AUGUST 2025 ACTIVITIES REPORT

Coaches have scheduled specific sports meetings for their respective players and parents on Wednesday, August 13, to discuss team information and policies. The meeting will take place before the NCA presentation - *The Role of Parents in Education-Based Athletics* by Darin Boysen

The first competition of the season for each fall sports team is as follows: Girls Golf will open at the O’Neill Invite on Thursday, August 21. Volleyball begins with a jamboree game at Valentine on Tuesday, August 26, followed by a dual with North Central on Thursday, August 28, in Springview. Football will kick off at home against Hartington-Newcastle on Friday, August 29. Cross Country will host the Ainsworth Invite on Thursday, September 4.

Middle school fall sports organizational meetings and practices will begin after school is in session.

With the help of the Brown County Hospital Physical Therapy Department, we are utilizing the SWAY concussion management system to conduct baseline assessments for our athletes. All athletes will be tested to establish a baseline.

The NSAA will again require all coaches and sponsors (head, assistant, and volunteer) to complete courses through NFHS on concussion, heat prevention and illness, and sudden cardiac arrest prior to the start of practice with their teams.

The Booster Club will host the 8th Annual Bulldog Pride Fundraiser on August 16th at the Community Center. Thanks to the generous support of local businesses and individuals, there will be a wide variety of great items available through both silent and live auctions. The evening will also include a meal.

We explored the Turf Tank system for painting the football field and marking areas for shot put and discus. While we’ve decided to hold off for this year, we plan to revisit the option next year and are hopeful to partner with a neighboring school to move forward with the purchase.

SUBJECT: Superintendent's Report for the July 2025 Regular Meeting

1) Financial Report

The working draft of the budget is complete. We are sitting in a good place with options to consider that will relate to our strategic plan. Soon, August expenses and payroll will be complete, and I will be able to fine tune our position and prepare options for the annual budget retreat. I would recommend holding the retreat on August 25th at 7:00 pm. We can be flexible if that date is problematic.

We should see property tax saving due to retiring the debt on the Ag/Tech facility. Please be thinking about any options you would like to see and have brought forward to the budget retreat.

Through July 2025, we have spent 7.585 million (70.18%) of the general fund budget compared to 7.575 million (68.54%) in 2024 and 7.557 million (68.25%) in 2023. As you can see, we are on track with no surprises. On the revenue side, we have brought in 8.650 million through July 2025 compared to 7.993 million and 7.645 million for 2024 and 2023, respectively. Our revenue is up due to the receipt of additional property tax credit due to previous legislative action. This does not represent additional funds or aid and remain mindful of our revenue, this fall will be less due to property tax credit received.

2) Transportation, Buildings and Grounds

The cafeteria and kitchen flooring project went well and looks very nice. The custodial crew has done well this summer getting the building ready for students and staff.

I will be meeting with Dan Morrell on Tuesday the 12th to discuss some HVAC needs and expenses on the horizon as we take care of that area of our facility.

Recently, I spoke with Megan Boldt (ALICAP) about our school vans and her take on the situation. Megan explained we would be in good company to begin to phase the vans out over this school year regarding transporting students. This stems from NDE's

recent communication at admin days which was “no vans” for students will go into Rule 91/92. If that happens, interpretation of federal recommendations will not matter.

3) Board Policy Review

We are back on track this month with our periodic review of policy in the 600s section with policies 606.06 through 609.01 up for review.

The “Board Policy Review” shared folder has been updated, and the Policy committee members have access. If you have trouble with access or viewing the policies, please let me know.

4) Personnel and Hiring Update

We hired Alexandra (Ally) Vega to serve as a para for 3 days a week. Ally is working on her teaching degree from UNK. We are glad to have her help with sped para needs. In addition, we are in communication with 1 to 2 other individuals regarding para work.

5) Strategic Plan

The administrators have received their surveys, and the Board will receive their survey invites on Monday Aug 11th. In addition, invites have been mailed to individuals we wish to serve on the Strategic Overview Committee (SOC). The first SOC meeting will be Thursday, August 14th, at 6:00 p.m. in the cafeteria. I was in contact with Caden Frank (NASB) today and they are excited to be in person with us for the SOC meeting next week.

6) Professional Development Opportunities

The annual membership meeting for NASB is in Valentine on August 19th. We are planning on everyone unless you have told me otherwise. We will leave district office about 3:45 or a tad earlier as registration and vendors begin at 4:30.

The Labor Relations conference is October 1st and 2nd in Lincoln. Usually there is a dinner and speaker the night before the conference kicks off. It is a good conference with excellent information and updates related to personnel, contracts, legal, etc.

The NASB/NCSA State Education Conference is November 19-21 in Omaha. November seems like a long time away, but we all know it will be here before we know it.


What is an Emergency Operations Plan (EOP)?

A comprehensive plan for;

- addressing prevention, preparedness, response, and recovery
- minimizing the impact of any hazard, threat or incident to the safety and security of students, staff, visitors, school building(s), and property.



Purpose of an EOP



- Identify / Respond to Threats, Hazards or Incidents (THI)
- Outlining Roles and Responsibilities
- Educates Staff, Students, Parents & Community Partners (Before, During, and After a THI)
- Developing, maintaining and exercising an EOP increases legal protection

Where we started ~ Where we are:

- *Our EOP began in June of 2021 when we developed an EOP team and began working in on our plan.
- *August 2022, our team participated in 3 Virtual Tabletop Exercises with NDE (Bus Accident, Tornado, and Threat Outside at a Track Meet).
- *We started with monthly meetings and have evolved into an “as needed” basis. In 2023-24, we met twice to plan our Lockdown drills, and then met briefly following each lockdown to discuss what worked and where we need to grow.
- *We have conducted LockDown drills in the fall and spring semesters for the last three years, constantly making improvements to our plan.
- *The Brown/Rock Co. Emergency Management team has put together a Reunification Team of community members utilizing many past educators and current substitute teachers.
- *Ainsworth hosted a Standard Reunification Method (SRM) exercise in March with the iloveguys Foundation and Nebraska Department of Education School Safety personnel.
- *We will continue updating the current working document and obtain board approval annually.

SCHOOL WELLNESS

The board adopts this policy to create positive, safe and health-promoting learning environments at every level, in every setting, throughout the school year. This will assist in providing students with the opportunity to achieve personal, academic, developmental and social success.

The District will develop and maintain a plan for implementation to manage and coordinate the execution of this wellness policy. The plan sets out roles, responsibilities, actions and timelines specific to each school as well as specific goals and objectives for nutrition standards for all foods and beverages available on the school campus, food and beverage marketing, nutrition promotion and education, physical activity, physical education and other school-based activities that promote student wellness.

The District will convene a District Wellness Committee (DWC) that meets at least four times per year to establish goals for and oversee school health and safety policies and programs, including development, implementation and periodic review and update of this District wellness policy.

Leadership

The Superintendent or designee(s) will convene the DWC and facilitate development of any updates to the wellness policy to ensure each school site's compliance with the policy.

Nutrition Education

The District will provide nutrition education designed to provide students with the knowledge and skills necessary to promote and protect their health, not only in health education classes, but also in other classroom instruction through subjects such as math, science, language arts, social sciences and elective subjects.

Nutrition Promotion

Nutrition promotion and education positively influence lifelong eating behaviors by using evidence-based techniques and nutrition messages, and by creating healthy food environments along with marketing and advertising only nutritious foods and beverages allowed to be sold on the school campus.

1. The District will promote healthy food and beverage choices for all students throughout the school campus, as well as encourage participation in school meal programs.
2. The District will use its media and publications resources to encourage students to

- make healthy nutrition choices through their participation in school meal programs.
3. Staff will model healthy eating habits in the schools.

School Meals

The District is committed to serving healthy meals to children, with plenty of fruits, vegetables and whole grains, and meeting the nutrition needs of school children within their calorie requirements. The school meal programs aim to improve the diet and health of school children and to help mitigate childhood obesity, model healthy eating to support the development of lifelong healthy eating patterns and support healthy choices while accommodating cultural food preferences and special dietary needs.

The District will participate in USDA child nutrition programs, including the National School Lunch Program (NSLP) and the School Breakfast Program (SBP). It will meet or exceed current nutrition requirements established by local, state, and Federal statutes and regulations.

Water

The District will make drinking water available where school meals are served during mealtimes and throughout the school day with drinking fountains or safe, hygienic cups or containers.

Physical Activity and Education

Students in grades K-7 should participate in at least 80 minutes of physical activity every week. Teachers with an endorsement in physical education will supervise varied physical activity opportunities through an age appropriate written curriculum and will promote participation in additional physical activities during nonschool times. Physical activity during the school day (including but not limited to recess, classroom physical activity breaks or physical education) will not be withheld as punishment.

The District will typically provide Elementary School students with a minimum of 20 minutes a day of supervised outdoor recess. When conditions require indoor recess, teachers and staff will adapt the activities to provide physical activity for all students to participate to the extent practicable. Teachers and staff are expected to serve as role models for engaging in physical activity whenever possible.

Competitive Foods and Beverages

The District is committed to ensuring that all foods and beverages available to students will meet the USDA Smart Snacks in School nutrition standards, at a minimum. Foods and beverages that meet these nutrition standards may be sold through fundraisers on the

school campus during the school day. The District will make available to parents and teachers a list of healthy fundraising ideas or similar resources.

Celebrations and Rewards

All foods will meet or exceed the USDA Smart Snacks in School nutrition standards. The district will provide a list of healthy party ideas to parents and teachers, including non-food celebration ideas. The District will provide to parents a list of foods and beverages that meet Smart Snacks nutrition standards and will provide teachers and other relevant school staff a list of alternative ways to reward children. The use of foods and beverages will be discouraged as a reward or punishment.

Staff Qualifications and Professional Development

All school nutrition program directors, managers and staff will meet or exceed both hiring and any annual continuing education/training requirements in the USDA professional standards for child nutrition professionals. These school nutrition personnel will refer to USDA's Professional Standards for School Nutrition Standards website to search for training that meets their learning needs.

Staff Wellness and Health Promotion

The District will implement strategies to support staff in actively promoting and modeling healthy eating, attention to personal mental health, and physical activity behaviors and may provide examples of specific actions staff members can take. The District promotes staff member participation in health promotion programs such as the EHA wellness program.

Public and Community Involvement

The District Wellness Committee (DWC) will focus on staff wellness issues and goals, identify and disseminate wellness and safety resources, and perform other functions through school and community wide messaging to support and implement the components of the School Wellness policy.

The District will develop or continue relationships with community partners such as students, parents, teachers, staff, nutrition and healthcare representatives, administrators, board members, and the general public. Existing and new community partnerships and sponsorships will be evaluated to ensure that they are consistent with the School Wellness policy and its goals.

Monitoring and Recordkeeping

The District will maintain and compile records documenting compliance with the requirements of the School Wellness policy at the District's Central Administrative
