# District Administrator's Report

December 2020

## Determining Learning Model Transitions

Unity has been making every effort to provide and return to the in-person learning model. We want our students in school, with their peers, and our educators. During the COVID pandemic, our highest priority is to keep students and staff safe and healthy. The alarming increase in the number COVID-19 cases in our school community required us to adjust our approach. We have developed and implemented the Unity Learning Model Transition Matrix to provide a framework for decision-making regarding the implementation of the different learning models. This matrix will be reviewed weekly to determine the learning model for the following week. This timeframe is to help parents with childcare decisions for longer periods of time and reduce the difficulties for students moving too frequently between learning models.

- Hybrid Learning may occur earlier in the matrix due to specific contact tracing.
- The matrix may be modified due to staff and/or substitute shortages.
- The matrix may be modified due to total attendance.
- Remote learning model may be implemented immediately due to a serious outbreak.
- The status of the LEAP Child Care Center is individually addressed.
- The source of the Polk County COVID data is the COVID-19 Case Dashboard at [www.co.polk.wi.us](http://www.co.polk.wi.us). It is the case activity positive number in the upper right hand tab, "Positivity Rate - Past 14 Day Range."
- If Polk County has "Critically High" COVID case activity, as reported by the WI DHS, the Matrix may be required to accelerate to the 4K-12 Remote Learning Model.
- The *Virtual Learning Option* will continue as an option for families throughout all learning models.

## Food Service During Remote Learning Model

Unity School District meal pick up is available through our Food Service Department when a school is in the remote learning model. Unity is offering lunch and breakfast to families who do not have students attending school in person. Meals are FREE to all kids 18 and under. Menu items are either shelf stable or need to be refrigerated/frozen. There will be cooking instructions included with pick up.

Parents/Guardians are asked to complete an order form for meal requests (one for each child). The cut off time for ordering will be 9:00 AM on Fridays for the following week meal pick up. Meal pick up will be at one of the following two locations. (Please choose the most convenient option for you). Meal pick up options will be Tuesday afternoon between noon and 1:00 PM at the High School entrance, Wednesday morning between 7:30-8:00 AM at the High School entrance or Thursday at the Round Lake Community Center from 10:30-11:00 AM. An entire week of meals (5 breakfasts and 5 lunches) will be included in the meal pack.

**Unity School District - Board of Education**  
**Administrative Rule 345.64**  
**Graduation Standards and Requirements**  
**Community Involvement**

**Requirement:**

All students must complete, on an independent basis, 40 hours of “community involvement” as part of their graduation requirement.

The earliest day for a student to begin counting the number of community involvement hours is the second week of June prior to the student’s freshman year.

**Keeping Record:**

Verification forms will be readily available in the high school office. Students will use verification forms to get signatures and phone numbers from community members for whom they are performing services. The students’ verification forms will be turned in to the High School Office.

Time tracking forms will be in order to record the number of hours for each student. Advisors will then transfer this information to the high school office so reports can be generated each quarter on report cards. This process is the responsibility of the high school principal or designee.

**Responsibilities:**

The high school principal and/or counselor will be responsible for resolving questions about the validity of community involvement projects and will be responsible for addressing community complaints about work performed by Unity students if such complaints arise.

The high school guidance counselor will post opportunities for community involvement projects.

**Criteria for Community Involvement Projects:**

A community involvement project is an “unpaid, uncompensated helpful act.” A list of possible projects will be kept updated and posted for students’ use. Students will be encouraged to think of independent projects as well. Independent projects must have prior written approval by the high school principal or the high school counselor.

Questions about the validity of community involvement projects, should they arise, will be resolved by the high school principal and/or high school counselor.

**Communications:**

The high school staff will be informed of the procedures, paperwork and timelines.

At the 8<sup>th</sup> grade orientation, information will be provided to students and parents regarding the community involvement requirement.
