Our school committees have been actively working to support student and staff well-being, academic progress, and overall school improvement this month.

Wellness Committee:

Our Wellness Committee is committed to taking a well-rounded approach to supporting the health and well-being of all students and staff. With an increase in illnesses—including COVID-19, Influenza A, and Norovirus—we are placing a strong emphasis on proper handwashing, particularly when handling food. To enhance prevention efforts, we will be distributing informational handouts on Norovirus. Additionally, we have received multi-testing kits from Tribal Public Health that screen for COVID-19, Influenza, and RSV, helping us stay proactive in identifying and addressing illnesses. Our commitment to student health also includes completing dental sealants for all students, a process that is currently underway. Lastly, the committee is actively monitoring the school's drinking water supply to ensure its safety and quality. Our goal is to keep everyone healthy by promoting good hygiene, prevention strategies, and overall wellness. Thank you for your support in fostering a healthy school environment.

Professional Learning Communities (PLCs):

Teachers are making steady progress on their curriculum maps, with most nearing completion for both reading and math. Tasks are being divided among educators to streamline the process, and support is available to assist as needed. In addition to mapping out the curriculum, teachers are reviewing standards for mastery and addressing any missed reading and math objectives to ensure student success.

The teams are also focusing on the essential components of their curriculum maps, ensuring alignment with BIE and ND State Standards. Discussions have centered on learning objectives, instructional strategies, assessment methods, and necessary resources. Moving forward, teachers will review their maps to confirm all required components are included, with a follow-up meeting planned for refinement and adjustments. The committee emphasized the importance of maintaining consistency across grade levels while allowing flexibility for teacher creativity.

School Improvement Team: Members will be attending the Cognia Strategic Planning sessions on February 12-13 to support our school's continuous improvement efforts. We appreciate the dedication of our staff and committees as they work to create a healthy, supportive, and academically strong environment for our students!

The Chief Financial Officer and Business Manager have the following report:

- Claims are being processed for the Title programs.
- The budget meeting is scheduled for next week.
- Getting ready for negotiations, which will be happening soon.

Negotiations Process Begins:

The Belcourt Association for Improvement of Teaching (BAIT) has given notice of their intent to negotiate in 2025 along with petition to school board to recognize BAIT as the appropriate negotiating unit. At this point, the school board is awaiting the petition signed by majority of BSD#7 teachers asserting that BAIT represents many of the BSD#7 teachers. Once the signed petition is received and the school board provides approval, negotiations must start within 30 days unless agreed otherwise by parties. The current teacher negotiated agreement expires June 1, 2025.

School Board Election:

The school board on February 11, 2025, approved the 2025 School Board election date as June 3, 2025, and corresponding election calendar.

2025 North Dakota Legislative Session – We are closely tracking the 2025 state legislative session in regard to bills that can significantly impact our BSD#7 education policy, funding, and other key areas. I primarily monitor bills that may affect budget and funding, policy changes, local control vs. state authority bills, education advocacy, student services, long-term planning. We analyze how bills will affect our district long term. In addition, North Dakota School Boards Association and the North Dakota Council of Education Leaders also monitor education related bills, but not specific to BSD#7 with the uniqueness primarily serving a high Native American student population with BIE funds schools.

Voucher Bills - We oppose the ND legislature considering allowing ND taxpayer funds to be directed in a “voucher” payment system to non-publics. My opinion is that public funds should support public schools, which serve all students and operate under clear accountability measures. Authorizing private schools’ vouchers could adversely drain resources from public schools. We continue to support allowing North Dakota public schools to enter into agreements with non-public schools to educate students while at minimum meeting the same standards that public schools must; these agreements can be for students with disabilities, alternative high schools, or joint educational opportunities.

Usage Agreement with Ray Keplin Equine Center – Currently finalizing the agreement with Ray Keplin Center (located within the District) for the purposes of TMHS rodeo club activities/practice, little kids/youth rodeo events, equine therapy sessions and other equine related school activities. We are currently working waiting on confirmation from our insurance provider that adequate insurance coverage is in place; after such confirmation, we will sign agreement, acquire student liability waivers from students that will use the equine facility under supervision of a TMCS staff member or advisor.

North Dakota Department of Public Instruction Change in Allocating Title I Funding to School Districts:

In 2023, ND DPI announced a change in the Title funds allocation method for ND school districts. The current method of allocating Title I funds in North Dakota school districts is based on a formula that used counts of low-income students, primarily derived from the number of students enrolled in the district eligible for the Free and Reduced-Price Lunch (FRPL) program. The Turtle Mountain School free and reduced lunch program student enrollment indicates student poverty percentage of 90%-100%. This formula method directed federal funds to school districts that served a higher percentage of low-income students, such as that of the BSD#7.

The ND DPI movement to census based allocation method, back in 2023, indicated a result of an estimated \$1.4 million dollar decrease in Title I funds awarded to the Belcourt School District primarily due to a 2021 census indicating 26% poverty level (versus the free and reduced lunch poverty level of 90%-100%) and out of district students funding remains with district of residence.

After consultations and testimonials in 2023, which the Belcourt School District was a part in asking for a transition period or a hybrid allocation method, ND DPI agreed to postpone the change in the Title I fund allocation method to school districts in North Dakota.

On January 7, 2025, ND DPI provided notification to school districts that ND would join 43+ states in using the US Department of Education (USED) school district census-based method to determine Title I fund allocations for the 2025-2026 school year for all ND school districts. The BSD#7 estimated 2025-2026 Title I allocation indicates a result of an estimated \$1.6 million dollar decrease in Title I fund.

In response to the decrease in Title I funding as communicated by the ND DPI, and to maintain current Title I services for students, discussions have been held weekly since January 7, 2025,

with each school administrator, in collaboration with the Federal Programs Officer. In addition, a meeting was held with ND DPI Superintendent, Dr. Shane Martin, Allan Malaterre (Board President) and other school administration. Meetings are on-going with ND State legislators in hopes of acquiring some additional “gap” funding in the state funding formula for the next biennium, which will help to ensure equitable opportunities for every student we serve. A proposal for additional funding is being submitted.

There is also a focus on school district level strategies to minimize loss of services to students. Immediate strategies to be incorporated, when possible, include attrition in school district Title I positions and reassignment of Title I staff to vacant positions as they become available. Other strategies may involve shortening employment terms for staff or identifying alternative funding sources to reassign staff. We will also explore renting space or implementing time and effort logging to charge services to other federal programs, resulting in revenue to the General Fund, which could be used to support Title I areas.

Our intention and goal for the 2025-2026 school year is to avoid a staff layoff situation. The new North Dakota Title I fund allocation method also does not, to which we are aware, affect BIE Title I nor TMHS 100-297 Grant Title I allocations or methods of disbursement.

Transportation Department:

Bus Barn Construction Project – We are in the process of selecting a project architectural and engineering firm. Once on board, we will finalize budget based on feasibility and bid out the project in spring 2025. This facility is intended to be located on the west (back) side of the bus garage. A bus barn is essential for sheltering our school buses from the elements, such as extreme temperatures, rain, snow, and sunlight, helps prevent weather-related wear and tear as well as better/warmer starting in cold temperatures.

NDHSAA Spectator Ejection Policy

On August 14, 2024 the NDHSAA Board of Directors approved a Class A Review recommendation to add a minimum penalty for spectators who are ejected from contests during the regular season. The policy was drafted by the NDHSAA Sportsmanship & Citizenship Committee prior to being approved.

Any attendee ejected from a regular season or NDHSAA tournament contest will incur a minimum three (3) game/event suspension from that team's games/events and all other NDHSAA games/events in the interim at any level of competition. If the ejection occurs with fewer than three (3) games/events remaining in the team's season, the suspension will carry over to the school's sports season which immediately follows. An attendee ejected for a second time during a school year shall be suspended for a minimum of one (1) calendar year from all NDHSAA regular and postseason events. NDHSAA member schools may increase these minimum penalties at their discretion.

NDHSAA BEHAVIOR EXPECTATIONS FOR REGULAR AND POSTSEASON COMPETITIONS:

Respect the American flag and the National Anthem. Contesting schools shall each have an authorized faculty representative present who shall be responsible for his/her school's participants, students, and fans throughout the contest. Spectators must wear appropriate clothing. Those who do not comply or who wear clothing that is vulgar, obscene or that in some other way inappropriate, as determined by school/tournament personnel, will be removed from the facility if they do not cooperate with this behavior expectation. The use of appropriate language is expected at all times. Profanity, negative chants, trash talk, name-calling, personal attacks or other acts of disrespect are unacceptable and must be immediately addressed by school/tournament administrators. Any discriminatory slur will result in immediate removal from the facility. Any attendee ejected from a NDHSAA tournament venue will be banned from the venue(s) for the remainder of the event. Respect the game/contest. Under no condition shall anyone other than the members of the official squad enter the playing surface. No one may interfere with the contest in any way. Handheld signs and flags, which do not obstruct the view of others, are permitted provided they are in good taste. Signs or other similar items contest/tournament officials deem to be in poor taste will be removed. Message or "white" boards are prohibited. The carrying of flags around the playing surface is NOT allowed. Artificial noisemakers of any kind (i.e. megaphones, cowbells, sirens, whistles, thunder sticks, and other similar items) are not allowed at any indoor events, including outdoor sports played at indoor venues. Exception – Megaphones appropriately used by cheerleaders are permitted if allowed by contest officials. Laser lights or any other lights deemed distracting to participants are strictly prohibited. The use of unmanned aerial vehicles (UAV), also known as drones, is prohibited at all contests.

School Board Report

March Board Report

Overview

In both Interim assessments NDA+ ELA and Math our 9th and 10th Graders are scoring within 10 points or less of the State Scale Score meaning our students are performing comparably to the rest of the students in the state on those assessments.

Key Observations:

- **Both 9th and 10th grades show positive NDA+ growth**, meaning students improved their NDA+ raw scores from Fall to Winter.
- **10th grade has slightly higher growth than 9th grade**, suggesting better retention or instructional effectiveness at that level.
- **Despite growth, performance levels remained at Level 1**, indicating that while scores improved, they might not have been significant enough to shift students into higher performance categories.

Key Takeaways:

1. **SPED/504 students consistently scored lower** than their general education peers across all measures (grades, assessments, and risk levels).
2. **The gap widened in Quarter 2**, indicating that performance differences may increase as the school year progresses.
3. **SPED/504 students had higher risk levels**, both in reading and math, suggesting a greater need for targeted interventions.
4. **Assessment scores for SPED/504 students were ~11 points lower** than their peers, reinforcing the need for additional academic support.
