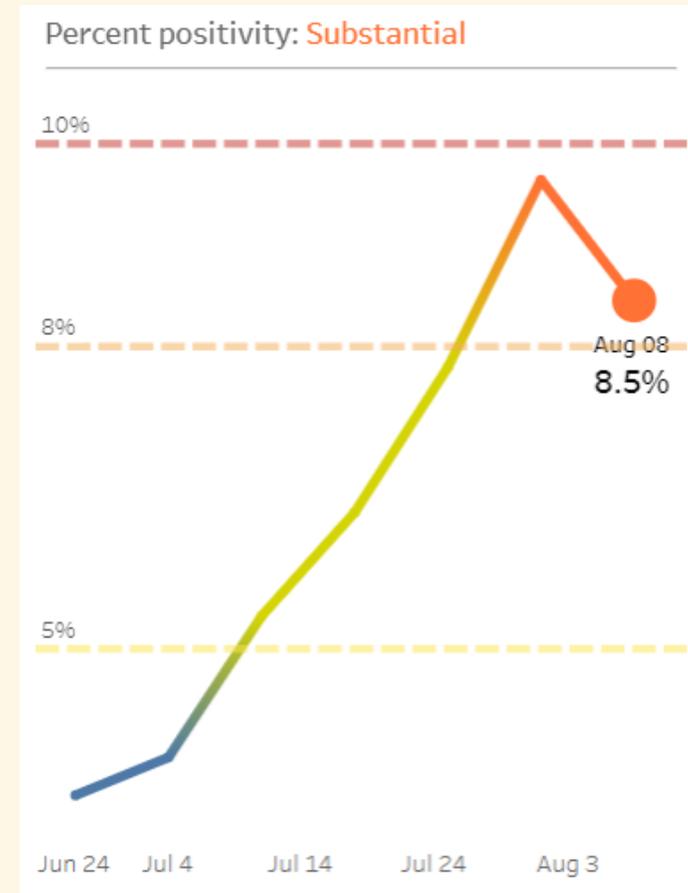

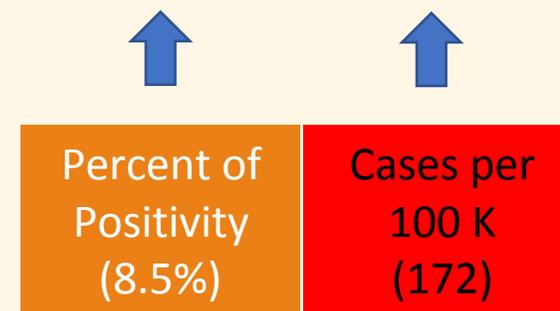

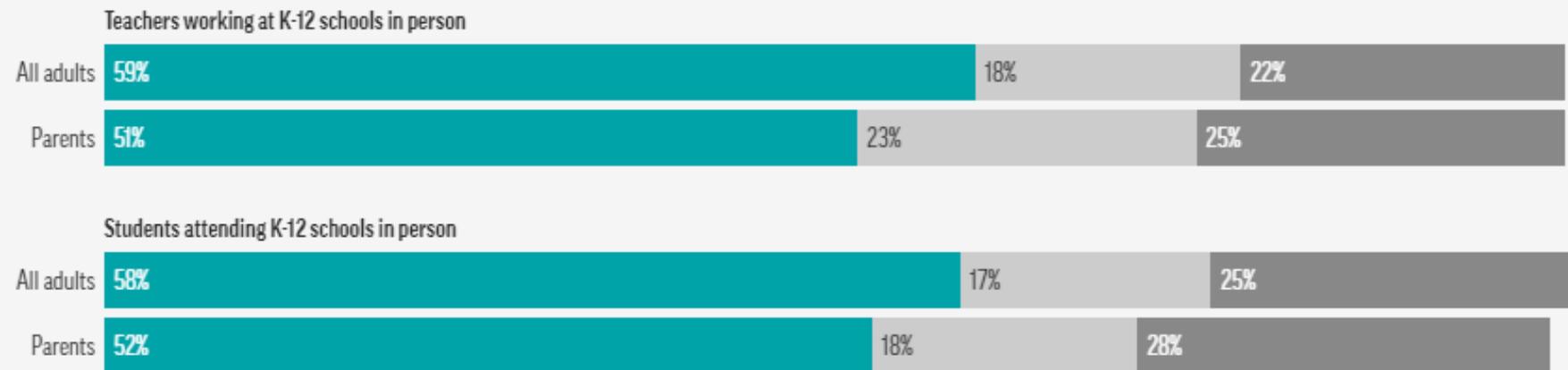
# Masks: A Point of Controversy

## About 6 in 10 Americans favor requiring K-12 teachers, students to wear masks

The science around the use of masks by the public to impede COVID-19 transmission is advancing rapidly. In this narrative review, we develop an analytical framework to examine mask usage, synthesizing the relevant literature to inform multiple areas: population impact, transmission characteristics, source control, wearer protection, sociological considerations, and implementation considerations. A primary route of transmission of COVID-19 is via respiratory particles, and it is known to be transmissible from presymptomatic, paucisymptomatic, and asymptomatic individuals. Reducing disease spread requires two things: limiting contacts of infected individuals via physical distancing and other measures and reducing the transmission probability per contact. Public mask wearing is most effective at reducing spread of the virus when the current form of source control is less effective. Because many respiratory particles in both laboratory and real-world settings are smaller than the size of a human hair, we recommend the adoption of public mask wearing in conjunction with existing hygiene, distancing, and source control measures. Stay-at-home orders in unincorporated counties and the continued increase in cases in incorporated counties adds to the evidence supporting the effectiveness of wearing masks and implementing policies to mitigate the spread of SARS-CoV-2. Community-level mitigation strategies emphasizing physical distancing, staying at home, and practicing good hygiene practices can help reduce the spread of SARS-CoV-2.

Requiring the wearing of face coverings in public places became effective July 3, 2020. Data on the effectiveness of these orders were obtained from the Kansas Health Department. We analyzed health orders that are less stringent than the statewide executive orders. We found that counties that opted out of the state mandate had higher case rates. We considered to have been affected by the state mandate were counties that had not opted out.

# Mask Guidance



- Arizona Department of Health Services (AZDHS):

- *Wear masks in public settings.*
- *Fully vaccinated individuals are recommended to wear masks in indoor public settings where transmission is substantial or high.*



- CDC (July 27, 2021):

- *All staff and students 5 years or older should wear masks indoors unless medical or developmental conditions prohibit their use regardless of vaccination status.*
- In general, people do not need to wear masks when outdoors.



- Pima County Health Department (PCHD):

- *Fully vaccinated individuals are recommended to wear masks in indoor public settings where transmission is substantial or high.*



- SB 1824 (ARS 15-342.05), passed by legislature, created new Arizona law which prohibits school mask mandates.



- We will not violate state law, but a recent court ruling clarified this law is not yet effective and efforts to make it so were unconstitutional. (Effective Date: September 29, 2021)



- In absence of law, I feel constrained to be guided by public health guidance – not politics, not funding, not threats, not insults and vulgar slurs.





# Mitigation Measures: Quarantine & Isolation



- Amphitheater is working with PCHD on contact tracing and case investigation for positive cases and close contacts.



- What's a close contact?



- Anyone within 6 feet of an infected person for a cumulative total of 15 minutes or more over a 24-hour period.



- *Where the parties involved are wearing masks, this zone is reduced to 3 feet of distance.*<sup>20</sup>



- An infected person can spread COVID-19 starting from 2 days before they have any symptoms (or 2 days before the positive specimen collection date) until they meet criteria for discontinuing home isolation.



- Isolation and quarantine recommendations will be determined by PCHD through contact tracing and case investigation.





# Mitigation Measures: Quarantining



- A.R.S. § 36-624 enables county health departments to adopt quarantine and sanitary measures to prevent the spread of an infectious or contagious disease within their jurisdictions.



- PCHD is implementing such protocols during the current pandemic and the District is subject to the law.



- Pursuant to A.R.S. § 36-630, any person who violates such a measure is guilty of a class 3 misdemeanor.

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- Again, we will comply with the law. All laws.





# Quarantine & Isolation Public Health Order

- Unvaccinated or partially vaccinated close contacts must remain at home and be excluded from school and extra-curricular activities.
- Unvaccinated or partially vaccinated close contacts who remain asymptomatic may return on or after day seven (7) upon providing documentation of a valid negative COVID-19 test collected on or after day 5 of the quarantine.
- Close contacts who can provide documentation of a completed COVID-19 vaccination series may return to school immediately if asymptomatic.
- Individuals who are vaccinated should test for COVID-19 between day 3 and 5 of their exposure to someone who has been diagnosed with COVID-19, as well as continue to mask.

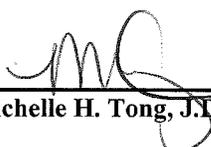

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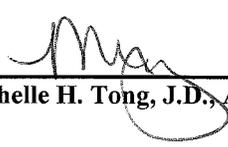

**Minutes of the Special Governing Board Meeting

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A Special public meeting of the Governing Board of Amphitheater Public Schools was held Tuesday, June 27, 2021, beginning at 5:30 p.m. at the Wetmore Center, 701 W. Wetmore Road, Tucson, AZ 85705 in the Leadership and Professional Development Center. This meeting was held under COVID-19 pandemic related conditions.

**1. CALL TO ORDER AND SIGNING OF THE VISITOR'S REGISTER**

President Zibrat called the meeting to order at 5:30 p.m. and invited members of the audience to sign the visitor's register.

**2. PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE**

President Zibrat asked Vice President Day to lead the Pledge of Allegiance.

**3. ANNOUNCEMENT OF DATE AND PLACE OF NEXT REGULAR GOVERNING BOARD MEETING**

President Zibrat announced that the next Regular Governing Board meeting would be held on Tuesday, August 10, 2021 at 6:00 p.m., at the Wetmore Center, 701 W. Wetmore Road, Tucson AZ 85705 in the Leadership and Professional Development Center.

**4. PUBLIC COMMENT<sup>1</sup>**

*President Zibrat read the Call to the Audience procedures.*

John Maynard thanked the Board members for their service, and said he has two grandchildren at Ironwood Ridge High School. He felt a quality education is important for all students, and graduates need to possess good communication and reading skills, and an understanding of basic math and science. He understood the Governing Board could not answer, but he had two questions: what is the definition of an outbreak; and what are the specific guidelines of quarantining?

Jessica Olsen said she has a student at Ironwood Ridge High School. She referenced COVID-19 mitigation information on the Amphi website that said the Pima County Health Department (PCHD) determines when a student is allowed to return to class after an exposure to an infected individual. She felt the wording was too vague and urged the Governing Board not to rely on PCHD for guidance. Ms. Olsen spoke about her concerns defining quarantining and said the Governing Board and District needs to be more specific in the definition. She concluded, saying she appreciated Mr. Jaeger's email about mask wearing that stated the District will respect the decision made by families for their children and urged everyone to be respectful also.

Nolan Reidhead said he has a student at Ironwood Ridge High School and five children that have graduated from Amphi schools. He talked about some of the topics being pushed nationally in the educational system. He encouraged the Governing Board to be vigilant with issues in the classroom concerning justice, equality and Critical Race Theory. Mr. Reidhead also urged the Governing Board to continue to follow the mask mandates issued by Governor Ducey. He thanked the Governing Board for the support of the students of Amphi and hoped the schools will continue to be "Schools of Excellence".

Jim McFadzean read a statement from Governor Ducey, addressing the new Center for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) guidelines. He quoted, (in part) "Arizona does not allow mask mandates, vaccine mandates, vaccine passports or discrimination in schools based on who is or isn't vaccinated. We've passed all of this into law, and it will not change." Mr. McFadzean continued, quoting "Public health officials in Arizona and across the country have made it clear that the best protection against COVID-19 is the vaccine". He urged the Governing Board to adhere to these policies going forward.

Darlene Rowe, a third grade teacher at Coronado K-8, said that last year even with COVID-19 protocols in place in her classroom, there was one student who tested positive. She was told the student did not contract it in the classroom. She mentioned information she has heard on the news, regarding the opening of schools. The recommendation is that students should have in-person learning, children over the age of two should wear a mask, hands should be washed frequently and students should be vaccinated when they are old enough. Ms. Rowe stated in her classroom, she will encourage families to have their students wear masks and will request parents to wear a mask when they enter her room. She urged the Governing Board to adopt a District-wide mask policy that advocates for protection.

## **5. INFORMATION<sup>2</sup>**

### **A. Superintendent's Report; Update on Pandemic Conditions and Operations**

*For the Superintendent's Report Point Presentation see Exhibit 1.*

Superintendent Jaeger began his report by highlighting some of the activities that have taken place over the summer. He said the new school year will begin on August 5, 2021, and teachers, staff and administrators have been preparing for the students. He shared some pictures of staff and administrators participating in professional development.

Superintendent Jaeger spoke about the BOOST training offered for brand new teachers, saying it has been very well received. He stated that at a future meeting, Dr. McKinney will give a detailed report about the summer trainings. He said he has received positive feedback and thanked her and all involved for their hard work.

He talked about the annual All Admin Team Retreat and thanked Board members for participating in the event. He said they are excited for the year ahead.

Superintendent Jaeger spoke about the lack of staff, saying there is a shortage of qualified applicants statewide. He commented that because of budget restraints, school districts find wage competition difficult to meet. In order to recruit more staff, the Human Resources Department held a career fair on July 14, 2021. They invited applicants for all types of jobs, including teachers, support staff, bus drivers, and counselors. Amphi staff interviewed 93 candidates in just a few hours, then followed up for more extensive interviews and to make offers. He thanked Ms. Tong, the Human Resources Department, and all the staff involved that made the event a success.

Superintendent Jaeger expressed his appreciation to Luciano Sanchez and Advance Auto Parts for donating 100 backpacks filled with school supplies to Amphi students. He said they are being distributed to students in need.

Superintendent Jaeger then updated the Board on current public health metrics. He reported that recently Pima County statistics are going in the wrong direction, and percent positivity is now in the yellow category. He commented that another metric, hospital bed capacity, has changed, and it is in the red category. He noted that Public Health Tracking and Investigation category has continued to stay in the green category, and felt confident in their ability to investigate cases as they are reported. Superintendent Jaeger shared additional data used for guidance, saying there was an increase in cases for the week of July 11, 2021, with 52 cases per 100,000 individuals testing positive for COVID-19. He said according to the Arizona Department of Health (AZDHS) standards, Pima County is now in the Substantial Transmission category and mentioned the increase in cases can be attributed to the Delta variant, which seems to spread more rapidly. Referencing the increase of cases, he stated that he did not anticipate any changes in District protocols.

Superintendent Jaeger spoke about the changes in mask regulations. He stated he rescinded the mask requirement in the District at the end of June, and on June 30, 2021 the Arizona Legislature enacted a law which prohibits any Arizona public school from mandating masks. He said as the Superintendent and a licensed attorney, he will ensure the District will comply with Arizona law. He reported since masks are recommended to help prevent the spread of the virus, the District will encourage people not vaccinated to wear masks for their own protection and for that of others. The District and staff will respect individuals' decisions under the law.

Superintendent Jaeger talked about the guidelines released today from the Center for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), recommending that fully vaccinated individuals should wear a mask in an indoor setting, particularly in areas that are in a substantial transmission category. He reiterated that the CDC guidelines are only recommendations and cannot dictate what is done in Arizona or the District, and only the legislature can make laws.

Superintendent Jaeger explained that while the Governing Board is not allowed to respond to Public Comment, however, as a District employee he may respond to clarify any misinformation. He said as he explained at a previous Governing Board meeting, the District does not teach Critical Race Theory (CRT). By law, school districts are required to implement state standards as determined by the Arizona Board of Education. The Governing Board then adopts a curriculum that aligns with the state standards, and the staff is required to implement that curriculum. He acknowledged that CRT is a topic in other parts of the country, but wanted to reassure people it is not happening in Amphitheater.

President Zibrat thanked him for his report, and asked the Governing Board members if they had any questions.

There were none.

He spoke about her many roles within the district, beginning as a Clerk and ultimately serving as Principal at Amphi High School for nine years. He said she has held multiple positions in the District for over 23 years, and with other staff promotions creating this opening at Ironwood Ridge, he felt that she was the appropriate person to step in to assist. He was personally grateful for her willingness to do so.

A picture was taken with Ms. Harris, the Governing Board, and Superintendent Jaeger to mark the occasion.

**TITLE:** Approval of Student Fee Rates Charged Pursuant to Governing Board Policy JQ, A.R.S. §15-342 (24), and A.R.S. § 15-1142

---

**BACKGROUND:**

Arizona Revised Statutes 15-342 sets forth the permissive powers of the Governing Board. Among other things, the provision allows the Governing Board to assess reasonable fees for optional extracurricular activities and programs conducted when schools are not in session. For the purposes of this provision, "extracurricular activity" means any optional, noncredit, educational or recreational activity which supplements the education program of the school, whether offered before, during or after regular school hours.

For high schools, the law also allows Governing Boards to assess fees for fine arts and vocational education courses and for optional services, equipment and materials offered to students beyond those required to successfully complete the basic requirements of any other course. No fees may ever be charged for access to or use of computers or related materials.

Fees must be adopted at a public meeting after notice has been given to all parents of students and cannot exceed the actual costs of the activities, programs, services, equipment or materials. The Governing Board must also authorize principals to waive the assessment of all or part of a fee assessed pursuant to this provision of law if it creates an economic hardship for a pupil.

Attached is a revised list of proposed District fees for the 2021-2022 school year. This list has been displayed on the Amphitheater District website for thirty days.

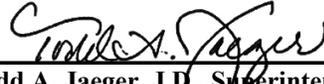
