ESY JUNE 2026

PAEC Academy

Academics

PAEC Academy successfully provided Extended School Year (ESY) services to more than 40 students this summer. The program focused on helping students recoup previously learned skills and maintain critical academic and functional abilities identified through their IEPs.

Students attended ESY from both PAEC Academy and their home district placements, resulting in a total of five instructional classrooms. Throughout the session, students received targeted instruction in reading and mathematics while participating in activities designed to promote engagement, communication, and social interaction.

In addition to academic instruction, students enjoyed structured outdoor recreation and water play activities, providing opportunities to practice social skills, follow routines, and participate in enriching summer experiences within a supportive educational environment. Overall, the ESY program successfully balanced academic intervention with developmentally appropriate recreational activities to support student growth and skill maintenance.

PAEC Early Childhood

The Early Childhood extended school year (ESY) program had 12 students that registered for the ESY program attended for all three weeks. Due to the ongoing construction, we did have all students housed in the PAEC Center building.

The students all had fun reviewing and maintaining their knowledge of letters, numbers 1-10 and basic colors. The classroom themes focused on summer topics such as water animals and summer fun activities. All the students received the related services of social work, speech, occupational, and physical therapy as recommended in their IEP.

We look forward to seeing all of our students back in August along with many new students that will be turning 3 years of age over the summer. We anticipate opening in the new school year with 19 students and 2 additional students that may be starting in early September after their eligibility meetings are conducted.

We plan to open with three classrooms and all 3 teachers are certified. We feel very lucky to have not only three certified teachers but they are all experienced in working with early childhood students. We will also have all our current veteran program assistants returning to our program.

Extended School Year 2026

During the month of June, PAEC Elementary welcomed fifteen students. With our facility being under construction for the GeoThermal project,

our students had direct access to PAEC Center's classrooms, playground and B-Pod. These spaces allowed students to enjoy breaks unstructured in lieu of technology breaks. PAEC Elementary would like to thank PAEC Center for the hospitality.

Daily, staff delivered whole- and small-group instruction, using smaller class sizes to promote rich classroom conversation and support students in developing appropriate prosocial behaviors.

PAEC Elementary students attended the Juneteenth Celebration hosted by PAEC Center. It was great to see our students in community with others across the district.

PAEC OT/PT Department

Staff adjustments: Based on current caseload assignments, we have all OT and PT positions filled for next year. Working on the paperwork for new direct-hired staff and staff who are converting from contract staff to PAEC direct hire next school year. Increased one OT from 0.60 FTE to 1.0 FTE.

Adjustments to the website: None at this time.

Activities of the department:

1. The AT Team has been working with students and staff during summer school on assistive technology and will continue to check in on students currently using AAC devices throughout the summer.
2. The OT/PT/AT departments conducted in-person services during summer school. They collaborated with teachers, program assistants, and other related staff to perform these tasks.
3. The OT/PT/AT departments are retrieving equipment throughout the districts and PAEC programs to ensure equipment is working properly and ready for the upcoming school year.
4. The OT/PT department worked on closing up the sensory rooms at PAEC Academy, PAEC Center, and PAEC Elementary at the end of the regular school year and summer school. The sensory rooms will reopen at the beginning of the new school year.
5. The OT/PT/AT department lead continues to work on assignment caseloads and make any adjustments for hiring to fulfill the specific discipline openings as needs arise.
6. The following OTs and PTs provided services during ESY: OT: Iris Cabrera, Jamie Kramer, Paul Mikelson, Ashley Strand, and Michele Wolter; and PT: Sandra De Jesus, Abbey Melling, Nancy Costello, and Julia Barnicle (Lead duties)
7. When needed during the summer months, our OT/PT Staff have been providing evaluation services to our member districts for students.
8. The OT/PT department worked on boxing up and making equipment ready for the PAEC Academy move from Divine Infant to Thurgood Marshall.
9. The Lead OT/PT/AT is working to set up new hire orientation, as well as the department meeting and professional development calendar for the upcoming school year.

PAEC Psychology Department

Dr. Michael Cermak, Lead School Psychologist, was officially elected President of the Illinois School Psychologist Association. His term will run from July 1, 2026-June 30, 2027. Dr. Cermak's presidential theme is Leading With Care: Improving Practice, Supporting People with an emphasis on mental health supports for children and families as well as supporting other psychologists and related services personnel to avoid burn out.

Dr. Tiffany Jenkins will be joining our team next year! She brings 8 years of experience and will be servicing Hillside School (District 93) and PAEC Alternative Therapeutic Day Elementary School as a direct hire. Welcome Tiffany!

Our psychologists with their NCSPs (nationally certified, the highest credential) have been working hard to submit their required documentation for renewal using the new system. Dr. Cermak and Dr. Gloria Washington (PAEC Alternative High School) both completed their renewals this June.

- SLP Shevawn Brekan, who has been contracted with PAEC through RCM, has converted to be a direct PAEC employee for the upcoming school year!

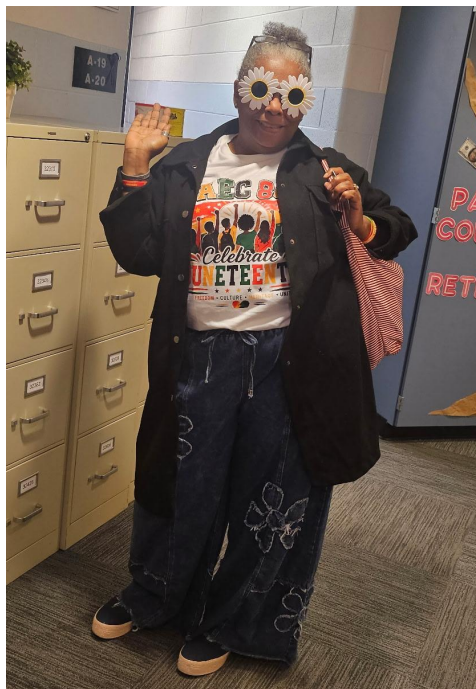
