MINUTES OF BOARD OF EDUCATION MEETING
March 29, 2022

The Board of Education of Jordan School District met in study, general, and closed sessions on Tuesday, March 29, 2022, beginning at 4:02 p.m. at JATC South (Board Conference Room), 12723 S. Park Avenue (2080 West), Riverton, Utah. The sessions were also provided electronically via YouTube.

President Miller presided and conducted. The Board of Education met in a study session to discuss the following:

A. Review of 2023-24 Calendar Survey

Caleb Olsen, Consultant of Planning and Enrollment, gave a brief review of two calendar options for 2023-24, noting public survey results from 8,419 respondents. He recommended changing the date for secondary spring parent conferences as it conflicts with Valentine's Day.

Board members agreed to bring calendar Option A, with a minor change to spring parent conference dates, to the general session for a vote.

B. Discussion on Updates to New Administrative Policy DP381 *Employee Code of Ethics*

Marilyn Richards, Finance Committee Chair, explained the phrase "policy provisions" was added to DP381 to align with other policies and she asked for Board input on wording about ethical behavior in regards to thank you gifts and recognitions.

Board members agreed to changing paragraph thirteen to refer to the "reasonable value" of gifts and to vote on the final revised policy in the general session.

C. Summer 2022 Project Review

Bryce Dunford, Facilities Committee Chair, reported that bids for summer projects had been received and a summary with projected costs was posted to BoardDocs. He said projected costs exceed the original budget of \$15 million by \$655,000, however the committee recommends proceeding with all projects.

Jen Atwood asked how the overage would be covered and Mr. Dunford recommended using South Jordan Redevelopment Agency (RDA) funds. Marilyn Richards, Finance Committee Chair, agreed with this recommendation.

The Board decided to present all bids for a vote of approval in the general business portion of the meeting.

D. Continued Discussion on Fee Schedule for 2022-23

Brad Sorensen, Administrator of Schools, referred the Board to the updated District fees webpage: fees.jordandistrict.org which clarifies why participation fees have increased and how fundraising money is used.

Matt Young asked if the Board would consider reducing the secondary general registration fees to offset the increase in participation fees for sports and activities. After considerable discussion, the Board agreed to lowering registration fees with the District assuming the difference. However, Board members couldn't come to a consensus on the amount of the reductions.

Mr. Young expressed the need for a data-collection tool that could assist the Board in future comparisons and year-end accounting of fees (how fees are spent, where funds come from, overages, etc.) He proposed the Finance Committee develop an athletic/activity financial template report, with standardized data, that could be filled out by schools in a timely manner and submitted to them for review each year. Dr. Godfrey concurred, saying this data will not only help the Board, but also coaches, advisors, and parents.

MOTION: It was moved by Bryce Dunford and seconded by Matt Young to direct the Board Finance Committee to develop a tool to understand the exact spending for each activity or athletics within a reasonable time that the activity is concluded. It is intended that this will be developed by the start of the 2022-23 school year and the committee will report the data back to the Board on a frequent basis. The motion passed unanimously.

As Board member's opinions differed in regards to the amount of registration fees to reduce, some "practice motions" were recommended to decide the final motion that would be brought to the general session regarding fees.

MOTION: It was moved by Bryce Dunford and seconded by Matt Young to reduce the general registration fee by \$50 for high school students and \$40 for middle school students. The vote was tied at three to three.

MOTION: It was moved by Darrell Robinson and seconded by Marilyn Richards to reduce fees by \$25 for high school students and \$10 for middle school students with the reduction coming out of the District portion of the fees and with the intent to bring this back for further study at a later date. The "practice" motion passed with a unanimous vote.

Mr. Young questioned the way fundraising is being communicated with parents and students. Mr. Sorensen mentioned more clarification may be needed and noted that our District is more strict than the State regarding fundraisers. President Miller said if members would like to add the fundraising policy to a future Board meeting agenda, they should let the Executive Committee know.

Mr. Robinson commended Jordan District for the work done on school fees during the past five years, noting it has been an example for other districts in the State. He also said it has developed further trust between administrators and coaches.

E. Review of Unfunded Bus Routes for 2022-23 School Year

Due to time constraints, it was decided to discuss this item in the continued study session following the general session.

F. Continued Discussion of Growing Enrollment at Ridge View Elementary School

Due to time constraints, it was decided to discuss this item in the continued study session following the general session.

G. School Start and End Times for 2022-23

Superintendent Godfrey gave a progress update, saying this topic is connected to Friday Schedules and both recommendations will be brought for further discussion at the Board study session on April 12, 2022.

Board First Vice President Dunford recommended consulting local school districts to see who have tried later start times to hear their feedback on the results. Dr. Godfrey said he would ask other Superintendents at the upcoming USBA Conference and give this information to the Board.

At 6:06 p.m., the meeting adjourned. The general session started at 6:32 p.m.

Mr. Young also asked about the “weight” of customer service versus cost in considering the contract and Ms. Matson stated 40% was customer service, 40% was cost, and 20% was adherence to terms.

III. **Special Business**

A. Recommendation to Approve Student Fee Schedule 2022-23

Darrell Robinson invited the public to listen to Board study sessions, where District policies and agenda topics are studied in depth including many hours spent discussing student fees. President Miller explained new legislation eliminates subsidizing of certain programs which has resulted in a fee increase, but the Board is proposing to offset this increase by decreasing general registration fees for secondary students. This will be taken from the District's portion in order to hold the schools harmless. She thanked high schools who have helped collect data on fees and invited Matt Young to explain a standardized financial reporting template that will be developed soon.

Mr. Young said the Board directed the Finance Committee to develop a reporting template to collect data on each extracurricular and athletic activity to help the Board better evaluate how fees are being generated and used and how these fees compare across the District. They hope to have this ready for schools to use beginning this fall.

In addition, fees will be re-evaluated at a later date this year. The motion passed unanimously.

B. Recommendation to Approve Calendar for 2023-24 School Year

President Miller recommended the Board approve the school calendar for the 2023-24 school year. She thanked the Calendar Committee and stakeholders for their input.

A. **Committee Reports and Comments by Board Members**

Bryce Dunford, Facilities Committee Chair, reported building assessments have been completed with administrators and staff and the committee will be presenting a list of potential summer projects for 2023 to the Board in June. He indicated West Jordan Elementary will be added to the watch list and a plan of action and timeline will be presented to the Board.

Darrell Robinson expressed concern over the safe walking route for Oak Leaf Elementary School which he does not believe is safe.

Jen Atwood asked about Board participation in local city parades and Ms. Miller said this will be brought to the next study session for further discussion.

Marilyn Richards, Finance and Audit Committee Chair, said they have had ongoing discussions about Truth in Taxation hearings. She mentioned the District Communications department has completed a video that will be shared with the public, regarding District finances and Truth in Taxation and invited input from the Board. Ms. Richards reported the committee is working to receive tax increment projects timelines from cities and announced both Riverton and South Jordan cities are having public hearings on April 5, 2022 regarding future potential RDAs.

Ms. Richards also announced the Utah High School Activities Association sanctioned boys volleyball for the 2023-24 school year.

President Miller said she enjoyed giving out the Jordan Education Foundation Outstanding Educator Awards and reminded the Board of the awards banquet for the top 12 teachers on April 13, 2022.

At 8:16 p.m., President Miller declared the meeting adjourned and announced that the Board would return to study session.

President Miller presided and conducted. The Board of Education continued its study session to discuss the following:

E. Review of Unfunded Bus Routes for 2022-23 School Year

Board member Matt Young explained the annual process by the Facilities Committee of analyzing bus routes under 50% utilization to determine the necessity of continuing the routes. The committee recommends eliminating all five middle school ALPS routes since three schools are housing this program now. They also recommend eliminating two routes that cover the entire District for Valley High students because of low ridership and the high per-student cost for the routes.

Mr. Young said the Western Springs bus “courtesy” route was also considered, but it is 100% utilized. If approved, it would be the third year for this temporary route. It was mentioned that Riverton City is making efforts to create a safe walking route and the Board decided to vote on approving the bus route for another year.

MOTION: It was moved by Bryce Dunford and seconded by Matt Young to approve one more year of funding the Western Springs Courtesy Bus Route. The motion passed unanimously.

The Board also agreed that unfunded routes should be placed on the next Board agenda including busing options for Valley High School.

F. Continued Discussion of Growing Enrollment at Ridge View Elementary School

Bryce Dunford, Facilities Committee Chair, approached the Board with four proposals to address the growing enrollment issue for this school:

- 1) To move forward with exploration of building a flexible facility
- 2) To move forward in getting a statement of qualifications (SOQ) for approximate building estimates
- 3) That the SOQ process would be turned over to staff with recommendations brought back to the Board
- 4) That the starting point timeline would be approved pending the Finance Committee’s proposal and the addition of stakeholder input.

MOTION: It was moved by Matt Young and seconded by Marilyn Richards to approve moving forward with exploring the idea of building a flexible space facility that will serve as a Campus “B” of Ridge View Elementary to address enrollment growth. The motion was approved by a vote of six to one. Mr. Robinson cast the dissenting vote.

Board members asked for a rough estimate of the building cost and square footage. Scott Thomas, Administrator of Facilities Services, estimated it would be approximately 100,000 Square feet and cost roughly \$28-35 Million (about \$300 per square foot). Dr. Godfrey suggested architects should be allowed to be creative in their design proposals to allow a broad range of building utilization.

MOTION: It was moved by Marilyn Richards and seconded by Bryce Dunford to approve moving forward with obtaining an SOQ for a building that would cost approximately \$28-38 Million with the projected size of approximately 100,000 square feet. The motion was approved by a vote of six to one. Mr. Robinson cast the dissenting vote.

Board members discussed the level of involvement of the Board in the design process and agreed to ask staff to move forward with obtaining the SOQ.

MOTION: It was moved by Marilyn Richards and seconded by Bryce Dunford the SOQ process will be turned over to staff with recommendations being brought back to the Board. The motion was approved by a vote of six to one. Mr. Robinson cast the dissenting vote.

Mr. Young mentioned the proposed timeline for this project was posted on BoardDocs and asked the Board for a vote of approval.

MOTION: It was moved by Bryce Dunford and seconded by Matt Young to approve the proposed starting point timeline for this project pending the Finance Committee proposal with the addition of a May to December period to obtain stakeholder feedback. The motion was approved by a vote of six to one. Mr. Robinson cast the dissenting vote.

It was noted that timeline constraints would necessitate exploring temporary boundary changes for the 2023-2024 school year. Board members decided on a vote.

MOTION: It was moved by Darrell Robinson and seconded by Marilyn Richards that staff will look at options and a timeline for temporary future boundary changes that meet the State timeline. The motion was approved unanimously.

H. **Update on Board Priorities on Challenges Board Members Would Like to Solve**

Dr. Godfrey said there is overlap in the three Board priorities and he presented a proposal for additional staffing that would maximize District resources and provide supportive measures directly affecting the quality of life at the school level. The proposal includes the following additions:

- 42 elementary and 6 middle school Counselors
- Assistant Principals for elementary schools with over 600 students
- An extra paid week in the summer for Elementary Head Administrative Assistants
- Changing the FTE for middle school Social Workers from half to full-time and adding one full-time Hall Monitor per middle school
- Three middle school Administrative Interns and one full-time Administrative Intern at each comprehensive high school
- A full-time Camp/Clinic ESP at the high school level
- Other ESP departmental positions

Dr. Godfrey noted the total estimated cost of this proposal is \$13,800,000 and said it propels the District forward with a focus on health and wellness; learning; preparedness; and employee, student and family quality of life. He projected it will help students, teachers and employees feel welcome and supported.

Board members expressed their excitement and gratitude for the thorough proposal and said the next step is determining what changes the Board's budget can accommodate.

I. **Board and Superintendent Reports and Comments**

There were no additional reports or comments from the Board or Superintendent.

MOTION: At 10:41 p.m., it was moved by Jen Atwood and seconded by Darrell Robinson to go into closed session. The motion passed with a unanimous vote.

President Miller presided and conducted. The Board of Education met in a study session to discuss the following:

A. Summer Events Calendaring

President Miller invited Board discussion on two items: parades and the summer Board session. Although parades help in connecting with the community, Board members expressed the desire to take a break from participating this year due to scheduling conflicts. They agreed to discuss this again next year. Jen Atwood expressed appreciation to the Facilities department for their work in helping to make parade experiences successful.

Ms. Miller, Executive Committee Chair, recommended a “strategic planning session” for the Board and suggested the following agenda topics: review of Ends policies, “Portrait of a Graduate”, or developing a 5-10 year growth plan. Board members were in support of a summer session and will determine the date at a later time. Ms. Miller requested Board members let the committee know if they prefer a specific topic or meeting location.

President Miller welcomed Dr. Godfrey, who joined the meeting after immediately returning from the Utah School Superintendent Association (USSA) conference.

B. Procedural Safeguards and Organization of Special Education

Dr. Godfrey mentioned this was a continuation of a presentation given in the March 15, 2022 study session. President Miller invited Kim Lloyd, Director of Special Education, and Amanda Bollinger, Staff Assistant in Special Education, to resume their presentation.

Ms. Lloyd noted this discussion is based on general or ideal situations, although there are many unique and complex situations in special education. She commended the outstanding special educators in Jordan District and recognized the many hours they spend in IEP meetings.

Ms. Lloyd discussed five more key ideas: eligibility assessments and determination, the Individual Education Program (IEP), the definition and scope of “Least Restrictive Environment” (LRE), parental rights and procedural safeguards, and District and teacher expectations in special education.

Board members asked for clarification about the amount of IEP meetings, the electronic signing option in Goalview (the online IEP data storage system), and which safeguards are put in place by our District. Ms. Lloyd said the number of IEP meetings vary, but can be held virtually and documentation signed electronically. She discussed the federal and State safeguards for students and parents, noting there are none for public employees. Board members wished to discuss this further in a future closed session and asked for a list of LEA expectations.

Ms. Bollinger presented information about the hiring process and support for special education teachers. She noted a new mid-year hiring fair, the hiring of additional itinerant staff, and more training and support which helps fill needs in the Special Education department. Matt Young asked about the average tenure of special educators versus regular educators in the District. Dr. Godfrey agreed to work with staff on gathering useful data for further discussion on this topic.

C. Summer Schedule for Employees

Dr. Godfrey announced he would like the Board to consider a pilot program to alter two weeks of summer hours for the staff at schools and District offices. He proposed during the weeks of July 11 and 18, 2022, staff would work four 10 hour shifts on Monday-Thursday with Friday off. He noted there could be flexibility for those positions that, due to the nature of their job, cannot adhere to this schedule. He expressed appreciation for the research done on other districts’ summer hours by the Business Administrator, John Larsen, and the Board agreed to moving forward with this plan.

D. Discussion on Friday Schedule for 2022-23

Superintendent Godfrey proposed a recommended schedule for Fridays during the 2022-23 school year. He said although the transition time between AM and PM kindergarten has been difficult for some teachers, he would like to preserve the additional hour of kindergarten instruction time. He mentioned he would like to meet with focus groups in the next few weeks to study the issue further.

Dr. Godfrey said the proposed schedule remains unchanged for elementary and high school, but alters the middle school hours to begin at 10:00 a.m. and end at 3:00 p.m., with a half hour of flexible learning time built into the schedule. He said this would help with busing, and student flex and enrichment time. Board members expressed interest in a small adjustment to the pick-up bus time for middle school students. They decided to let administration decide the Friday schedule going forward, with the expectation that the Board will be informed about final scheduling decisions.

It was also decided that kindergarten information will be brought back to the Board at one of the next two Board meetings.

E. School Start and End Times for 2022-23

The Board decided to postpone this agenda item until the April 26, 2022 study session.

F. Update from School Closure Policy Committee

President Miller said an updated policy draft is posted on BoardDocs and she asked Board members for feedback. She explained the word “policy” was taken off the heading because it was redundant.

It was decided to bring this policy to the April 26, 2022 Board meeting for a vote of approval.

G. Discussion on Potential District School Community Council Proposal

Darrell Robinson made a proposal to the Board for a District-wide School Community Council to inform parents, clear up misconceptions, and solicit input. He noted Granite District has a similar council and he shared a link to their website that includes meeting minutes. He asked the Board for feedback on the idea.

The Board agreed to an ad hoc committee drafting a proposal in policy format. Darrell Robinson, Niki George, and Tracy Miller agreed to be a part of this committee and to bring the draft to a future Board meeting for further discussion.

H. Review of National School Board Association (NSBA) Conference

President Miller reported that Board members, Superintendent Godfrey, and John Larsen attended the recent NSBA conference and she invited those that attended to share highlights.

Darrell Robinson enjoyed a class about student and teacher well-being. He said it discussed issues like stress and poor compensation and recommended ways to better support district employees. He loved the class on “Principles of Mr. Rogers Neighborhood” which used Mr. Rogers as an example on how to be more innovative, creative, and loving. Mr. Robinson commended the District Communications team and Dr. Godfrey for their presentation about the “Supercast,” noting it has received national recognition.

Niki George agreed with Mr. Robinson and gave a shoutout to our District Communications department for their enthusiastically received presentation. She enjoyed classes on “Portrait of a Graduate”, non-defensive communication, and a dance performance entitled the “Power of Yet.” She said we need to create safe places where people can express themselves in a non-divisive way. Ms. George also expressed appreciation for Mr. Robinson’s Facebook posts after Board meetings that explain to the public “what happened and why.”

Jen Atwood stated she learned a lot about how to better communicate with patrons, parents and students. She also enjoyed the "Portrait of a Graduate" class and a presentation about Dual Language Immersion (DLI). Ms. Atwood congratulated the Communications department for their successful presentation and said it garnered a lot of interaction and interest.

Marilyn Richards expressed kudos to Superintendent Godfrey and the Communications team. She was also intrigued with the "Portrait of a Graduate" class and shared handout highlights with Board members. She recommended the Mr. Rogers book and loved the idea of always being curious. Ms. Atwood concurred, with a reminder that it is part of Dr. Godfrey's District motto.

Tracy Miller came away with the impression that Jordan District is "awesome." She expressed gratitude for the Board and administration who accomplish great things with our large District. Ms. Miller said she would like to explore more ways to connect with the community, and Board members agreed to reinstate the Community Outreach Committee for this purpose.

Dr. Godfrey echoed what was reported, and thanked all who contributed to their multi-media presentation. He expressed gratitude for the great relationship administration has with Board members and he thanked them for their support.

Dr. Godfrey attended presentations about more effectively connecting with the community, recruiting and retaining employees, and instruction "service centers" that provide services for smaller districts in the State. He said there were great ideas to make things more engaging without taking more time or adding stress.

John Larsen enjoyed learning about a unique approach to creating a magnet school to alleviate overcrowding, but he felt the District's "Supercast" presentation was the most "engaging and phenomenal." He also attended a moving class by Liz Murray, a woman who overcame insurmountable odds to reach her dreams of becoming a Harvard graduate. Ms. George added that this class was very inspirational.

I. Board and Superintendent Reports and Comments

Tracy Miller, Executive Committee Chair, announced that due to Matt Young's LEAC resignation, a new chair is needed. She announced the appointment of Bryce Dunford to this position. She also said the new Government Relations Chair would be Niki George.

Marilyn Richards, Facilities Committee Chair, reported the independent auditor, Chris Harding, needs to be released from the District project after its completion due to his heavy responsibilities. She also projected the revised tax increment considerations list will be finalized by the next Board meeting.

Ms. Richards thanked those that worked on the finance video that was to be shared with the public and asked Board members for feedback and direction on the next step. Board members discussed using smaller segments of the video (highlighting the fact that "Jordan District does more with less") or posting graphics or articles on social media.

Niki George attended the region PTA meeting where they asked for ways to encourage volunteers or make fingerprinting more accessible. Dr. Godfrey noted the large expense and explained policy DE502 *Volunteer Services* only requires fingerprinting if a volunteer is alone with students. He suggested the need to be thoughtful and intentional as the policy is reviewed and look for ways to increase access. Ms. George said PTA members were also concerned about schools using classrooms inappropriately to address discipline issues. They requested this be included in further discussions about special education.

President Miller reminded the Board about the Jordan Education Foundation awards banquet on April 13, 2022 and Dr. Godfrey reported the District retirement dinner will be held May 17, 2022 at Gardner Village.

SUBJECT: School Consolidation/Closure

I. Board Directive

The Board of Education seeks to provide every student with access to a high-quality learning environment that provides superior educational programming and supports student health and well-being. Board members recognize that at times there may be the need to reconsider the use of District buildings. The Board strives to maximize the efficient use of District facilities while balancing the effect that changes can have on students, families, employees, and communities. The Board of Education has the sole authority to consolidate or close Jordan District schools.

The Administration is authorized to administer school consolidation and/or school closures under the direction of the Board.

II. Administrative Policy

- A. When reviewing the use of District facilities, the Board of Education will consider applicable factors including but not limited to:
 - 1. Need for significant investment in a building
 - 2. Supplementing general teacher Full Time Equivalent (FTE)
 - 3. Decreasing enrollment over time, building capacity, and enrollment of near-by schools
 - 4. New opportunities or use for District needs

- B. When changes are made, the priority of the Board is to provide students and staff with the opportunity to experience a smooth transition. If the Board decides to pursue consolidation or closure, the following conditions will be in place:
 - 1. Teachers who are subject to policy [DP327 NEG - Reduction in Licensed Staff](#) will have access to the negotiated policy protections which include one year of substituting with benefits and guaranteed opportunity to interview.
 - 2. Education Support Professionals (ESP) who are subject to policy [DP349 NEG - Reduction in Force – Contract Education Support Professionals](#), who apply for and are offered a position at a lower lane, will have their pay held harmless for a period of one year.

- C. Additional consideration will be given to the following possibilities:
 - 1. Provide temporary transportation to ease transition.
 - 2. Create a sense of ownership for all students at the receiving school(s) such as:
 - a. New name for school
 - b. New mascot
 - c. Building improvements
 - d. Additional programs
 - 3. Have a plan for the use of the closed school that prioritizes a new opportunity or is utilized for District needs.
 - 4. Bring in an outside entity to facilitate stakeholder conversations.

SUBJECT: School Consolidation/Closure Policy

D. Timeline:

1. October/November
 - a. Enrollment, capacity and projection data provided to the Board by staff.
 - b. Staff provides Facilities Committee with information on schools that meet the trigger points and an initial analysis of the trigger point data:
 - 1) Estimated costs associated with all short-term repairs, building lifespan needs over the next five (5) years, and/or addressing the structural safety issues is greater than 35% of the estimated cost of building a new school.
 - 2) General teacher FTE supplemented to allow for two teacher options per grade level in an elementary school.
 - 3) Enrollment is below 850 for a middle school.
 - 4) Five-year enrollment projection data indicates the school will be at or below 50% of capacity and surrounding schools will be at or below 65% of capacity.
 - c. Facilities Committee notifies all Board members of schools being discussed and involves the Board member representing the affected school(s) in the discussions.
 - d. Facilities Committee will analyze trigger point data, school information, potential resolutions, and determine if further action is recommended.
2. March - June
 - a. Facilities Committee presents recommendation(s) to the Board.
 - b. Board reviews the recommendation(s) and identifies next steps.
 - 1) If the Board determines further action is necessary, the potentially impacted areas will be identified.
 - 2) If the Board determines no further action is necessary at this time, a timeline for re-evaluation will be established.
3. May/June
 - a. Provide notice to required groups of potential school consolidation or closure 120 days prior to final approval. [Utah Code 53G-4-402\(21\)\(a\)](#)
4. August/September
 - a. Feedback on options is received from patrons through open houses with stakeholders, surveys, and meetings with other focused stakeholders. (SCC, PTA, faculty, etc.)
5. October/November
 - a. Provide opportunity for public comment during at least two public school board meetings.
 - b. Hold a public hearing on the issue.

6. November/December
 - a. Final vote is held during a public general meeting by the Board of Education.
 - b. Approved changes take effect the subsequent school year unless noted by the Board.
