Safety Committee:

Additionally, SIT/MTSS members are helping lead the organization of our summer school program—coordinating student selection, staffing, and resource needs to support a smooth and impactful experience.

We are proud of the collective efforts of our SIT/MTSS team and thank them for their ongoing commitment to fostering academic success, strong instructional practices, and a positive school climate for all students.

School Board Election: The school board on February 11, 2025 approved the 2025 School Board election date as June 3, 2025 and corresponding election calendar. School Board Candidate sign-up is March 1st through March 31st. Sign-up

2025 North Dakota Legislative Session – I am still closely tracking the 2025 state legislative session in regards to bills that can significantly impact our BSD#7 education policy, funding, and other key areas. Legislative session will wrap up by end of April 2025. Party demographics indicate Republican majority, evident with Governor seat, State House seats at 82 of 94 seats, and State Senate at 42 of 47 seats.

- House Bill 1369: This is the K-12 funding bill passed and includes a 2.5% increase in the per pupil payment for each year of the 2025-27 biennium, raising it to \$11,349 in FY 2026 and \$11,633 in FY 2027. The bill raises the threshold for bidding a public improvement project and for the requirement to procure plans, drawings and specifications from \$200,000 to \$250,000. The bill modifies construction or renovation project to require architectural design from \$200k to \$250k, and school district levies from 60 mills down to 45 mills. Our District wide enrollment is currently about 1,434 students.

- Senate Bill 2400 (Education Savings Account Bill): Bill did not pass.

- House Bill 1540 (Education Savings Account Bill): Bill did not pass.

- SB2241 (Charter Schools Bill) passed both house and senate, which is a charter school bill; just waiting for Governor signature. So, North Dakota now has an allowance and a framework for charter school operation and funding. Charter schools, from what I understand, are public institutions operated by nonprofits. SB2241 allows ND charter schools to receive per-pupil funding from the state and prohibits them from charging tuition. If I recall, about \$8.164k per student. I am not aware of any charter schools in North Dakota, but there is likely a reason this bill passed.

- HB 1214 (Transportation Bill) – This bill passed. Changes the transportation payment calculation for school districts. The formula would include factors of square miles of the district, number of runs, and number of buildings in the district. The formula would no longer use rides as a factor. Under current formula, we receive a transportation allocation based on number of rides and miles we provide as we are densely populated in our 6x12 school district. This bill changes the calculation to go by District square miles and weighted ADM related to ND per student payment.

ND School Based Medicaid Consortium – Our District, with the assistance of the ND South East Education Cooperative, has joined the ND School-Based Medicaid Consortium which works with special education units and school districts to access available federal reimbursement dollars for medically necessary services provided to students, specifically that of Medicaid. Our goal the District's Special Education Unit will facilitate enrollment of students into the Medicaid program with the District Special Education Unit recognized as a provider which may receive reimbursement for allowable services. During the 2025-26 school year, data and demographics will be collected and reimbursement should follow beginning in the 2026-27 school year.

2025-2026 School Wide Budget

The Belcourt School District Business Office staff is currently engaged in compiling the 2025–2026 school-wide budget. This process involves determining projected revenue from all funding sources, estimating salary and fringe benefit expenditures, and calculating operational costs necessary for the district’s day-to-day functions. Additionally, the team is incorporating anticipated expenses related to upcoming construction projects to ensure a comprehensive and balanced budget that aligns with district priorities and strategic planning. The 2024-2025 school wide budget was \$55,570,224, which included General Fund 01, Food Service Fund 05 and Student Activities Fund 06. We do not anticipate the 2025-2026 school wide budget to be at that level due to decreased carry over and revenues.

2025-2026 School Calendars

On May 13, 2025, the school board approved the 2025-2026 TM Elementary, Middle and High Schools Calendars. District school calendar term staff will return on School for 2025-2026 would begin on August 18, 2025. (Calendars are attached)

- The 185 day (1,480 hours) calendar for Elementary School consists of 173 instructional days, 5 professional development days, 2 parent teacher conference days and 5 paid holidays; the projected 1,032.91 instructional hours meets minimum required elementary school calendar standard of 962.5 hours per North Dakota Century Code.
- The 185 day (1,480 hours) calendar for Middle School consists of 173 instructional days, 5 professional development days, 2 parent teacher conference days and 5 paid holidays; the projected 1,177.75 instructional hours meets minimum required elementary school calendar standard of 1,050 hours per North Dakota Century Code.
- The TM High School calendar of 1,480 hours is based on a reconfigured 4 day week with alternating Braves Fridays resulting in 1,074 instructional hours (state required minimum is 1,050 hours); the TM High School calendar also includes 5 professional development days, 2 parent teacher conference days (8 hours) and 5 paid holidays (40 hours). TMHS Calendar hours total 1,480 hours.

TMBCI Field and Construction Update:

The Byron Dorgan Youth Wellness Center is coming along nicely. Concrete should be finished throughout the building this week which includes the track and outside areas around the track. Field Turf will start their work simultaneously with other work on-site at the TMCS baseball field for the infield of the BDYWC.

The General will begin the office area taping and texturing next week in hopes of wrapping that area up within 2 weeks-Beginning of June. Overhead Door Company will work with Legacy Builders on the design of overhead door to install within the next 3 weeks (1st week of June). Once the Offices are taped and textured, field turf is installed, CL Linfoot will finish fixtures and test the HVAC units.

Legacy Builders will be in, within the next three weeks, to do their finished work and will include a new overhead door header for the garage install-a final walkthrough will also be conducted at that time. At the conclusion of the taping and texturing, H2I group will start the installation of the court systems (looking like the 1st of June or 2nd week of June). Field Turf will finish their work with Benyon Track surface installation and painting of the lines. The General will start finish work on the Breezeway and outside lights along with outside drainage system and do clean up with hopes of a soft opening at the end of June. The track surfacing will be our hold-up but will not impede our soft opening in June.

The baseball field is also set to start again this week and be wrapped up with installation and lighting by the middle of June. From there, we will hydroseed the fields and be prepared for the beginning of the school year. The event staff will install the dugouts at the baseball field, and we will wrap that project up with hydro-seeding around that area of the baseball field, the softball fields, the football practice field and around the track and field apparatuses.
