Dear Superintendent Horsley:

We respectfully request that you consider taking the design fees for the Lincoln Elementary and Granite Park Junior High HVAC upgrades to the Board Study Session on September 15, 2026, for the Board's review and approval.

As we work to complete these projects during the upcoming 2027 summer break, we view every moment as crucial. There are several critical factors that impact the overall schedule, including approximately two months for design, one month for the bidding process, and an additional two to three months for equipment and materials procurement. To maintain the timeline and ensure the construction work can be initiated and completed during the brief window of summer break, it is important that we begin the design process as soon as possible. Our hope in approving the design's financial component is soon as we can is to get cool air into those spaces at these two schools before they come back next August.

We have received a design fee proposal from DLJ Engineers for Lincoln Elementary in the amount of \$88,000.00 and for Granite Park Junior High in the amount of \$99,500.00. Both projects will be a million dollars each, which is what our budget is.

We hope to provide the needed upgrades on schedule so that our students and faculty can have the proper environment for our educational goals. We appreciate your consideration and support in moving these projects forward.

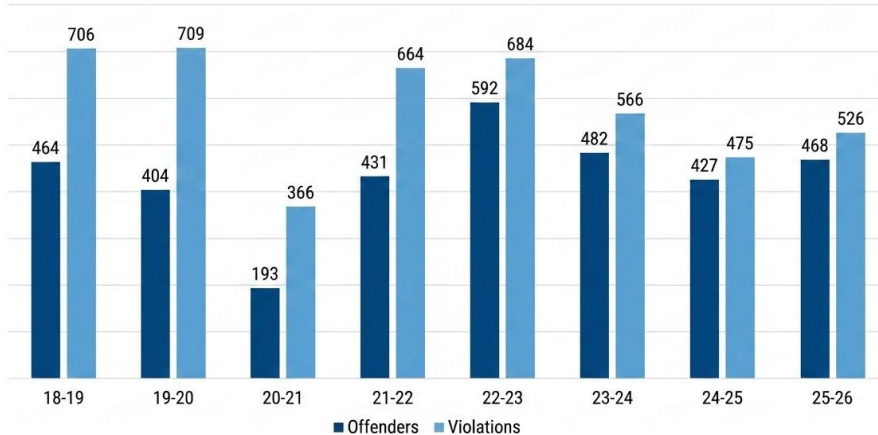

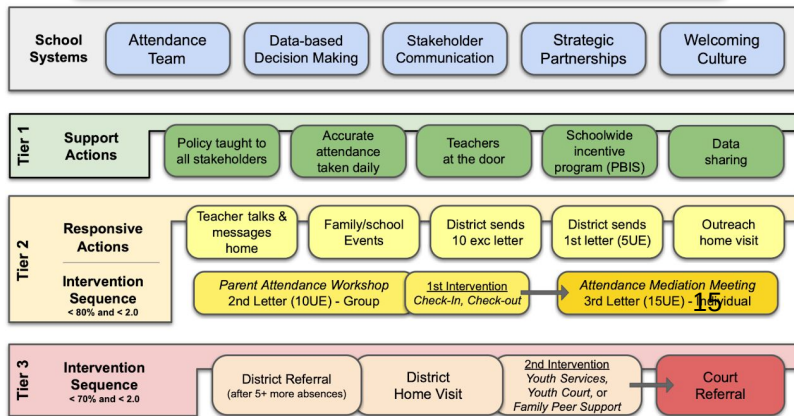

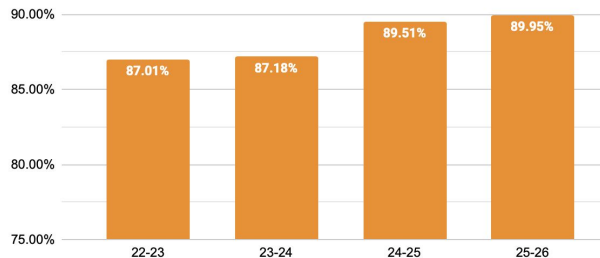

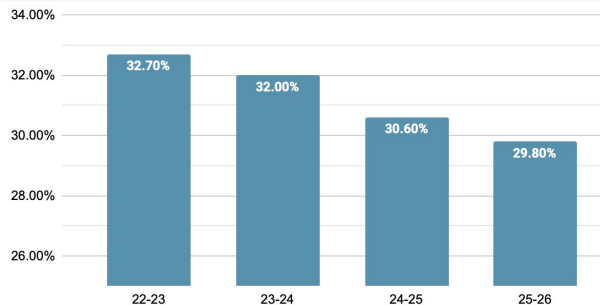
District Attendance Framework

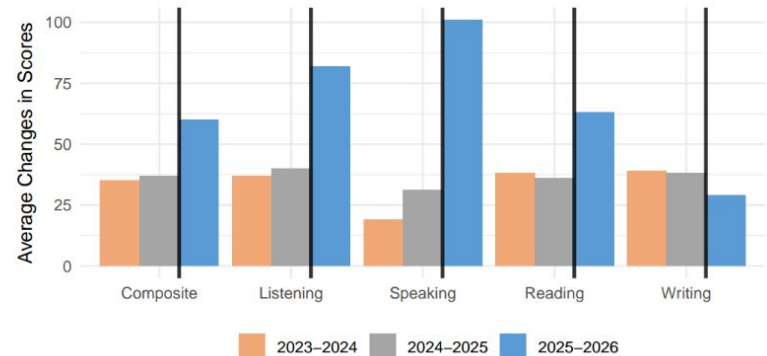

Title IX Informal Resolution Facilitator

- Title IX prohibits any unwelcome conduct on the basis of sex determined by a reasonable person to be so severe, pervasive, and objectively offensive that it effectively denies a person equal access to the district's education program or activity.
- Work in conjunction with Policy and Legal Services/Travis Walker.
- Informal Resolution Facilitator: The person who assists the parties in voluntarily resolving a sex discrimination or harassment complaint without a formal investigation or hearing. If the parties reach a mutually agreed-upon resolution, the facilitator prepares the final written settlement agreement and obtains both parties' signatures.



Section 504 District Coordinator

Section 504 prohibits discrimination against individuals with disabilities in programs and activities receiving federal financial assistance. It ensures that qualified individuals with disabilities have equal access to educational opportunities and other services.

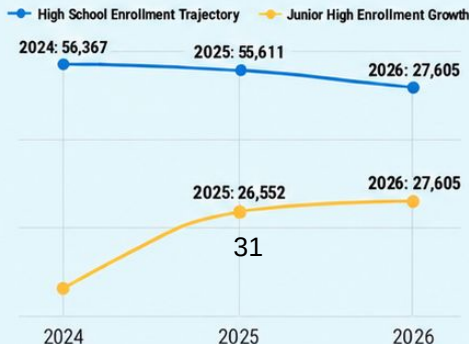

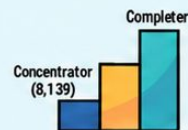

Utah First Credential

The First Credential Program was created through [HB260](#) (GS 2025), and ensures each Utah student has the opportunity to graduate from high school with a meaningful, industry-aligned credential that supports college credit, career readiness, and lifelong learning. The initiative aligns K–12, higher education, and employers to create a cohesive statewide talent pipeline.

The program is powered by partnerships. Schools, colleges, employers, and state leaders work together to turn classrooms into career pathways and make opportunity a shared reality for each student.

Students who complete any of the five credentialing routes will be eligible to earn a First Credential Scholarship beginning with the high school graduating class of 2027.

Career and Technical Education

Earned by completing a state approved program of study in a career and technical education field

Concurrent Enrollment

Earned by completing either 12-18 general education credits across different GE Categories or a prescribed set of courses designated by USBE

300 Hour Youth Apprenticeship
