2024-2025 Dress Code

The campus dress code is established to teach grooming and hygiene, instill discipline, prevent disruption, avoid safety hazards, and teach respect for authority. **Enforcement of this code is the responsibility of the campus staff with assistance from the administration.**

In order to promote and develop an educational climate that will be conducive to learning and the education process, and that will be consistent with the high standards and character of our student body, the following dress code has been adopted in accordance with school board policy in order to avoid disruptions, disturbances, interferences with, or distractions from school activities.

1. SGS strives to set the standard above the rest– we expect students to use good judgment in their grooming by dressing modestly, neatly, and appropriately. We appreciate parent support in upholding these expectations.

- All clothing shall be worn in the manner in which it was designed to be worn.
- Excessively revealing/distracting garments are disruptive and not allowed.
- See-through shirts or blouses, sleeveless or vests, tank tops (shirts with less than a one-inch strap), cut-off blouses, dresses or shirts, crop tops, bare midriffs (short blouses that ride up and allow the flesh to be viewed), low cut in the front or back blouses/dresses, string tie/spaghetti strapped/halter-type blouses or dresses, and torn shirts or blouses may not be worn.
- Mon-Wed: Shirts will be a school uniform polo or t-shirt with the SGS insignia. **They are available online only.**

Thursday: Students may wear a school spirit shirt or their uniform shirt.

Friday: Students may wear free dress that is appropriate for school and in accordance with SGS standards.

- **A uniform shirt is required under hoodies/sweatshirts etc.**
- No garments designed as underwear can be worn as outerwear; undergarments should not be visible past the first two buttons below the collar.
- Shirts and blouses may be worn unbuttoned no lower than two buttons below the collar; if appropriate wear is underneath, then shirts may be worn open.
- The length of dresses and skirts shall be no shorter than 2 ¾ inches (the width of a dollar bill.) above the top of the knee and slits may not go more than six inches above the knee; skirts must be hemmed. Skirts worn with tights must also meet the dress code.
- Shorts may be worn, but shall be no shorter than 2 ¾ inches above (width of a dollar bill) the top of the knee and must not be excessively tight or too baggy and no longer than 1.5 inches below the knee. 3rd-8th- Shorts need to be button-up: can be jean, khaki, cargo, and/or style dress shorts. No un-hemmed cutoffs, athletic, mesh shorts, boxer shorts, rolled-up shorts, or beachwear. PK-2- Shorts shall be no shorter than 2 ¾ inches above the knee- no spandex or tight fitting cotton shorts– jeans, khaki, dress, and/or athletic shorts

are allowed.

- Pants/shorts must be worn at the appropriate waist level; belt will be worn if needed; no baggy/saggy pants/shorts; pants and shorts must be worn at the waist; no shiny plastic pants. **Ripped pants with holes below the knee will be allowed/holes above the knee must not show skin.** Sweat pants, pajama pants—any pants jersey or cotton are not allowed. **Skin or undergarments must not be visible.**
 - Shirts may not fall below the student’s hands at the side while standing upright. If it is longer, the shirt must be tucked in.
 - Shirts with tails must fit appropriately (fitted to shoulders and arm length).
 - Spandex material, tight-fitting cotton shorts, acrylic biker shorts, or cutoffs are prohibited, as are spandex tops, leotards, and tube tops.
 - Leggings/Jeggings- are not allowed 3rd-8th grade. PK-2nd– they are allowed with a shirt that comes down to the thigh.
 - Caps, hats, bandanas, or beanies are not allowed to be worn inside buildings. Students will be given a warning. If the behavior continues then the item will be taken away and returned at the principal’s discretion. All caps or headgear must be worn in the manner they are designed to be worn. (All caps must be worn with bills facing forward.)
 - Clothing or body art that advertises, displays, or represents items such as alcoholic beverages, tobacco, obscenities/vulgarity, the occult, suggestive language or scenes depicting sex, violence, blood or gore, controlled substances, or objectionable insignias are prohibited.
 - Students are prohibited from wearing or displaying identical garments, decals, jewelry, beads, pins, shoes, etc., that may indicate gang association and/or membership; polishing fingernails the same color to signify membership is not allowed.
 - Athletic jerseys are allowed as long as the jersey follows prior guidelines. Sleeveless jerseys must be worn with a shirt underneath. **Gym clothing may be worn during P. E. class only.**
 - Blankets/pillows are prohibited in classrooms/hallways unless the student will be attending a school function that entails travel for competition.
2. Students shall wear the appropriate footwear at all times: All shoes must have a back on them and be worn at all times. Any form of slides, Burkes, flip-flops- **are not allowed.** Any footwear that constitutes a safety hazard is prohibited. Steel toe shoes may not be worn. Certain classes may require closed-toed shoes for safety.
 3. Sunglasses may be in a pocket, purse case, etc. (not displayed anywhere on a student).
 4. Hair shall be clean and neat, shall not cover the eyebrows, and shall not be styled or colored in a manner that might create distractions (i.e. hair color not typical such as green, blue, red; a color that is too bright, the partial coloring of the hair, etc.) No mohawks or designs shaved into the hair will be allowed.
 5. Boys are to be clean-shaven; mustaches and beards are prohibited; sideburns may be worn to the bottom of the earlobe and must be neat.
 6. Earrings worn by boys and girls are allowed. Earrings should not excessively hang from the ear-lobe. Body/oral/nose earrings/Gauges are not allowed, including those covered by tape, Band-Aids, etc.
 7. Visible tattoos must be covered at all times.

8. Jewelry and accessories shall not cause a distraction or be dangerous to the individual or others (i.e., chains on billfolds, dog collars, necklaces made of safety pins, chain links, etc.)
9. **PE/Athletics**– Athletic wear can be worn in PE/Athletics only– shorts need to hit at least mid-thigh. No spandex, tight-fitting shorts will be allowed (exceptions will be made **only** during volleyball season). Tennis shoes/shoes students can run in are required for all grade levels– they attend PE/Athletics every day and PK-5th have recess.

Dress code violations will be corrected immediately. **The administration may provide clothing for the student or the student may call the parents for a change of clothes.**

Regardless, parents/guardians will be notified and the violation will be documented. Students will be placed in the front office while waiting for a change of clothes. Persistent refusal to comply with the dress code may result in further disciplinary action.

Any departure of exception to this code for the purpose of extracurricular activities may be approved by agreement between the activity sponsor and principal. **Campus administrators reserve the right to modify dress code rules to respond to unexpected changes in fashions.**
