1. **MAP Testing** - Fall MAP testing has been completed for all HHS 9-11 students. We tested over two days August 26-27. We held testing sessions 8-10 AM and ran a late start schedule the remainder of the day. The teaching staff much preferred this format over previous years as each of their classes were able to meet each day. Seniors were assigned job shadowing in place of MAP testing.
2. **John Baylor, On to College** - On to College is an ACT preparation program that we use with our Junior class. John will work with our students on September 28th for an in-person three hour session at the Tassel to get the students off to a solid start in English preparation for the ACT. Juniors take the ACT in April. John's program is productive and engaging, he is the voice of Husker volleyball, and takes a special interest in Holdrege as we were one of the first schools in his program. Our students benefit greatly from Mr. Baylor!
3. **Homecoming Week** - Homecoming is this week Mrs. Mach and the student council have an engaging week planned for HHS. Last year we saw a significant increase in student participation with the activities planned by the student council. We will again use our Seminar periods for some of the activities, this allows for maximum participation with so many of our students involved in various activities in the evenings. Coronation will take place right before the football game this year. The student council voted for this, in an effort to provide more time after the game for students to prepare for the dance. The dance will be Friday after the game, 9PM-midnight.
4. **Staff Update** - We have been in school for over 5 weeks at this point. I'm happy to report a very positive start to the year with our new staff. I believe the culture and overall quality of the educational experience continues to improve, I'm observing many positives.

I started early this year with teacher observations and evaluations, 27% of this year's HHS teaching staff evaluations have been formally completed. Nine staff are currently in the probationary period and will need to be evaluated each semester. My plan is for every teacher to have one evaluation completed by the end of October.

5. **Grades update:** Last week ended with just 33 students (11% of the student body) with at least one grade below C-. 19 students (6.4% of the HHS Student body) had at least one failing grade, and 18 students (6.0% of the HHS Student body) had at least one D grade. These numbers provide a good starting point after 5 weeks and will be used to evaluate our progress with student accountability throughout the semester.

Notice of Annual Determination — September 14, 2026

Holdrege Public Schools - **met requirements**: We are pleased to share that our annual special education determination information has been received. We will continue to review the information provided by the Nebraska Department of Education and use it to guide our ongoing work to improve outcomes and services for children with disabilities.

Focused Monitoring

Our Focused Monitoring materials were submitted on August 31. We will now wait for next steps and feedback from the Review Team. In the meantime, our special education teachers and staff will continue to focus on identified areas for improvement and strengthening services and outcomes for children with disabilities.

NASES Conference

Mrs. Klein attended the NASES Conference September 9–11. The first day provided opportunities for networking, collaboration, and learning about resources available to support special education. The second day focused on Leading Complex, Adaptive Change, providing strategies for leading through change and addressing complex challenges in education. The final day included the State of the State, where participants reviewed current trends, progress, and potential changes impacting special education across Nebraska.

Targeted Improvement Plan (TIP)

Our Targeted Improvement Plan continues to guide our work toward strengthening special education practices and improving outcomes for students. Staff will continue to focus on using data, collaboration, and evidence-based practices to identify areas of need and make meaningful improvements.

Elementary Board Report
Amber Porter
September 21, 2026

- Elementary students took Fall MAP Assessments September 2nd and 3rd in Kindergarten through 4th grade. We assessed the areas of reading/language arts and math. We had the whole elementary school test at one time. This allowed for everyone in the building including specials teachers to be involved. This called for less out of class testing time. This data is invaluable for student decision making for student placement and school improvement and focus for classroom instruction. We had training on how to adjust classroom work according to the NWEA data from a NWEA/NDE trainer. We have another inservice on this on January 5, 2027.
- Teachers have been again setting their goals for the year based on what we have been learning from our Marzano professional development. These goals help teachers focus on specific areas to improve and use Marzano research based learning strategies within the classroom.
- School Pictures for the Elementary School will be taken on September 17 and 18.
- Our PBIS Team continues to implement the Duster Way all school ticket collection to honor positive student behavior. The whole school will turn in tickets given for positive behavior. When we reach certain goals we get special days at school such as Pajama D. We have a point level system on a very large Duster on a bulletin board in the commons. Students are very excited about this. We are also going to have a Duster t-shirt give away for all students.
- We continue to get teachers and staff trained in the Science of Reading.
