**Directors' Reports**

**Superintendent Report:** Reminder, Michigan Association School Board Legislative Priorities Region 1 Meeting is 9/30/24 from 7:00 – 8:30 p.m. The GOISD, local school board, and administration are invited to attend. Senate Bill 911 passed along party lines. This legislation will reduce the amount districts pay into the pension system, as the system is now fully funded will have a direct impact on the ISD and school districts. It has been a busy start to the new year. Thank you staff for a good start to the new school year.



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**Financial and Grants Report:** The Business Office and Grant Management staff along with the Business Managers from Bessemer, Wakefield-Marenisco, and ETC attended Schools OPEN training September 11<sup>th</sup> – 13<sup>th</sup>. Watersmeet’s conversion is scheduled for October 25<sup>th</sup> – 28<sup>th</sup>. We received and are currently reviewing the draft financials and audit report for the ISD. ETC’s audit fieldwork is 99% complete. Watersmeet’s field work begins September 30<sup>th</sup>. We received the grant funds into our MiLAF account for both the 23h Improving Mathematics grant and the 32v Early Childhood Workforce grant.

**Career and Technical Education Report:** About 50% of juniors and seniors are participating in the CTE programs. Our enrollment is the same as it was last year. The Career and Technical Education Academy has 10 students this year. Thank you to the local businesses for hosting students on CTE WBL or LTCS placements. Thank you to Paulette Niemi for her efforts coordinating placements. The latest CTE video has been published for the DTE Education Academy Program. Great job to Mrs. Witt and her students. Students from Watersmeet are also participating in Welding and Nursing CTE programs. Students will ride the bus with the ETC students to attend the welding and nursing programs in Ontonagon.

**Early Childhood Report:** All four GSRP classrooms are off to a great year. Staff participated in a COR Advantage training, which is a child assessment tool that is used to measure a child’s development and growth from birth to Kindergarten. COR Advantage is based on observation assessment that focuses on a child’s strengths during daily activities, rather than performances on tests. The center was closed August 22<sup>nd</sup> and 29<sup>th</sup> for Zones of Regulation training. Special Education Supervisor Rebecca Samson, Karen Kangas, Social Workers, Jenna Fingeroos and Darienne Lane came to the center to conduct the training with the LLECC and GSRP staff. This training provided staff with some tools used to regulate student’s emotions while in class. We took this opportunity to meet with staff individually to help align classroom set up according to HighScope curriculum.

**Instructional Services Report:** It was a busy productive week leading up to the start of the school year. Our Department has expanded significantly this year. New Staff Orientation was successful and supportive of their transition into their new roles. The GOISD hosted Dr. Anthony Muhammed, presenting on school culture and the Professional Learning Communities process as part of back to school in-service training for staff. Megan Hagen guided new members in Instructional Services Student Health and Wellness Department’s on a tour of all six GOISD Districts. All districts were open and welcoming, introducing to key staff and procedures at each building. Instructional Services is part of the General Education Leadership Network (GELN), which is a consortium of Directors from all ISDs across the state, held the first meeting of the year followed by a joint session between GELN, MCIFN, and MiLEAP. This opportunity was valuable and will support future improvements in our service. Our Department will be providing support internally at the GOISD and all six Districts for evaluating Teachers and Certified Staff. Our staff is working to increase our understanding of the systems and tools that we will be using to support the Districts. With our team expanding, we are excited to help support in any way we can.

**Special Education Report:** As we get rolling this year, our ancillary team has been working on schedules for services, working with teachers and staff members to ensure students are being seen at appropriate times of their days. Continuing work with LEA’s on corrective action plans and uncorrected non-compliance. We are working with the MDE Office of Special Education to better assist LEA’s in completing their CAP’s and progress monitoring. Targeted assistance for LEA/CB teachers to assist with REED, IEP and Permission to Place development. Looking for ways to identify and access training for the local teachers that is accessible. Strategic Plan for the GOISD to communicate effectively to ensure equitable access and connect.



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**Student Health and Wellness Services Report:** We had a great start to the 24-25 school year. Our staff engaged in work around Medicaid, Illuminate, streamlines data collection wellness screen pilot, and creation of SSW guidelines. We are working on developing our behavioral supports as a systematic process. Multiple districts have reached out to our team for support for specific student's behavioral situations. Having a BCBA and Mental Health Professional that districts and ISD can work with has been a significant shift from last year. We are working with administration and teachers from our local districts to identify target groups from a universal screen pilot using Pearson SSIS SEL to identifying students who may have been missed. Our support staff has received positive feedback from both staff, and the public, good things are happening. I attended Standard Response Protocol (SRP) action-based enhancement to all hazards in school safety planning, Standard Reunification Method (SRM) fills a critical void in school safety planning, and Digital Threat Assessment Training (DTA) engaging with social media applications on how to find and document worrisome digital media content originating from the community. Two of our support staff are attending this training.

**REMC Report:** The REMC Save statistics for 2023-2024 are generally the same as the previous year. On Monday 9/20/24 and 9/26/24 Josh Hiner will be participating in the REMC RITS9 (REMC Instructional Technologists Specialist) REMC1 supports AI/Artificial intelligence literacy in our school environments while underlining student data safety and current regulations. The SupportNet has had its busiest season through August into September, resolving 48% more tickets.

The Policy Committee met to review the Fall 2024 Policy Update. Below, you will find a list of the policies revised or added by Thrun and the committee's recommendation for each. As you review the policies, anything in red stricken-through text has been removed by Thrun and replaced with updated language. Anything in red automatically becomes a part of the policy. Thrun provided optional language highlighted in aqua blue for some policies for the committee to review and consider.
