IV. 2022 - 2023 DISTRICT GOALS/GUARDRAILS (CHECK ALL THAT APPLY)

- Improve Reading and Writing Outcomes for all Students** - We will increase the percentage of all students who are Meets grade level in reading across all grades from 35% in August 2022, to 50% in August 2027.

NOTICE OF PUBLIC MEETING TO DISCUSS BUDGET AND PROPOSED TAX RATE

The San Antonio Independent School District will hold a public meeting at 5:30 PM, Tuesday, June 20, 2023 in the Central Office Board Room, 1st Floor, 514 W. Quincy St., San Antonio, Texas 78212. **The purpose of this meeting is to discuss the school district's budget that will determine the tax rate that will be adopted. Public participation in the discussion is invited.**

The tax rate that is ultimately adopted at this meeting or at a separate meeting at a later date may not exceed the proposed rate shown below unless the district publishes a revised notice containing the same information and comparisons set out below and holds another public meeting to discuss the revised notice.

The 86th Texas Legislature modified the manner in which the voter-approved tax rate is calculated to limit the rate of growth of property taxes in the state.

*The Interest & Sinking Fund tax revenue is used to pay for bonded indebtedness on construction, equipment, or both. The bonds, and the tax rate necessary to pay those bonds, were approved by the voters of this district.

Under state law, the dollar amount of school taxes imposed on the residence homestead of a person 65 years of age or older or of the surviving spouse of such a person, if the surviving spouse was 55 years of age or older when the person died, may not be increased above the amount paid in the first year after the person turned 65, regardless of changes in tax rate or property value.

Notice of Voter-Approval Rate: The highest tax rate the district can adopt before requiring voter approval at an election is \$1.38362. This election will be automatically held if the district adopts a rate in excess of the voter-approval rate of \$1.38362.

The following estimated balances will remain at the end of the current fiscal year and are not encumbered with or by a corresponding debt obligation, less estimated funds necessary for operating the district before receipt of the first state aid payment:

A school district may not increase the district's maintenance and operations tax rate to create a surplus in maintenance and operations tax revenue for the purpose of paying the district's debt service.
