HARDWARE

All nuts, bolts, screws, inserts, and lock washers used in the assembly of all play equipment shall be stainless steel, yellow dichromate plated steel, blue-coat plated steel, mechanically galvanized or powder coated/yellow dichromate plated steel. All primary fasteners shall be 304 alloy stainless steel. Fasteners with yellow dichromate treatment have an electro-deposited, 99.9% pure zinc substrate applied from a specially formulated solution sealed with a yellow dichromate top coat designed to work in conjunction with the zinc plating. Yellow dichromate has a 320% longer life to white corrosion and 275% longer to red corrosion than does hot-dip galvanizing. All primary stainless steel fasteners shall be Button Head Socket Caps.

GALVANNEAL COATING

All Galvaneal coating shall meet or exceed the specifications of ASTM A-6530-CQ.

POWDER COAT FINISH

Shall be an electrostatically applied custom formula of TGIC polyester powder. All components will be free of sharp edges and excess weld spatter and shall be cleaned in a four stage solvent / zirconium based bath system (free of iron phosphate), as a rust inhibitor, and a zirconium conversion coating to prevent flash rusting before coating. STEEL TUBING

All tubing used to manufacture components shall be an electrical resistance welded, cold rolled, high strength steel tubing. The exterior coating will consist of an in line hot-dipped uniform zinc galvanizing, chromate conversion, and acrylic over-coating. The interior coating will consist of a special organic acrylic modified polyester.

ENTRY WAY

Entry Way shall be fabricated from 1-5/16" O.D. x .083" (14 gauge) wall galvanized steel tubing with 3/16" hot rolled steel formed and stamped mounting tabs. The Entry Way shall be an all welded assembly and shall be coated with a custom formula of TGIC polyester powder, after fabrication in conformance with the specifications outlined herein.

BOLT-THROUGH CONNECTION

DECKS - SQUARE

Shall have a minimum surface area of 1,286 square inches, maintaining a full 36" center to center spacing on the upright posts. The 36" square deck shall be fabricated from punched steel in conformance with the specifications outlined herein. The deck frame shall be fabricated from 3/16" x 2-1/2" hot rolled steel with corner supports fabricated from 1/4" x 2-1/2" hot rolled steel. Intermediate supports, fabricated from 1/8" x 1" hot rolled steel, shall be notched and welded at the intersections forming a support grid underneath the entire deck surface. The deck shall be a one-piece welded assembly, coated after fabrication with an oven cured matte finish polyvinyl chloride (PVC) coating in accordance with the specifications herein. Each square deck shall be directly bolted to the upright posts with four 3/8" diameter button head cap screws in accordance with the hardware specifications herein.

ACCESSIBLE STEP ATTACHMENT

The accessible step attachment shall be a one piece weld assembly made from 11 Ga. punched steel in conformance with the specifications outlined herein. The accessible step shall have a decent of 8" or less, as specified by the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA). The accessible step shall be finished with a matte PVC coating per the plastisol coating specifications herein. A steel handhold shall be provided on both sides of the step. The handholds shall be bolted directly to the uprights on each side of the step. TRANSFER SYSTEM

The Steps shall be made from 11 gauge punched steel with a protective P&O finish in conformance with the specifications outlined herein. The Steps shall each be a one-piece welded assembly finished with the matte PVC coating per the specifications herein. Handrails and attachment rails shall be fabricated from 1-5/16" O.D. x .083" (14 gauge) wall galvanized steel tubing, with supports fabricated from 1-1/16" O.D. x 15 gauge (.075" thick) galvanized steel tubing and 2" square x 3/16" wall steel tubing. Handholds and attachment rails shall be all-welded assemblies and shall be coated with a custom formula of TGIC polyester powder in conformance with the specifications outlined herein, after fabrication.

TRANSFER PLATFORM

The Platform and Steps shall each be made from 11 gauge punched steel with a protective P&O finish in conformance with the specifications outlined herein. The Platform and Steps shall each be a one-piece welded assembly finished with the matte PVC coating per the specifications herein. The steps shall have a minimum of 355 square inches of area per step and shall descend in increments of 8" or less, as specified by the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA). Handrails and attachment rails shall be fabricated from 1-5/16" O.D. x .083" (14 gauge) wall galvanized steel tubing, with supports fabricated from 1-1/16" O.D. x 15 gauge (.075" thick) galvanized steel tubing and 2" square x 3/16" wall steel tubing. Platform support shall be fabricated from 5" O.D tubing with a 3/16" hot rolled flat steel flange. The Leaning wall panel shall be made from 3/4" thick (solid) high density, UV-stabilized, laminated and color impregnated polyethylene. LOOP LADDER

The loop ladder side rails shall be fabricated from 1-5/16" O.D. x .083" (14 gauge) wall galvanized steel tubing. The coated footpad shall be a one-piece welded assembly fabricated from 11 gauge punched steel with a protective P&O finish. Coated products shall consist of a welded assembly with an oven cured matte finish polyvinyl chloride (PVC) coating with a minimum coating thickness of .080". Climbing Pole shall be fabricated from 1-5/8" O.D. x .083" (14 gauge) wall galvanized steel tubing, 1-5/16" O.D. x .083" (14 gauge) wall galvanized steel tubing and 3/16" formed steel mounting tab. Climbing Pole shall be a one-piece welded assembly and shall be coated with a custom formula of TGIC polyester powder in conformance with the specifications outlined herein, after fabrication.

Overhead Ladders:

HORIZONTAL & INCLINED LOOP LADDERS

The horizontal loop ladder assembly shall be fabricated from 2-3/8" O.D. x .134" wall galvanized steel tubing. The loops shall be fabricated from 1-1/16" O.D. x .075" (15 gauge) wall galvanized steel tubing. The ladder assembly shall be an all welded construction which bolts directly into the uprights and shall be coated with a custom formula of TGIC polyester powder coating in conformance with the specifications outlined herein, after fabrication. The end rails shall be fabricated of 1-7/8" O.D. x .095" (13 gauge) wall galvanized steel tubing and 3/16" formed hot rolled steel mounting tabs. The end rails shall be an all welded assembly and shall be coated with a custom formula of TGIC polyester powder coating in conformance with the specifications outlined herein, after fabrication.

Panels:

BONGOS

The Bongos are molded from a color impregnated linear low density polyethylene and shall conform to the rotationally molded specifications outlined herein.

DECORATIVE PANEL

DECORATIVE PANEL

The Decorative Panel shall be color impregnated linear low density polyethylene and shall conform to the rotationally molded specifications outlined herein

ZOO PANEL

ZOO PANEL

Frame shall be 1-7/8" thick, color-impregnated linear low density polyethylene and shall conform to the rotationally molded specifications outlined herein. Rungs shall be made of 3/8" galvanized pipe. The zoo bar assembly shall be an all welded assembly and shall be powder coated after fabrication with a custom formula of TGIC polyester in conformance with the specifications outlined herein. Panel shall be color-impregnated linear low density polyethylene and shall conform to the rotationally molded specifications outlined herein.

Slides:

ZIP SLIDES (SINGLE & DOUBLE BEDWAY, AND RUMBLE & ROLL)

Zip Slides and hoods shall be color impregnated linear low-density polyethylene and shall conform to the rotationally molded specifications outlined herein with double wall construction molded to a minimum .25" wall thickness. Single bedway Zip Slides shall have a minimum inside bed width of 17.5" while double bedway Zip Slides shall have a minimum inside bed width of 16.5" on each bedway. Outside rails are at least 7" high when measured from the centerline of the bedway surface. The angle of descent shall be no greater than 50°. Each Zip Slide works in conjunction with a rotationally molded hood that has an integrated cross bar which force users to a seated position. The exit section of the bedway shall have a minimum 40" radius for a smooth transition from the slide chute to the run-out area. The run-out shall be angled at a maximum of 4° with an integrated drain at 5° to reduce pooling of water. Zip Slides bolt directly to the deck and to the slide hood.

**RESOLUTION SUPPORTING USE OF TEMPORARY ASSISTANCE FOR NEEDY
FAMILIES (TANF) FUNDS**

WHEREAS, the _____ Board of Education is charged with governing the school district so that all students receive the best educational opportunities in order to graduate prepared to enter a postsecondary institution or the workforce;

WHEREAS, the Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) is a program authorized under federal law that was developed to provide funds to assist needy families, end the dependence on government benefits, prevent and reduce the incidence of out-of-wedlock pregnancies, and encourage the formation and maintenance of two-parent families;

WHEREAS, Tennessee receives approximately \$191 million each year in TANF funds, and at one time, maintained approximately \$798 million of unused funds in reserve;

WHEREAS, Tennessee maintains flexibility in spending these funds and has the option to expand TANF-funded services to underfunded areas;

WHEREAS, the state's funding formula is the method used in determining how Tennessee education funding is generated and distributed among Tennessee schools;

WHEREAS, several programs dealing with social services, such as guidance, school health, psychology, and social work, are funded by the state and deal directly with TANF purposes;

WHEREAS, using even a portion of unused TANF funds could support local boards of education when funding programs in these key areas and serving students who are eligible for TANF funds under federal law; and

WHEREAS, local boards of education struggle to fully fund these programs as the state's funding formula does not adequately meet the needs of districts when funding these programs.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the _____ Board of Education urges the General Assembly to allow local boards of education to use TANF funds for costs related to funding programs that support social services.

RESOLUTION SUPPORTING THE USE OF FUNDS TO PAY FOR THE PRAXIS

WHEREAS, the _____ Board of Education is charged with governing the school district so that all students receive the best educational opportunities in order to graduate prepared to enter a postsecondary institution or the workforce;

WHEREAS, each year, school districts struggle to fill open teaching positions;

WHEREAS, this is especially troubling when considering how many teachers are eligible for retirement;

WHEREAS, approximately 8,000 teachers were eligible to retire as of June 30, 2022 – making that over one thousand more compared to the prior year;

WHEREAS, Tennessee could provide incentives for individuals entering into the teaching profession, such as creating a program to fund the Praxis tests for new teachers or educators seeking an additional endorsement;

WHEREAS, state law requires all students wishing to receive a teaching license to pass a test that measures professional knowledge and a standardized or criterion-referenced test for each desired area of endorsement;

WHEREAS, currently, the majority of academic licensure areas require two assessments: one content area assessment and one which measures pedagogy, and these assessments cost approximately \$150 per administration;

WHEREAS, additional endorsements require that educators submit qualifying scores on required content assessments which cost, on average, \$150 per administration; and

WHEREAS, providing these incentives for the teaching profession would make strides in overcoming teacher shortages as well as attract more qualified individuals to enter the teaching profession.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the _____ Board of Education urges the General Assembly to provide incentives for individuals wishing to enter the teaching profession in Tennessee or seeking an additional endorsement by reimbursing that individual for successful completion of the Praxis.

**RESOLUTION SUPPORTING THE USE OF FUNDS FOR SPECIAL EDUCATION
SCHOLARSHIPS**

WHEREAS, the _____ Board of Education is charged with governing the school district so that all students receive the best educational opportunities in order to graduate prepared to enter a postsecondary institution or the workforce;

WHEREAS, each year, school districts struggle to fill open teaching positions;

WHEREAS, this is especially troubling when considering how many teachers are eligible for retirement;

WHEREAS, approximately 8,000 teachers were eligible to retire as of June 30, 2022 – making that over one thousand more compared to the prior year;

WHEREAS, Tennessee could provide incentives for individuals entering into the teaching profession, such as creating a scholarship to assist individuals wishing to pursue teaching careers in special education;

WHEREAS, there are over 9,200 special education paraprofessionals, and if a scholarship was provided for college level juniors and seniors, it is estimated that over 500 paraprofessionals would be eligible for the scholarship program;

WHEREAS, as a result, several hundred new special education teachers would graduate with a commitment to teach in a Tennessee public school; and

WHEREAS, providing these types of incentives for the teaching profession would make strides in overcoming teacher shortages as well as attract more qualified individuals to enter the teaching profession in high need areas, such as special education.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the _____ Board of Education urges the General Assembly to provide incentives for individuals wishing to enter the teaching profession by creating a college student scholarship program to attract individuals to teach special education.

RESOLUTION SUPPORTING THE OPTION FOR DISTRICTS TO HIRE TEACHER CANDIDATES

WHEREAS, the _____ Board of Education is charged with governing the school district so that all students receive the best educational opportunities in order to graduate prepared to enter a postsecondary institution or the workforce;

WHEREAS, school districts struggle to fill open teaching positions and would benefit if additional options were available to allow districts more flexibility when recruiting for these open teaching positions;

WHEREAS, when considering the process to become certified to teach in Tennessee, teacher candidates must meet certain requirements, such as completing an educator preparation program that includes completing at least one clinical practice, such as student teaching, within a public school;

WHEREAS, the process to become certified to teach can place certain challenges on many teacher candidates, such as being unemployed and the uncertainty of a full-time teaching position;

WHEREAS, an option to help alleviate some of these concerns would be to allow school districts the ability to hire a teacher candidate as a full-time teacher while using the first-year of teaching to fulfill his/her student teaching requirement; and

WHEREAS, allowing the school district to hire this individual would benefit both the district and the teacher candidate as the district would be able to fill an open position and the teacher candidate would be compensated for his/her time in the classroom.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the _____ Board of Education urges the General Assembly to allow school districts the option of hiring teacher candidates that only need to complete their student teaching requirements as full-time teachers.

**RESOLUTION SUPPORTING THE OPTION FOR MILITARY VETERANS TO
OBTAIN AN OCCUPATIONAL TEACHING LICENSE**

WHEREAS, the _____ Board of Education is charged with governing the school district so that all students receive the best educational opportunities in order to graduate prepared to enter a postsecondary institution or the workforce;

WHEREAS, school districts struggle to fill open teaching positions and would benefit if additional options were available to allow districts more flexibility when recruiting for these open teaching positions;

WHEREAS, an additional option would be to allow a military veteran who has not yet earned a bachelor's degree the ability to receive an occupational teaching license;

WHEREAS, when considering open teaching positions, school districts are seeing an increased need in individuals who are qualified to teach high need areas, such as CTE courses, and with the background and experience of some military veterans, school districts would have the option to consider these individuals for the job;

WHEREAS, school districts would need to ensure that these individuals are qualified for the job, and therefore, military veterans who wish to utilize this option would need to meet certain criteria, such as holds a high school diploma or higher, pursuing an active industry certification for the area of endorsement related to the individual's military service and experience, possesses military training and experience, as determined by the State Board of Education, that is equivalent to the relevant work experience needed to receive a practitioner occupational teaching license, etc.; and

WHEREAS, allowing the school district to hire military veterans to fill some of these high need areas would benefit both the district and the military veteran as the district would be able to fill an open position and the military veteran would be able to continue pursuing his/her passion in education while being employed full-time within a school district.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the _____ Board of Education urges the General Assembly to allow military veterans the option of obtaining an occupational teaching license that is based on military qualifications, such as training and experience, that would align to qualifications currently required for an individual to receive an occupational teaching license as determined by the State Board of Education.

**RESOLUTION SUPPORTING A STATEWIDE REVIEW AND CORRECTION OF
UNNECESSARY REQUIREMENTS ON EDUCATORS**

WHEREAS, the _____ Board of Education is charged with governing the school district so that all students receive the best educational opportunities in order to graduate prepared to enter a postsecondary institution or the workforce;

WHEREAS, over many years, state and local governing bodies have created policies, practices, procedures, and other requirements that affect educators in Tennessee that, while the requirements may have been well-intended and in many cases helpful, Tennessee's educators have been spending growing amounts of time, resources, and energy on these voluminous requirements; and

WHEREAS, many of the requirements have outlived their usefulness and have caused considerable collateral damage in many Tennessee schools, including driving excellent teachers out of the profession, undermining school climate, and draining precious resources; and

WHEREAS, because educators are vital to the well-being of, not only children, but all citizens of Tennessee, Tennesseans cannot afford for our educators to be hampered by regulatory overload that uses their valuable time, resources, training, and talent to focus on requirements not directly related to student outcomes and wellbeing; and

WHEREAS, the volume of requirements on our educators must be lowered in order to foster engaging school experiences that promote joy in learning, depth of thought, and breadth of knowledge for students.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the _____ Board of Education urges the Governor, General Assembly, and State Board of Education to establish a comprehensive, collaborative, and thoughtful review program of Tennessee laws, rules, regulations, and policies governing teachers to recommend improvements to reduce educator workloads to facilitate teacher focus on the mission of educating Tennessee's children.

**RESOLUTION REQUESTING GENERAL ASSEMBLY TO AMEND TENNESSEE
CODE ANNOTATED § 49-6-3115 TO ALLOW SCHOOL DISTRICTS TO MAKE
RETENTION DECISIONS FOR THIRD AND FOURTH GRADE STUDENTS**

WHEREAS, the _____ Board of Education is charged with governing the school district so that all students receive the best educational opportunities in order to graduate prepared to enter a postsecondary institution or the workforce;

WHEREAS, Tennessee Code Annotated 49-6-3115 states that, beginning with the 2022-2023 school year, a student in third-grade shall not be promoted to the next grade level unless the student is determined to be proficient in English language arts (ELA) based on a performance level rating of “on track” or “mastered” on the ELA portion of the student's most recent Tennessee comprehensive assessment program (TCAP) test;

WHEREAS, Tennessee Code Annotated 49-6-3115 states, however, that a third-grade student who is not proficient in ELA as determined by a performance level rating of “approaching” on the ELA portion of the student's most recent TCAP test may be promoted if:

- a. The student is an English language learner and has received less than two (2) years of ELA instruction;
- b. The student was previously retained in any of the grades K-3;
- c. The student is retested before beginning the next school year and scores proficient in ELA;
- d. The student attends a learning loss bridge camp before the beginning of the upcoming school year, maintains a 90% attendance rate at the camp, and the student's performance on the post-test at the end of the learning loss bridge camp demonstrates adequate growth as determined by the Department of Education; or
- e. The student is assigned a tutor through the Tennessee accelerating literacy and learning corps to provide the student with tutoring services for the entirety of the upcoming school year based on tutoring requirements established by the Department of Education;

WHEREAS, Tennessee Code Annotated 49-6-3115 goes on to further state that a third-grade student who is not proficient in ELA as determined by a performance level rating of “below” on the ELA portion of the student's most recent TCAP test may be promoted if:

- a. The student is an English language learner and has received less than two (2) years of ELA instruction;
- b. The student was previously retained in any of the grades K-3;
- c. The student is retested before beginning the next school year and scores proficient in ELA; or
- d. The student attends a learning loss bridge camp before the beginning of the upcoming school year, maintains a ninety (90%) percent attendance rate at the camp, and is assigned a tutor through the Tennessee accelerating literacy and learning corps to provide the student with tutoring services for the entirety of the upcoming school year based on tutoring requirements established by the Department of Education;

WHEREAS, a student who is promoted to the fourth grade pursuant to this process must show adequate growth on the fourth grade ELA portion of the TCAP test, as determined by the Department of Education, before the student may be promoted to the fifth grade; and

WHEREAS, in states that have adopted similar legislation, the educational outcomes for the students who have been retained have been mixed, with one reported negative outcome being that retention laws can have adverse effects on students with disabilities and at-risk students;

WHEREAS, other than Tennessee, most if not all of the states that have adopted legislation regarding the retention of third-grade students have included a provision allowing school districts to promote students who, even though not proficient in ELA as measured by standardized state tests, showed progress based on school district data demonstrating an understanding of ELA via alternative knowledge assessments; and

WHEREAS, Tennessee's failure to afford school districts the discretion to make retention decisions, based on all school district data that measures student progress, adversely and disproportionately affects students who, for many reasons, might not perform well on standardized tests but yet demonstrate an understanding of ELA via alternative knowledge assessments.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the _____ Board of Education urges the General Assembly to allow school districts the ability to consult with stakeholders and use data that demonstrates a proficiency in ELA when making retention decisions for all students as well as urges that all third grade ELA TCAP results be returned to school districts by May 31st at the latest.

**RESOLUTION REQUESTING A CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT TO ARTICLE
XI, SECTION 5, OF THE TENNESSEE CONSTITUTION**

WHEREAS, the _____ Board of Education is charged with governing the school district so that all students receive the best educational opportunities in order to graduate prepared to enter a postsecondary institution or the workforce;

WHEREAS, Article XI, Section 5, of the Tennessee Constitution prohibits any lotteries or lottery type events except as provided in said Article; and

WHEREAS, the Tennessee Constitution should be amended to allow officially recognized Boards of Education to hold a lottery type event to assist in raising money for educational programs and extracurricular activities held within the school district; and

WHEREAS, this additional funding would create a significant benefit as it would allow school districts the opportunity to better support current educational programs and extracurricular activities as well as provide the opportunity to create new ones.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the _____ Board of Education urges the General Assembly to enact an amendment to Article XI, Section 5, of the Tennessee Constitution to allow Boards of Education to conduct lotteries or lottery-type events to obtain funds that will be solely and exclusively used to supplement the educational and extracurricular programs officially recognized and approved by said Boards of Education.

1 *Individual Schools*

2 The schools shall avoid exploiting students, whether by advertising or otherwise promoting products or
3 services, soliciting funds or information, or securing participation in non-school related activities and
4 functions. At the same time, schools shall inform and assist students in learning about programs,
5 activities or information which may be of help or service to them. To attempt a fair balance, the following
6 general guidelines will apply:¹

- 7 1. Fundraising activities shall be authorized by the Board and shall be for the purpose of
8 supplementing funds for established school programs and not for supplanting funds which are
9 the responsibility of the public.
- 10 2. Fundraising companies and other salespersons shall obtain permission in writing from the
11 director of schools' office to visit the schools.
- 12 3. Any commission payable by companies will be paid in the form of reduced prices to the
13 students, or paid into the activity fund of the school for use by the school. No school employee
14 shall personally benefit from any fundraising activity.
- 15 4. The principal must obtain written approval from the director of schools or designee for all
16 fundraising activities that involve the participation of the general student population in the
17 marketing process of the fundraising effort. All other fundraising activities must have written
18 approval from the principal and comply with all administrative procedures issued by the
19 director of schools. The authorization request shall contain the following information:²
 - 20 a. A list of the proposed fundraising activities;
 - 21 b. Purpose of the fundraising activity;
 - 22 c. Proposed uses of funds raised;
 - 23 d. Expected student involvement in fundraising activity (school-wide or individual class or
24 club); and
 - 25 e. Margin of profit and how it is to be paid to the school.
- 26 5. The director of schools shall determine whether or not the activity will benefit the school,
27 contribute to the welfare of the student body and supplement, not replace, funds necessary to
28 fulfill the board's required contributions.
- 29 6. The director of schools will inform the Board of any approved fundraising activity.
30 Authorization requests and the director's letter of approval shall be provided to the Board
31 before the fundraising activity is implemented.

- 1 7. Students will not be excused from a regular class to participate in a fundraising activity. No
2 grade in a subject or course will be affected by a student's participation in a fundraising
3 activity.
4
- 5 8. No quotas will be imposed on students involved and their efforts will be voluntary. Students
6 who do not participate in fundraising activities will not be punished or discriminated against in
7 any way.
8
- 9 9. Principals shall submit an annual report on fundraising activity to the director of schools and to
10 the Board which will indicate the gross amount of funds raised and the net profit realized.

11 This policy shall not be construed as preventing a teacher from using instructional or informational
12 materials even though the materials might include reference to a brand, product or a service.

13 **LOTTERIES**

14 No fundraising activity shall be conducted which distributes prizes or makes awards to winners from
15 among purchasers of chances by means of tickets or otherwise through a random drawing or other
16 random selection process.³

17 **ONLINE FUNDRAISING**

18 Individual schools may establish school-wide online fundraising accounts. The accounts must meet all
19 fundraising requirements established by the board and the *Internal School Uniform Accounting Policy*
20 *Manual*. The principal/designee of each school shall have access to the established fundraising account
21 to ensure all funds are properly accounted for, and the information is recorded in the school's
22 accounting records by the designated personnel. Online fundraising shall not be used on behalf and for
23 the benefit of an outside party.

24 Employees shall not engage in online fundraising in their official capacity as district employees nor
25 make any reference to non-school sponsored fundraisers, online or otherwise, that would lead another
26 to believe such activity is an approved school fundraiser.

27 **FUNDRAISING FOR NONEDUCATIONAL PURPOSES⁴**

28 On approval of the principal, an employee may be authorized to raise and use funds for the following
29 noneducational purposes:

- 30 1. Bereavement support;

32 2. Award recognition;

34 3. Employee morale;
35
36 4. Banquets; or
37
38 5. Other situations at the principal's discretion.

39 These funds shall be derived from vending machine revenue, donations, or charitable organizations.

- 1 The Director of Schools shall develop administrative procedures regarding the receipt, disbursement,
- 2 accounting, and auditing of these noneducational funds. The Director of Schools shall ensure that the
- 3 procedures are consistent with board policy and state law and disseminate them to all employees.

	Rights and Responsibilities of Students of Legal Age	Rescinds:	Issued:

Every student eighteen (18) years of age or older shall be an eligible student as defined in Hickman County Board of Education policy 6.601 and 6.6011. Such students, like all other students, shall comply with the rules established, pursue the prescribed course of study, and submit to the authority of teachers and other in a position of authority.

FIELD TRIPS/ATHLETIC PROGRAMS

Approved forms for participation shall be required of all students. The form should indicate that the signature is that of the parent or guardian or the eligible student. Sponsors and/or coaches shall be required to confirm the ages of those students signing their own forms.

ATTENDANCE

Notes submitted for attendance-related reasons, normally signed by parents/guardians, may be signed by eligible students.

DISCIPLINE PROCEDURES

Discipline procedures and proceedings shall conform to the requirements established in board policies for student discipline. Notification of discipline infractions shall continue to be communicated with parents and/or guardians. Eligible students, however, are permitted to represent themselves upon reinstatement to school following a suspension. If a student wants to represent himself or herself without parental involvement, he or she shall sign a statement to that effect.

WITHDRAWAL FROM SCHOOL

Eligible students may withdraw from school without parent/guardian approval. Efforts shall be made to contact parents/guardians and the students for a conference and explanation of the consequences that may result from dropping out of school. Assistance shall be provided for educational opportunities that are available to the student.

REPORT CARDS

Progress reports, reports cards, and other documents communicating student progress will be made available to parents.

RESIDENCE REQUIREMENTS

The regulations pertaining to residence requirements shall pertain to eligible students.

FINANCIAL RESPONSIBILITY

Eligible students can be held financially responsible for damage to school property.

12 **Drugs:** Unlawfully possessing, acquiring, attempting

9 school grounds and is not a firearm. This safe harbor provision does not apply if a search is ongoing
10 in the school. If a student approaches a school official and voluntarily surrenders such an object,
11 then the student will not be subject to discipline under these rules. The principal will make
12 arrangements to return the object to the student's parents or legal guardian.
- 13 2. If a student discovers an illegal item such as drugs, a weapon or other contraband (e.g. tobacco,
14 alcohol) on school property, including on a school bus, the student may approach a school official
15 and report the discovery. A student shall not be in violation of the rules solely by making such a report.
16 School officials shall use discretion in determining whether the circumstances surrounding the report
17 warrant further investigation of the reporting student.

~~If all steps of the administrative procedure have been pursued and there is still a desire to appeal to the Board, the matter shall be referred in writing to the office of the director of schools and the Board shall determine whether to hear the appeal.~~

APPEARING BEFORE THE BOARD

The Board will add 15 minutes of public comment time to the beginning of each board meeting. Individuals desiring to speak during public comment period should sign up to speak prior to the meeting. The sign-up sheet for public comment will be available at the meeting location 1 hour prior to the meeting. The sign-up sheet will include (1.) Name (2.) address.

Use respect when presenting your concern, be prepared, and end timely. Stick to facts as you know them.

~~Individuals desiring to appear before the Board must submit a written request with descriptive materials to the office of the director of schools ten (10) days before the meeting. If the request is approved by the Executive Committee, the item will be placed on the agenda. Individuals placed on the agenda will be recognized at the beginning of the meeting and given time to speak when their topic of interest is addressed on the agenda. All requests submitted will be included in the board packet.~~

Recognition of individuals who are not citizens of **Hickman County** ~~the school system~~ is to be determined by a majority vote of the Board.

The chairman may recognize individuals not on the agenda for remarks to the Board if he/she determines that such is in the public interest. A majority vote of members present can overrule the decision of the chairman.

Individuals speaking to the Board shall address remarks to the Board ~~chairman~~ and may direct questions to individual board members or staff members only upon approval of the chairman. Each person speaking shall state his name, address, and subject of presentation. Remarks may ~~will~~ be limited to five (3 5) minutes unless time is extended by the Board. The chairman shall have the authority to terminate the remarks of any individual who is disruptive ~~or does not adhere to Board rules.~~[†] Members of the Board and the director of schools have the privilege of asking questions of any person who addresses the Board.

1 *General*

2 The Director of Schools shall be responsible for library collection development. Library materials shall
3 be reviewed to ensure the content aligns with state law.¹ The library collection shall adhere to the
4 following criteria:

- 5 1. Materials shall be suitable for and consistent with the educational mission of the school;
6
- 7 2. Materials shall be appropriate for the age and maturity levels of the students who may access
8 them. The determining factor will be based on an assessment of any mature themes or content
9 (i.e., violence, sexual content, vulgar language, substance abuse);
10
- 11 3. Materials shall contain literary, historical, and/or artistic value and merit; and
12
4. The collection as a whole shall offer a variety of viewpoints.

14 Grade level supervisors shall be responsible for periodically reviewing the district's library collection
15 in line with these established standards.

16 The Board supports principles of intellectual freedom inherent in the First Amendment of the
17 Constitution of the United States¹ and expressed in the *Library Bill of Rights* of the American Library
18 Association.

19 Because opinions differ, there may be questions concerning some instructional and library materials
20 despite the quality of the selection process.

21 **COMPLAINTS**

22 If a complaint is made by an employee, student, or parent/guardian, this process is to be followed:

- 23 1. Inform the complainant of the selection procedures and make no commitments.
24
- 25 2. Request the complainant to submit a Request for Reconsideration of Library Materials form.
26
- 27 3. Inform the principal (and other appropriate personnel).
28
- 29 4. Keep challenged materials available for use during the reconsideration process.

- 1 5. Upon receipt of the completed form, the principal shall notify the Director of Schools.
- 3 6. The principal shall request review of the challenged materials by an ad hoc materials review
4 committee within ten business days. The review committee is appointed by the principal and
5 includes certified library media personnel, representatives from classroom teachers, one or
6 more parents, and may include one or more students. The principal will inform the Director of
7 Schools of the review committee's progress.
- 8
- 9 7. The review committee shall take the following steps after receiving the challenged materials:
- 10
- 11 a. Read, view, or listen to the contested material in its entirety;
- 12 b. Check general acceptance of the material by reading recognized and evaluative reviews;
- 13 c. Determine the extent to which the material supports the educational mission of the
14 school;
- 15 d. Complete the appropriate Checklist for Reconsideration of Library Materials, judging
16 the material for its strength and value; and
- 17 e. Present recommendation to principal for further action and to the Director of Schools
18 for purposes of information.
- 19
- 20 8. The Board shall review the recommendation presented by the review committee and make the
21 determination whether the material is appropriate for the age and maturity levels of the students
22 who have access to the materials and whether the material is suitable for, and consistent with,
23 the educational mission of the school.
- 25 9. If it is determined that the material is not appropriate for the age and maturity levels of the
26 students who have access to them or is not suitable for, and consistent with, the educational
27 mission of the school, the Board shall require the school to remove the material from the library
28 collection.

1 All employees, prior to entering service, shall present a certificate showing a satisfactory health record.¹
2 Employees shall inform the director of schools whenever they contract a contagious or communicable
3 disease.

4 No employee who has any communicable disease shall perform his/her duties in any location where such
5 might endanger the health of school children. The Board shall require any employee to submit to a
6 physical examination by a physician whenever there is reason to believe that the employee has any
7 communicable disease.²

8 The director of schools shall reassign or suspend any employee who is suspected of having a
9 communicable disease which might endanger the health of children, pending investigation and final
10 disposition of the case before the Board.

11 To assist the Board in making final disposition of the case, the director of schools may refer the case to
12 the County Health Office or other medical experts.

13 The Board shall use the written report to determine the employment status of the employee.

1 LIABILITY AND NON-DISCRIMINATION

2 No employee who is diagnosed with HIV infection or AIDS shall be prevented from continuing his/her
3 employment. No disciplinary action may be taken against an employee solely on the basis of HIV
4 infection or AIDS. Action may be taken against an employee only if s/he is disabled and the disability
5 interferes with his/her ability to perform the activities involved in employment duties. The Board shall
6 make reasonable accommodation to enable the employee to perform employment duties as may be
7 required by state or federal law.¹

8 HIV/AIDS TESTING

9 No school official can require any employee to undergo an HIV antibody test or other HIV-related test.
10 This does not preclude school officials from requiring an employee to undergo an examination when
11 another communicable illness is suspected.²

12 CONFIDENTIALITY

13 If information is received regarding an employee's HIV status, the director of schools may consult with
14 the school board attorney on the appropriate course of action to pursue, bearing in mind the school
15 system's potential liability for defamation, employment discrimination, and breach of confidentiality
16 requirements.³

17 Information about an employee's HIV status is not to be documented in the employee's personnel file
18 and shall not be faxed.^{1,3}

19 Information obtained is confidential and may not be released to anyone except:³

- 20 1. Persons named on an Authorization for Release of Confidential HIV-Related
21 Information Form;
- 22
- 23 2. Persons listed on a court order, and
- 24
- 25 3. Persons authorized to receive such information without a release or court order according
26 to TCA 68-10-113.
- 27

28 **Under no circumstances shall information identifying an employee with AIDS be released to the**
29 **public.**
30

1 **INFECTION CONTROL**

2 To prevent and manage exposure in the workplace, all school system employees will receive in-service
3 training and education annually regarding HIV/AIDS and OSHA's Blood-borne Pathogens Standard.
4 The Board shall follow the most current Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) Universal
5 Precautions for Prevention of Transmission of Human Immunodeficiency Virus, Hepatitis B Virus, and
6 Other Blood-borne Pathogens in Health Care Settings.³

7 **EDUCATION AND TRAINING**

8 Annually, the director of schools shall ensure that all employees, including newly hired staff, receive
9 current HIV training. These programs can utilize the educational/training resources of agencies or private
10 institutions with personnel trained in the areas of HIV/AIDS prevention education.¹

11 The director of schools shall be responsible for developing, revising and implementing the administrative
12 guidelines and procedures for this policy.⁴ The director of schools shall be responsible for enforcing this
13 policy by communicating it to all personnel and by providing necessary instruction to all administrators.

1 All schools shall provide a sanitary environment and shall establish routines for handling body fluids
2 that are recommended by appropriate health professionals.¹

3 All school district personnel shall be advised of routine procedures to follow in handling body fluids.
4 These procedures shall provide simple and effective precautions against transmission of diseases to
5 persons potentially exposed to the blood or body fluids of another. These procedures shall be standard
6 health and safety practices. No distinction shall be made between body fluids from individuals with a
7 known disease and individuals without symptoms or with an undiagnosed disease.

8 The administration shall develop, in consultation with medical personnel, a regulation to be distributed
9 to all staff. Training and appropriate supplies shall be available to all personnel including those involved
10 in transportation and custodial services.

11 In addition to insuring that these health and safety practices are carried out on a districtwide basis, special
12 emphasis shall be placed in those areas of school district operation that potentially present a greater need
13 for these precautions.

14 **CONFIDENTIALITY AND NON-DISCRIMINATION²**

15 In all instances, district personnel shall respect the individual's right to privacy and treat any medical
16 diagnosis as confidential information. The director of schools shall initiate procedures to insure that all
17 medical information will be held in strict confidence. Any school staff member who violates
18 confidentiality shall be subject to appropriate disciplinary measures.

19 Under no circumstances shall information identifying an employee with HBV be released to the public.

20 **SAFETY**

21 Employees who are at high risk of occupational exposure shall be identified and provided with personal
22 protective equipment, including HBV vaccinations. Employees considered to be at high risk shall
23 include custodians, school nurses, special education teachers and instructional assistants, playground
24 supervisors, coaches and physical education teachers.

25 When any employee is known to have been exposed to HBV on the job site, the employee will be notified
26 immediately by a supervisor, and the Board shall provide vaccinations.

27 The principal will ensure that an accident report is filed for all accidents. The report will include the
28 employee's name, date of the accident, an explanation of the accident and the care used in treating the
29 individual. These reports will be kept on file in the principal's office for a minimum of one (1) year.

30 **EDUCATION AND UNIVERSAL PRECAUTIONS**

- 1 HBV education, including universal precautions on handling blood and other body fluids, will be
- 2 provided to all school personnel and volunteers and may include members of the Board.

1 REASONABLE SUSPICION DRUG TESTING

2 Trained supervisors have the responsibility to observe and document the cause for reasonable
3 suspicion and when appropriate, refer the matter to the director of schools/designee. It is not the
4 supervisor's responsibility to attempt diagnosis. All information, facts and circumstances leading to
5 and supporting this suspicion should be included in a written report detailing the basis for the
6 suspicion. After the report is filed, the employee should be notified.

7 Any employee may be required to submit to substance screening if the following conditions exist: (list
8 is not inclusive)

- 9 1. Observed use, possession or sale of illegal drugs and/or use, possession, sale, or abuse of
10 alcohol and/or prescription drugs.
- 11 2. Apparent physical state of impairment of motor functions.
- 12 3. Marked changes in personal behavior not attributed to other factors.
- 13 4. Employee involvement in or contribution to an accident where the use of alcohol or drugs
14 is reasonably suspected or employee involvement in a pattern of repetitive accidents
15 whether or not they involve actual or potential injury.
- 16 5. Violation of criminal statutes involving the use of illegal drugs, alcohol or prescription
17 drugs and/or violations of drug statutes.
- 18
- 19
- 20
- 21

22 TESTING FOR CDL EMPLOYEES

23 All drivers and applicants for driver positions who are required to hold a Commercial Drivers License
24 (CDL) to perform their job function must adhere to the requirements of this policy and all procedures
25 relating to this policy.¹

26 The use, possession, sale, purchase or transfer of any controlled substances except medically prescribed
27 drugs on school property, while on school business or while operating school vehicles and equipment is
28 prohibited. Drinking alcoholic beverages during working hours, four (4) hours before reporting to work
29 or having any measurable amount of alcohol in his/her system during working hours is prohibited,
30 whether on or off school property. Working hours include all breaks. Off-duty use of drugs and alcohol
31 is prohibited to the extent that it affects driver's attendance or performance and his/her ability to pass

1 required DOT alcohol and controlled substance tests. Any violation of this policy is grounds for
2 termination as employee of the Board and possible legal prosecution.

3 The use of any prescription drug that could affect the central nervous system or one that would impair
4 reaction time shall be reported to the director of schools/director of transportation. Notice shall be given
5 of non-prescription (over-the-counter) drugs being taken on a regular basis. The notice shall include the
6 duration of ingestion and the possible side effects.

7 **Procedures**

8 The execution and enforcement of this policy will follow set procedures to screen bodily fluids, conduct
9 breath testing, and/or search all employee/applicants for alcohol and drug use, and those employees
10 suspected of violating this policy who are involved in a reportable accident or who are periodically or
11 randomly selected. The procedures are designed not only to detect violations of this policy, but also to
12 ensure fairness to each employee. Disciplinary action will be taken as necessary.

13 **Implementation**

14 The director of schools/director of transportation is authorized to implement this policy and procedures
15 for the drug testing program, including a periodic review of the program to address any problems,
16 changes and/or revisions of it, maintenance of all records required by the federal regulations, and
17 determination upon Board approval of how the program will be accomplished, whether in-house,
18 contracted or by consortium.

19 **Dissemination**

20 The director of schools/director of transportation shall be responsible for communicating this policy
21 and the procedures to all employees affected by this policy and shall be accountable for its consistent
22 enforcement.² The director of schools/director of transportation is designated to answer questions
23 about this policy, procedures and all other matters involved in alcohol and controlled substance testing
24 of CDL drivers and the reasonable suspicion testing of all other employees.

1 Employees shall be provided a work environment free from sexual, racial, ethnic and religious
2 discrimination/ harassment. It shall be a violation of this policy for any employee or any student to
3 discriminate against or harass an employee through disparaging conduct or communication that is sexual,
4 racial, ethnic or religious in nature. The following guidelines are set forth to protect employees from
5 discrimination/ harassment.

6 Employee discrimination/harassment will not be tolerated.¹ Discrimination/harassment is defined as
7 conduct, advances, gestures or words either written or spoken of a sexual, racial, ethnic or religious
8 nature which:

- 9 1. Unreasonably interfere with the individual's work or performance; or
- 10 2. Create an intimidating, hostile or offensive work environment; or
- 11 3. Imply that submission to such conduct is made an explicit or implicit term of employment;
- 12 4. Imply that submission to or rejection of such conduct will be used as a basis for an employment
13 decision affecting the harassed employee.

14 Alleged victims of sexual, racial, ethnic and religious discrimination/harassment shall report these
15 incidents immediately.² This report should be made to the immediate supervisor except when the
16 immediate supervisor is the offending party. If the immediate supervisor is the offending party, the report
17 may be made to the Federal Rights Coordinator or the director of schools. Allegations of
18 discrimination/harassment shall be fully investigated (as set forth in Complaints and Grievances 5.500).
19 An oral complaint may be submitted; however, such complaint must be reduced to writing to ensure a
20 more complete investigation. The complaint should include the following information:

- 21 1. Identity of the alleged victim and person accused;
- 22 2. Location, date, time and circumstances surrounding the alleged incident;
- 23 3. Description of what happened;
- 24 4. Identity of witnesses; and
- 25 5. Any other evidence available.

26 The privacy and anonymity of all parties and witnesses to complaints will be respected. However,
27 because an individual's need for confidentiality must be balanced with obligations to cooperate with
28 police investigations or legal proceedings, to provide due process to the accused, to conduct a thorough
29 investigation or to take necessary action to resolve a complaint, the identity of parties and witnesses may
30 be disclosed in appropriate circumstances to individuals with a need to know.

31 A substantiated charge against an employee shall result in disciplinary action up to and including
32 termination. A substantiated charge against a student may result in corrective or disciplinary action up
33 to and including suspension.

- 1 There will be no retaliation against any person who reports discrimination/harassment or participates in
- 2 an investigation. However, any employee who refuses to cooperate or gives false information during the
- 3 course of any investigation may be subject to disciplinary action. The willful filing of a false report will
- 4 itself be considered harassment and will be treated as such.

- 5 An employee disciplined for violation of this policy may appeal the decision by contacting the Federal
- 6 Rights Coordinator or the director of schools.

1 EMPLOYMENT-RELATED COMPLAINTS/GRIEVANCES

2 The Board believes that differences of opinions arising in the course of employment should be resolved
3 as quickly as possible and at the lowest supervisory level.

4 In instances of questions by an individual staff member concerning the interpretation of policies and
5 procedures to that staff member, administrative practices within his/her particular school, and
6 relationships with other employees, the staff member concerned must consult the administrative or
7 supervisory personnel to whom he/she is responsible. If a satisfactory resolution of the problem cannot
8 be reached after ample opportunity for consideration of the matter, the staff member concerned may
9 discuss the matter with the next level of supervision up to and including the director of schools.

10 In instances where an individual staff member feels for personal reasons that he/she cannot discuss a
11 problem with his/her immediate superior, he/she may take the problem directly to the director of schools.
12 After review of the case, the director of schools shall take action as he/she deems appropriate and within
13 a prompt, reasonable time shall notify all parties concerned of his decision.

14 HARASSMENT/DISCRIMINATION GRIEVANCES

15 Employees should notify any district complaint manager if they believe the Board, its employees or
16 agents have violated their rights guaranteed by the State or federal Constitution, State or federal statute
17 or board policy including:^{1,2,3}

- 18 1. Age Discrimination Employment Act;¹
- 19
- 20 2. Title II of the Americans with Disabilities Act⁴
- 21
- 22 3. Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972⁵
- 23
- 24 4. Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973⁶
- 25
- 26 5. Claims of sexual harassment under Title VII of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 and Title IX of the
27 Education Amendments of 1972^{7,5}

28 The complaint manager will endeavor to respond and resolve complaints without resorting to this
29 grievance procedure and, if a complaint is filed, to address the complaint promptly and equitably. The
30 right of a person to prompt and equitable resolution of the complaint shall not be impaired by the
31 person's pursuit of other remedies. Use of this grievance procedure is not a prerequisite to the pursuit
32 of other remedies and use of this grievance procedure does not extend any filing deadline related to the
33 pursuit of other remedies.

- 1 1. Filing a Complaint — An employee who wishes to avail himself or herself of this grievance
2 procedure may do so by filing a complaint with any district complaint manager. The employee
3 may request a complaint manager of the same sex. The complaint manager may assist the
4 employee in filing a grievance.
5
- 6 2. Investigation — The complaint manager will investigate the complaint or appoint a qualified
7 person to undertake the investigation on his or her behalf. The complaint and identity of the
8 complainant will not be disclosed except (1) as required by law or this policy; or (2) as
9 necessary to fully investigate the complaint; or (3) as authorized by the complainant. The
10 complaint manager shall file a written report within ten (10) days of the filing of the grievance,
11 of his or her findings with the director of schools. If a complaint of sexual harassment contains
12 allegations involving the director of schools, the written report shall be filed with the Board.
13 The director of schools shall keep the Board informed of all complaints.
14
- 15 3. Decision and Appeal — After receipt of the complaint manager's report, the director of schools
16 shall render a written decision within five (5) days of the receipt of the report which shall be
17 provided to the employee. If the employee is not satisfied with the decision, the employee may
18 appeal the decision to the Board by making a written request to the complaint manager. The
19 complaint manager shall be responsible for promptly forwarding all materials relative to the
20 complaint and appeal to the Board. Thereafter, the Board shall render within thirty (30) days
21 from the date the appeal was received, review the report and affirm, overrule or modify the
22 decision and render a written finding which shall be provided to the complainant. This
23 grievance procedure shall not be construed to create an independent right to a Board hearing.

24 **APPOINTING COMPLAINT MANAGERS**

25 The director of schools shall appoint at least two complaint managers, one of each gender. The Federal
26 Rights Coordinator may be appointed as a complaint manager. The director of schools shall insert into
27 this policy the names, addresses and telephone numbers of current complaint managers. (see note)

28 *(Note: Title IX regulations require districts to identify the name, address and telephone number of the*
29 *person who is responsible for coordinating the district's compliance efforts. A policy should not be*
30 *adopted with a person's name in it; rather, the identifying information can be added and amended as*
31 *necessary.)*

1 In fulfilling any citizenship rights and responsibilities, employees shall give proper consideration to the
2 educational welfare of students and ensure that no conflict exists with their actual duties.

3 Each staff member has the right to:

- 25 1. Make themselves familiar with and abide by, the laws of the state as these affect their work, the
26 policies of the board and the procedures designed to implement them;
- 27 2. To adhere to the Teacher Code of Ethics;⁵
- 28 3. Exercise good judgment in selecting issues for discussion and balance the relative maturity of
29 students and the students' right to know;

- 1 4. Be courteous and helpful in interacting and responding to parents, visitors and members of the
- 2 public;
- 3 5. Keep all records and prepare and submit promptly all reports that may be required by state law,
- 4 state board regulations, board policy and administrative procedures; and

1 ADMINISTRATIVE PERSONNEL

2 Administrative and supervisory personnel shall have no financial interest, directly or indirectly, in
3 supplying books, maps, school furniture, or apparatus for the schools or to act as agent for any author,
4 publisher, bookseller, or dealer in school furniture or apparatus, however a spouse or family member of
5 a principal, teacher or other school administrative employee may participate in business transactions
6 with the school system where a sealed competitive bid system is used, provided that the employee does
7 not have discretion in the selection of bids or specifications.¹

8 It shall be a misdemeanor for the director of schools to take any other contract under the Board, to
9 perform any other service for additional compensation, to act as principal or teacher in any school, or to
10 become the owner of a school warrant other than that allowed for his/her service as director of schools
11 or as secretary to the Board.²

12 PROFESSIONAL AND SUPPORT PERSONNEL

13 Employees of the Board will not engage in, or have financial interest in, any activity that raises a
14 reasonable question of conflict of interest with their duties and responsibilities as members of the school
15 staff. This includes but is not limited to the following:

- 16 1. School employees may not purchase for sale to students any goods or equipment or render any
17 service to the school system on a commission basis;¹
18
- 19 2. Employees who have patented or copyrighted any device, publication, or other item will not
20 receive royalties for use of such item in the school system;
21
- 22 3. Employees will not engage in any type of work where the source of information concerning a
23 customer, client, or employer originates from information obtained through the school system;
24
- 25 4. The Board shall make no purchase of supplies, materials, or equipment from a school system
26 employee; and
27
- 28 5. Employees shall not solicit for the purpose of selling instructional supplies, equipment and
29 reference books in a territory that includes the parents of the children of the school in which the
30 employee is assigned.

1 WORK SCHEDULES

2 The workday for full-time licensed and professional staff will be a minimum of eight hours¹ and will
3 continue until professional responsibilities to the student and the school are completed. Administrative
4 meetings, curriculum development, student supervision, assigned duties, parent conferences, group or
5 individual planning and extra-curricular activities will require hours beyond the stated minimum.
6 Teachers shall be allotted a duty-free planning period of two and one-half (2 1/2) hours each week to
7 provide time for planning, preparation for effective teaching and attention to major program
8 improvement.² Work schedules for other employees will be defined by the director of schools or his/her
9 designee, consistent with the Fair Labor Standards Act and the provisions of this policy.

10 WORKWEEK DEFINED

11 Working hours for all employees not exempted under the Fair Labor Standards Act,³ including
12 secretaries, bus drivers, cafeteria, janitorial and maintenance personnel, will conform to federal and state
13 regulations. The director of schools will ensure that job positions are classified as exempt or non-exempt
14 and that employees are made aware of such classifications. Supervisors will make every effort to avoid
15 circumstances which will require non-exempt employees to work more than forty (40) hours each week.
16 For purposes of compliance with the Fair Labor Standards Act, the workweek for school district
17 employees will be 12:00 a.m. Sunday until 11:59 p.m. Saturday.

18 OVERTIME AND COMPENSATORY TIME⁴

19 The Board discourages overtime work by non-exempt employees. A non-exempt employee will not work
20 overtime without the express approval of his/her supervisor. All overtime work must be expressly
21 approved in writing by the director of schools or his/her designee. All supervisory personnel must
22 monitor overtime on a weekly basis and report such time to the director of schools/designee. Principals
23 and supervisors will monitor employees' work, will ensure that overtime provisions of this policy and
24 the Fair Labor Standards Act are followed and will ensure that all employees are compensated for any
25 overtime worked. Principals or supervisors may need to adjust daily schedules to prevent non-exempt
26 employees from working more than forty (40) hours in a workweek. Accurate and complete time sheets
27 of actual hours worked during the workweek will be signed by each employee and submitted to the
28 finance director. The finance director will review work records of employees on a regular basis to make
29 an assessment of overtime use.

30 In lieu of overtime compensation, non-exempt employees may receive compensatory time off at a rate
31 of not less than one and one-half (1.5) hours for one hour of overtime worked, if such compensatory time
32 (1) is pursuant to an agreement between the employer and employee reached before overtime work is
33 performed, and (2) is authorized by the immediate supervisor.

1 Employees will be allowed to use compensatory time within a reasonable period after requesting such
2 use if the requested use of the compensatory time does not unduly disrupt the operation of the school
3 division. Employees may accrue a maximum of 240 compensatory time hours before they will be
4 provided overtime pay at the rate earned by the employee at the time the employee receives such
5 payment. In addition, upon leaving the school division, an employee must be paid for any unused
6 compensatory time at the rate of not less than the higher of (1) the average regular rate received by the
7 employee during his/her last three (3) years of employment, or (2) the final regular rate received by the
8 employee.

9 Non-exempt employees whose workweek is less than forty (40) hours will be paid at the regular rate of
10 pay for time worked up to forty (40) hours. Such employees shall be provided overtime pay or
11 compensatory time as provided for working more than forty (40) hours in a workweek.

12 This policy shall be included in the staff handbook, however, employees will be provided with a copy
13 of this policy and will be required to sign this policy to acknowledge their understanding of overtime
14 and compensatory time provisions. Such signed policy shall be placed in the employee's personnel file
15 and shall constitute the written agreement required in this section.

16 ATTENDANCE EXPECTATIONS

17 All employees are expected to be present during all work hours. Absence without prior approval, chronic
18 absences, habitual tardiness or abuses of designated working hours are all considered neglect of duty and
19 will result in disciplinary action up to and including dismissal.

1 Staff meetings shall be held in each school for the purpose of promoting school improvement and
2 professional growth and may be conducted by the principal, teachers or committees.

3 Faculty meetings shall be held at regularly scheduled times in each school, and teachers will reserve
4 those appointed times for this purpose. Such meetings shall be attended by all teachers unless excused
5 by the principal.

6 When possible, the building level principal shall provide an agenda for each faculty meeting.

7 Professional personnel shall also attend all designated meetings called by the administration of the school
8 district.

9 Special called meetings or changes in regularly scheduled meetings should be announced two (2) days
10 in advance of such meeting.

11 Emergency meetings may be called at any time.

12 When excused from a staff meeting, the teacher is responsible for contacting the principal and obtaining
13 information presented at the meeting.

14 Teachers' meetings may include but not be limited to:

- 15 1. Meetings of the entire staff of school;
- 16
- 17 2. Meetings of teachers in the same subject area or on the same grade level;
- 18
- 19 3. System-wide in-service meetings; and
- 20
- 21 4. Committee meetings dealing with specific problems.

22 Coaches have the same responsibility to attend faculty meetings, in-service meetings, assemblies and
23 other school activities as do other teachers. However, during the season of the sport to which the coach
24 is assigned, he/she may be excused by the principal from meetings held after the close of the school day.
25 It shall be the responsibility of the coach to inquire of other teachers as to the content of meetings missed
26 and to keep informed of activities going on in the school.

Outline of Hepatitis B for Hickman County School Employees

Hickman County Schools will make the Hepatitis B vaccine available to all employees who have occupational exposure and to employees who are at high risk of occupational exposure to blood or other potentially infectious material at no cost to the employee.

The Hepatitis B vaccine shall be made available after the employee has received the annual Blood-borne Pathogen training and within 10 days of initial assignment to a job where there is occupational exposure. A consent form to receive the HBV will be signed, by the employee, and kept on file with Hickman County Schools. An employee may decline the Hepatitis B vaccination, in which case the employee must sign a declination statement that will also be kept on file with Hickman County Schools. The employee may, at a later date, request the vaccination.

Employees considered to be at high risk shall include custodians, school nurses, special education teachers and instructional assistants, playground supervisors, coaches and physical education teachers.

*Additional high risk employees not stated in current board policy: maintenance, first-aid administrators (first responders, front office staff and principals), therapists (OT, PT, Speech) and preschool teachers.

Procedure for identifying and vaccinating high risk employees:

1. At the beginning of each school year, CSH will request from principals the names of any new employees/volunteers assigned to high risk positions for occupational exposure.
2. These individuals will be contacted personally or via email/mailed letter and offered the HBV.
3. Either a signed consent to receive the HBV or a signed declination form will be obtained.
4. Three Rivers Health Center will be notified of the employees requesting the HBV.
5. Employees requesting the HBV will call and make an appointment with Three Rivers to receive the vaccine. At this time, the employee will make the clinic aware that they are a Hickman County School employee. Also, required forms from Three Rivers will be made available to the employee previously and expected to be filled out and presented when arriving at Three Rivers (on the scheduled appointment date).
6. CSH will follow-up with employees requesting the HBV vaccine until the 3 shot series is complete. The dates of the received vaccines will be documented and kept confidential and not disclosed or reported without the employee's consent. Hickman County Schools will keep these files for the duration of employment plus 30 years.

Any school district employee who has an exposure incident should follow the Exposure Control Plan. This document is updated annually.

Exposed employee should:

1. Immediately wash exposed area or flush mucous membrane with running water.
2. Contact the principal and the school nurse.
3. Post-exposure evaluation and follow-up will be conducted as listed in detail in the Exposure Control Plan.

1. Follow reporting procedures outlined in board policy 5.501.
