SUBJECT: STUDENT INFORMATION NETWORK ACCEPTABLE USE POLICY

I. Board Policy Directive

The Board recognizes the need for a policy governing the use of the electronic information resources by students as outlined in [Utah State Code §53G-7-1002](#) and [§53G-7-1003](#). **The Board is committed to fostering an educational environment where students are encouraged to be curious and intentional, and the school community is united in using digital resources in schools. This policy promotes the positive use of technology for all students in the District in alignment with Jordan's Portrait of a Graduate.**

Responsibility is delegated to the District administration for implementing the policy according to established **guidelines policy provisions.**

II. Administration Policy

The Acceptable Use Policy shall be administered and implemented according to the terms and conditions outlined in the following **guidelines policy provisions:**

A. Scope

This policy references the use of electronic information resources made available to students by Jordan School District. These resources include, but are not limited to, voice mail, electronic mail, the Internet, and other network files or accounts provided to students. Student use of electronic information resources must be in support of education and research and must be consistent with the educational objectives of Jordan School District. While access to all materials on a worldwide network cannot be controlled, Internet access in Jordan School District is filtered and monitored **with the use of a content filtering system on an ongoing basis to restrict access to internet and online sites that contain obscene or inappropriate material.**

B. Terms and Conditions of This Policy

1. Acceptable Network Use

- a. Students will use the Internet and other electronic information resources in an appropriate manner, abiding by the rules and regulations described in this policy.
- b. Students who formally publish school or District related information on the Internet must have proper approvals and abide by District publishing guidelines and procedures (as per [D212—District and School Web Sites](#)).
- c. Students are expected to abide by generally accepted rules of network etiquette. These rules include, but are not limited to, being polite, never sending or encouraging others to send abusive messages, and never using inappropriate language.

2. Unacceptable Network Use

- a. Students may not intentionally transmit or receive material in violation of law or District policy. This includes, but is not limited to, pornographic, indecent or sexually suggestive materials, weapons, controlled substances or alcohol, or incendiary devices. A student may not be in possession of or use pornographic material on school property. Users are prohibited from posting or sending content that contains threats or is hatefully or racially, ethically or otherwise objectionable.

SUBJECT: STUDENT INFORMATION NETWORK ACCEPTABLE USE POLICY

- b. Students may not participate in or promote any illegal or inappropriate activities, disruptive use of the network, or activities of any kind that do not conform to the rules, regulations and policies of Jordan School District.
 - c. Students may not use the network for product advertisement or political lobbying.
 - d. Students may not reveal personal information such as names, addresses, telephone numbers, passwords, credit card numbers or social security numbers. Releasing personal information of others or that of organizations associated with the District is prohibited.
 - e. Students may not intentionally harm or destroy District data, the network, or network performance. This includes, but is not limited to, creation and introduction of computer viruses, unauthorized access to restricted systems or programs, or using the District network to illegally access other systems.
- 3. Expectation of Privacy
 - a. Student files, disks, documents, etc., which have been used or created with District electronic information resources are not considered private.
 - b. Electronic mail transmissions are not private.
- 4. Discussion/Submission
 - a. Students will participate in a discussion with a parent or legal guardian District policy AA445— Student Information Network Acceptable Use Policy, which includes proper behavior and use of the network.
 - b. Students will receive training regarding appropriate online behavior, including interacting with other individuals on social networking websites and in chat rooms, and cyberbullying awareness and response.
 - c. Students will be required to submit a new [Student Signature of Agreement Form](#) each year or upon special request.
- 5. Disciplinary ~~Action~~Procedures and Guidelines
 - a. The combined signatures indicates that the student and parent/legal guardian has carefully read, understands and agrees to abide by these terms and conditions regarding proper behavior and use of the network. The signatures on the Student Signature of Agreement Form are legally binding.
 - b. Students who violate the terms and conditions of this policy will be subject to disciplinary action, including the possibility of suspension or expulsion from school and appropriate legal action. Access to electronic information may be limited, suspended or revoked.
 - c. Complaints, observed behavior and enforcement of this policy will be handled by district administration. The terms and conditions as outlined in this policy are available for review at the school and are in place for district administration to enforce the policy.
- 6. Parent or Legal Guardian Resources
 - a. At the request of the student's parent or legal guardian, the District will restrict the student's internet access on their school-approved electronic device to websites or online resources preapproved by District administration. District administration will review this approved list for any inappropriate content before the three-year review of this policy takes place as required in Utah Code 53G-7-1003.

SUBJECT: STUDENT INFORMATION NETWORK ACCEPTABLE USE POLICY

- b. The District will provide a parent-accessible monitoring system that will enable parents and legal guardians to review the internet activity of their student's school-managed devices.

President George presided and conducted. The Board of Education met in a work session to discuss the following:

A. Board Self-Assessment

President George introduced Richard Stowell, Jennifer Partridge, and Mark Clement of the Utah School Boards Association. The group briefly reviewed a survey of Board members on various thoughts regarding board improvement and collaborative efforts. They also discussed the role and responsibilities of being a board member.

B. Board Goal Setting

President George led a discussion on how the Board can improve their practices and recommended members review comments made in the Board survey. It was decided Board members will take the USBAs board assessment survey every odd-numbered year, and future meeting agendas will include the topic "Board Member Professional Learning."

C. Break: Mind-resilient Lifelong Learners Activity

D. Empathetic Communication Strategies

Stacey Worthen, Counseling Consultant in Student Services, explained empathetic communication, noting it is included in the District's Portrait of a Graduate. She discussed the 3Cs of empathy: curiosity, care, and connection; and demonstrated the importance of perspective in understanding and connecting with others.

E. Five-Year Housing Plan

Mr. Barnett shared his perspective on the building plan, explaining the Board's established policy which specifies they receive a 5-year enrollment forecast annually from administration. This data is reviewed to determine districtwide needs.

Erin Barrow shared thoughts from Board members from a recent 5-year plan survey that focused on facilities and housing of students. The Board discussed steps toward a possible closure of Joel P Jensen Middle School and the needs and possible locations of CTE campuses.

Consideration was given to the timing of building a new school on the Terraine property. Staff was directed to inquire about possibilities of amending the construction timeline to a later date.

Discussion was held about constructing field houses, including a possible timeline for a general obligation bond vote and communication to educate the public prior to a vote.

At 12:23 p.m., the Board recessed for lunch. The Board reconvened at 2:09 p.m.

Vice President Bryce Dunford presided and conducted. The Board of Education met in a study session to discuss the following:

A. Technology Use in Schools

Richard Culatta summarized his presentation “From Screentime to Screen Value” given at the Districtwide Professional Development Day on August 11, 2026, and invited questions from the Board. He commented that what is being done with technology in education is more important than the amount of time spent on it. The focus should be on the “why.”

Mr. Culatta made three recommendations to the Board to support technology use in classrooms: 1) Prioritize professional development for teachers; 2) Remove technology and tools that are not teaching; and 3) Involve parents and model what good use of technology looks like.

B. Board Member Professional Learning

Erin Barrow introduced a three-minute professional development moment that will be included as an agenda item at each Board meeting. Ms. Barrow spoke about what she has done with the resiliency challenge from PEHP and how she is applying the information to become a better Board member. Darrell Robinson accepted this assignment for the next meeting to be followed by Suzanne Wood, Lisa Dean, Brian Barnett, Niki George, and Bryce Dunford.

The America 250 project professional development will be on the agenda for the next meeting.

C. Review of Administrative Policy AA445 *Student Information Network Acceptable Use Policy*

Business Administrator John Larsen reviewed proposed changes to policy AA445 *Student Information Network Acceptable Use Policy* to comply with changes to Utah Code 53G-7-1003. He noted that many of the new requirements were already in place in Jordan's current policy. David Bowman and Anthony Muto assisted in the policy review and answered questions.

Action items in the law include: 1) the policy must be approved in an open meeting; 2) the policy needs to be reviewed every three years; and 3) information on the policy must be posted in a conspicuous place in every school.

Assignments were made as follows:

Mr. Barnett is to consider the frequency at which pre-approved websites are reviewed to evaluate if it would be advantageous to revisit them more often than every two to three years.

Positive elements were recommended to be added to the Board section of the policy as found on the policy summary poster for schools explaining the "why." This was assigned to Mr. Larsen, as well as adding the words "or appropriate" to section A. in describing the websites with restricted access.

Staff has been requested to remind parents of the "iboss" parent portal after school starts.

MOTION: It was moved by Suzanne Wood and seconded by Darrell Robinson to instruct staff to bring the proposed policy back for approval at the next business meeting. The motion passed with a unanimous vote.

The policy will be on the August 25, 2026 study session agenda for further discussion prior to a potential vote in the business meeting.

D. Reporting Required by Utah Code 53G-6-11-1101

Administrator of Schools Brad Sorensen and District Athletic Director Bryan Veazie reviewed the purpose of Utah Code 53G-6-11-1101 for gender-designated sports and the legal requirements for reporting. They reported on the number and type of interscholastic sports, participation rate for gender-designated sports, spending devoted to each gender-designated sport, and designated practice and game locations.

Each high school was analyzed for the 10% maximum discrepancy allowed in participation in gender-specific sports. Collectively, JSD is in compliance at 9.45%. UHSAA reclassified drill as a non-specific sport, which contributed to the increase in the number of Jordan schools above the 10% threshold.

Mr. Veazie will work with each of the high schools that are above the threshold to develop a plan that will bring them into compliance.

E. Continued Discussion on Potential Changes to Administrative Policy AA417 *Fundraising*

Superintendent Godfrey summarized the changes to the policy to reflect the Board's discussion in the June 9, 2026 study session. The current policy is proposed to be revised into three policies, one for each level: elementary, middle, and high schools.

Discussion ensued, and revisions were recommended. Dr. Godfrey will make the changes and bring the new policies back for review at the next study session. Concern was raised about PTA involvement in fundraisers, so Erin Barrow was assigned to take the proposed policies to the Region VI PTA for feedback.

MOTION: It was moved by Suzanne Wood and seconded by Erin Barrow to instruct staff to move forward with approval for a Board vote at the next business meeting, pending requested changes to all three policies. The motion passed with a unanimous vote.

Mr. Van Komen was excused from the meeting at 6:49 p.m.

F. Review of Board Policies GP113 through GP115

Erin Barrow, Policy Committee member, conducted the discussion and reviewed each of the Board-level policies. Board members held discussion and made suggestions that will be submitted to the Policy Committee for revisions.

It was confirmed that the President will introduce agenda items and may give a brief history in a public meeting to give context to policy changes or other agenda items prior to a vote.

G. Board Member, Committee, and Superintendent Reports and Comments

Brian Barnett reported on the Facilities Committee and said they will have two agenda items for the next meeting: unprioritized Summer Projects 2027 and a review of declining enrollment in the West Jordan feeder system.

Information on the Government Relations Committee was reported by Suzanne Wood, who thanked Dr. Anderson for coordinating upcoming meetings with legislators. She also reported that the Jordan Education Access Committee has distributed lapel pins and has two events coming up. On August 31, 2026, the Fall Family Fair will be held at the Viridian in West Jordan. September 30, 2026, is Orange Shirt Day and also the Native Community Night.

Erin Barrow commented that she is planning to meet with the Jordan Parent Advisory Committee and talk to parents about technology use in schools and training for teachers. She will also be participating in the training for new council presidents.

Lisa Dean asked for thoughts from Board members on feedback they want from the Licensed Employee Advisory Committee. Ideas included asking if they have enough training to use educational technology in their classrooms, what they need for Board support to support student learning, and also what could lighten the load for teachers. The annual meeting for the Jordan Education Foundation is September 3, 2026, at Lone Peak Hospital.

President George reported that Julie Jackson, USBA President-elect, is resigning. The Board of Directors will appoint someone to her seat until January, when the full USBA will elect the new president. She attended many events recently, including the Administrative Conference, Special Education opening, and Show Up for Teachers, and stated that these events helped reinforce to her that the District is in good hands. She is concerned that Jordan schools are not in session on the day chosen for Read Across America. Dr. Godfrey said that staff will come back to the Board with ideas.

Darrell Robinson commented on the recent ISTE conference that he attended and encouraged other Board members to go to the conference next year, as it is very impactful.

A personal statement was read by Suzanne Wood regarding reviewing sensitive materials as part of her work on the Sensitive Materials Review Committee.

Superintendent Godfrey thanked the Board for supporting all of the activities over the past weeks and those staff members who worked to make each of them successful.

MOTION: At 8:02 p.m., it was moved by Erin Barrow and seconded by Darrell Robinson to go into closed session. The motion passed with a unanimous vote.

SUBJECT: STUDENT INFORMATION NETWORK ACCEPTABLE USE POLICY

I. Board Policy Directive

The Board recognizes the need for a policy governing the use of the electronic information resources by students as outlined in [Utah State Code §53G-7-1002](#) and [§53G-7-1003](#). **The Board is committed to fostering an educational environment where students are encouraged to be curious and intentional, and the school community is united in using digital resources in schools. This policy promotes the positive use of technology for all students in the District in alignment with Jordan's Portrait of a Graduate.**

Responsibility is delegated to the District administration for implementing the policy according to established **guidelines policy provisions.**

II. Administration Policy

The Acceptable Use Policy shall be administered and implemented according to the terms and conditions outlined in the following **guidelines policy provisions:**

A. Scope

This policy references the use of electronic information resources made available to students by Jordan School District. These resources include, but are not limited to, voice mail, electronic mail, the Internet, and other network files or accounts provided to students. Student use of electronic information resources must be in support of education and research and must be consistent with the educational objectives of Jordan School District. While access to all materials on a worldwide network cannot be controlled, Internet access in Jordan School District is filtered and monitored **with the use of a content filtering system on an ongoing basis to restrict access to internet and online sites that contain obscene or inappropriate material.**

B. Terms and Conditions of This Policy

1. Acceptable Network Use

- a. Students will use the Internet and other electronic information resources in an appropriate manner, abiding by the rules and regulations described in this policy.
- b. Students who formally publish school or District related information on the Internet must have proper approvals and abide by District publishing guidelines and procedures (as per [D212—District and School Web Sites](#)).
- c. Students are expected to abide by generally accepted rules of network etiquette. These rules include, but are not limited to, being polite, never sending or encouraging others to send abusive messages, and never using inappropriate language.

2. Unacceptable Network Use

- a. Students may not intentionally transmit or receive material in violation of law or District policy. This includes, but is not limited to, pornographic, indecent or sexually suggestive materials, weapons, controlled substances or alcohol, or incendiary devices. A student may not be in possession of or use pornographic material on school property. Users are prohibited from posting or sending content that contains threats or is hatefully or racially, ethically or otherwise objectionable.

SUBJECT: STUDENT INFORMATION NETWORK ACCEPTABLE USE POLICY

- b. Students may not participate in or promote any illegal or inappropriate activities, disruptive use of the network, or activities of any kind that do not conform to the rules, regulations and policies of Jordan School District.
 - c. Students may not use the network for product advertisement or political lobbying.
 - d. Students may not reveal personal information such as names, addresses, telephone numbers, passwords, credit card numbers or social security numbers. Releasing personal information of others or that of organizations associated with the District is prohibited.
 - e. Students may not intentionally harm or destroy District data, the network, or network performance. This includes, but is not limited to, creation and introduction of computer viruses, unauthorized access to restricted systems or programs, or using the District network to illegally access other systems.
- 3. Expectation of Privacy
 - a. Student files, disks, documents, etc., which have been used or created with District electronic information resources are not considered private.
 - b. Electronic mail transmissions are not private.
- 4. Discussion/Submission
 - a. Students will participate in a discussion with a parent or legal guardian District policy AA445— Student Information Network Acceptable Use Policy, which includes proper behavior and use of the network.
 - b. Students will receive training regarding appropriate online behavior, including interacting with other individuals on social networking websites and in chat rooms, and cyberbullying awareness and response.
 - c. Students will be required to submit a new [Student Signature of Agreement Form](#) each year or upon special request.
- 5. Disciplinary ~~Action~~Procedures and Guidelines
 - a. The combined signatures indicates that the student and parent/legal guardian has carefully read, understands and agrees to abide by these terms and conditions regarding proper behavior and use of the network. The signatures on the Student Signature of Agreement Form are legally binding.
 - b. Students who violate the terms and conditions of this policy will be subject to disciplinary action, including the possibility of suspension or expulsion from school and appropriate legal action. Access to electronic information may be limited, suspended or revoked.
 - c. Complaints, observed behavior and enforcement of this policy will be handled by district administration. The terms and conditions as outlined in this policy are available for review at the school and are in place for district administration to enforce the policy.
- 6. Parent or Legal Guardian Resources
 - a. At the request of the student's parent or legal guardian, the District will restrict the student's internet access on their school-approved electronic device to websites or online resources preapproved by District administration. District administration will review this approved list for any inappropriate content before the three-year review of this policy takes place as required in Utah Code 53G-7-1003.

SUBJECT: STUDENT INFORMATION NETWORK ACCEPTABLE USE POLICY

- b. The District will provide a parent-accessible monitoring system that will enable parents and legal guardians to review the internet activity of their student's school-managed devices.

7. Service Disclaimer

Jordan School District makes no warranties of any kind, either expressed or implied, for the electronic information resources it is providing. The District will not be responsible for any damages a student suffers while using these resources. These damages may include, but are not limited to, loss of data as a result of delays, student errors or omissions, or non-deliveries or service interruptions caused by a network system. Use of information obtained by the network system is at the student's own risk. Jordan School District specifically denies any responsibility for the accuracy of information obtained through the electronic information resources.

SUBJECT: FUNDRAISING FOR HIGH SCHOOLS

I. Board Directive

The Board recognizes that there are times when it may be beneficial to raise funds for specific projects and school activities. The Board also recognizes its responsibility to protect students, parents, and community members of the District from undue pressures applied through these fundraising efforts. This policy is intended to provide schools with the ability to raise funds without unduly pressuring students, families, and/or community members to support or participate in fundraising activities.

The Board provides funds for specific educational functions on an equitable basis; therefore, no school partnership or fundraising effort will be approved that would generate funds for the following categories:

1. Textbooks and supplies (the purchase of)
2. Transportation of students between school and home on a regular basis
3. The purchase or construction of an additional classroom(s)
4. The hiring of licensed, educational support professionals, or paraprofessional staff

The Board delegates to the District Administration the responsibility of administering this policy.

II. Administrative Policy

A. The Administration shall approve fundraisers that meet the administrative policy provisions listed below:

1. A needs assessment must be conducted before a fundraiser can be approved, in order to determine the amount of funds required and the methods that will be used to raise the funds.
2. All local school fundraisers must be submitted in writing to the Administrator of Schools for review and prior approval.
3. Fundraisers cannot involve door-to-door sales.
4. Students and families must not be compelled to sell or purchase products or services and must be free to voluntarily participate without peer or group pressure. Care must be taken in awarding bonuses or prizes to individuals or groups so that students do not feel pressured into competitive selling.
5. Students are not to miss class to participate in fundraisers unless approved by school administration.
6. Fundraisers must be consistent with the generally accepted moral and ethical standards and practices of the Jordan School District community.
7. Charitable fundraising will not be endorsed or sponsored on a Districtwide basis. Materials that advertise charitable fundraising activities that are not sponsored by the local school may be placed in the school office or other locations to be determined by the school administration.

SUBJECT: FUNDRAISING FOR HIGH SCHOOLS

B. High School Fundraisers

1. High Schools are not limited to a set number of fundraisers and may also participate in one annual school-wide charity drive fundraiser.

C. Schoolwide High School Charitable Drive

1. A school-specific process must be created and determined by the school administration in cooperation with staff advisors and elected student body officers to determine the outside organization(s) that the school will be contributing to for the current school year.
2. Charitable fundraisers must be directed towards existing charitable nonprofit organizations in the business of managing and distributing charitable contributions which serve a unique and defined purpose.
3. As an exception, a school may raise up to \$10,000 to be used for the local needs of the community as a "Sub-for-Santa", as approved by a pre-established vetting and approval process.
4. If the \$10,000 funds are not distributed prior to November 15th of the following year, whatever balance remains will be contributed to the new charity drive season to ensure the Sub-for-Santa allocation never exceeds \$10,000.
5. All funds raised must be deposited in the school's accounts. No outside accounts may receive fundraiser funds. Nevertheless, in a charitable fundraiser, the students may provide the option for the donor to donate directly to the nonprofit organization(s) selected or to the school to give the funds to the nonprofit organization(s).
6. The charity drive and associated activities may only take place starting the first Monday following the approved Thanksgiving recess and run through the last school day prior to the winter recess. Pre-sale exception: sales for charity-branded apparel (t-shirts, hoodies, etc.), events and activity sales may begin prior to the official Monday start date.
7. No individual may participate for more than 20 hours a week during the charity drive.
8. In order to ensure a full day of instruction, activities or assemblies may not interfere with the regular or assembly bell schedules.
9. "Odd Jobs" may be conducted within the school's community as long as the following is adhered to:
 - a. A minimum of four (4) students are participating in each group.
 - b. At least one student in the group is an elected or appointed student representative and is wearing their official school sweater or other school-issued clothing.
 - c. All "odd jobs" must conclude by 8:00 p.m.
 - d. All donations received during "odd jobs" must be returned to the school and accounted for each evening following regular accounting procedures.

D. Parent Donations

1. Parent donations to support a specific activity in the school will be accepted and will not be considered a fundraiser as long as they are unsolicited.
2. Monetary donations must be accounted for and recorded through the school office.

3. See policy [AA408 - Fees](#) for additional information regarding donations and school fees.
4. PTA may request parent donations for PTA-sponsored events or activities including volunteer time, supplies, and materials.

E. Business Partnerships

1. School-based business partnerships that generate revenue, products, or services for the school, based on voluntary participation of students, parents, and community members that do not involve students or the school in the sale of a product or service, are exempt from the level guidelines of this policy.
- ~~2.~~ Any approved school-based business partnership may request and receive the same promotional access to students and parents afforded to any other school-approved partnership.
- ~~3.~~ Advertisements from commercial enterprises for interested students and parents may be placed in an area designated by the school with the approval of the school administration.

F. Other Important Fundraising Information

1. All fundraisers are optional.

5. Fundraising credits for students towards a program or activity hold no cash value. Under no circumstances will funds be cashed out, refunded, or paid directly to students, parents, or guardians.

The Board provides funds for specific educational functions on an equitable basis; therefore, no school partnership or fundraising effort will be approved that would generate funds for the following categories:

1. Textbooks and supplies (the purchase of)
2. Transportation of students between school and home on a regular basis
3. The purchase or construction of an additional classroom(s)
4. The hiring of licensed, educational support professionals, or paraprofessional staff

The Board delegates to the District Administration the responsibility of administering this policy.

II. Administrative Policy

 1. A needs assessment must be conducted before a fundraiser can be approved, in order to determine the amount of funds required and the methods that will be used to raise the funds.

- B. Middle Schools may participate in a total of up to five fundraisers every year as outlined below:

3. One fundraiser sponsored by the PTA.
4. Memory book sales may serve as the PTA's primary fundraiser. If an alternate fundraiser is selected, memory books must be sold without profit, in accordance with Policy AA442.
5. Two charitable fundraisers.

C. Charitable Fundraising

1. Charitable fundraisers must be directed towards existing charitable nonprofit organizations in the business of managing and distributing charitable contributions which serve a unique and defined purpose.
2. Any funds raised must be deposited in the school's accounts. No outside accounts may receive fundraiser funds. Nevertheless, in a charitable fundraiser, the students may provide the option for the donor to donate directly to the nonprofit organization(s) or to the school to give the funds to the nonprofit organization(s).

D. Parent Donations

1. Parent donations to support a specific activity in the school will be accepted and will not be considered a fundraiser, as long as they are unsolicited.
2. Monetary donations must be accounted for and recorded through the school office.
3. See policy [AA408 - Fees](#) for additional information regarding donations and school fees.
4. PTA may request parent donations for PTA-sponsored events or activities, including volunteer time, supplies, and materials.

E. Business Partnerships

1. School-based business partnerships that generate revenue, products, or services for the school, based on voluntary participation of students, parents, and community members that do not involve students or the school in the sale of a product or service, are exempt from the level guidelines of this policy.
2. Any approved school-based business partnership may request and receive the same promotional access to students and parents afforded to any other school-approved partnership.
3. Advertisements from commercial enterprises for interested students and parents may be placed in an area designated by the school with the approval of the school administration.
4. A school-based business partnership does not count as one of the allotted school fundraisers.

C. Parent Donation Guidelines

Parent donations to support a specific activity (e. g. fieldtrips) in the school will be accepted and will not be considered a fundraiser if the following stipulations are met:

1. Donations may be solicited but are entirely optional with regards to parent participation.
2. Donations must not be a factor in determining if a student participates in the activity for which the donations are solicited.
3. Donations must be solicited in writing and approved by the school administration.
4. Donations must be accounted for and recorded through the school office.

D. Business Partnerships Guidelines

1. School-based business partnerships that generate revenue, products, or services for the school, based on voluntary participation of students, parents, and community members that do not involve students or the school in the sale of a product or service, are exempt from the level guidelines of this policy.
2. All requests to form school-based business partnerships must be reviewed and approved by the School Community Council on an annual basis.
3. Any approved school-based business partnership may request and receive the same promotional access to students and parents afforded to any other school-approved partnership.

E. Jordan Education Foundation Guidelines

1. Fundraiser Partnerships (Foundation-Initiated)
 - a. The Jordan Education Foundation develops partnerships with organizations for the purpose of raising funds for the schools and the Foundation. A list of these organizations is disseminated to the schools on a regular basis. School personnel are encouraged to consider these partnership organizations, among others, in determining the methods used to raise funds for the school or school organizations. As noted earlier in this policy, all School Community Council fundraisers must be selected from the Jordan Education Foundation list of partnership fund-raisers.
 - b. The Jordan Education Foundation Director shall consult with the Superintendent of Schools or a designee prior to disseminating fundraising information to the schools in the District.
 - c. All Jordan Education Foundation partnership fundraisers are subject to the level guidelines of this policy.
2. Advertising Partnerships (commercial and nonprofit)
 - a. The Jordan Education Foundation and the Jordan School District may not distribute advertisements to students unless there is a direct financial benefit to the District from the sale of the advertised product or service. All requests to distribute advertising to students must be reviewed and approved by the Jordan Education Foundation Director. The Foundation Director will approve no more than two requests per month, using criteria that evaluates the reputation of the advertising entity and the potential for revenue to support Foundation activities, among others. The local school administration is responsible to insure that any advertising to be distributed to students has been approved by the Jordan Education Foundation Director.
 - b. Advertisements from all other commercial enterprises may be placed in the school office for interested students and parents with the approval of the school administration.
