, annexations or de-annexations and any other changes to the master voter registration list within the jurisdiction.
- C. **Department of Justice Preclearance for Special Elections.** If required by law, the District shall be individually responsible for obtaining appropriate preclearance from the United States Department of Justice for any special elections.
- D. **Ballot Information.** The District shall prepare the text for the District's official ballot in English and Spanish and provide to the Contracting Officer as soon as possible at the end of the period for ordering the Election or filing for candidacy. The ballot information shall include a list of propositions showing the order and the exact manner in which the candidates' name shall appear on the ballot. The District shall promptly review for correctness the ballot when requested by the Contracting Officer to do so prior to the finalization and shall approve by e-mail or by signature in person.
- E. **Precinct Reports to the Texas Secretary of State.** Based on information provided by the Contracting Officer, the District shall prepare and file all required precinct reports with the Texas Secretary of State.
- F. **Annual Voting Report.** The District shall be responsible for filing its annual voting system report to the Texas Secretary of State as required under Chapter 123 et seq. of the Texas Election Code.

III. SPECIAL PROVISIONS RELATED TO ELECTION WORKERS

- A. **Number of Election Workers at Election Day Polling Locations.** It is agreed by the Contracting Officer and the District that there will be at least three Election workers at each Election Day polling location: the presiding judge, the alternate judge, and at least one election clerk appointed by the presiding judge. The number of necessary clerks is derived from the number of Elections at the poll and the number of registered voters at the poll.
- B. **Compensation for Election Workers.** The Contracting Officer shall compensate all Election workers in accordance with the Contracting Officer's established compensation policies, in accordance with the Texas Election Code and using the rates set by the Hays County Commissioners Court for county elections. The

Contracting Officer shall pay the workers and be reimbursed by the entities sharing the polling locations.

IV. PAYMENT

- A. **Charges and Distribution of Costs.** In consideration of the joint election services provided by the Contracting Officer, the District will be charged a share of the Election costs and an administrative fee. The costs distribution is set forth in the Joint Election Agreement. The costs to be paid by the District are set forth in the Cost Estimate.
- B. **Administrative Fee.** The Contracting Officer shall charge a fee equal to 10% of the District's share of the cost of the Election or a minimum of \$75.00.
- C. **Equipment Rental Fee.** Per Section 123.032(d) of the Texas Election Code, the Hays County Commissioners Court has set the equipment rental fee at \$175 each per controller, per Verity Duo, per scanner, per Tenex touchpad component. If the County acquires additional equipment during the term of the Contract, the charge for the use of the equipment may be reset by the Hays County Commissioners Court.
- D. **Payment.** The Contracting Officer's invoice shall be due and payable to the address set forth in the invoice within 30 days from the date of receipt by the District.

V. TERM AND TERMINATION

- A. **Initial Term.** The initial term of the contract shall commence upon the last party's execution hereof and shall continue thereafter in full force and effect for one year, subject to the termination rights set forth herein.
- B. **Renewal.** Subject to the termination rights set forth herein, this Contract shall be renewed annually.
- C. **Termination.** If either party wishes to terminate this Contract for convenience or for cause, the party must provide not less than ninety (90) days' written notice to the other party and allow for discussion of the desired outcome and options to reach the desired outcome. In the event of termination, it is understood and agreed that only the amounts due to the Contracting Officer for services provided and expenses incurred will be due and payable.

VI. MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS

A. Nontransferable Functions. In accordance with Section 31.096 of the Texas Election Code, nothing in this Contract shall authorize or permit a change in:

1. The authority with whom or the place at which any document or record relating to the Election is to be filed;
2. The officers who conduct the official canvass of the Election returns;
3. The authority to serve as custodian of voted ballots or other Election records; or
4. Any other nontransferable function specified under Section 31.096 or other provisions of law.

B. Cancellation of Election. If the District cancels its Election pursuant to Section 2.053 of the Texas Election Code, the Contracting Officer shall be entitled to receive an administrative fee of \$75. The Contracting Officer shall submit an invoice for the administrative fee as soon as reasonably possible after the cancellation, and the District shall pay the fee.

C. Contract Copies to Treasure and Auditor. In accordance with Section 31.099 of the Texas Election Code, the Contracting Officer agrees to file copies of the Contract with the County Treasurer and the County Auditor of Hays County, Texas.

D. Election to Resolve a Tie. In the event that an Election is necessary to resolve a tie vote, the terms of the Contract shall extend to the second Election, except:

1. The District and the Contracting Officer will agree upon the date of the Election and the early voting schedule subject to provisions of the Election Code and with regard to other elections being conducted by the Contracting Officer.
2. The District will be responsible for any Department of Justice preclearance submission under Section 5 of the Federal Voting Rights Act.

3. An attempt will be made to use the Election workers that worked in the first Election; those poll workers will not have additional training provided by the Contracting Officer.
 4. The cost of the Election will be borne by the District; the Contracting Officer will work with the District on cost management.
- E. **Amendment/Modification.** Except as otherwise provided, this Contract may not be amended, modified, or changed in any respect except in writing, duly executed by the parties hereto. Both the Contracting Officer and the District may propose necessary amendments or modifications to this Contract in writing in order to conduct the Election smoothly and efficiently, except that any such proposals must be approved by the Contracting Officer and the governing body of the District or its authorized agent, respectively.
- F. **Severability.** If any provision of the Contract is found to be invalid, illegal, or unenforceable by a court of competent jurisdiction, such invalidity, illegality, or unenforceability shall not affect the remaining provisions of this Contract and parties to this Contract shall perform their obligations under this Contract in accordance with the intent of the parties to this Contract as expressed in the terms and provisions.

3. Compile lists of eligible registered voters to be used in conducting the Election, including lists for early voting and for each precinct established for the Election.
4. Procure, prepare and distribute election equipment, transport equipment to and from the polling places, and issue election supplies to the precinct judges.
5. Supervise the conduct of early voting by personal appearance and by mail, and supply personnel to serve as deputy early voting clerks.
6. Assist in providing general overall supervision of the Election and provide advisory services in connection with the decisions to be made and actions to be taken by officers of the District.
7. Other incidental related services as may be necessary to effectuate the Election.

NOTHING IN THIS AGREEMENT IS INTENDED TO LIMIT THE DISCRETION OF THE ADMINISTRATOR IN THE EXECUTION OF HER DUTIES. IT IS FOR THE ADMINISTRATOR, IN THE EXERCISE OF REASONABLE DISCRETION, TO DETERMINE HOW THE EFFORTS OF HER OFFICE SHOULD BE ALLOCATED THROUGHOUT THE COUNTY.

Article 2. District Duties and Services. The District agrees to perform the following duties:

1. Prepare and adopt all orders and resolutions necessary to conduct the Election.
2. Prepare and publish all required Election notices.
3. Deliver to the Administrator as soon as possible, but not later than legally required before the Election, the ballot language including the list of candidates, or any measures that are to be printed on the ballot with the exact form, wording and spelling that is to be used.
4. Provide the services necessary to translate any Election documents into Spanish.
5. Pay any additional costs incurred by the Administrator if a recount for said Election is required, or the election is contested in any manner.
6. Provide technical assistance requested by the Administrator.

Article 3. Administration. The Administrator will be responsible for administering this agreement and providing supervisory control and command over all the agents, officers, and other

personnel performing services pursuant to this Agreement. The contact person and representative for the Elections Office is the Administrator, or her designee, and the contact person and representative for the District is Tim Savoy, Chief Communications Officer.

Article 4. Cost of Services. The County shall remit payment directly to the Vendor, any costs associated with ballots, programming, coding and any other expenses incurred. The County shall remit payment directly to the Election judges, alternate judges and clerks including their delivery fees.

Article 5. Liability. The District shall be responsible for any actual expenses for repairs for any damage that occurs to the DS200 or ExpressVote systems and related voting equipment to the extent that any such repairs are not covered under the vendor's warranty. The District shall not be liable for any damage to the Election equipment or related voting equipment that is caused by a third party outside of the control of the District.

Article 6. General Conditions.

1. Nothing contained in this contract shall authorize or permit a challenge in the officer with whom or the place at which any document or record relating to the Election is to be filed, or place at which any function of the canvass of the Election returns is to be performed, or the officer to serve as custodian of voted ballots or other Election Records.
2. The Administrator may assign deputies to perform any of the contracted services.
3. The Administrator may contract with third persons for the Election services and supplies; and the Administrator will pay the claims for those election expenses, and shall remain responsible for the supervision and conduct of such third parties.
4. This contract shall be construed under and in accordance with the laws of the State of Texas, and all obligations of the parties created hereunder are performable in Caldwell County, Texas.
5. In case any one or more of the provisions contained in this contract shall for any reason be held to be invalid, illegal, or unenforceable in any respect, such invalidity, illegality, or unenforceability shall not affect any other provision thereof, and this contract shall be construed as if such invalid, illegal, or unenforceable provision had never been contained herein.

6. No amendment, modification, or alteration of the terms hereof shall be binding unless the same is in writing, dated subsequent to the date hereof and duly executed by the parties hereof.
7. The parties acknowledge that the Contracting Officer may contract with other entities holding elections at the same time as the City on May 7, 2022.

Article 7. Miscellaneous. Nothing in this Agreement shall be deemed to waive, modify or amend any legal defenses available at law or in equity to the County, the District or the Administrator, or to create any legal rights or claim on behalf of any third party. Neither the County, the District, nor the Administrator waives any defenses whatsoever, including, but not limited to, governmental immunity.

ELECTION AGREEMENT BETWEEN TRAVIS COUNTY AND Hays CISD

Pursuant to Chapter 31, Subchapter D, Chapter 123, and Chapter 271 of the Texas Election Code and Chapter 791 of the Texas Government Code, Travis County (the “County”) and Hays Consolidated Independent School District (“Participating Entity”) enter into this agreement (this “Agreement”) for the Travis County Clerk, as the County’s election officer (the “Election Officer”), to conduct the Participating Entity’s elections, including runoffs, and for the Participating Entity’s use of the County’s current or future-acquired election equipment for any voting system that the County adopts, as authorized under Title 8 of the Texas Election Code, for all Participating Entity elections. The purpose of this Agreement is to maintain consistency and accessibility in voting practices, polling places, and election procedures in order to best assist the voters of the Participating Entity.

Section 1. GENERAL PROVISIONS

- (A) Except as otherwise provided in this Agreement, the term “election” refers to any Participating Entity election, occurring on any uniform election date prescribed by the Texas Election Code or a primary election date, along with any resulting runoff, if necessary, within all Participating Entity’s territory located in Travis County. If a runoff is necessary, the Participating Entity shall work with the Election Officer to determine a mutually acceptable run-off date. In the event that the Participating Entity and the Election Officer do not agree on a run-off date, the Participating Entity agrees to the run-off date selected by the Election Officer.
- (B) If the Participating Entity determines it is necessary to conduct an election during a time other than that specified in Section 1(A), the Election Officer and a representative designated by the Participating Entity will meet as soon as possible thereafter to determine the feasibility of the Election Officer conducting such an election. If both parties agree that the Election Officer will administer the election, the new election will be based on all other applicable provisions of this Agreement except provisions that are inconsistent and cannot be feasibly applied.
- (C) Except as otherwise provided in this Agreement:
 - (1) The term “Election Officer” refers to the Travis County Clerk;
 - (2) The term “precinct” means all precincts in the territory of the Participating Entity located within Travis County.
 - (3) The term “election services” refers to services used to perform or supervise any or all of the duties and functions that the Election Officer determines necessary for the conduct of an election.
 - (4) The term “cost for election services” includes the costs for personnel, supplies, materials, or services needed for providing these services as

permitted by the Texas Election Code but does not refer to costs relating to the use of the voting equipment.

- (D) Except as otherwise provided in this Agreement, the cost for “use of voting equipment” for a particular election is the amount the County will charge the Participating Entity for use of the County’s voting equipment in use at the time of that election.
- (E) The Participating Entity agrees to commit the funds necessary to pay for all election-related expenses for Participating Entity elections in accordance with this Agreement.
- (F) The Election Officer has the right to enter into agreements with other entities at any time, including during the dates listed in Section 1(A).
- (G) As a condition for providing election services and equipment usage, the Election Officer may require authorities of political subdivisions holding elections on the same day in all or part of the same territory to enter into a joint election agreement as authorized in Chapter 271 of the Texas Election Code, and the Participating Entity agrees to enter into any joint election agreement required by the County.

SECTION 2. PARTICIPATING ENTITY’S USE OF VOTING EQUIPMENT; DUTIES OF THE ELECTION OFFICER AND OF THE PARTICIPATING ENTITY

The County shall make available to the Participating Entity the County’s current voting system and any future-acquired voting system as authorized under Title 8 of the Texas Election Code, subject to restrictions and conditions imposed by the Election Officer to ensure availability of the equipment for County-ordered elections, primary elections, special elections, and subsequent runoff elections, if applicable. The Election Officer may also impose restrictions and conditions to protect the equipment from misuse or damage.

SECTION 3. APPOINTMENT OF ELECTION OFFICER

- (A) The Travis County Election Officer (“Election Officer”) is appointed to serve as the Participating Entity’s Election Officer and Early Voting Clerk to conduct the Participating Entity’s elections described in Section 1.
- (B) As the Participating Entity’s Election Officer and Early Voting Clerk, the Election Officer shall coordinate, supervise, and conduct all aspects of administering voting in Participating Entity elections in compliance with all applicable laws, subject to Section 3(C) below.
- (C) The Participating Entity shall continue to perform those election duties listed in (1) through (7) below and any other election duties, such as receipt of candidate applications, that are not allowed to be delegated to another governmental entity:

- (1) Preparing, adopting, and publishing all required election orders, resolutions, notices, and other documents, including bilingual materials, evidencing action by the governing authority of the Participating Entity necessary to the conduct of an election, except that:
 - a. The Election Officer does not provide newspaper notices on behalf of the Participating Entity with respect to a specific election.
 - b. With respect to each debt obligation election the Election Officer conducts for the Participating Entity pursuant to this Agreement:
 - i. The Election Officer, after receiving from the Participating Entity a copy of the debt obligation election order, shall post the notice required by and in accordance with Texas Election Code Section 4.003(f)(1) on election day and during early voting by personal appearance, in a prominent location at each polling place;
 - ii. The Election Officer shall provide written confirmation to the Participating Entity that the debt obligation election order was posted in accordance with Texas Election Code Section 4.003(f)(1); and
 - iii. The Participating Entity shall pay any applicable expenses incurred by the Election Officer that directly relates to the posting required by Texas Election Code Section 4.003(f)(1).
 - (2) Preparing the text for the Participating Entity's official ballot in English and Spanish and any other languages as required by law;
 - (3) Providing the Election Officer with a list of candidates or propositions showing the order and the exact manner in which the candidates' names and the propositions are to appear on the official ballot;
 - (4) Conducting the official canvass of a Participating Entity election;
 - (5) Administering the Participating Entity's duties under state and local campaign finance laws;
 - (6) Filing the Participating Entity's annual voting system report to the Secretary of State as required under Texas Election Code Chapter 123.
- (D) The Participating Entity shall also be responsible for proofing and attesting to the accuracy of all ballot language, including any required language translations, and format information programmed by the County. This includes any information programmed for use with the audio or tactile button features of the equipment. The Participating Entity may also monitor and review all logic and accuracy testing and mandatory tabulations. The Participating Entity will complete its duties within timeframes as prescribed by the County. If the Participating Entity finds any discrepancies or concerns, it will immediately report them to the Election Officer and work with her to resolve any issues so that final approval can be reached. The

Participating Entity shall be responsible for any and all actual costs associated with correcting the ballot and ballot programming if the error is discovered after the Participating Entity has signed off on its final proof containing the error.

- (E) Tim Savoy, Chief Communication Officer, will assist the County whenever possible when the conduct of the election requires assistance from Participating Entity departments and staff. Tim Savoy, Chief Communication Officer, will serve as the Regular Early Voting Clerk for the Participating Entity to receive requests for applications for early voting ballots and forward these applications to the Joint Early Voting Clerk. Tim Savoy, Chief Communication Officer, will serve as the Custodian of Records for the Participating Entity to complete those tasks in the Texas Election Code that the Election Officer will not perform.

SECTION 4. ELECTION WORKERS AND POLLING PLACES

- (A) For presentation to the governing body of the Participating Entity, the County shall provide a list containing the locations, times, and dates of early voting polling places suitable for consideration and adoption by the governing body in accordance with Texas Election Code Chapter 85. The Election Officer will designate and confirm all Election Day polling place locations.
- (B) The Election Officer will assume the responsibility for recruiting election personnel; however, if by the 5th day before the Election, the Election Officer reports vacancies in positions for election judges, alternate judges, election day clerks, early voting ballot board, receiving substation clerks, or any other key election personnel, the Participating Entity shall provide emergency personnel in these positions.
- (C) The Election Officer shall notify each of the election judges and alternates of their appointment and the eligibility requirements that pertain to them and to the selection of Election Day clerks. Included in this notification will be the number of clerks that each precinct should have in addition to the election judge and alternate judge. The election judges and/or the alternates are responsible for recruiting and supervising their clerks.
- (D) All election workers must agree to attend training sessions as determined by the Election Officer. Costs for these training sessions and compensation for attendees will be included as part of the election services costs.
- (E) During any election and any subsequent runoff election that involve entities in addition to the Participating Entity, the Election Officer will work with all parties to find a plan that can be agreed upon regarding the designation of polling places. If agreement cannot be reached, the Election Officer will resolve the differences. **In all cases, the Election Officer has sole discretion to determine whether polling place changes are necessary.**

SECTION 5. PAYMENTS FOR ELECTION SERVICES

- (A) Costs and payments for the use of voting equipment are addressed separately in Section 6 of this Agreement.
- (B) Requests for Election Services. For each election the Participating Entity desires the Election Officer to conduct, the Participating Entity must submit a written request to the Election Officer that describes the general nature of the election and specifies the date of the election.
- (C) Cancellations. On or before 11:59 p.m. on the 68th day before an election for which the Participating Entity has requested election services, the Participating Entity shall notify the Election Officer as to whether the Participating Entity anticipates the cancellation of its election, and on or before 11:59 p.m. on the 60th day before the election the Participating Entity shall notify the Election Officer as to whether the Participating Entity will cancel that election. If the Election Officer receives written notice from the Participating Entity on or before 11:59 p.m. of the 60th day before an election that the Participating Entity's election will be cancelled, the Contracting Officer shall only be entitled to receive the actual expenses incurred before the date of cancellation in connection with the election and an administrative fee of \$75 in accordance with Sections 2.051 - 2.053 of the Texas Election Code.
- (D) Notice, Cost Estimate, Initial Invoicing, and Initial Payment.
- (1) Notwithstanding the provisions in Section 9(B), the County and the Participating Entity agree that notice under Section 5 can be provided via e-mail. The following e-mail address will be used for e-mail communications to or from the County pursuant to Section 5: elections@traviscountytexas.gov, with a copy to ElectionEntities@traviscountytexas.gov. The Participating Entity has designated Tim Savoy, Chief Communication Officer, will as the Participating Entity's representative for sending and receiving e-mail communications under Section 5, and the Participating Entity designates the following e-mail address as the Participating Entity's email address for sending and receiving e-mail communications pursuant to Section 5: tim.savoy@hayscisd.net.
- (2) Initial Cost Estimate. On or before the 60th day before an election for which the Participating Entity has requested election services, the Election Officer will mail and/or email to the Participating Entity a cost estimate for conducting the election. The cost estimate will include an administrative fee that is equal to 10% of the total estimated cost of conducting the Participating Entity's election, excluding the costs of voting equipment. In the event of a joint election, the cost estimate will reflect that election costs will be divided on a pro rata basis among all entities involved in the election in the manner set

forth in this Section 5. The proportional cost for the Election Officer to conduct each participating entity's election will be calculated by dividing the number of registered voters in the territorial jurisdiction of each participating entity by the total number of registered voters for all of the participating entities involved in the joint election and multiplying that quotient by the total cost of the election. The product of these numbers is the pro rata cost share for each participating entity. The Participating Entity acknowledges and understands that if any other participating entity listed in the cost estimate cancels its election, each remaining participating entity's pro rata cost (including the Participating Entity's pro rata cost share) will result in a proportionate cost increase.

- (3) Initial Invoice and Initial Payment. Along with the initial cost estimate, the Election Officer will also include an initial invoice for the Participating Entity to pay 75% of the initial cost estimate. The Participating Entity must pay the County the amount specified in each invoice no later than 30 days after the Participating Entity's receipt of the invoice.
- (4) Runoff Elections. For each runoff election the Participating Entity has requested that the Election Officer conduct, the Participating Entity must make a payment equal to 75% of the projected costs for the runoff election no later than three business days after receiving that cost estimate from the Election Officer. The projected share of election costs will include an administrative fee that is equal to 10% of the total estimated cost of conducting the Participating Entity's runoff election, excluding the costs of voting equipment.
- (5) Each party may change its respective email addresses for e-mail communications under this Section 5, without the need to amend this Agreement, by sending notice to the other party in accordance with Section 9(B).
- (F) Final Accounting and Final Invoice. The County will send the Participating Entity a final invoice of election expenses not later than 90 days after an election unless the Election Officer notifies the Participating Entity during that 90-day period following the election that the Election Officer requires additional time to send a final invoice to the Participating Entity. The final invoice will include a listing of additional costs incurred at the Participating Entity's behalf and specify the total payment due from the Participating Entity for any unpaid portion of the Participating Entity's costs.
 - (1) Within 30 days after receipt of an election cost invoice setting forth the Election Officer's actual contract expenses and charges incurred in the conduct of the election, the Participating Entity shall pay the Election Officer the balance due on each final invoice no later than 30 days after the Participating Entity's receipt of that invoice.

- (2) A refund may be due from the County to the Participating Entity if the final costs are lower than the amount already paid by the Participating Entity or if, at the end of the calendar year, the County Auditor's Office makes adjustments to the election workers' payroll and the amount already paid by the Participating Entity for election worker payroll costs exceeds the payroll amounts calculated by the County Auditor's Office.
- (G) The Participating Entity shall promptly review an election invoice and any supporting documentation when received from the County. The Participating Entity may audit, during the County's normal business hours, relevant County election or accounting records upon reasonable notice to the County. The Participating Entity shall pay the entire final invoice or the undisputed portion of the final invoice not later than the 30th day after receiving the invoice. Failure by the Participating Entity to timely pay an invoice in full may impact the Election Officer's participation in future elections with the Participating Entity.

SECTION 6. PAYMENTS FOR USE OF VOTING EQUIPMENT

- (A) The Election Officer shall conduct elections using a voting system certified by the Secretary of State in accordance with the Texas Election Code and that has been approved for use by the Travis County Commissioners Court unless otherwise agreed upon by the Participating Entity, the Travis County Clerk, and the Travis County Commissioners Court.
- (B) The Participating Entity shall make payments to Travis County as consideration for the use of the County's voting equipment.
 - (1) For each election the Election Officer conducts for the Participating Entity after January 1, 2022, through January 1, 2023, the Participating Entity shall pay two percent of the cost of the electronic voting system equipment installed at a polling place and two percent for each unit of other electronic equipment used by the Travis County Clerk's Office to conduct the election or provide election services.
 - (2) In this Agreement "other electronic equipment" includes ballot marking devices, ballot scanners, ballot printers, ballot tabulators, electronic pollbooks, and ballot programming software.
- (C) Payment by the Participating Entity to the County for voting equipment is due no later than 30 days after the Participating Entity's receipt of an invoice from the County.
- (D) If the County acquires additional equipment, different voting equipment, or upgrades to existing equipment during the term of this Agreement, the charge for the use of the equipment may be renegotiated.

SECTION 7. ADDITIONAL EARLY VOTING LOCATIONS

- (A) All of the Participating Entity's voters within Travis County will have access to all of the Travis County Early Voting sites in each election at no additional cost.
- (B) If the Participating Entity desires to have one or more early voting sites that are in addition to those sites the Election Officer has already selected for a specific election, the Participating Entity must submit the request to the Election Officer no later than 60 days before the election, and the Election Officer will thereafter provide a written estimate to the Participating Entity that sets forth the estimated cost for providing the additional early voting location(s) and the deadline by which the cost estimate must be paid. If, after receiving the cost estimate, the Participating Entity desires to move forward with having the additional early voting location(s), the Participating Entity will notify the Election Officer and include payment of the cost estimate with the Participating Entity's notice to the Election Officer no later than the deadline specified in the Election Officer's cost estimate. *Pursuant to Texas Election Code Section 85.064(b) and notwithstanding any provision to the contrary, the Election Officer has sole discretion to determine whether to provide any additional early voting sites requested by the Participating Entity.*

SECTION 8. COMMUNICATIONS

- (A) The Participating Entity and the Election Officer shall each designate a member of their staff to serve as the primary contact for the respective offices under this Agreement and provide the name and contact information for that individual to the other party. Each party may change their designated staff members by sending notice to the other party without the further need to amend this Agreement.
- (B) Throughout the term of this Agreement, the Participating Entity and the County will engage in ongoing communications on issues related to Participating Entity elections, the use of County's voting equipment, and the delivery of services under this Agreement and, when necessary, the County Clerk, Elections Division staff members, and other election workers shall meet with the Participating Entity to discuss and resolve any problems which might arise under this Agreement.
- (C) The Election Officer shall be the main point of media contact for election information related to election administration. The Participating Entity shall designate a contact to be the main point of contact for matters related to the content of the Participating Entity's ballot or candidates.

SECTION 9. MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS

- (A) Amendment/Modification

Except as otherwise provided, this Agreement may not be amended, modified, or changed in any respect whatsoever, except by a further Agreement in writing and duly executed by the parties hereto. No official, representative, agent, or employee of the County has any authority to modify this Agreement except pursuant to such expressed authorization as may be granted by the Commissioners Court of Travis County, Texas. No official, representative, agent, or employee of the Participating Entity has any authority to modify this Agreement except pursuant to such expressed authorization as may be granted by the governing body of the Participating Entity. Rebecca Guerrero, Travis County Clerk (or her successor), may propose necessary amendments or modifications to this Agreement in writing in order to conduct a joint election smoothly and efficiently, except that any such proposals must be approved by the Commissioners Court of the County and the governing body of the Participating Entity.

(B) Notice

Unless otherwise provided herein, any notice to be given hereunder by any party to the other shall be in writing and may be affected by personal delivery, by certified mail, or by common carrier. Notice to a party shall be addressed as follows:

Notice by hand-delivery is deemed effective immediately, notice by certified mail is deemed effective three days after deposit with a U.S. Postal Office or in a U.S. Mail Box, and notice by a common carrier, is deemed effective upon receipt. Each party may change the address for notice to it by giving notice of such change in accordance with the provisions of this Section. When notices by e-mail are permitted by this Agreement, (1) the notice is deemed effective upon the day it is sent if the e-mail is received before 5:00 p.m. on a business day; (2) the notice is deemed effective on the first business day after the e-mail was received if the email was received after 5:00 p.m. on a business day or anytime on a Saturday or Sunday. In this Agreement, "business day" means any weekday that is not a holiday designated by the Travis County Commissioners Court.

(C) Force Majeure

In the event that the performance by the County of any of its obligations or undertakings hereunder shall be interrupted or delayed by any occurrence not occasioned by its own conduct, whether such occurrence be an act of God or the result of war, riot, civil commotion, sovereign conduct, or the act or condition of any persons not a party hereto or in privity thereof, then it shall be excused from such performance for such period of time as is reasonably necessary after such occurrence to remedy the effects thereof.

(D) Venue and Choice of Law

The Participating Entity agrees that venue for any dispute arising under this Agreement will lie in the appropriate courts of Austin, Travis County, Texas. This Agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Texas and the United States of America.

(E) Entire Agreement

This Agreement contains the entire agreement of the parties relating to the rights herein granted and the obligations herein assumed and also supersedes all prior agreements, including prior election services contracts and prior agreements to conduct joint elections. Any prior agreements, promises, negotiations, or representations not expressly contained in this Agreement are of no force or effect. Any oral representations or modifications concerning this Agreement shall be of no force or effect, excepting a subsequent modification in writing as provided herein.

(F) Severability

If any provision of this Agreement is found to be invalid, illegal or unenforceable by a court of competent jurisdiction, such invalidity, illegality or unenforceability shall not affect the remaining provisions of this Agreement. Parties to this Agreement shall perform their obligations under this Agreement in accordance with the intent of the parties to this Agreement as expressed in the terms and provisions of this Agreement.

(G) Breach

In the event that Participating Entity or County breaches any of its obligations under this Agreement, the non-breaching party shall be entitled to pursue any and all rights and remedies allowed by law.

(H) Payments from Current Revenues

Payments made by the Participating Entity in meeting its obligations under this Agreement shall be made from current revenue funds available to the governing body of the Participating Entity. Payments made by the County in meeting its obligations under this Agreement shall be made from current budget or revenue available to the County.

(I) Other Instruments

The County and the Participating Entity agree that they will execute other and further instruments or any documents as may become necessary or convenient to effectuate and carry out the purposes of this Agreement.

(J) Third Party Beneficiaries

Except as otherwise provided herein, nothing in this Agreement, expressed or implied, is intended to confer upon any person, other than the parties hereto, any benefits, rights or remedies under or by reason of this Agreement.

(K) Joint Election Agreements

The County and the Participating Entity expressly understand and acknowledge that each may enter into other joint election agreements with other jurisdictions, to be held on Election Day and at common polling places covered by this Agreement.

When mediation is acceptable to both parties in resolving a dispute arising under this Agreement, the parties agree to use a mutually agreed upon mediator, or a person appointed by a court of competent jurisdiction, for mediation as described in Section 154.023 of the Texas Civil Practice and Remedies Code. Unless both parties are satisfied with the result of the mediation, the mediation will not constitute a final and binding resolution of the dispute. All communications within the scope of the mediation shall remain confidential as described in Section 154.053 of the Texas Civil Practice and Remedies Code unless both parties agree, in writing, to waive the confidentiality. Notwithstanding the foregoing, the parties intend to fully comply with the Texas Open Meetings Act and the Texas Public Information Act whenever applicable. The term "confidential" as used in this Agreement has the same meaning as defined and construed under the Texas Public Information Act and the Texas Open Meetings Act.

Previous board action relating to this item – In December 2021, the Board of Trustees approved an increase in the total amount of this contract up to \$80,000.

Future action anticipated –

Background information – During 2021-2022, Maxim Healthcare Services has provided HCISD with a team of nurses and unlicensed personnel to assist with campus COVID-19 contact tracing, related parent notifications, and, for a period during the early fall, a COVID help desk to answer COVID-19 related questions. In December, a request was brought to the board to increase this contract as the total amount spent neared \$50,000. The board approved an increase of an additional \$30,000 to bring the contract total to \$80,000. Since that approval, the district has received an unexpected number of invoices due to a billing lag and the Hays County area has seen a rapid spike in COVID-19 cases requiring additional support for the near future. Additionally, the special education department has experienced a need for additional staff to provide nursing-related services to students with special health needs that cannot be met by the campus nurse, nor has the department been able to hire additional staff who could perform some of these delegated nursing tasks under the supervision of the campus nurse. Given these unanticipated needs, the Federal Programs department in support of the Health Services Department is asking to increase the total amount of the Maxim Healthcare services contract to a total of \$234,000.

ORDER CALLING SCHOOL BUILDING BOND ELECTION

STATE OF TEXAS §
COUNTIES OF HAYS, CALDWELL, AND TRAVIS §
HAYS CONSOLIDATED §
INDEPENDENT SCHOOL DISTRICT §

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees (the “Board”) of the Hays Consolidated Independent School District (the “District”) has the power to issue bonds pursuant to Chapter 45, Texas Education Code; and

WHEREAS, the Board has determined that it is necessary and appropriate to call and conduct an election to obtain voter authorization for the issuance of such bonds; and

WHEREAS, the District will enter into one or more election agreements (the “Election Agreements”) with Hays County, Caldwell County, and Travis County (the “Counties”), by and through the Counties’ respective elections administrators or other election officers (collectively, the “Administrators”) and possibly other political subdivisions (the “Participants”), in accordance with the laws of the State of Texas (the “State”) and applicable federal law.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDERED BY THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE HAYS CONSOLIDATED INDEPENDENT SCHOOL DISTRICT:

Section 1. Call of Election; Date; Eligible Electors; and Hours. An election (the “Election”) shall be held on May 7, 2022 (“Election Day”), which is seventy-eight (78) or more days from the date of the adoption of this order (the “Election Order”), within and throughout the territory of the District at which all resident, qualified electors of the District shall be entitled to vote. The Board hereby finds that holding the Election on such date is in the public interest. The hours during which the polling places are to be open on Election Day shall be from 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m.

Section 2. Voting Precincts; Polling Places; Election Officers. Except as otherwise provided herein, the boundaries and territories of the respective county election precincts that are wholly or partially within the territorial boundaries of the District are hereby designated as the voting precincts of the District for the Election and the precinct numbers for the District’s election precincts shall be the corresponding county precinct number of each precinct. The Election Day polling places shall be as shown in **Exhibit A** to this Election Order. The precinct judges and alternate judges for the Election shall be appointed in accordance with the Texas Election Code (the “Election Code”).

In the event that the Superintendent, or his designee, shall determine from time to time that (a) a polling place hereafter designated shall become unavailable or unsuitable for such use, or it would be in the District’s best interests to relocate such polling place, or (b) a presiding judge or alternate presiding judge hereafter designated shall become unqualified or unavailable, the Superintendent, or his designee, is hereby authorized to designate and appoint in writing a substitute polling place, presiding judge or alternate presiding judge, and correct or modify the

exhibits to this Election Order, giving such notice as is required by the Election Code and as deemed sufficient.

Section 3. Proposition. At the Election there shall be submitted to the resident, qualified electors of the District the following proposition (the "Proposition"):

HAYS CONSOLIDATED INDEPENDENT SCHOOL DISTRICT - PROPOSITION A

SHALL THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES (THE "BOARD") OF THE HAYS CONSOLIDATED INDEPENDENT SCHOOL DISTRICT (THE "DISTRICT") BE AUTHORIZED TO ISSUE BONDS OF THE DISTRICT, IN ONE OR MORE SERIES OR INSTALLMENTS, IN THE AMOUNT OF \$115,649,800 FOR THE DESIGN, CONSTRUCTION, ACQUISITION, REHABILITATION, RENOVATION, EXPANSION, IMPROVEMENT AND EQUIPMENT OF SCHOOL BUILDINGS IN THE DISTRICT AND THE PURCHASE OF NEW SCHOOL BUSES, WHICH BONDS SHALL MATURE, BEAR INTEREST AND BE ISSUED AND SOLD IN ACCORDANCE WITH LAW AT THE TIME OF ISSUANCE; AND SHALL THE BOARD BE AUTHORIZED TO LEVY, IMPOSE AND PLEDGE, AND CAUSE TO BE ASSESSED AND COLLECTED, ANNUAL AD VALOREM TAXES ON ALL TAXABLE PROPERTY IN THE DISTRICT SUFFICIENT, WITHOUT LIMIT AS TO RATE OR AMOUNT, TO PAY THE PRINCIPAL OF AND INTEREST ON THE BONDS, AND THE COSTS OF ANY CREDIT AGREEMENTS (INCLUDING CREDIT AGREEMENTS EXECUTED OR AUTHORIZED IN ANTICIPATION OF, IN RELATION TO, OR IN CONNECTION WITH THE BONDS), ALL AS AUTHORIZED BY THE CONSTITUTION AND LAWS OF THE STATE OF TEXAS AND THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA?

Section 4. Ballots. The ballots shall conform to the requirements of the Election Code and shall have written or printed thereon the following:

Section 5. Voting. Electronic voting machines may be used in holding and conducting the Election on Election Day; provided, however, in the event the use of such electronic voting machines is not practicable, the Election may be conducted on Election Day by the use of paper ballots (except as otherwise provided in this section). Electronic voting machines or paper ballots may be used for early voting by personal appearance (except as otherwise provided in this section). As required by the Election Code, the District shall provide at least one accessible voting system in each polling place used in the Election. Such voting system shall comply with Texas and federal laws establishing the requirement for voting systems that permit voters with physical disabilities to cast a secret ballot. Paper ballots may be used for early voting by mail.

Each voter desiring to vote in favor of the Proposition shall mark the ballot indicating “FOR” the Proposition, and each voter desiring to vote against the Proposition shall mark the ballot indicating “AGAINST” the Proposition. Voting will be conducted in accordance with the Election Code.

Section 6. Early Voting. The Board hereby appoints the Administrators as the regular early voting clerks for the voters of the District within their respective Counties. Early voting, both by personal appearance and by mail, will be conducted in accordance with the Election Code.

Early voting by personal appearance shall be conducted at the locations, on the dates and at the times as shown in **Exhibit B**. Early voting by personal appearance shall begin on Monday, April 25, 2022 and end on Tuesday, May 3, 2022.

For the use of those voters who are entitled by law to vote early by mail, the early voting clerk shall provide each voter with a ballot with instructions to mark the ballot indicating his or her vote “FOR” or “AGAINST” the Proposition. The Administrators are hereby authorized and directed to designate the early voting ballot board and other officers required to conduct early voting for the Election.

Section 7. Conduct of Election. The Election shall be conducted by election officers, including the precinct judges and alternate judges or clerks appointed by the Board, in accordance with the Election Agreements, the Education Code, the Election Code and the Constitution and laws of the State and the United States of America. The President of the Board of Trustees, the Superintendent, and their respective designees, are authorized to enter into, execute and deliver one or more Election Agreements, in accordance with applicable provisions of the Election Code. The terms and provisions of each Election Agreement are hereby incorporated into this Election Order. To the extent of any conflict between this Election Order and an Election Agreement, the terms and provisions of the Election Agreement shall prevail, and the President of the Board of Trustees, the Superintendent, and their respective designees, are authorized to make such corrections, changes, revisions and modifications to this Election Order, including the exhibits hereto, as are deemed necessary or appropriate to conform to the Election Agreement, to comply with applicable state and federal law and to carry out the intent of the Board, as evidenced by this Election Order. The Administrators shall be responsible for establishing the central counting station for the ballots cast in the Election and appointing the personnel necessary for such station.

Section 8. Bilingual Election Materials. All notices, instructions, and ballots pertaining to the Election shall be furnished to voters in both English and Spanish and persons capable of acting as translators in both English and Spanish shall be made available to assist Spanish language speaking voters in understanding and participating in the election process.

Section 9. Delivery of Voted Ballots; Counting; Tabulation; Canvassing of Returns; Declaring Results. The ballots shall be counted by one or more teams of election officers assigned by the presiding judges, each team to consist of two or more election officers. After completion of his responsibilities under the Election Code, including the counting of the voted ballots and the tabulation of the results, the presiding judge shall make a written return of the Election results to the District in accordance with the Election Code. The Board shall canvass the returns and declare the results of the Election.

If a majority of the resident, qualified electors of the District voting at the Election, including those voting early, shall vote in favor of the Proposition, then the issuance and sale of the bonds described in the Proposition shall be authorized in the maximum amount contained therein, and the bonds shall be issued and sold at the price or prices and in such denominations determined by the Board to be in the District's best interest.

Section 10. Training of Election Officials. Pursuant to the Election Code, a public school of instruction for all election officers and clerks may be held as arranged or contracted by the Administrators.

Section 11. Notice of Election; Voter Information Document. Notice of the Election shall be given in the manner required by the Election Code and other applicable law. A voter information document for the Proposition in the form attached hereto as **Exhibit C** is hereby approved, together with such revisions as may be approved by the Superintendent or Chief Financial Officer, and shall be posted in accordance with law. To the extent required by law, each notice of the Election shall include the District's internet website address, which is <https://www.hayscisd.net/>.

Section 12. Notice of Meeting. The Board officially finds, determines, recites and declares that written notice of the date, hour, place and subject of the meeting at which this Election Order is adopted was posted on a bulletin board located at a place convenient to the public at the District's administrative offices for a least seventy-two (72) hours preceding the scheduled time of the meeting; that a telephonic or telegraphic notice of such meeting was given to all news media who have consented to pay any and all expenses incurred by the District in connection with providing such notice, both as required by the Open Meetings Law, Chapter 551, Texas Government Code, as amended; and that such meeting was open to the public as required by law at all times during which this Election Order and the subject matter thereof was discussed, considered and formally acted upon.

Section 13. Mandatory Statement of Information.

(a) Pursuant to Section 3.009, Texas Election Code: (i) the proposition language that will appear on the ballot is set forth in Section 4 of this Election Order, (ii) the purposes for which the bonds are to be authorized are set forth in Section 3 of this Election Order, (iii) the principal amount of bonds to be authorized is set forth in Section 3 of this Election Order, (iv) if the issuance of bonds is authorized by voters, taxes sufficient, without limit as to rate or amount, to pay the principal of and interest on the bonds and the costs of any credit agreements may be imposed, as set forth in Section 3 of this Election Order, (v) bonds authorized pursuant to this Election Order

may be issued to mature over a specified number of years not to exceed the lesser of forty (40) years or the maximum number of years authorized by law and bearing interest at the rate or rates (not to exceed 15%), as authorized by law and determined by the Board, (vi) as of the date of the adoption of this Election Order, the aggregate amount of outstanding principal of the District's debt obligations is \$532,810,000.00, and the aggregate amount of outstanding interest on the District's debt obligations is \$233,492,330.41 (based upon the District's expectations relative to its variable rate debt obligations), and (vii) the District's ad valorem debt service tax rate as of the date of adoption of this Election Order is \$0.4877 per \$100 valuation of taxable property.

(b) Based upon market conditions as of the date of this Election Order, the maximum net effective interest rate for any series of the bonds is estimated to be 3.75%. Such estimated maximum interest rate is provided as a matter of information, but is not a limitation on the interest rate at which the bonds, or any series thereof, may be sold. In addition, the estimate contained in this subsection (b) is (i) based on certain assumptions (including assumptions concerning prevailing market and economic conditions at the time(s) of issuance of the bonds) and derived from projections obtained from the District's financial advisor, (ii) subject to change to the extent that actual facts, circumstances and conditions prevailing at the time that the bonds are issued differ from such assumptions and projections, (iii) provided solely in satisfaction of the requirements of Section 3.009, Texas Election Code, and for no other purpose, without any assurance that such projections will be realized, and (iv) not intended to and does not give rise to a contract with voters or limit the authority of the Board to issue bonds in accordance with the Proposition submitted by this Election Order.

Section 14. Authority of the Superintendent. The Superintendent shall have the authority to take, or cause to be taken, all reasonable or necessary actions to ensure that the Election is fairly held and returns properly counted and tabulated for canvass by the Board, which actions are hereby ratified and confirmed. Without limiting the generality of the immediately preceding sentence, the Superintendent and his designees are hereby authorized to complete and update, as necessary, the exhibits hereto with the necessary information as same is made available to the District.

Section 15. Authorization to Execute. The President or Vice President of the Board is authorized to execute and the Secretary of the Board is authorized to attest this Election Order on behalf of the Board; and the President or Vice President of the Board is authorized to do all other things legal and necessary in connection with the holding and consummation of the Election.

Section 16. Effective Date. This Election Order is effective immediately upon its passage and approval.

Future action anticipated – The 2022-2023 calendar matches with spring break for the University of Texas. The 2023-2024 calendar for UT is not yet published. If the spring break for UT does not match in 2024 with Hays CISD, the Board may consider amending the 2024 spring break schedule at that time.

Background information – The calendar pattern was endorsed by the DLT to be applied to the next two school year cycles. The parent, student, staff, and community survey regarding these calendar drafts shows a 90% favorability rating by the more than 2,700 people who responded to that question.

E. Scope of Options Reviewed:

The academic calendar in Hays CISD has been extensively reviewed during the past several cycles to accommodate the change in state law converting instruction time to minutes from days; and during the process to adopt a District of Innovation plan for Hays CISD.

Reasons for rejecting alternatives: The proposed draft calendars were modeled on previous calendars, with post-pandemic consideration for added student and staff breaks and PD spread throughout the year. It continues to address the historically key items most people want to see in a calendar – a continued week off for Thanksgiving and ending the school year before June.

Additionally, the 2023-2024 calendar is contingent upon the state renewing the district's District of Innovation status to allow for an early start to the school year than the fourth Monday in August.

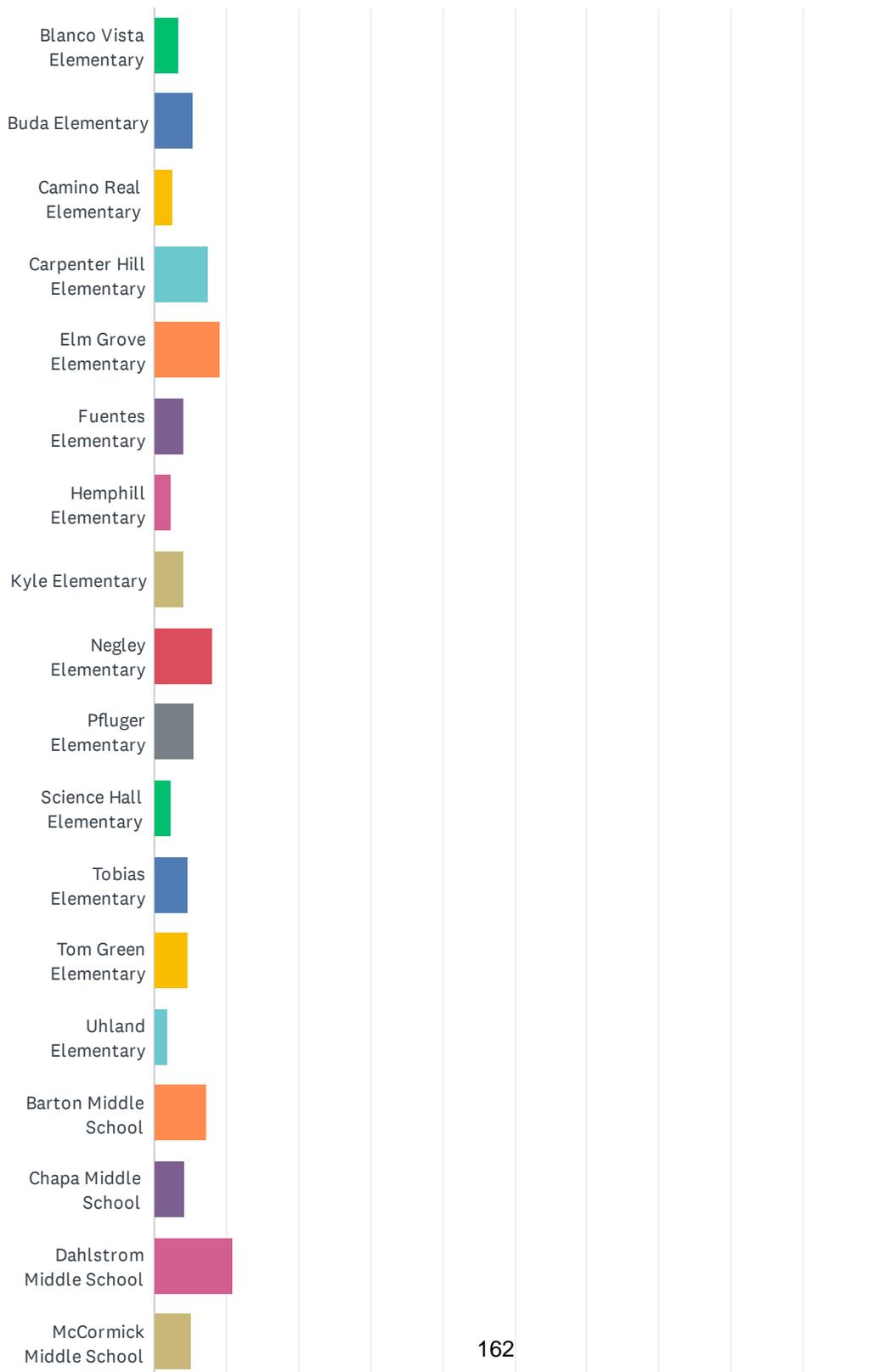

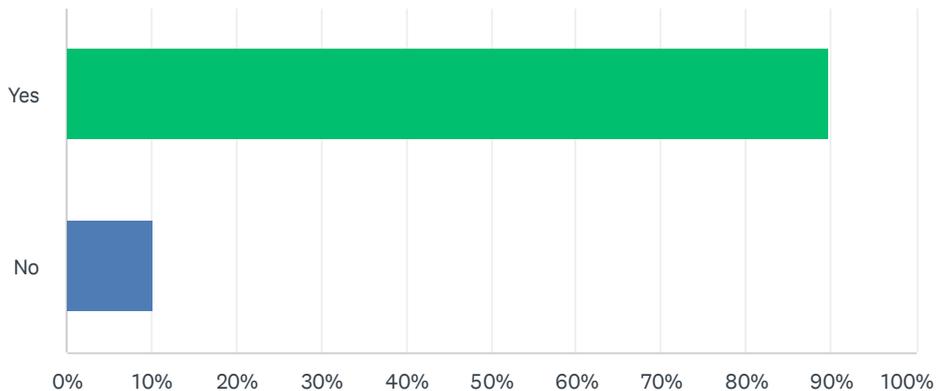

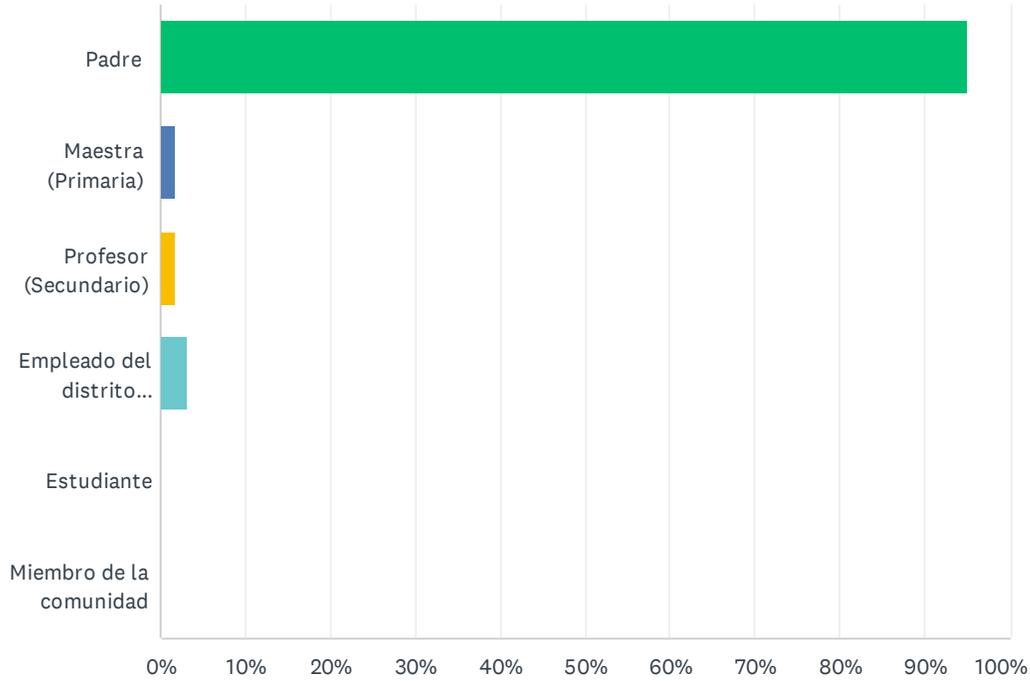

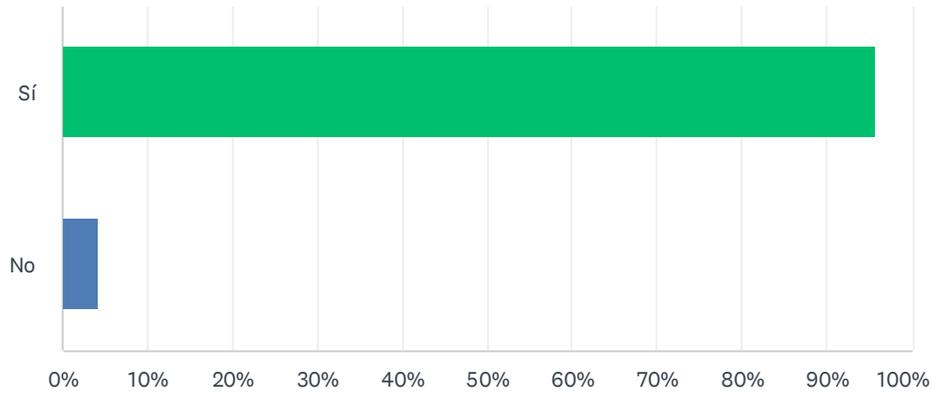

Based on existing statutory wording, a contract employee's resignation effective at the end of the school year and in the middle of the year must be filed with the Board of Trustees or the Board's designee, and the Board's designee, typically the Superintendent, may not further delegate the ability to receive these resignations. As a result, administration recommends revising the policy language by way of Board Action to give the Superintendent, Chief Human Resources Officer, Deputy Human Resource Officer, and Director of Talent Acquisition the authority to receive and accept certain resignations. A supervisor who has not been designated by the Board to receive or accept such resignations shall instruct the employee to submit the resignation to the Board designees.

Background information – In 2021-2022, Hays CISD and districts throughout the country have experienced staffing shortages. An effective strategy to mitigate staffing shortages is to implement early hiring practices such as providing candidates with “Intent to Hire” letters that communicate the district’s commitment to employ them, thus securing individuals to our district early on. While in ordinary times, it is customary to engage in early hiring within high need areas such as bilingual, special education, etc., we have come to recognize the need to intensify recruiting and early hiring in ALL areas. Universities and teacher preparation programs have communicated that they are experiencing less student interest in the teaching profession and that districts should anticipate higher than normal staffing shortages in the future.

To create a greater likelihood of securing and retaining teachers in high need content areas and campuses who will be in even greater demand, districts often implement monetary incentives. Hays CISD has identified high need content areas as bilingual (including SpEd and general education), Dyslexia, Speech Language Pathologist, and Licensed Specialist in School Psychology. Human Resources request board approval to hire a projected increase in allocations in the following areas:

Bilingual – increase of 6

Dyslexia – increase of 3

Speech Language Pathologist – increase of 6

Licensed Specialist in School Psychology – increase of 6

The approximate cost is \$1.5M. Human Resources will continue to monitor the need for additional allocations.

Hays CISD has identified the need to support teacher hiring and retention at the following high need elementary and secondary campuses: Camino Real ES, Uhland ES, Hemphill ES, Simon Middle School (Core Content Areas), and Lehman High School (EOC, Social Studies, and Dual Certified SpEd). Teachers (new and returning) will receive the incentive. Human Resources will continue to monitor to determine other potential high need campuses.

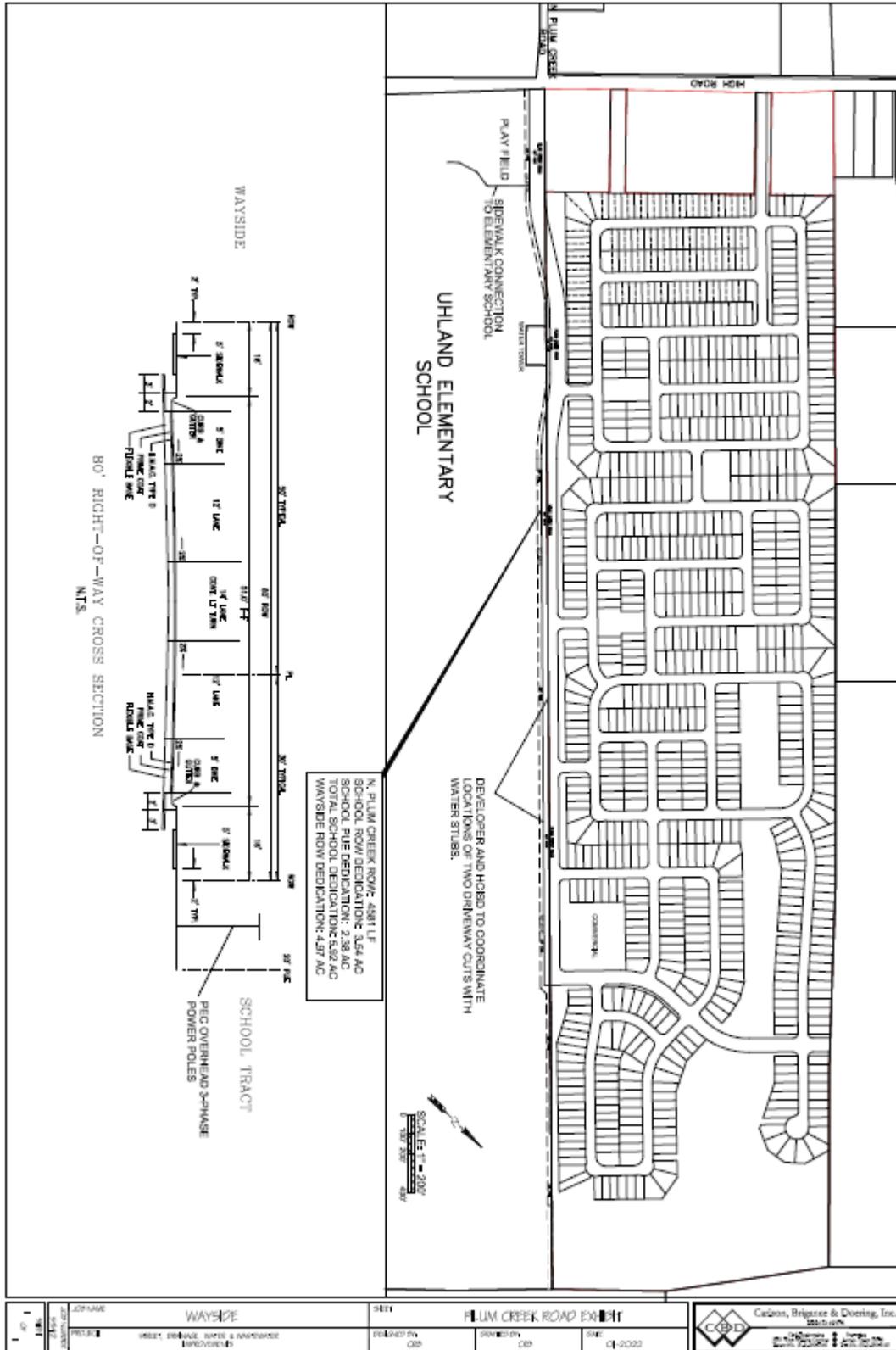

TERM: The easement shall remain in full force and effect for so long as Grantee or Grantee's assigns shall use the Easement Property for purposes of providing public utility systems, and for one year thereafter, following which the property shall automatically revert to Grantor.

ASSIGNMENT: The easement may not be assigned, in whole or in part, by Grantee, except to another governmental unit, or with the express, written consent of Grantor.

ACCESS: Grantee shall have the right of ingress and egress at all times upon Easement Property for the above stated purposes. In the event immediate access to the Easement Property is not reasonably available over the Easement Property, and only in that event, then Grantee shall have the right of ingress and egress over existing roads across the adjacent property of Grantor for the purpose of obtaining such access. Grantor agrees that Grantor shall not place any structure in or on the permanent Easement Property without written approval of Grantee.

RIGHT OF REENTRY: As additional consideration for the conveyance contained herein, Grantee does covenant and agree that if the Easement Property is not used for the delivery of at least one utility service by the second anniversary of the execution of this instrument, Grantor shall have the right to reenter and reclaim said easement property free and clear of this Easement. Grantee may request that Grantor execute a document declaring that the requirement of use for utility service has been satisfied upon a showing that the Easement Property is, prior to reentry by Grantor, being used for the purpose set forth herein by at least one public utility provider.

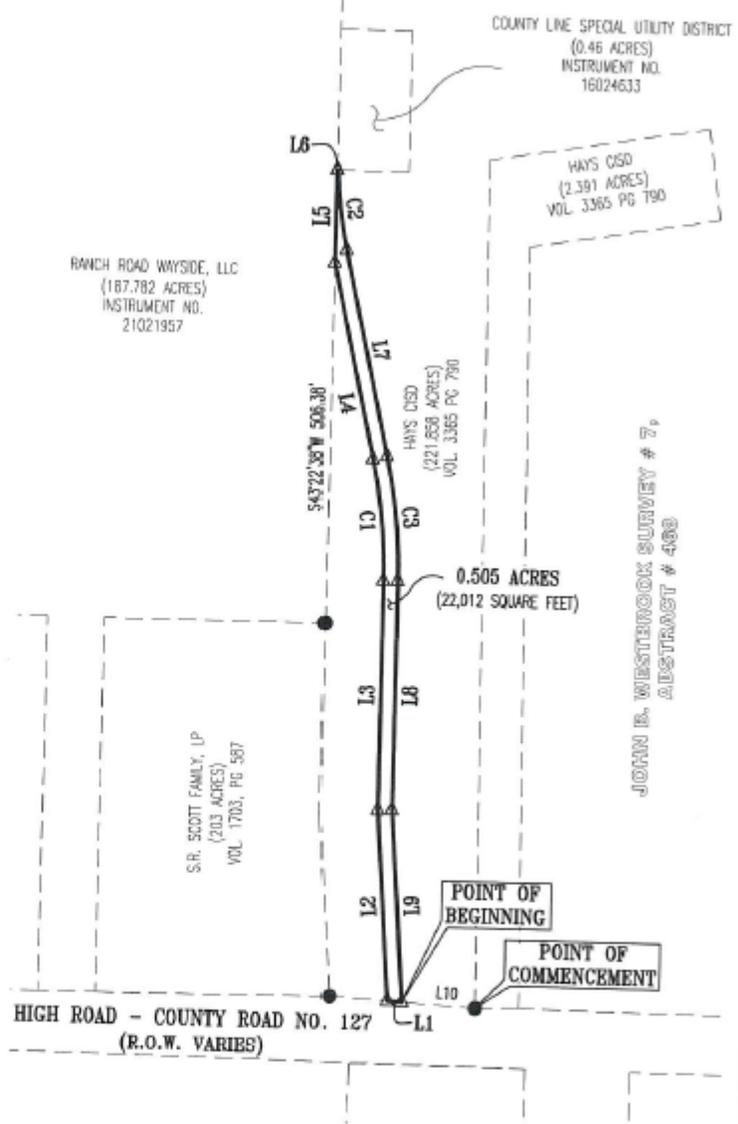

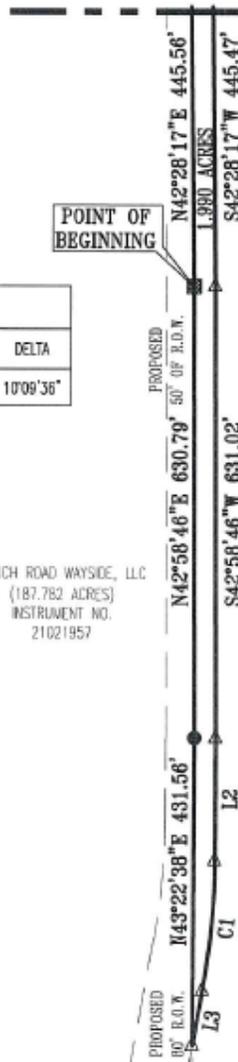

Monthly Financial Highlights

- The monthly Financial Reports represent financial data through December 31, 2021.
- The cash and investment balances of all funds at month end totals \$248,047,373.62. The Capital Projects Funds make up the largest portion of the total with \$113,063,025.28 or roughly 45.58%.
- Through the end of the month (6/12 or 50.00% of the budget year):
 - The General Fund has collected \$112,913,116.5 (55.55% of its budgeted revenue) and has spent \$98,024,627.13 (46.62% of its budgeted expenditures). The *estimated* ending fund balance through the month of December 2021 is \$86,643,366.26.
 - The Child Nutrition fund has collected \$6,028,968.05 (52.99% of its budgeted revenue) and has spent \$4,085,846.42 (35.91% of its budgeted expenditures).
 - The Debt Service fund collected \$36,426,593.54 (63.51% of its budgeted revenue) and spent \$21,638,074.13 (37.72% of its budgeted expenditures). Debt service payments are made two times a year, February 15th and August 15th.
 - The Capital Project funds have expenditures of \$26,163,757.10 in the current fiscal year through the month of December 2021 and have collected \$30,807.84 in interest revenue. The 2021 bonds were sold in late August 2021 in the amount of \$125,000,000 and are categorized as “other sources”.
- Special Revenue funds consist of Federal, State, and local grants received by the District. Some of these grants such as Title I and IDEA are non-competitive federal grants which the District receives based on certain types of student populations reported through PEIMS. Other local grants are “competitive grants” and are awarded based on demonstrated needs. This group of funds also includes the Textbook (IMA) and awarded Education Foundation funds. Total revenue is \$11,696,293.99 and total expenditures are \$10,599,788.79.
- Current Tax collections for the month of December 2021 totaled \$90,392,501.61 representing 59.29% of the levy collected during the month. Approximately 64.87% of the total levy has been collected through the end of December 2021. In comparison, 55.81% of the total levy was collected through the end of December 2020.

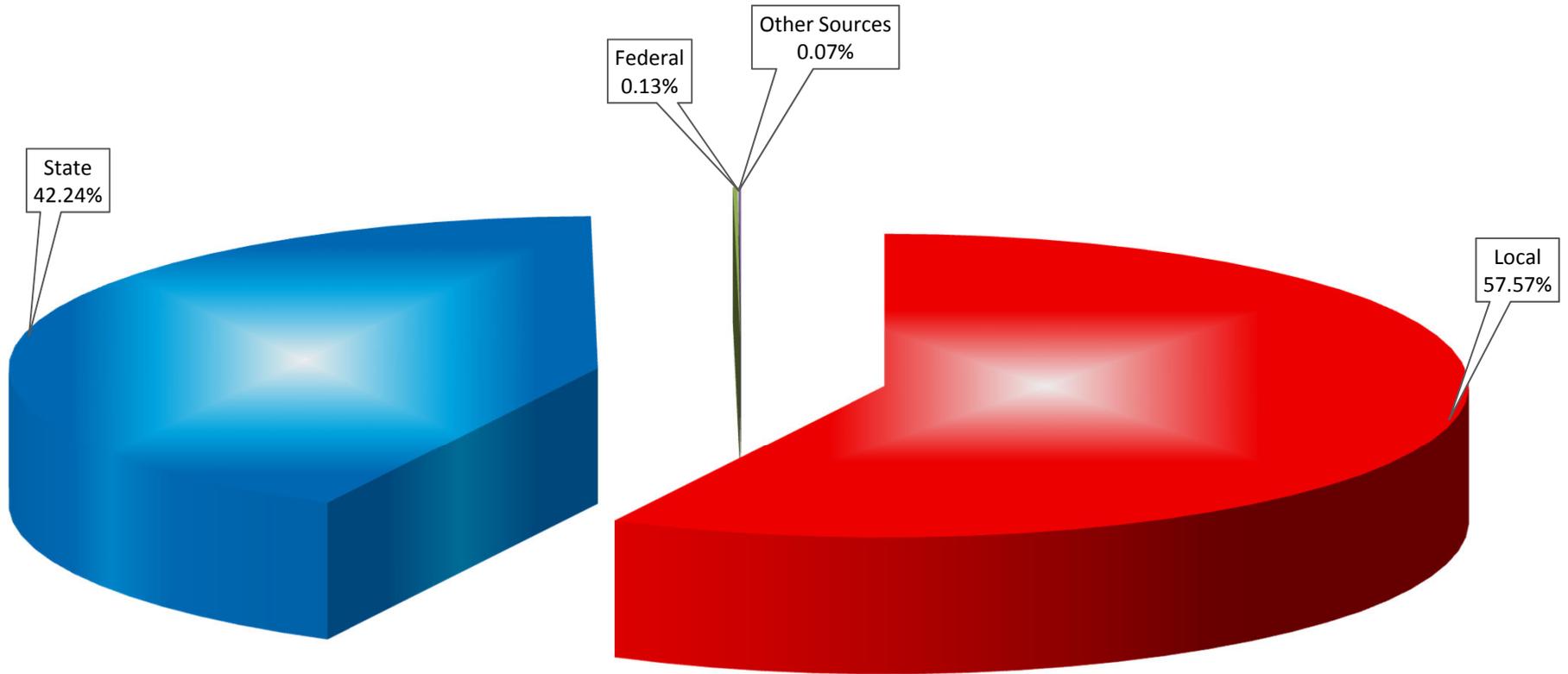

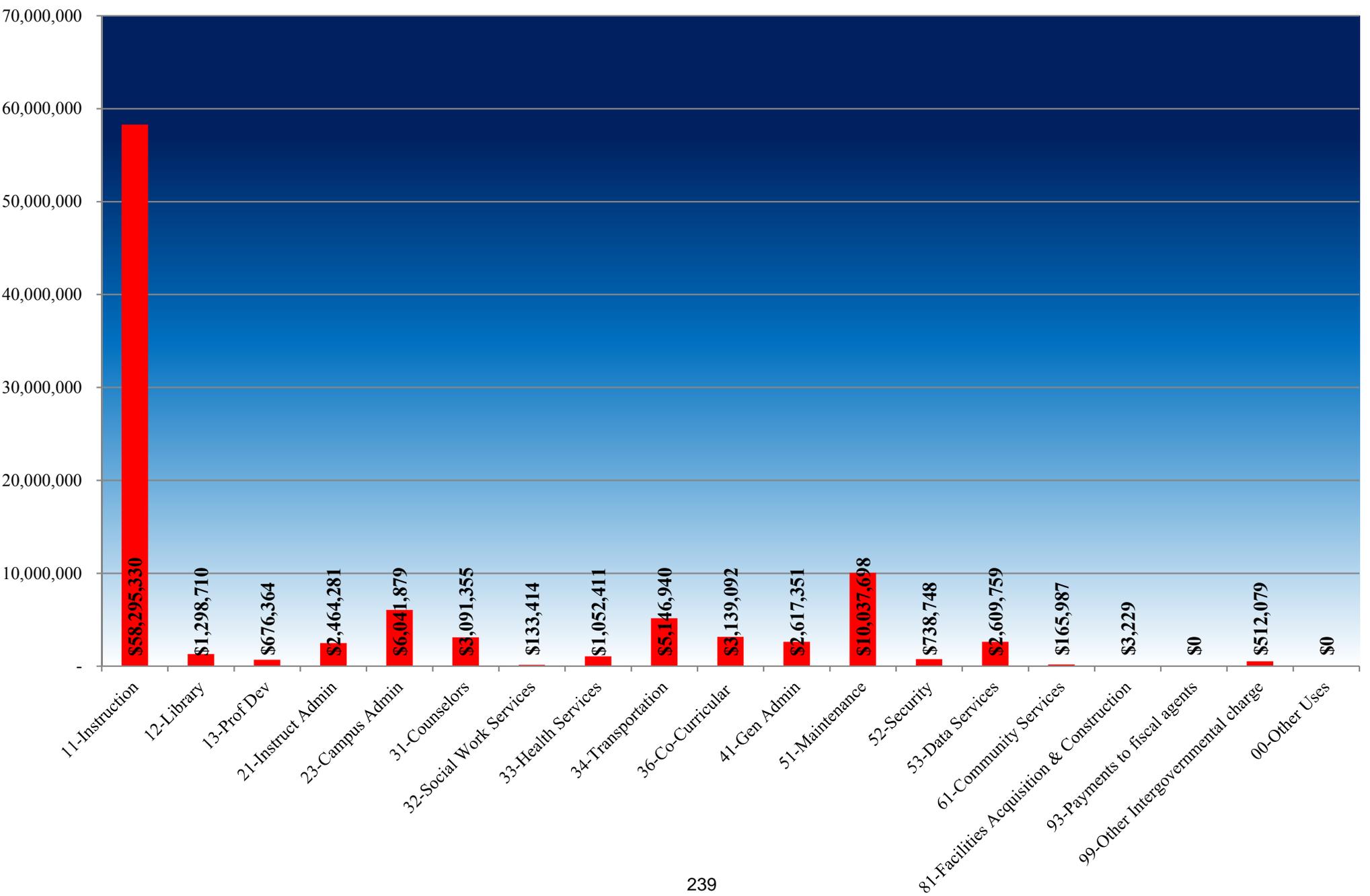

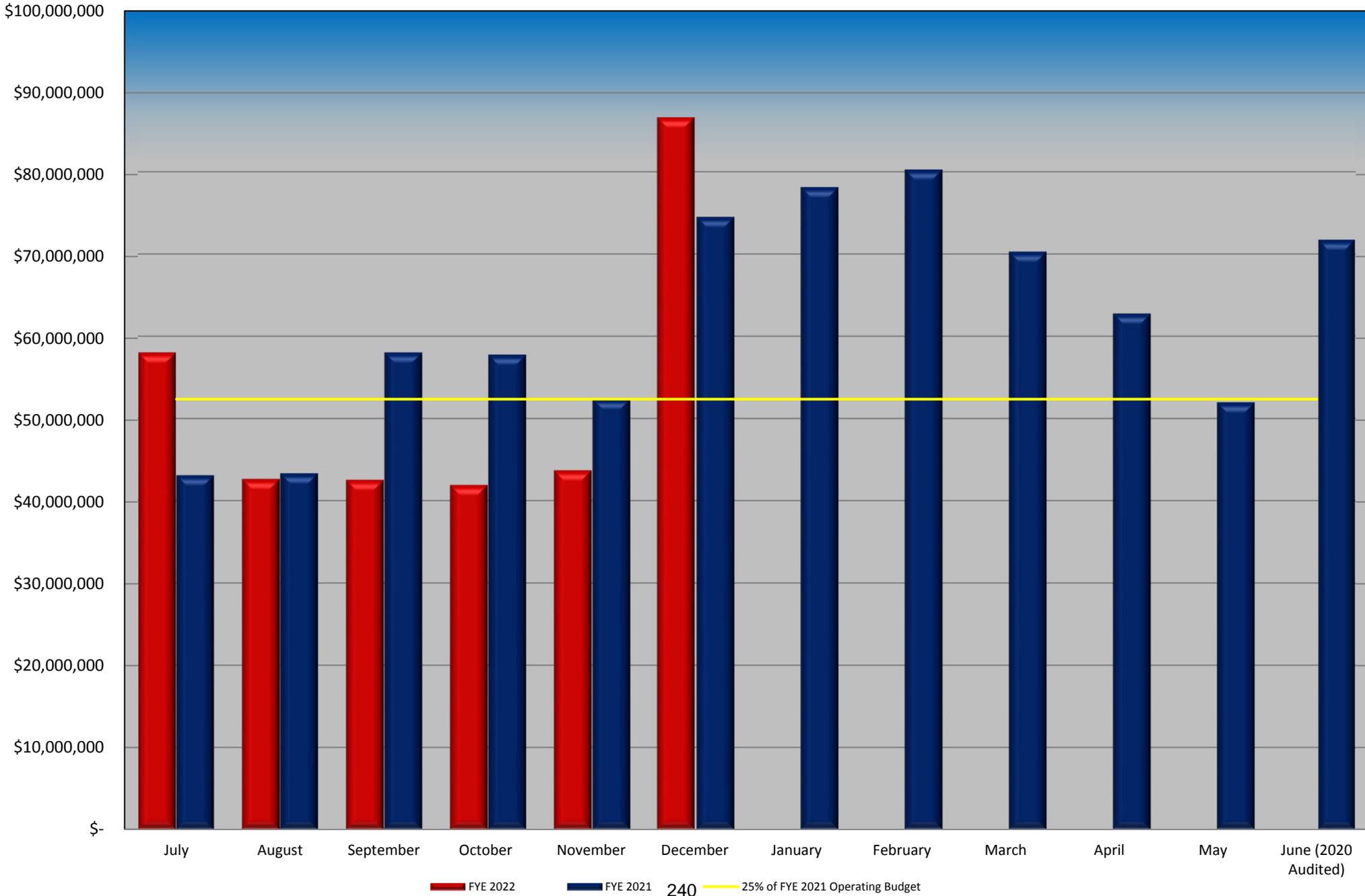
General Fund Revenues Collected to Date

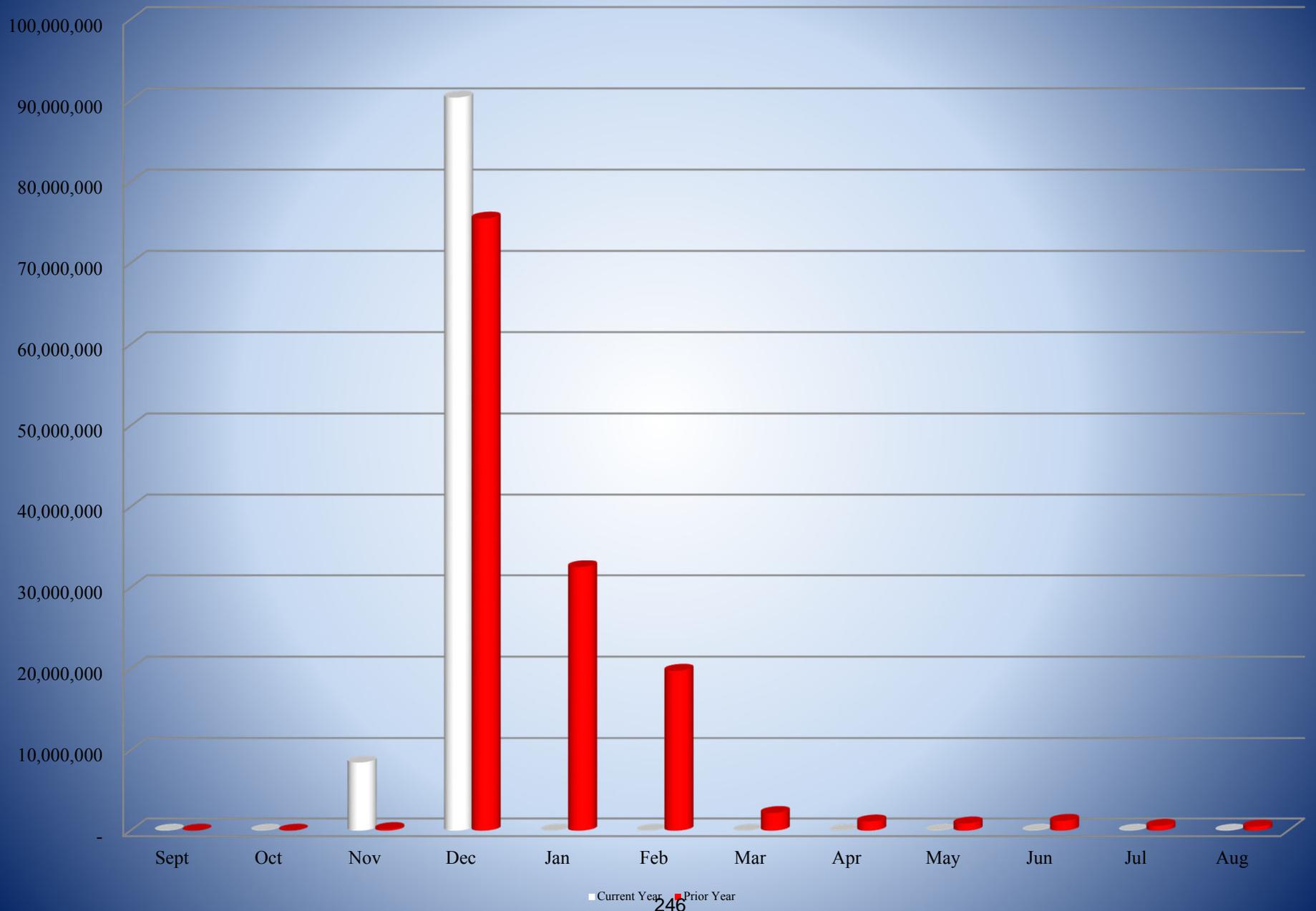

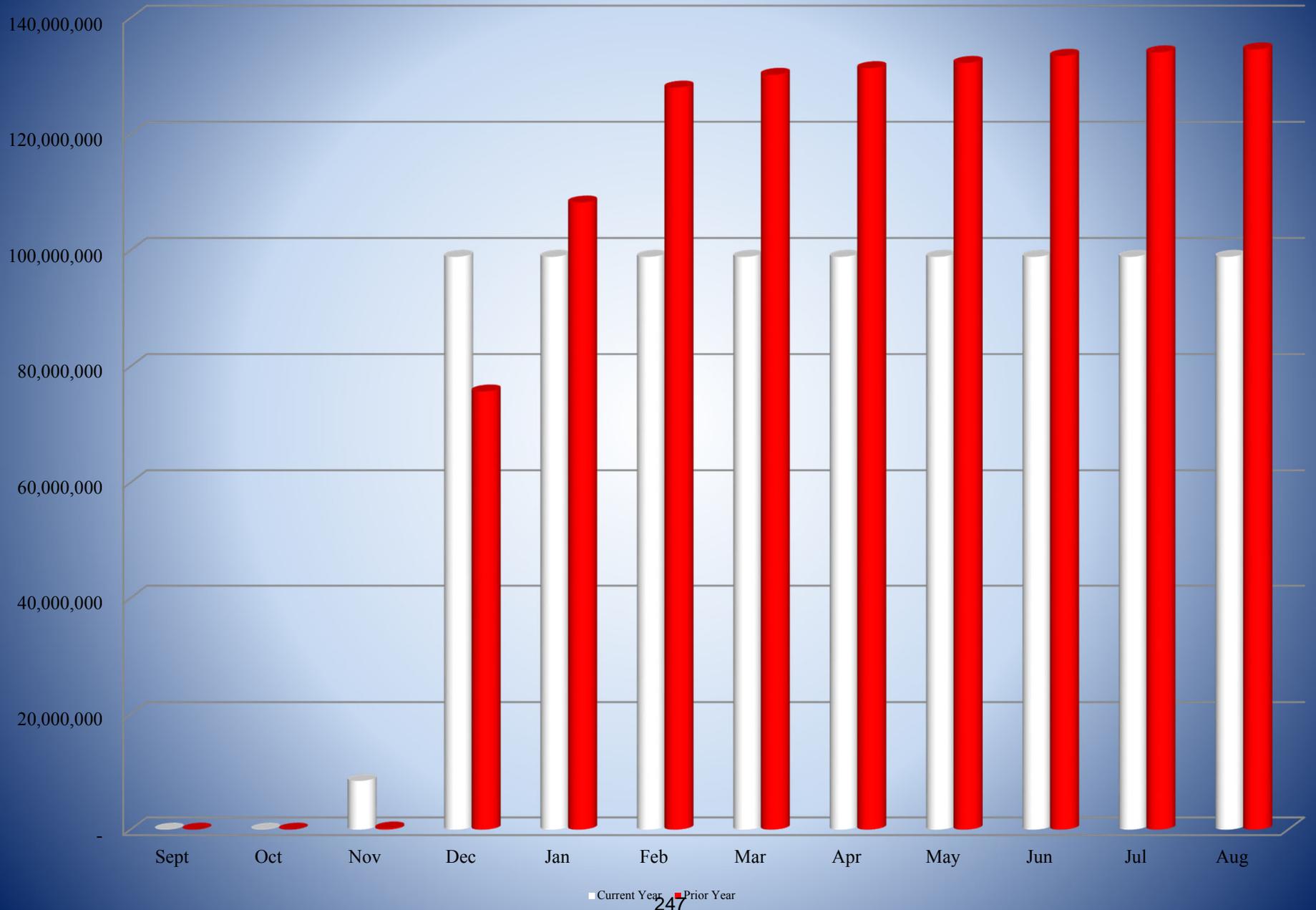

Board of Trustees Operating Procedures



Board Meetings

While Board Meetings are for the purpose of the Board conducting the business of the District in public, they are not public forums for the purpose of securing interaction with the public.

Developing the Board Meeting Agenda (Ref Policy BE)

- ▶ Agendas
 - The Superintendent will develop all Board Meeting agendas in collaboration with the Board President.
 - Items discussed at previous Board Meetings which are proposed for inclusion by more than one board member at a future meeting will also be added when appropriate.
 - Board Members must request to the Board President and Superintendent in writing, any item(s) they wish to have considered for placement on the agenda.
 - Items may be placed on the agenda by the Superintendent, the Board President, any Board Member with approval of the President, or through a request by any two Board Members.
 - No item can be placed on the agenda less than ten days in advance of the meeting without the Board President's approval.
 - No item can be placed on the agenda less than three work days in advance of the meeting unless an emergency or public necessity exists.
 - The complete agenda will be reviewed by the Superintendent and the Board President the Tuesday afternoon prior to the Agenda Workshop Meeting.
 - An annual agenda content calendar will be maintained by the Superintendent's office. This will be used to determine the minimum routine items that need to be on each regular meeting agenda. Other items can be added as requested following the procedures above and as noted in the minutes of previous Board Meetings. At, or close to the beginning of each school year, this agenda content calendar, including references to impacted policies and performance goals, will be presented to the Board at an agenda workshop meeting for Board review.
 - Board Members will adhere to deadlines and parameters of the Board agenda/event calendar.

- ▶ Timely Notification and Information
 - Board Members shall be notified of a meeting at least 72 hours prior to a regular meeting, workshop or special meeting, and at least one hour prior to an emergency meeting.
 - Typically, information will be provided to each Board Member via electronic or hard copy delivery. Questions regarding supporting documents should be directed to the Superintendent, or a member of the Superintendent's Cabinet, with a copy to the Administrative Assistant to the Superintendent.

- Copies of the agenda, for non-emergency meetings, shall be available for the Board Members requesting a copy no later than 5:00 p.m. on Wednesday prior to the Agenda Workshop Meeting.
 - Board members will attempt to have all questions regarding agenda items submitted to the Superintendent by 5:00 p.m. on Friday prior to the Board Agenda Workshop Meeting. The Superintendent and his Cabinet will make every attempt to communicate the answers to the questions to Board Members prior to the Monday meeting with a copy of the questions and answers included in the dais folders.
- ▶ Open and Closed Session Format
- Every Board Meeting will begin at the designated posted time and reconvene at the posted time.
 - Closed Session items for which there is a corresponding action item to be considered during the Open Session of the meeting will be scheduled prior to the beginning of the Open Session. The Board President and Superintendent shall, to the extent possible, allocate sufficient time to complete Closed Session discussion prior to the beginning of the Open Session.
 - If more Closed Session discussion is needed, the Presiding Officer shall announce that it is necessary for the Board to reconvene in Closed Session.
 - The Presiding Officer shall state publicly that any action, if taken, will be conducted in Open Session following the Public Comment portion of the meeting; or, if appropriate, that no action will then be taken.
- ▶ Consent Agenda
- The consent agenda includes items of routine and/or recurring nature, grouped together under one action item.
 - The consent agenda shall be limited to:
 - > Routine Personnel
 - > Minutes
 - > Budget Amendments
 - > Routine Contracts/Agreements
 - > Routine Procurements
 - > Acceptance of Gifts
 - > Acceptance of Grants
 - > Other items agreed to by the Board
 - Background material for each consent agenda item shall be furnished to the Board in the meeting's supporting documents.
 - All consent agenda items shall be acted upon by one vote without separate discussion.
 - A Board Member may request that an item be withdrawn for individual consideration.
- ▶ Meeting Dates
- The Superintendent and Board will develop a Board calendar that will include regular and workshop meeting dates of the Board of Trustees and the Board shall vote on the calendar annually.

- The calendar will include those items that are cyclical and/or recurring for consideration at regular or workshop meetings.

Conducting Board Meetings

▶ Quorum

- Attendance at Meetings - Whenever a Board Member will be late to, or absent from, a meeting or workshop, the Board Member must notify the Board President and the Superintendent's Secretary of the absence or the anticipated time of arrival to the meeting or workshop.
- Any time four or more Board Members are gathered to discuss school district business, it is considered a meeting, and must be posted as such according to Board legal policy.

▶ Closed Sessions

- The Board may meet in Closed Session as provided for in the Texas Open Meetings Act, Government Code, Chapter 551, Subchapters D and E.
- Before any Closed Session is convened, the Presiding Officer will announce publicly, as appropriate, that matters before the Board exist that necessitate convening into Closed Session to serve and protect the interests of the District, and that any action, if necessary, resulting from duly posted Closed Session items shall be conducted in Open Session. The Presiding Officer will also announce the specific sections of the Texas Government Code under which the Board will be meeting in closed session.
- The posted agenda shall identify the section or sections of the Act authorizing the Closed Session and the general topics or subjects to be discussed. The Presiding Officer of the Board shall publicly identify such section or sections and such topics and subjects.
- The Superintendent shall attend all sessions of the Board, both Open and Closed, except when the Board desires to meet without the Superintendent to consider the Superintendent's contract, evaluation or performance, or to resolve conflicts between individual Board Members, or to act as a tribunal.
- In the event of the Superintendent's illness or Board approved absence, the Superintendent's designee shall attend such meetings.

▶ Public Participation at Board Meetings

- The Board shall provide for public comment at each meeting, including all regular and special meetings. (Ref Policy BED)
- Prior to the beginning of the Public Forum, the Presiding Officer will announce the rules for public participation.
- A citizen must sign up on the appropriate form prior to the Public Forum portion of the agenda. The topic described on the form may be complete and in sufficient detail as to determine appropriateness of the topic prior to addressing the Board. Comments on posted agenda items may be taken first. Comments on non-agenda items may be permitted only after all agenda-specific comments have been made and if time permits.

- Public comments may be on items listed on the agenda or other areas of school district operations. Speakers with specific complaints or comments about identifiable students, employees, or officials of the District will be directed to the appropriate District administrator and/or the District's formal complaint process. Speakers shall be discouraged from using the names of specific individuals in their public comments.
 - Questions asked during Public Forum on posted agenda items may be answered or addressed by the Board during the discussion of that agenda item. Comments or questions on topics not on the posted agenda may be referred to the Superintendent for consideration and a later response, if appropriate.
 - The Presiding Officer shall determine the time limitation for each speaker, based on the number of individuals signed up to speak in Public Forum at the entrance prior to reconvening in open session. The time allotted to each speaker shall not exceed five minutes. Groups of five or more people wishing to speak on a single subject will be encouraged to appoint a spokesperson to express the views of the group. A speaker may not defer his/her allotted time to another speaker.
 - The Presiding Officer shall determine the total allotment of time for each Public Forum, based on the number of individuals signed up to speak at the start of each meeting. The standard time allotted for Public Forum shall be a total of 30 minutes.
 - The Board vests in its Presiding Officer the authority to terminate the remarks of any individual when such individual does not adhere to the established rules.
 - The Board shall not tolerate disruption of the meeting by members of the audience. If any person disrupts the meeting by his or her words or actions, the Presiding Officer may request assistance from law enforcement officials to have the person removed from the meeting.
- ▶ Board Meeting Parliamentary Procedure (Ref Policy BE)
- The Board President serves as the Presiding Officer at Board Meetings. In the absence of the President, the Vice-President will preside.
 - The Board shall be guided by parliamentary procedure as detailed in Robert's Rules of Order, for Small Boards and Committees, or as spelled out in adopted procedure.
 - The Board President has the responsibility to keep the discussion to the motion at hand and shall halt discussion that does not apply to the business before the Board.
- ▶ Transacting Business (Ref Policy BBE)
- When an agenda item is presented, a discussion shall be held and a decision reached through voting in accordance with prescribed procedures.
 - Whenever possible, the Board should work toward a consensus model of decision-making. There may be dissenting votes which are a matter of record. However, once a decision has been made, all Board Members should support the majority vote of the Board, recognize that it carries the full authority of the Board, and individually respect that vote.
 - Whenever possible, board members are strongly encouraged to state reason why they are abstaining or voting no on an item.

- ▶ Hearings (Ref Policy FNG, FOD, DGBA, GF)
 - Employee, community and/or student/parent grievances will be handled according to Board policy FNG, FOD, DGBA, GF.

Board Workshops

The Board will conduct Special Meetings/Board Workshops as needed.

- ▶ The workshop format is intended to allow the Administration to present information to the Board that is:
 - Time sensitive and/or discussion intensive
 - Required by law, rule or policy, and
 - Is necessary for the efficient and effective operation of the District
- ▶ Board workshops are not intended to substitute for regular monthly Board Business Meetings, although a quorum of the Board may take action, as necessary.
- ▶ The workshops are intended to allow an opportunity for presentation, questions, discussion and an assessment of the Board's perspective.
- ▶ The Board President serves as the Presiding Officer at Board Workshops; however, it is understood that the intended nature and format of workshops allows for the Superintendent to substantially facilitate the presentation and ordering of items under consideration. In the absence of the President, the Vice-President will preside.

Board Committees (Ref Policy BDB)

- ▶ The Board may, from time to time as it deems necessary, create committees to facilitate the efficient and necessary operation of the Board.
- ▶ The President shall appoint members to special Board committees, and the Board President and the Superintendent shall be ex officio members of all Board committees unless otherwise provided by Board action.

District- and Campus-Level Committees

- ▶ District- and campus-level planning and decision-making committees serve in an advisory capacity to the Board and make recommendations to the Board for final Board action; therefore, Board Members shall not serve on or attend such committees, except the Board and Superintendent Student Advisory Panel, unless otherwise provided by federal or state law, or approved by the Board

Electing Board Officers (Ref Policy BDAA)

- ▶ At the first meeting after each election and qualification of Board members, the members of the Board shall organize by selecting:
 1. A president, who shall be a member of the Board – Presides as chair over meetings.

2. A vice president, who shall be a member of the Board – Fills in as chair if President unable to attend or chair meeting
3. A secretary, who may or may not be a member of the Board – Records requests for information from trustees.
4. Such other officers and committees as the Board may deem necessary
Education Code 11.061(c).

- ▶ A vacancy among officers of the Board shall be filled by majority action of the Board.

ANNUAL EVALUATIONS

Superintendent Evaluation (Ref Policy BJCD, BJCF, BJA)

- ▶ The Superintendent evaluation instrument will be updated and approved annually in conjunction with the adoption of the Board and Superintendent Goals.
- ▶ Three formative evaluations may be conducted annually in closed sessions at the Board Agenda Workshops. The suggested dates of these evaluations are the Agenda Workshops in February, August and November, or as close to those months as possible. New Board members will receive training on how to evaluate the superintendent prior to the first formative dialogue session.
- ▶ A summative evaluation will be conducted in closed session annually in May.
 - This closed session shall be on a date separate from the regular monthly Board Agenda Workshop or Board Meeting.
 - This session may include a discussion of the Superintendent's contract.
- ▶ The Board will use the approved evaluation instrument for the summative evaluation. A copy of the evaluation document will be completed in advance by each Board Member and brought with the Board Member to a special closed session meeting. After coming to a consensus on each evaluated item, the Board shall prepare a single composite Summative Evaluation Document to be given to the Superintendent for discussion during that closed meeting.
- ▶ The Board shall strive to accomplish the following objectives during each evaluation.
 - Develop and sustain a harmonious working relationship between the Board and the Superintendent.
 - Ensure administrative leadership for excellence in the District.
 - Formulate Board consensus about the Superintendent's performance and the District's progress toward achieving its goals and objectives.

Board Evaluation/Team Building

- ▶ There will be a routine assessment of the status of the Board/Superintendent team annually as required by law.

- ▶ The evaluation and team building process may include:
 - Board operating procedures
 - Board Member training
 - Social Contract
 - Conflict resolution
 - Working relationships with the Superintendent
 - Long-range planning and goal setting
 - Relationship with the community

INDIVIDUAL BOARD MEMBERS

Access to Information (Ref Policy BBE)

- ▶ An individual Board Member, acting in his or her official capacity, shall have the right to seek information pertaining to District fiscal affairs, business transactions, governance, and personnel matters, including information that properly may be withheld from members of the general public in accordance with the Public Information Chapter of the Government Code.
- ▶ Individual Board Members shall not have access to confidential student records, unless there is a legitimate educational interest in the records in accordance with policies FL (LEGAL) and (LOCAL).
- ▶ A Board Member may request existing information and reports from the Superintendent's office. If the information is not available or a new report must be generated, it shall be requested through the Board President. If the Board President does not agree to the request, it may be resubmitted to the Board President by two or more Trustees. In case of emergency, the Board President may request information or reports.
- ▶ Board Member inquiries of staff shall be limited to Superintendent's Cabinet and responses will be distributed to all Board Members.

Communication with Other Board Members

- ▶ Board electronic and written communications regarding District issues should be routed through the Superintendent's office so that information can be disseminated and/or questions can be addressed in this manner, rather than among and between Board Members.
- ▶ A Board Member may discuss a District issue with no more than two other Board Members unless in a duly posted Board Meeting.

Communication with the Media

- ▶ The Board President serves as the official spokesperson for the Board team to the media/press on issues of media attention.
- ▶ Media calls should be directed to Superintendent and the Chief Communication Officer as the district spokesperson.
- ▶ Board Members asked for individual comments or opinions by the media/press are to qualify those statements as being the opinion of the individual Board Member and not representative of the Board as a whole or the District.

Complaints to Board Members (Ref Policy BBE)

- ▶ Employees, students, parents or other members of the public who bring concerns or complaints to an individual Board Member for the purpose of seeking remedy or perspective shall receive guidance that reflects:
 - An understanding by each Board Member that information provided to a Board Member, in some specific situations, could cause the Board Member receiving the information to be disqualified from participating in future hearing(s) or action by the Board specific to the issue;
 - Adherence to the Board's policies (DGBA, FNG, FOD and GF) regarding complaints and grievances.
- ▶ Board Members may notify the Superintendent's office of any complaint.
- ▶ As necessary, the Superintendent or designee shall guide the complainant to the appropriate staff member.

Visits to Campuses

- ▶ Board Members are encouraged to attend any and all school events as their time permits, and to show support of school activities.
- ▶ Board Members must notify the Superintendent or designee prior to visiting a campus in an official capacity.
- ▶ Board Members shall not visit a campus in an attempt to evaluate.

Board Member Training (Ref Policy BBD)

- ▶ Board Members are required to attend training set forth in Policy BBD. In addition to the orientation and team building training, a Board Member shall receive additional continuing education on an annual basis, in fulfillment of assessed needs and based on the framework for governance leadership. At a minimum, the district will cover the cost of registration, travel and lodging for each Board Member for the minimum number of hours shown on the *Continuing Education Requirements for School Board*

Members as published on the TASB website (with the exception of the 2021 TASA/TASB Convention). All costs for additional training will be the responsibility of the individual Board Member, unless otherwise agreed to by the Board

- ▶ Board memberships to any and all associations shall be brought to the Board for discussion and approval.
