Celebrating Unity's Educational Assistants

Wednesday, April 2, 2025, was Paraprofessional Day, a special occasion to recognize our educational assistants' dedication and hard work at Unity School District. These remarkable individuals play a vital role in supporting students and staff, ensuring every student receives the personalized care and attention needed to succeed academically and emotionally. Whether helping in the classroom or providing one-on-one support for students with special needs, our paraprofessionals consistently go above and beyond to make a meaningful difference in the lives of our students every day.



High School Transitions Class

On Friday, March 21st, students in the Special Education Transitions Class took a field trip to Royal Credit Union (RCU) in St. Croix Falls to tour the bank and learn about banking processes. In class, students are also learning about meal planning and budgeting.



STATE TESTING ACCOMMODATIONS

State testing, typically held from March to April, measures students' academic progress in subjects like math, reading, social studies, and science. Grades 3-8 and 10 take the Forward Test, while 9th and 10th graders take the PreACT Secure, and 11th graders take the ACT.

Accommodations are adjustments made to help students with disabilities or special needs perform their best. Examples include extra time, separate testing locations, or assistive technology. Most accommodations are part of an Individualized Education Plan (IEP) or 504 Plan.

Providing accommodations ensures all students have a fair chance to succeed on state tests.





Hello Families!

As we approach the summer break, I am excited to share details about our upcoming summer school program at Unity School District. Our summer school program is jam-packed with fun camps, outdoor learning, and educational support for all grade levels.

There will be summer school sessions June, July and August this year, Monday - Friday! In an effort to provide more course options for families, as well as to lessen the cost for families needing care for their children, the days will be schedule with a morning 8AM-1:00 PM session and an afternoon 1:00PM-4:00PM session. *Please note that dismissal runs from 3:45PM - 4:00PM.

We would love for students to attend as much as possible, but do know that in Summer School, families are welcome to attend when able. While we are offering Mon - Fri courses, it is not a problem to pick up early on Fridays, or be gone on any day(s) or week(s) your family needs for vacations, camps, etc. We want to support a full and fun summer, whatever your family tradition!

Please note that bussing this year is only offered during the larger June sessions.

Check out our enclosed calendar and read about all of our exciting course offerings.

Make sure to send your child in weather appropriate clothing and good walking shoes! Each student entering grades 1-4 will have three weeks of required swimming lessons as well, and MS students will have the option to swim, so make sure they come prepared with a suit and towel!

All students in need of additional reading support will be individually supported during summer school. They will be able to attend their choice of classes and our district reading specialist will work to arrange convenient tutoring sessions where needed. Students do not need to sign up for this and will be individually assigned and worked with during the school day.

All registration is due by Friday, May 9, 2025. Many courses have space limitations - we cannot guarantee course selections for late registrations. In cases of on-time registrations where courses may be filled, we will make every effort to provide the best programming for each child. Please feel free to reach out with any questions or concerns.


