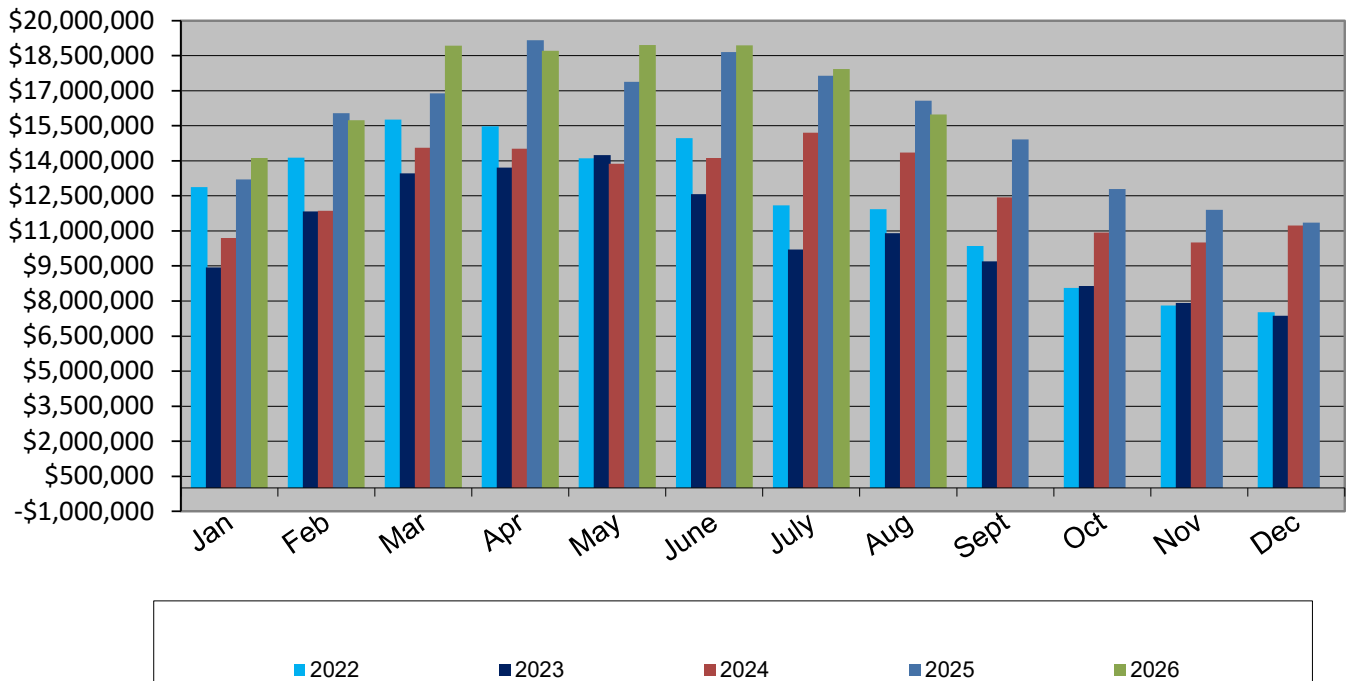

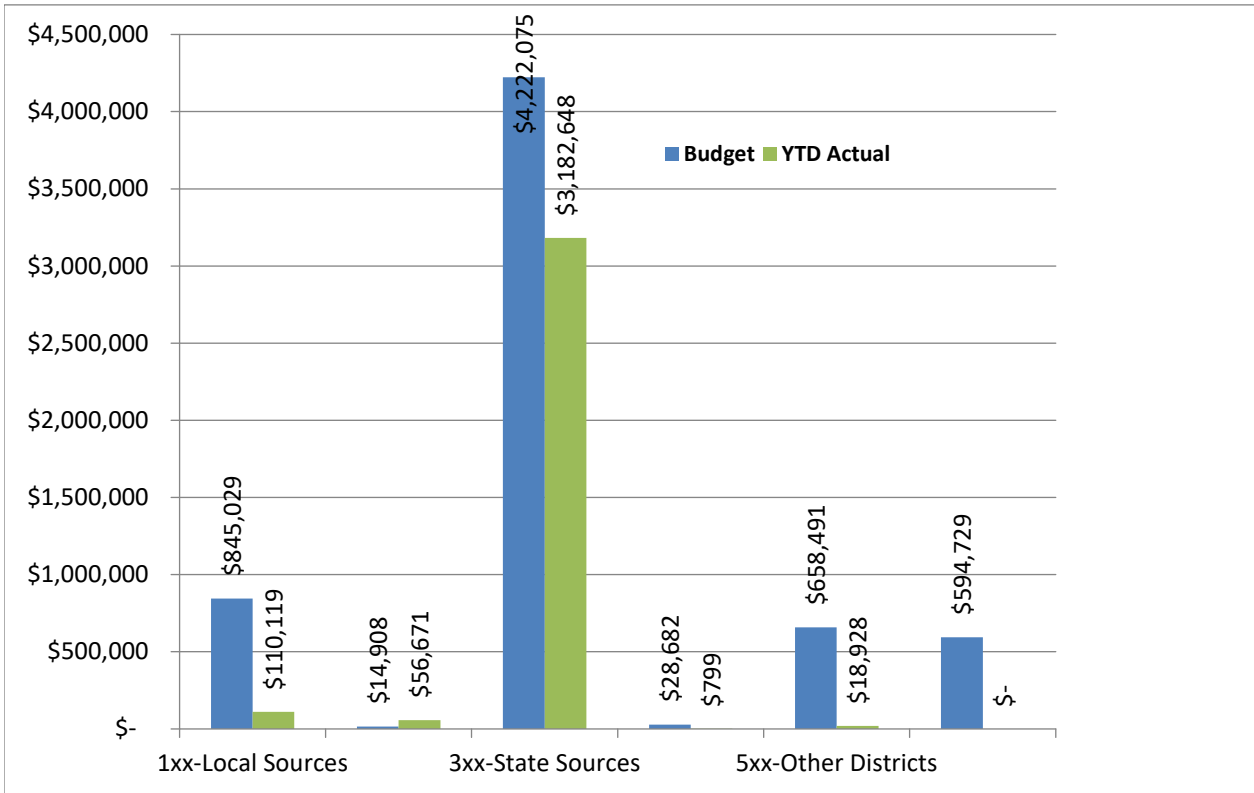

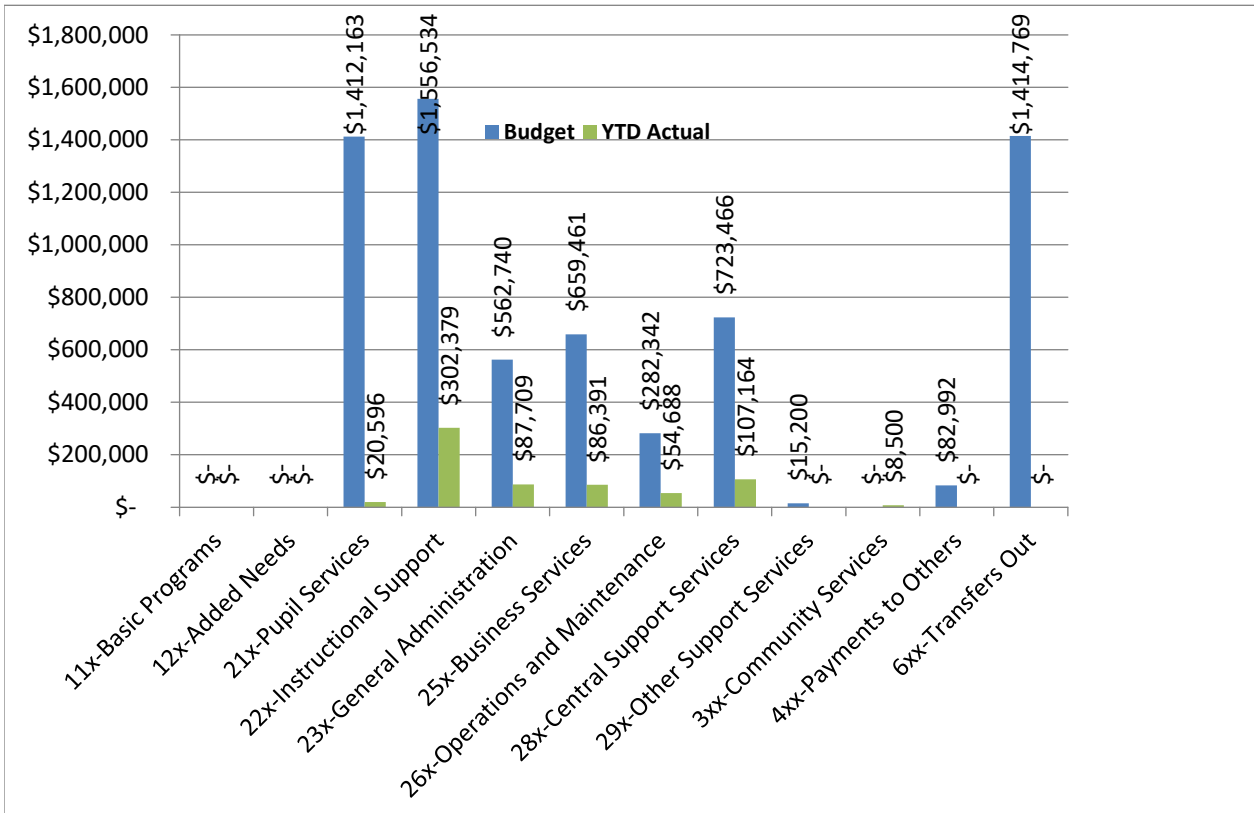

General Fund Revenues as of August 31, 2026

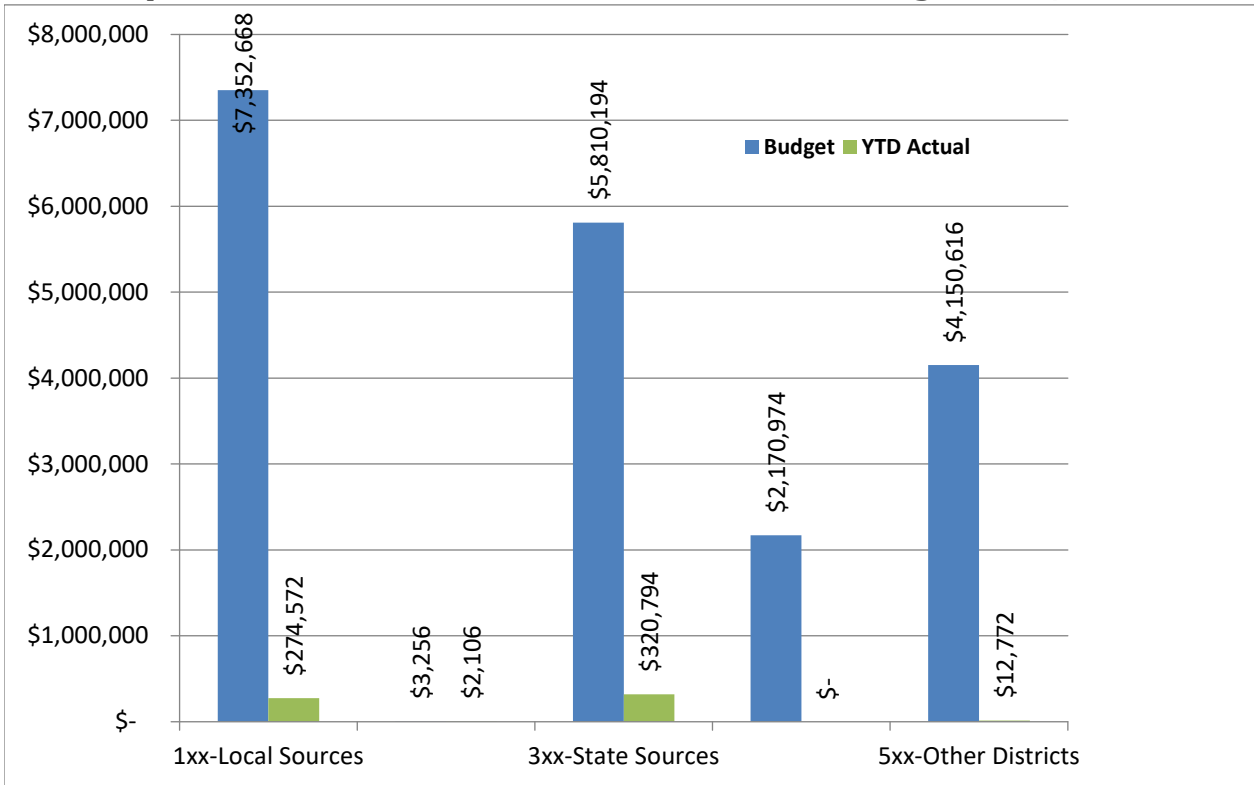


General Fund Expenditures as of August 31, 2026

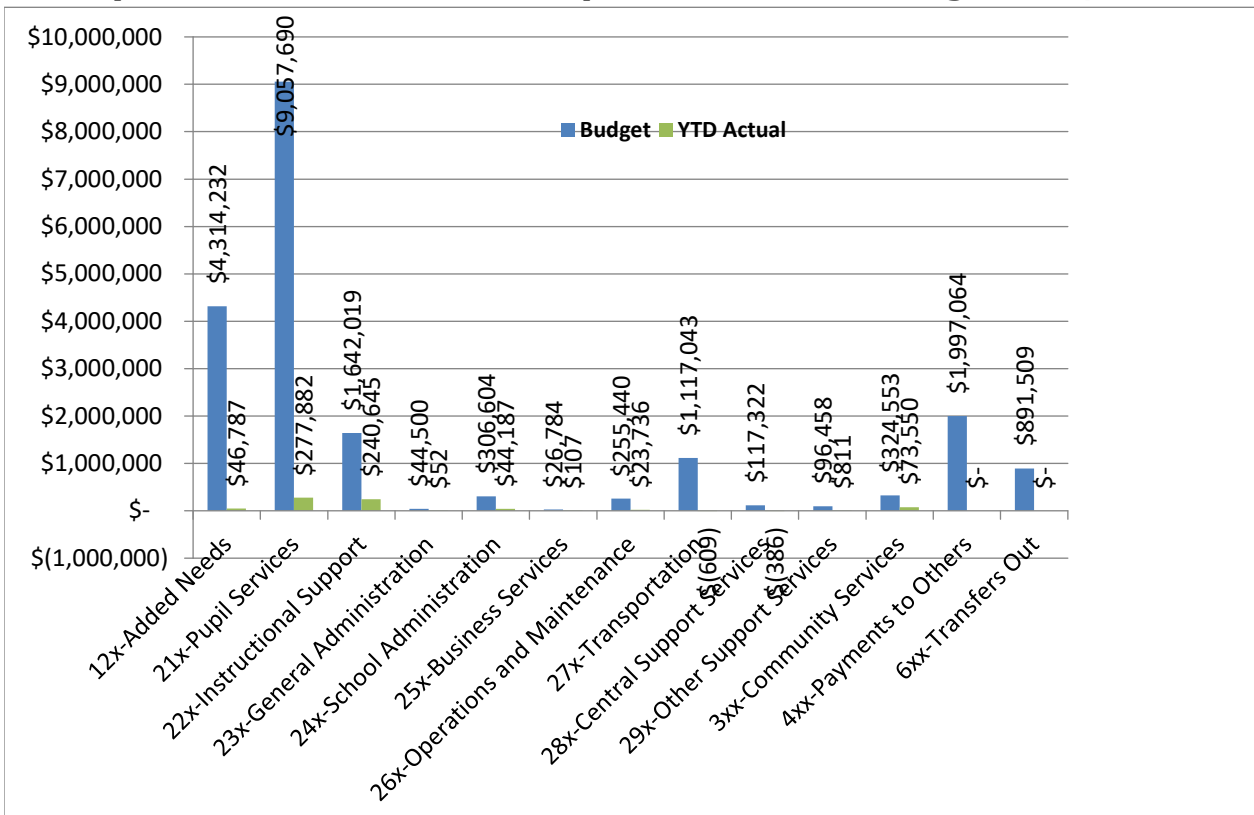

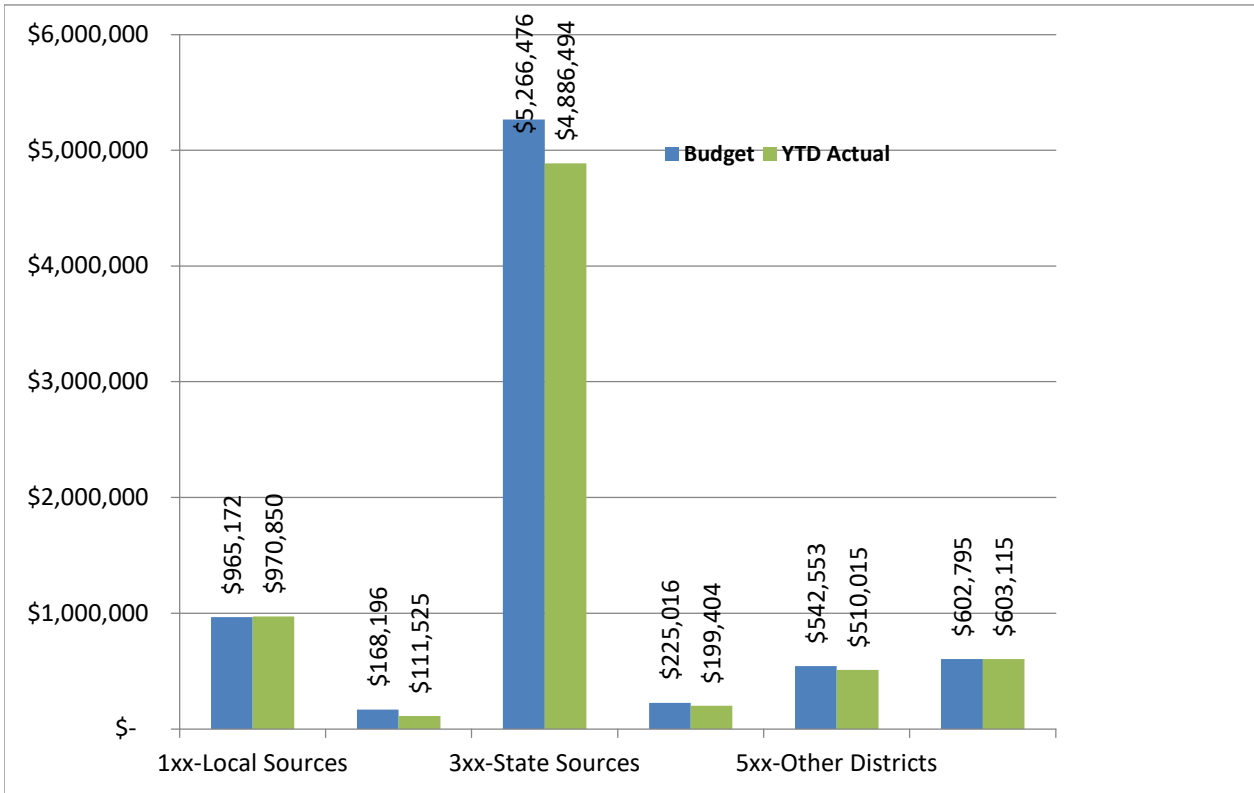

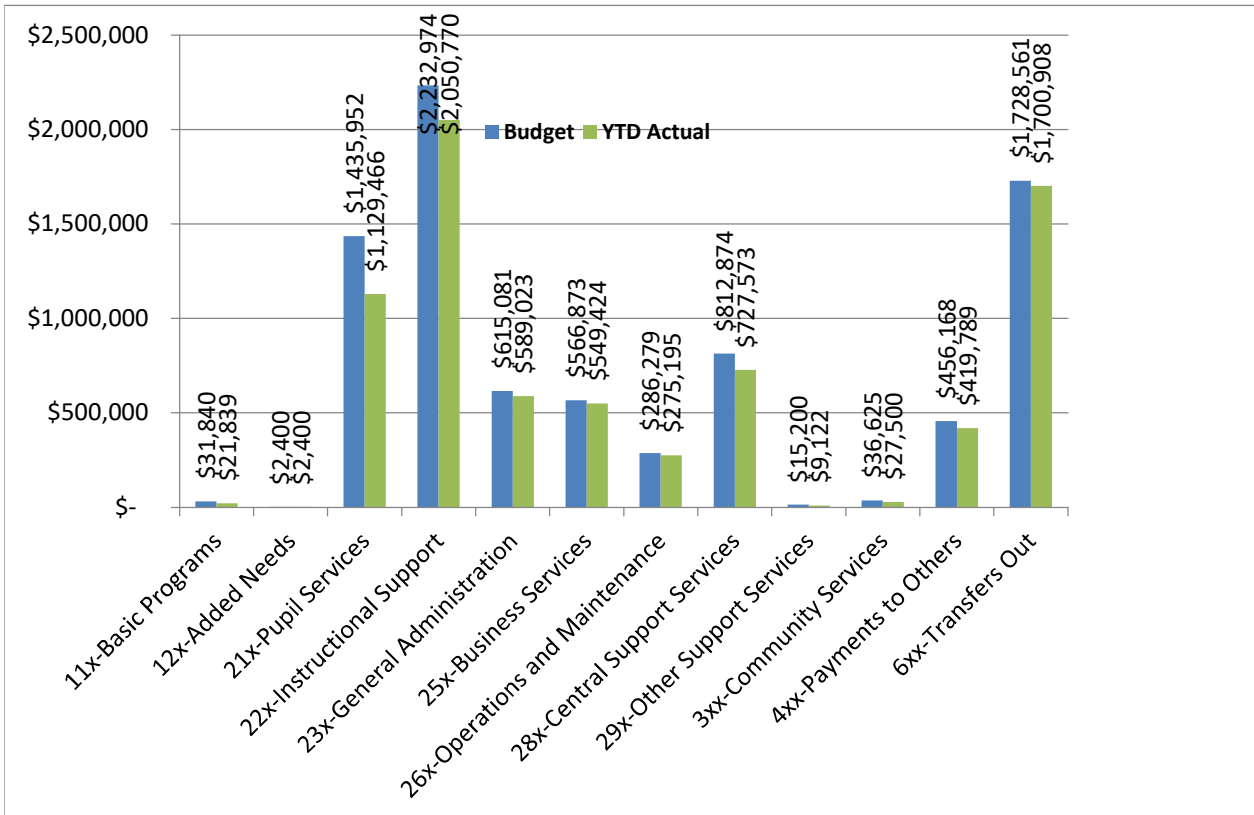

General Fund Revenues as of June 30, 2026

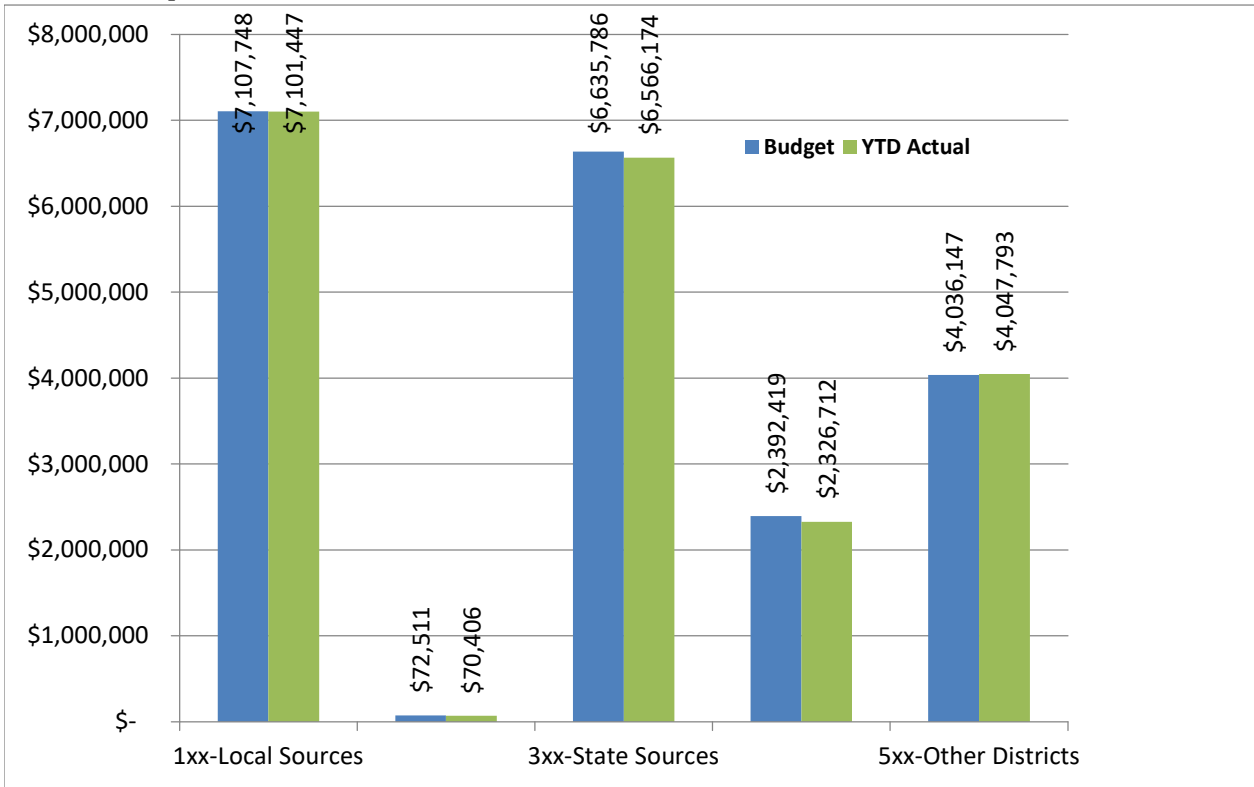


General Fund Expenditures as of June 30, 2026

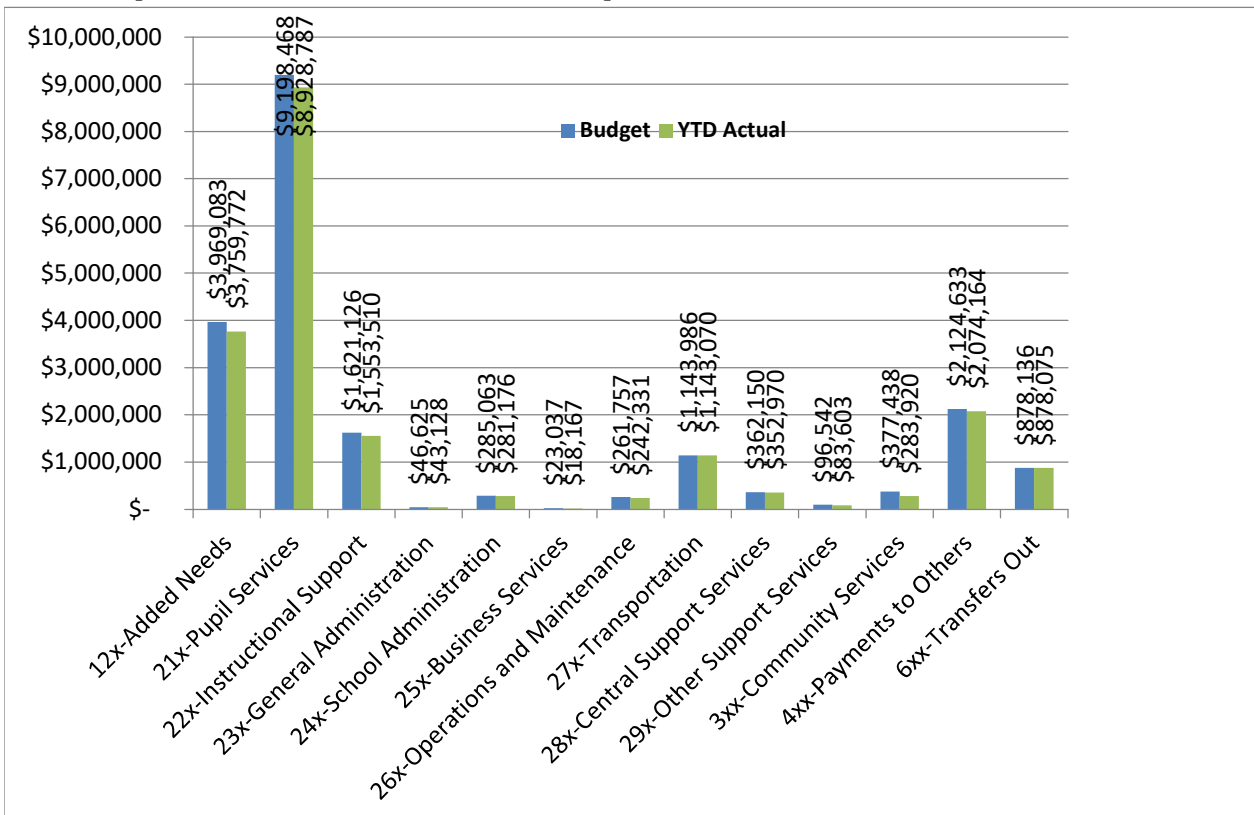

Legislative Update

For discussion: Section 31aa provides \$147.06 per pupil for student safety – requires a waiver; and \$73.53 per pupil for student mental health – does not require a waiver

*To receive funding under subsection (3), a district ... must agree to be subject to a **comprehensive investigation** after a **mass casualty event**, must agree to comply with a comprehensive investigation into the mass casualty event and, for the purpose of that investigation, must affirmatively agree to **waive any privilege held by the district** . . . that may otherwise protect information from disclosure in the event of a mass casualty event, and must agree to comply with a comprehensive investigation. MCL 383.1631aa(6)*

A mass casualty event is defined as significant physical injuries; 2 or more fatalities; an incident that requires outside resources; or a sudden surge of injured individuals requiring emergency services.

The EUPISD Strategic Plan Framework was introduced to staff on our opening day. I shared the full plan with the board. We can address any questions at the board meeting.

MI STEM Funding

I submitted a Letter of Intent to apply for the re-approved MI STEM funding. It requires that we post and hire a regional director by January 2027.

Summer Youth Work and Learn 2026

The Summer Youth Work and Learn Program continues to have a positive impact on students with disabilities aged 14 and older entering the workforce. In 2026, program participation grew to 41 students, surpassing enrollment numbers from 2025. The increase strengthened and expanded partnerships with community sites, allowing more students to gain valuable workplace experience. This year's partnerships included:

The Summer Youth Work and Learn Program is supported by a team of ten dedicated Skills Trainers, one Lead Skills Trainer, and a traveling instructor, all of whom are committed to fostering student success. Together, they created a safe, supportive, and empowering environment where participants could learn, grow, and build confidence.

Building on the success of last year's implementation of the *Foundations: Skills for Success Program*, the traveling instructor model was implemented in 2026 to bring structured employability training directly to each student group. Through this instructional component, participants received lessons on essential workplace skills, including resume development, interview preparation, workplace professionalism, communication, and teamwork. These lessons provided a strong foundation for career readiness while increasing students' confidence in pursuing future employment opportunities.

In addition to gaining valuable hands-on work experience, participants developed the knowledge, skills, and professional behaviors needed to succeed in the workplace. As a result, the 2026 program played a significant role in preparing youth for future employment and supporting their long-term personal and professional growth.

Medicaid School Service Program

The Michigan Department of Health and Human Services has released [Medicaid Bulletin MMP 26-23 SSP](#), outlining required changes to the School Services Program. These updates reflect a state plan amendment that resulted from audit findings from the Office of the Auditor General. Key Updates Include:

- Specialized Transportation Reimbursement – to qualify 100% of students transported on a Medicaid-approved specialized transportation route must require the use of a wheelchair and / or lift. This requirement means none of our current regional special education transportation routes (ISD and local district) are eligible.
- Extended School Year Service Costs are no longer eligible for Medicaid reporting - starting July 1, 2026.
- Random Moment Time Studies will require a quicker staff response. These are surveys staff complete to indicate what services they are providing at a specific, designated time during the school day. Individuals are randomly selected, and the sample is aggregated to generate a picture of the overall staff activities. The response to this random moment in time surveys is directly linked to reimbursement, so timely completion by staff is critical.

Results Driven Accountability - Summary

Results Driven Accountability (RDA) is a federal initiative that relies on data in a variety of categories to assess the health of state special education systems. Michigan uses the same concept to analyze results (student performance) and compliance metrics assess the overall health of Michigan ISD's special education system. Statewide data is compared and Michigan ISDs are sorted into three groups (tertiles) and then assigned scores for each data category. The top third highest performing ISDs in the category receive a 2, middle third a 1 and the lowest performing a 0. The scores for each category are totaled and the overall performance of the ISD special education system is determined; Meets Requirements, Needs Assistance, Needs Intervention, Needs Substantial Intervention.

In 2026, the EUPISD's overall RDA rating was Needs Assistance. On compliance metrics, the EUPISD scored very high compared to other ISDs with an overall score of 95%. However, the EUPISD scored lower on results metrics with an overall score of 60%. In results, the EUPISD was in the lowest tertile of ISDs in the following areas for students with disabilities: 8th grade proficiency in math, graduation, and dropout.

Results Driven Accountability – A Deeper Look at the RDA Math Data

Data provided to the EUPISD through the Results Driven Accountability (RDA) process indicated the following:

- 16.36% of 4th grade students with disabilities were proficient on a state assessment of mathematics (MSTEP or MiACCESS); placing the EUPISD in the middle tertile of ISDs
- 5.19% of 8th grade students with disabilities were proficient on a state assessment of mathematics (MSTEP or MiACCESS); placing the EUPISD in the lowest tertile of ISDs

The RDA information included the following statewide metrics for tertiles:

- 4th Grade: <14% = score 0 14-18.99% = score 1 ≥19% = score 2
- 8th Grade: <6% = score 0 6-7.99% = score 1 ≥8% = score 2

In October, the Board will receive a deeper dive into math MSTEP for students with disabilities compared to students without disabilities.

Specially Designed Instruction: Math

Targeted Professional Learning + Instructional Coaching

The Special Education Department will continue to support high quality, evidence-based math instruction for students with disabilities through the Specially Designed Instruction professional learning and instructional coaching process. Teachers assigned to the Math SDI cohort for year 2 will engage in one day of onsite professional development with follow up in-district coaching throughout the school year to support the implementation of evidence-based strategies. Key highlights for this year include:

- expanding the number of SE department staff supporting this initiative (from 3 to 4) to increase the frequency and intensity of coaching available for teachers
- supporting instruction that is grounded in the National Council of Teachers of Mathematics (NCTM) concept of eliminating “terms that expire” and “rules that expire” – the temporary calculation “tricks” or mnemonics that damage long-term mathematical understanding
- emphasis on teaching for deep understanding versus supporting via accommodations

3. Participants will also engage in at least one coaching cycle (3-6 in-district coaching sessions during the course of the 2026-2027 school year. Sessions will include coach observation followed by debriefing.

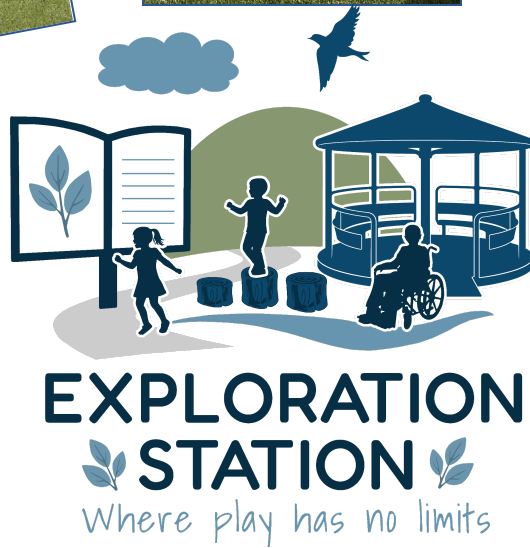

Early Childhood Department Office Move

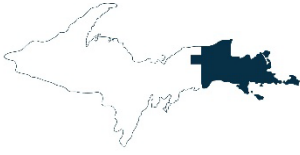

PARTICIPATING SCHOOL FEEDBACK

100% of participating administrators recommended continuing the Kindergarten Enrichment Camp model. District staff noted that the camps provide preparation beyond a traditional orientation or school visit; gave children time to practice routines and build relationships; supported smoother transitions; reduced family uncertainty; and helped teachers begin the year with students who are already familiar with school expectations.

Developing Cohesive Systems of Support for Student Learning

In June, nine districts participated in the first workshop of this series. Teams consisted of administrators, general education teachers, special education teachers, interventionists, and instructional coaches. During a balanced day of new learning and action planning, teams began work to complete a plan for a high-functioning district literacy leadership team to drive, guide, and monitor the professional learning process throughout the course of the year and to support learning in the district. They also started a professional learning plan for the year, guided by the overarching structure of MTSS, the district definition of high-quality instruction and high-quality instructional materials, and the requirements of the law.

These leadership teams came together again on August 25 with a focus on multi-tiered systems of support for literacy. Some of the districts brought additional team members with them and two more districts joined the group. Activities included reviewing/refinement of their tiered delivery system and comprehensive screening and assessment system. They also developed a plan to gather information on K-12 student and teacher needs during this 2026-2027 school year to determine potential staffing, scheduling, and funding needs for the 2027-2028 school year.

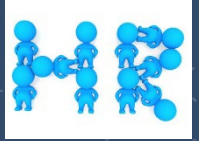
FCC E-Rate comment period

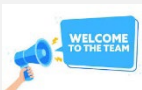

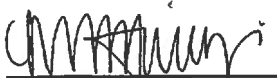

The theme for the conference is *The Confluence: Where Research and Professional Learning Meet*.

In addition to presenting, Lindsay will attend two days of thought-provoking sessions on professional learning (PL) and PL research, as well as taking part in opportunities to connect with PL organizations, researchers, and system leaders who are shaping the field. Through participation, Lindsay will explore the evolving paradigms, emerging trends, and transformative practices reshaping the field of PL, including share-outs from RPPL's latest research.

Due to her presenter status, RPPL will reimburse Lindsay's travel expenses up to \$1350 immediately following the event. With that in mind, here are the cost estimates:
