Minutes of the Board of Education Meeting held on March 17, 2026  
Council Chambers, 3 Primrose Street, Newtown, CT.

Mrs. Plante called the meeting to order at 7:31 p.m.

**Item 1: Pledge of Allegiance**

**Item 2: Celebration of Excellence**

The SHS recipients were not able to attend this evening. The Board will recognize the Sandy Hook School Scripps Spelling Bee Winners at a future date.

**Item 3: Consent Agenda**

**MOTION:** Mrs. Linnetz moved that the Board of Education approve the Consent Agenda, which includes the Minutes from March 3, 2026. Seconded by Ms. Beylouni. Motion passes unanimously.

**Item 4: Public Participation None**

**Item 5: Reports**

**Chair Report:**

Mrs. Plante offered a brief budget update. The Board of Finance made a \$125,000 reduction to the BOE Budget last week. The Board of Finance felt the budget was very well defended and has now passed it along to the Legislative Council.

**Superintendent's Report:**

Mrs. Uberti discussed her budget presentation that was sponsored by the PTA at Reed Intermediate School on March 16th. It was well attended in person and on line and Mrs. Uberti acknowledged and appreciated the public engagement in the process. She also expressed thanks to Assistant Superintendent Frank Purcaro and Matt Mervis from EdAdvance for the presentation on AI and the challenges and opportunities it presents to us as a district.

Mrs. Uberti asked Board Members to think about the Special Meeting on a special topic and whether or not that's a format they'd like to use in the future to discuss topics board members are interested in covering.

Mrs. Uberti addressed the change in the state law regarding the Kindergarten start age. Right now, the waiver is optional. The big change will be in 2027 and 2028 where the waiver will be

going away and by law, students will have to be five by September first to start school and there will be no exceptions.

Mrs. Uberti then encouraged the public to support Newtown High School and go see Mama Mia this weekend and lastly, she acknowledged that it is Board of Education Appreciation month and she thanked our Board of Education for all of their hard work and dedication.

#### **Committee and Liaison Reports:**

Ms. Tomai gave a quick update on the 3/16 CFF Meeting. Right now we have expended 99.6% of our budget. Projected year end balance of 300K.

#### **Student Report:**

Our student representatives shared some NHS highlights. The College Career Fair on March 16th at NHS was a huge success. The College and Career Center is in full swing with supporting students in search of scholarships and internships. As of now, 78 seniors have committed to college with the expectation of many regular decisions releasing this week. The Mental Health Fair on March 13th was well attended and supported by staff and students. The NHS Cap Club, first student-based scholarship foundation at NHS, has upped their \$1000 scholarship to two \$2500 scholarships. This club has been spearheaded by Claire DiNoto. The Class Council has been working on a bulletin board calendar to provide seniors with reminders during this busy time of year, including payment of transcripts, cap and gown dues and senior events. The National Honors Society is running a peanut butter, sports equipment and children's clothing drive. All donated items will be personally delivered by Miss Violet to a community in the Dominican Republic.

#### **Financial Report and Transfers for Month Ending February 28, 2026:**

*MOTION:* Mrs. Linnetz moved that the Board of Education approve the financial report and transfers for the month ending February 28, 2026. Ms. Beylouni seconded.

Tanja Gouveia, Director of Business, reiterated a year end projected balance of just over \$300,000. The transfers that came in were from Newtown Middle School. Three thousand dollars from Student Travel to cover equipment repairs and instructional supplies in music and then \$9500 is being requested from equipment repairs at NHS in athletics to cover instructional supplies.

Mrs. Plante asked for a vote. Motion passes unanimously.

#### **Old Business:**

*MOTION:* Mrs. Linnetz moved that the Board of Education approve the 7th and 8th Grade Science Curriculum. Seconded by Ms. Beylouni. Motion passes unanimously.

*MOTION:* Mrs. Linnetz moved that the Board of Education set the Newtown Middle School Moving Up Ceremony to June 15, 2026 and the Newtown High School Graduation for June 16, 2026 with a rain date of June 17, 2026. Seconded by Mrs. Beylouni.

Mrs.Beylouni confirmed that the last day of school is June 18th. The updated calendar is being maintained on the District Website so families can check the website calendar any time for up to date information. Mrs. Plante asks for a vote. Motion passes unanimously.

*MOTION:* Mrs. Linnetz moved that the Board of Education authorize the Superintendent to modify the middle school schedule for 2025-2026, 2026-2027, and 2027-2028 school years to provide for an early dismissal on the day of the Grade 8 Moving Up Ceremony, in alignment with the already modified schedule for Newtown High School on that same day. Seconded by Mrs.Beylouni.

Superintendent Uberti outlined the burden on families with respect to time frame and scheduling This schedule modification addresses these challenges. Motion passes unanimously.

*MOTION:* Mrs. Linnetz moved that the Board of Education approve the ratified contract between the Newtown BOE Security Officers, Unit 147, United Public Service Employees Union, and the Newtown Board of Education, covering the period from July 1, 2025 through June 30, 2029 and move further that the Board authorize the Board Chair to execute the contract on its behalf. Seconded by Mrs.Beylouni. Motion passes unanimously.

**Item 7: New Business**

Mrs.Linetz discussed the 9000 series Bylaws being presented for first-read. Questions can be directed to Mrs. Linnetz or Mr.Ramsey. Mrs.Plante added that the Board should have strong knowledge of these policies and be sure they represent how the Board operates accurately.

*MOTION:* Mr.Vouros moved that the meeting be adjourned. Seconded by Mrs.Beylouni. Motion passes unanimously. The meeting is adjourned at 8:00pm.

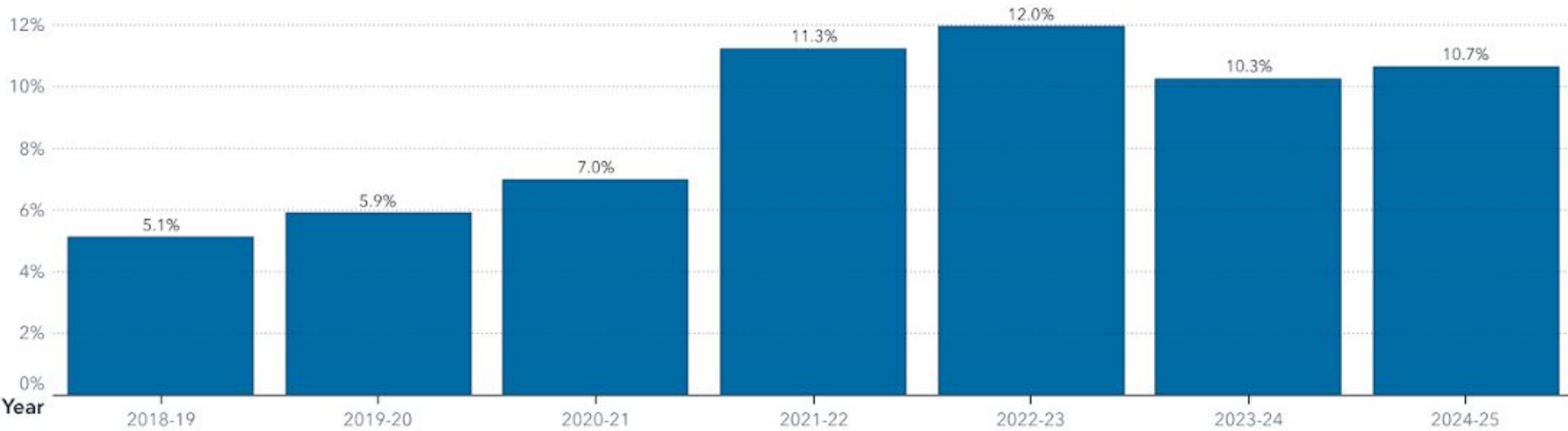

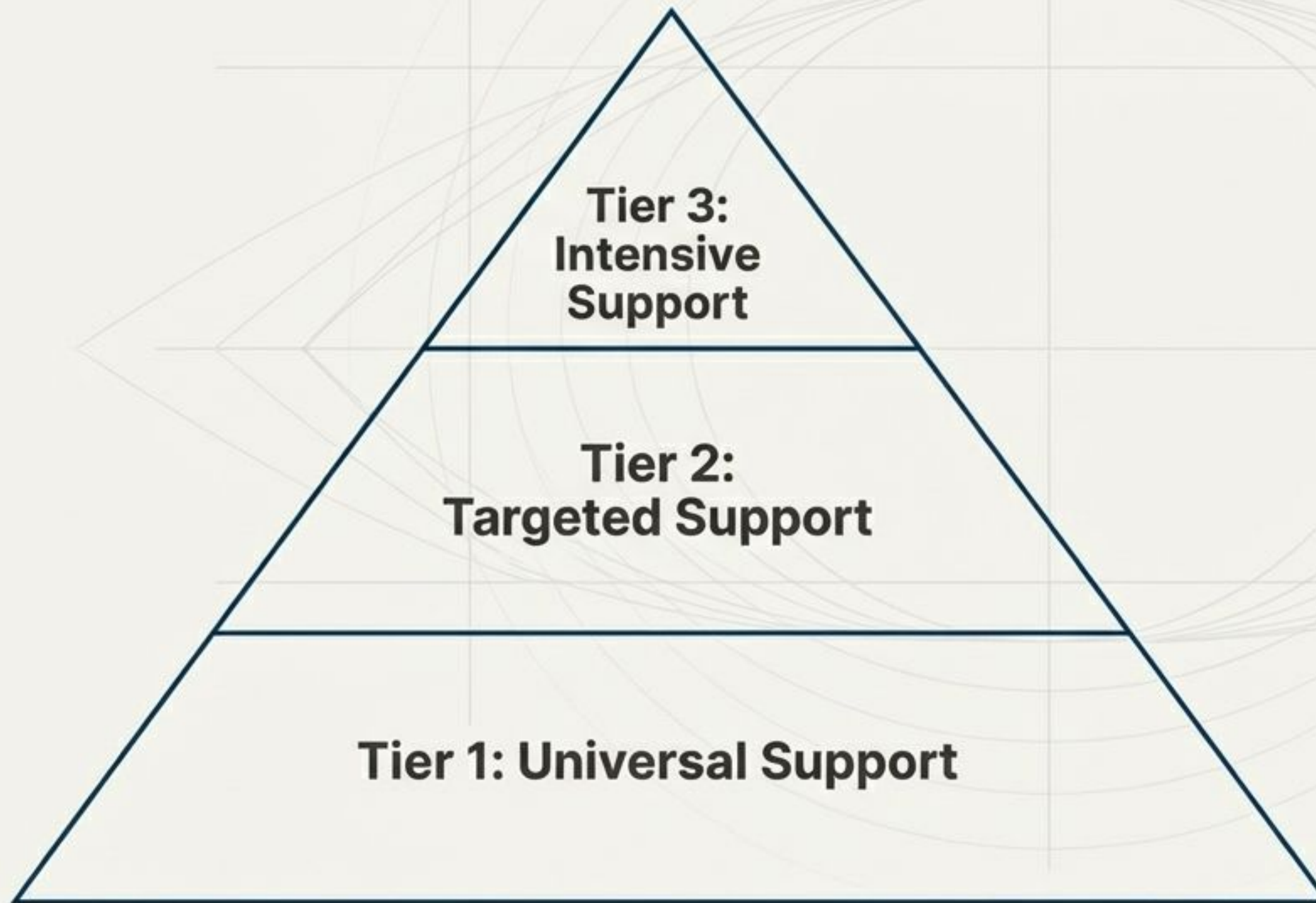

# A Three-Tiered Approach to Support to Reducing Chronic Absenteeism



Applied a **multi-tiered system of support (MTSS)** to systematically address attendance. This framework ensures **every student receives foundational support**, while providing **progressively intensive interventions** for those with greater needs.

This model is applied across two key focus areas: **Students and Families**.

# Pillar 1: A Tiered Strategy for Student Engagement



## Tier 1: Universal Engagement

- Monthly-themed 'NHS Attendance Matters' student newsletters.
- Embedded student support videos on topics like getting to school on time, time management, and study skills.



## Tier 2: Targeted Intervention

- Daily and weekly PowerSchool attendance data analysis to identify at-risk students.
- Direct meetings with identified students to determine and address root causes (barriers, aversions, disengagement, misconceptions).
- Collaborative student/family/staff 'care and concern' meetings.



## Tier 3: Intensive Support

- Increased frequency of meetings with students.
- Referral to the NHS Attendance Review Board.
- Home visits.
- In-depth EduClimber attendance data analysis.

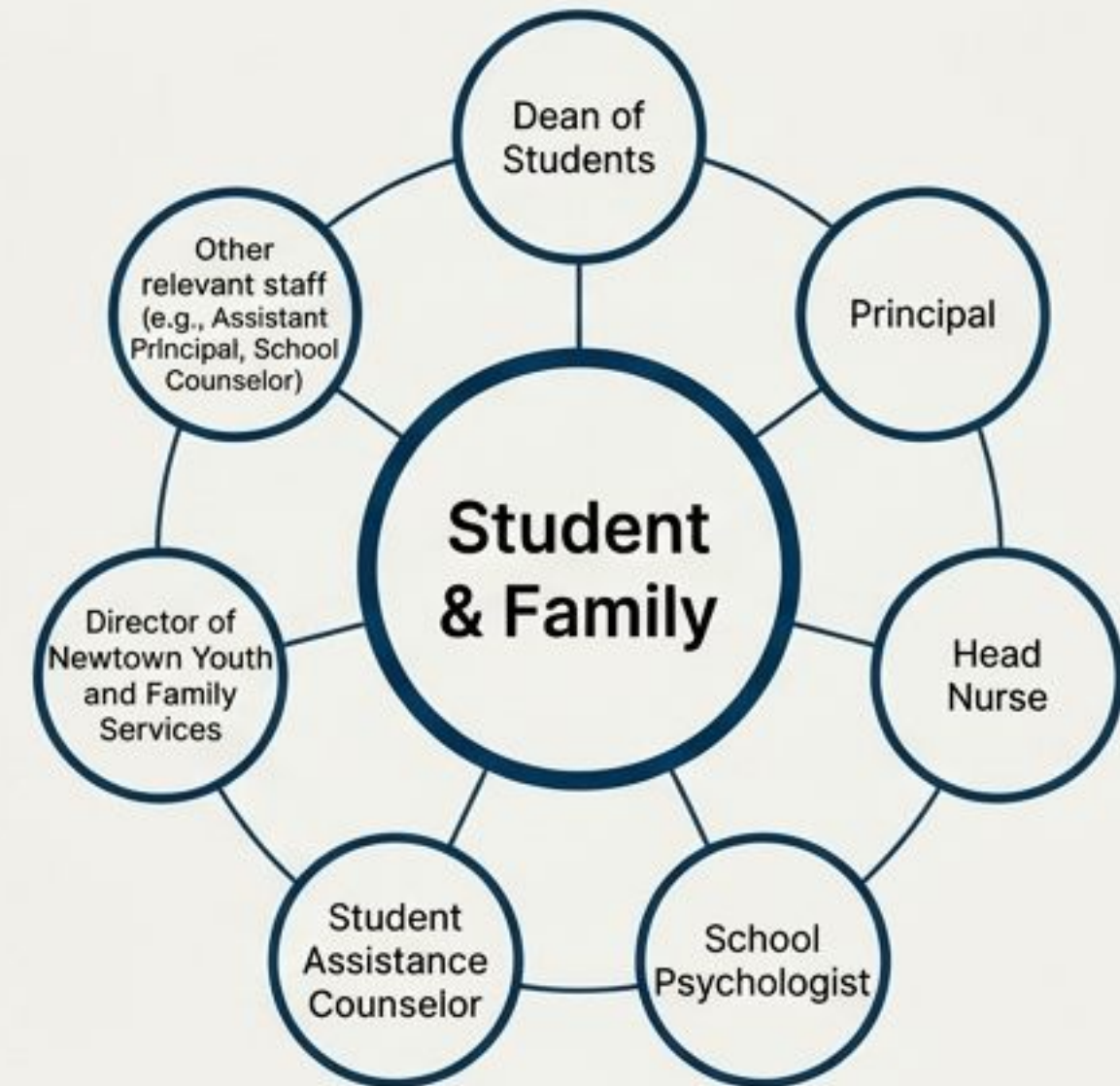
# Tier 3: The NHS Attendance Review Board

## Core Objective

To assess attendance patterns of selected students and provide support to reduce chronic absenteeism. Specifically, we aim to:

- Identify relevant barriers, aversions, or misconceptions regarding attendance.
- Determine any underlying issues of school disengagement.
- Identify and provide appropriate, targeted support for each student.

# Pillar 2: A Tiered Strategy for Family Partnership



## Tier 1: Universal Communication

- Monthly-themed “NHS Attendance Matters” parent/guardian newsletters with the same embedded student support videos.



## Tier 2: Proactive Notification & Collaboration

- Daily PowerSchool data analysis to communicate with parents/guardians about absence concerns.
- Weekly Logical Attendance Tracker analysis to automatically notify families via email, text, and PowerSchool letter when students reach 6, 9, 12, and 15 day absence marks.

*All communications translated into Spanish, Portuguese-Brazil, Albanian, and Ukrainian for ELL families.*

- Student/family/staff “care and concern” meetings.



## Tier 3: Intensive Partnership

- More frequent, direct communication with families.
- Participation in NHS Attendance Review Board meetings.
- Home visits.

# **Common Family & Student Attendance Misconceptions...**



## Why we count every day (The 10% Rule).

- **The Research:** Students who miss just 10% of the school year suffer significant academic harm.
- **The Hard Truth:** This applies regardless of whether absences are "excused" or "unexcused."
- **The Law: *Sec. 10-198c (2015)*** defines a "Chronically absent child" as one whose **total absences  $\geq$  10%** of their enrollment days.

# How the State defines “Present.”



## The 50% Threshold

(State Board of Education 2022)

*A student is “In Attendance” if they are present for at least half of the instructional school day.*

- ✓ Present at assigned school.
- ✓ Participating in a school-sponsored activity (e.g., field trip).
- ✓ Participating in authorized remote learning.

Note: Students serving out-of-school suspension are reported as “absent.”

# The Tipping Point for Excused Absences: Absence #10

## State Board of Education Guidance (2012)

### Level 1: Days 1–9



#### Parent Discretion

Requirement: Parent or guardian approval/note.

### Level 2: Days 10+



**Medical, Legal, Religious, Family Emergency, or Extraordinary Educational Opportunity Requirement.**

Requirement: Doctor's note, court document, or specific exemption only.

**Parent notes no longer suffice for illness.**

The 10-Day Rule: All documentation must be provided within 10 school days of the absence.

## Why We May Not Notice Chronic Absence



### Absences Add up

Chronic Absence = 18 days of absence = 2 days a month

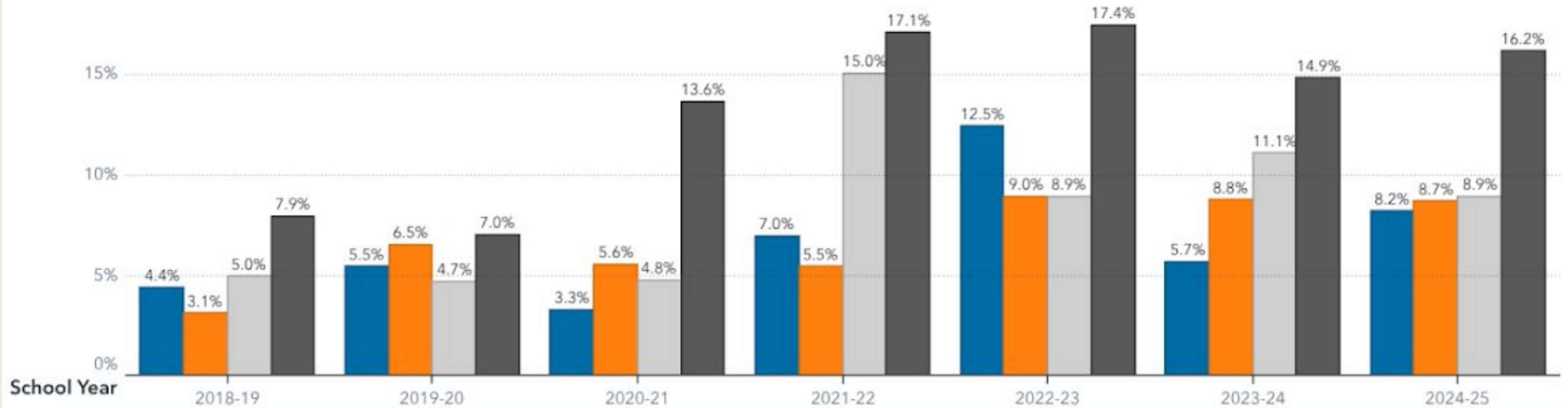

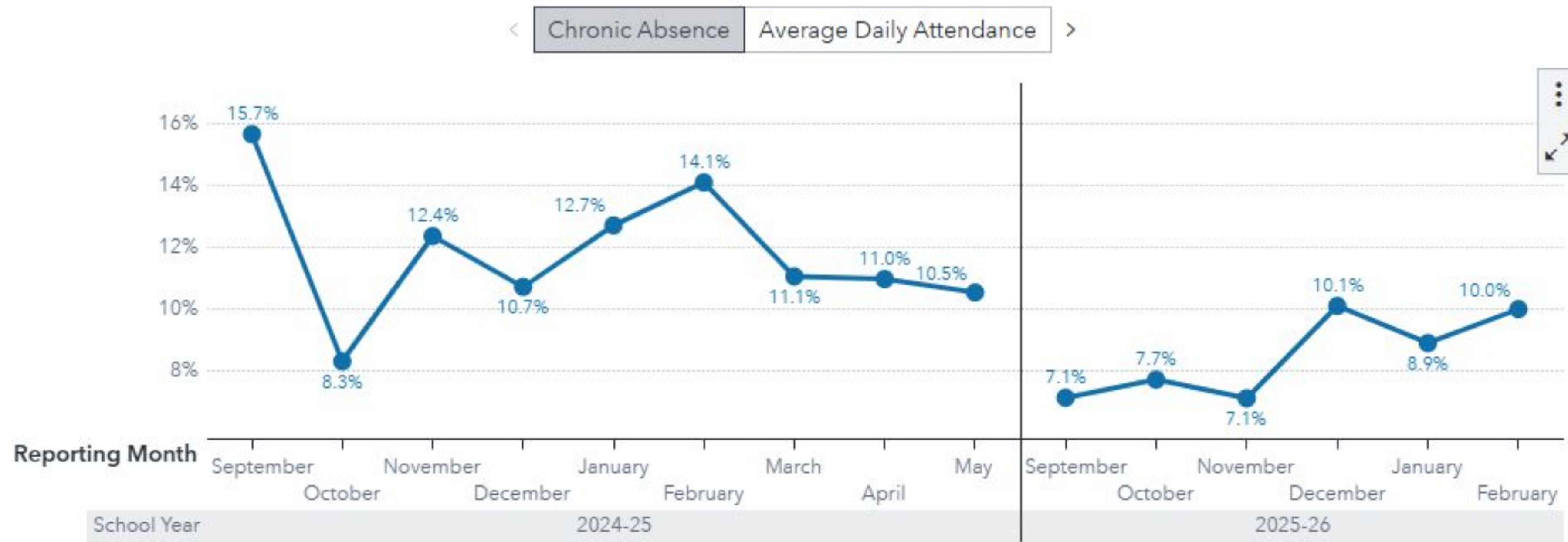

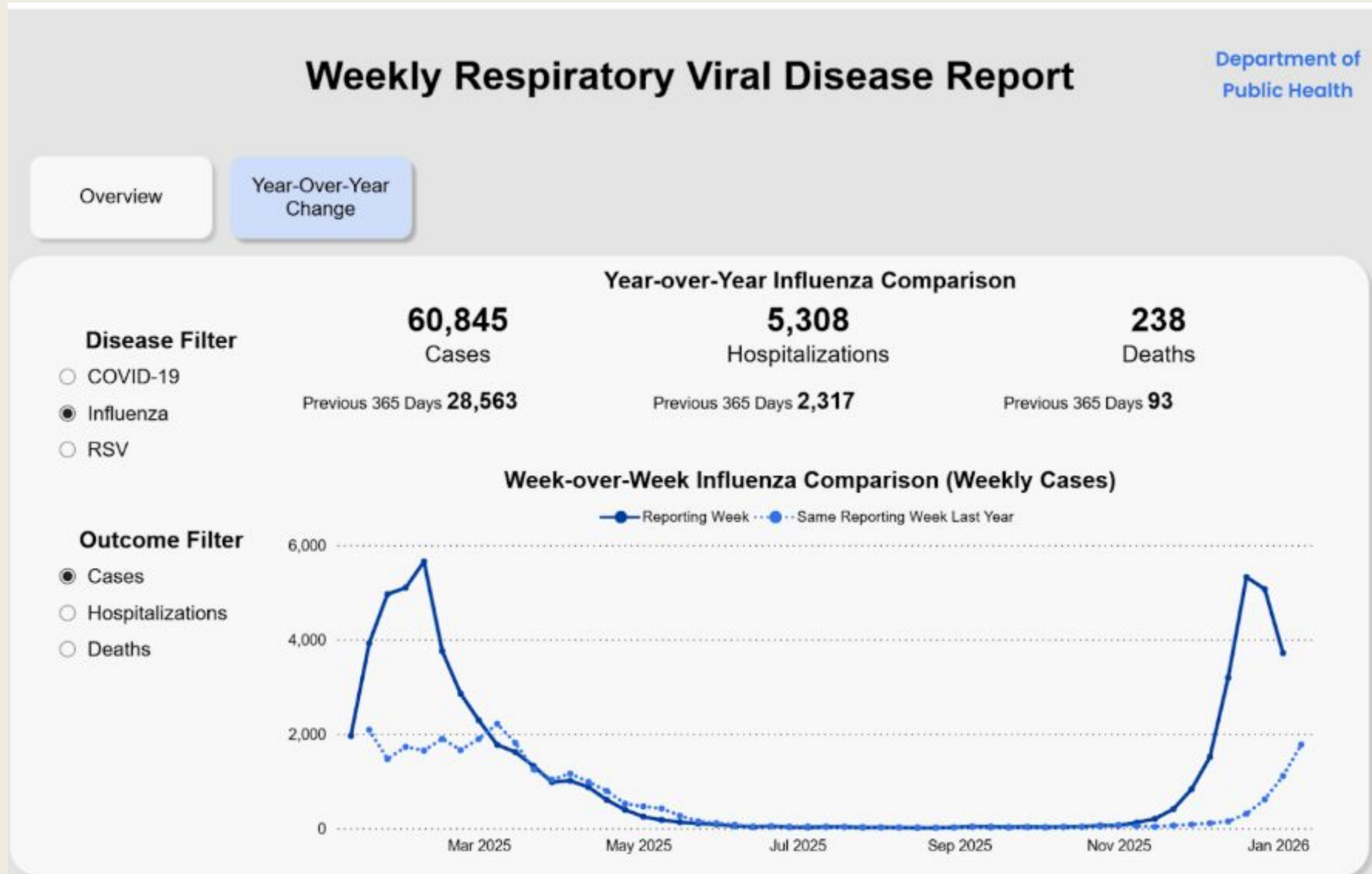

# Why Did Chronic Absenteeism in the Winter? Flu B



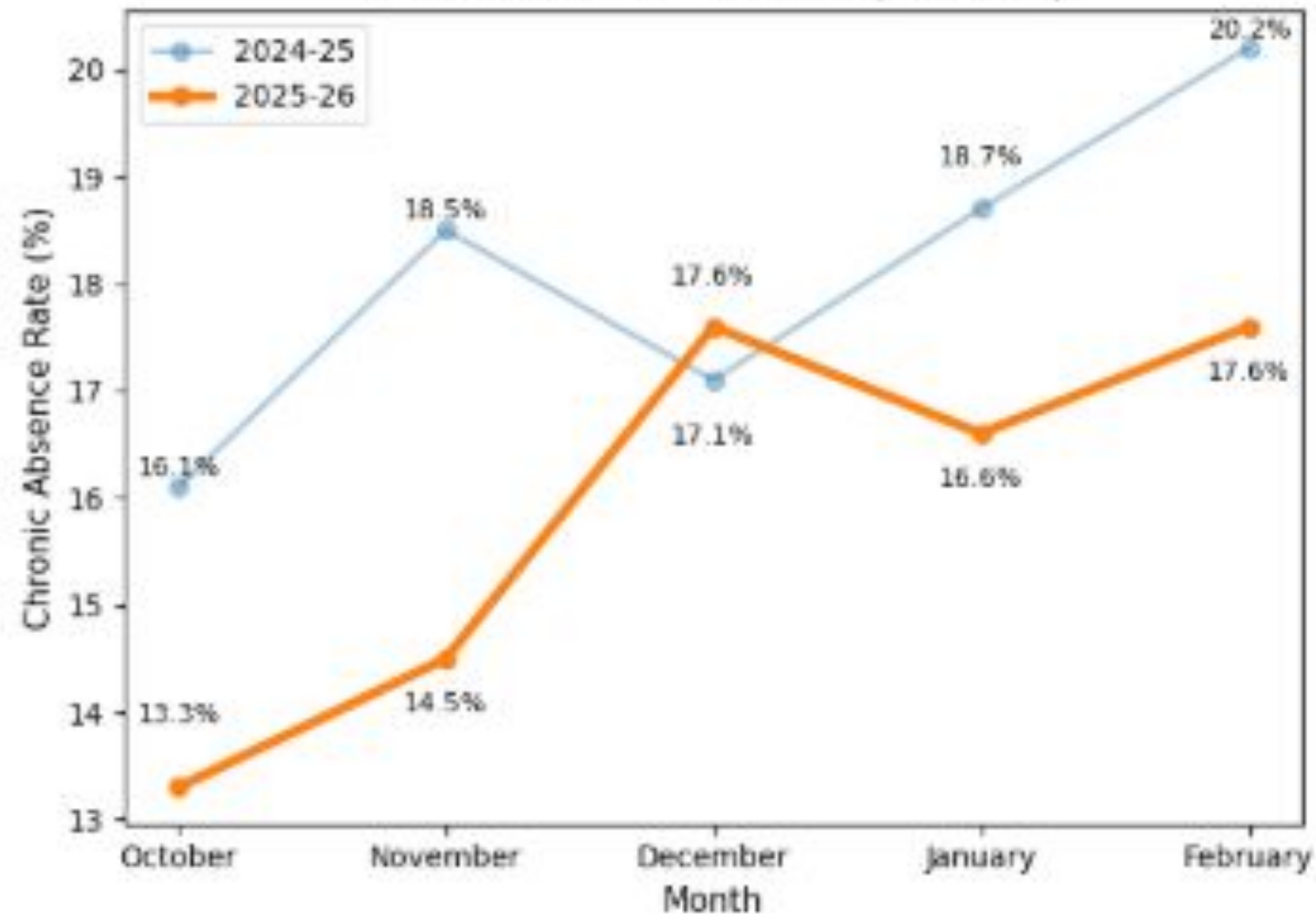

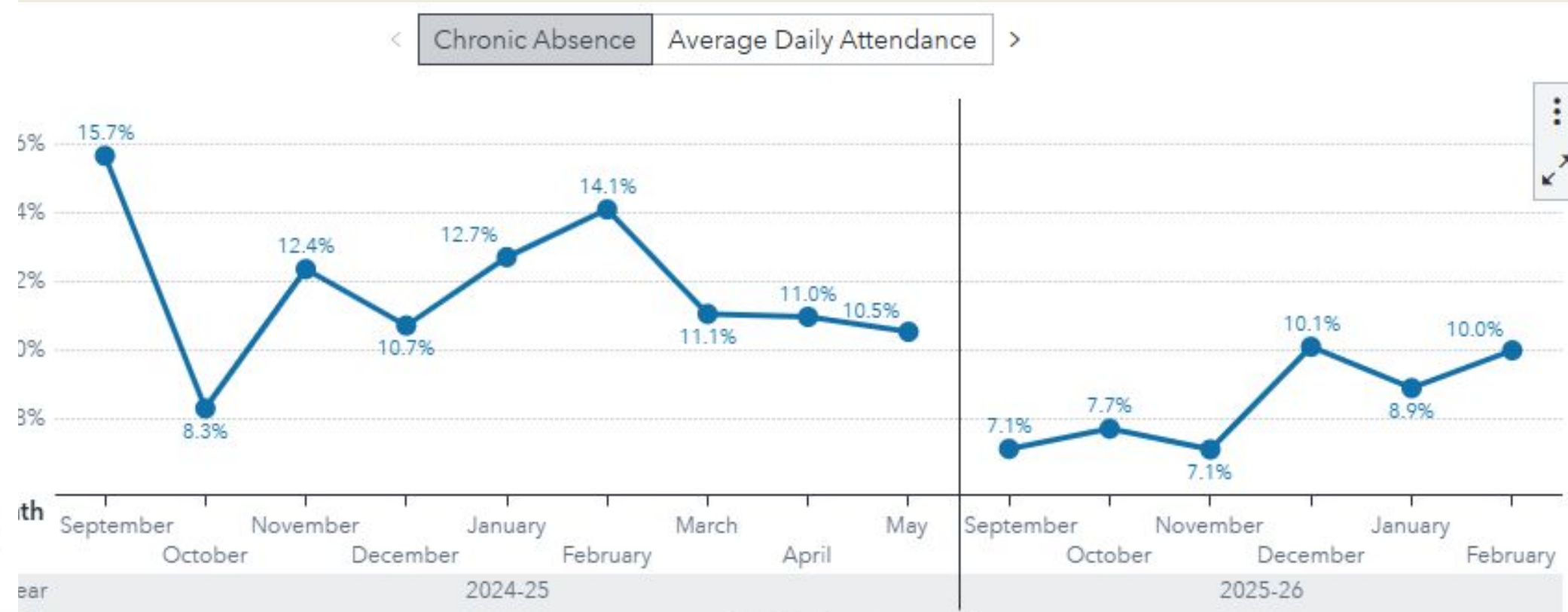
