Background Information:

TEA requires that the Board designate hazardous routes. This allows Red Oak ISD to request supplemental funding as these routes are within the 2-mile radius of a school, but include conditions that are deemed unsafe for students to walk. Exhibit A notes the routes, the new areas for 22-23 are highlighted in yellow.

Fiscal Implications:

Administrative Recommendation:

The Administration recommends approval of the Resolution and list of “Hazardous Routes” for the 2022-2023 school year.

RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD REGARDING HAZARDOUS TRAFFIC CONDITIONS

WHEREAS, Education Code 42.155(d) allows the Board of Trustees of Red Oak Independent School District to obtain supplemental state funding for transporting regular, otherwise ineligible students who live within two miles of their school but who would be subject to hazardous traffic conditions if they walked to school; and

WHEREAS, the TEA handbook on School Transportation Allotments requires the Board to adopt language providing the definition of hazardous traffic conditions applicable to the District and identifying the specific hazardous areas for which such funding is requested; and

WHEREAS, the Board acknowledges the Education Code 42.155(d) provisions stating that a hazardous condition exists where no walkway is provided and students must walk along or cross a freeway or expressway, an underpass, an overpass or a bridge, an uncontrolled major traffic artery, an industrial or commercial area, or another comparable condition;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Trustees of the Red Oak Independent School District has determined that a hazardous condition exists in the detailed attached list (Exhibit "A").

Background Information:

With the May 2022 Bond propositions not passing and feedback received from the community, the District is scaling down a future bond proposal to focus on the need for a new middle school. Traditionally, the timeline for the design and construction of a new school is around 24 months. Under the current environment, an additional 4 to 6 months needs to be factored in the construction timeline.

The timeline for the construction of a new middle school if the May 2022 Bond had passed would have the new middle school opening in August 2025. If a November 2022 Bond passes for a new middle school, the opening would be pushed back a year, to August 2026. One way to shorten this timeline and the additional costs that would be incurred due to the projected cost escalation is to begin the design phase prior to the Bond Election. By doing this approach, the new middle school would be scheduled to open in August 2025.

Corgan has developed three (3) scenarios and projected costs for the construction of a new middle school. The approach that the District has reviewed and feels is in the best interest of the students and the community is to begin the design of a new middle school in August. This will also provide actual architectural design information before the November election.

Fiscal Implications:

By moving up the design phase of the project, a portion of the architect, engineering and construction manager fees will be incurred and paid prior to the Bond Election. The positive is a reduction of \$4.38 million in the estimated cost escalation if the project starts in August. The estimated costs for the pre-Bond work is estimated to be less than \$1.3 million and will be funded from existing capital project funds.

Administrative Recommendation:

Administration recommends the School Board approve the initiation of the design phase of a new middle school to be overseen by Corgan.

Morris has made her mark in Dallas County as she fought for children in education, blue-collar workers, and individuals with disabilities. Morris was one of the representatives in the lawsuit for a single-member district in Washington D.C. for an African American to hold an elected seat in the City of Lancaster. Morris became the first African American elected to the school board in 1995, Within her tender, she was a graduate of the Texas Association of School Boards LTASB.

From 1995 to 2010, Morris served in the Lancaster Independent School district for 15 years, not serving on the board from 2010 to 2019, as Morris continued to provide services for children in education with disabilities to ensure they received a quality education and understanding of how to build bridges between home and school. Morris is a graduate of Texas Association of School Boards LTASB.

In 2020 Morris and two other board members stepped outside their board role to save the school district \$2.3 million. The expenditures of funds would have been devastating and hardship to Lancaster Independent School District. TEA would have penalized LISD \$1.8 millions of penalties. Dallas County District Judge Parker April 2021 ordered an injunction for the district not to disburse the funds, reported in the Dallas Morning News.

Morris is a strong advocate with loyalty and a proven record of being a good steward with integrity to the Lancaster Independent School d District for over 30 years.

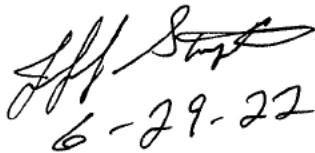
My name is Jeff Striplin and I am interested in being a candidate for the TASB board of directors.

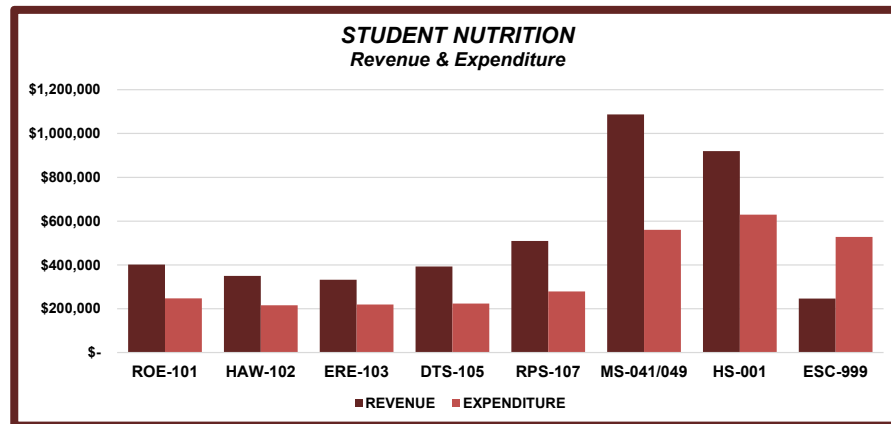

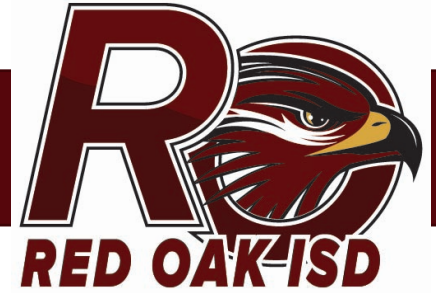
