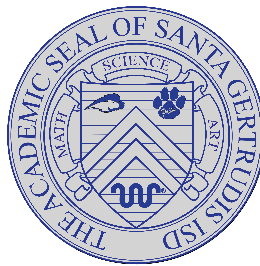

October 2022

Saturday marked the end of “Bandtober”.

On October 1st, The Band competed at the GP Tournament of Bands and won 2nd Place Drumline, 1st place Drum Majors, and 2nd place Band in 3A. We were also ranked 6th out of the 18 bands entered, beating many 4A and 5A bands.

On October 8th, The Lion Band competed at the Bay Area Marching Band Contest at Calallen HS. The Lion Band earned 2nd place in 3A. (After review of the recap sheets, the band also earned 2nd place in Drumline, 1st place Drum Majors, and 1st place Colorguard). Then the band competed at the Crossroads marching contest in Robstown and again earned 2nd place in 3A. The band also won 2nd place Drum Majors and 1st place Colorguard. That day the SGMPA provide lunch and snacks for the band.

October 15th, The band earned a 1st division rating at UIL Marching Band competition earning straight superior 1st division ratings from all 3 judges and advanced to the Area Marching Band contest. This was the 8th year in a row that Academy has earned a 1st division. The band first entered UIL in 2014.

October 22, The band competed at the AREA E Marching Band contest in Beeville. Students reported at 5:15 am and earned 12th place out of 35 bands to advance to the Finals competition that evening. In Finals, the band jumped up 6 spots to earned 6th place in 3A. If this had been a state year, 7 bands would have advanced and SG would be going to state again. This year there were 5 bands added to our area that were very successful 4A bands last year. 3 of those band were in Finals.

Marching band has the remaining football games and a couple of parades, but we have already started working on the individual region band auditions, and shifting to concert band and getting the Mariachi and jazz band going.

The Areilles are working on their final pep rally and football game routines.
