Thank you for reaching out and for the work your team has put into your local designation system. We understand how important these results are to your district and your teachers.

Once Texas Tech completes data validation, TEA conducts a holistic system review prior to approving designation systems and teacher designations. Data validation results are final and cannot be overturned, as they reflect the evidence submitted during the validation window and are applied consistently across districts to ensure fairness and reliability.

The purpose of **Checks 2, 3, and 10** is to verify that teachers who demonstrate strong performance locally also meet the statewide bar for effectiveness. While the district is implementing the system as outlined in the application, the evidence for these checks shows that the local designation criteria are not yet calibrated to statewide rigor. This misalignment—along with additional **inconsistencies identified in other checks**—resulted in the district not meeting statewide expectations for approving proposed teacher designations this year.

We are glad to connect directly with your leadership team to walk through the report and identify opportunities for improvement.

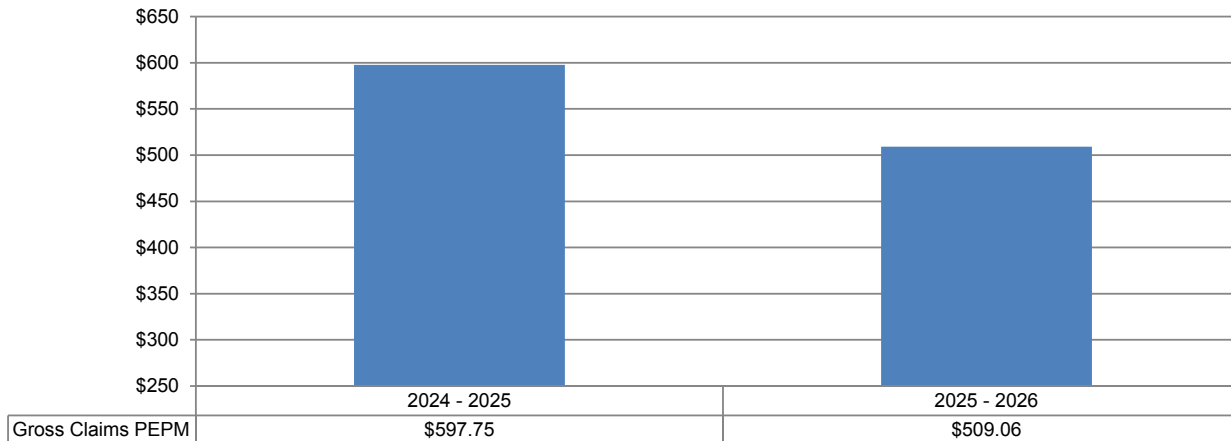

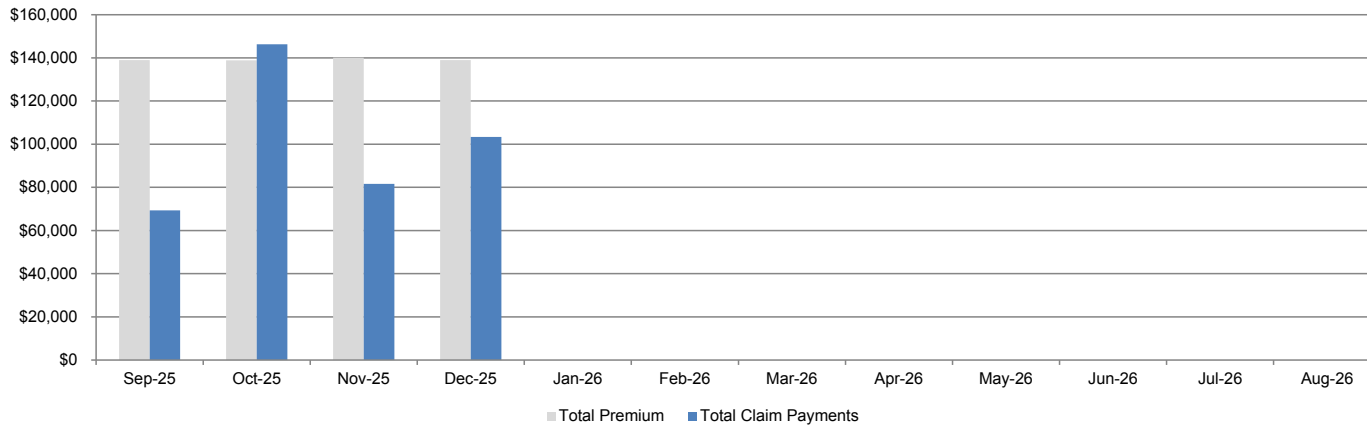

**Gross Claims PEPM**


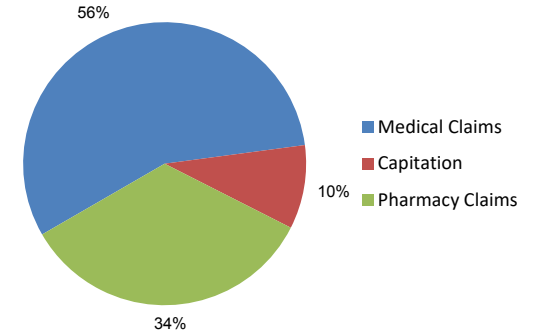
