**Discussion and Possible Action to Approve an Order Approving Early Voting and Election Day Voting Sites and Other Matters in Connection with the May 2, 2026 Trustee District Nine Election**

Presented to the Board Acting as Committee of the Whole on April 14, 2026 and now presented to the Board for approval at a regular meeting on April 21, 2026.

**MINUTE ORDER:**

**“The Board hereby approves the attached Order approving early voting and election day voting sites and other matters in connection with the May 2, 2026 Trustee District 9 election.”**

**PURPOSE:**

To ratify the Early Voting sites and to approve the Election Day voting sites as designated by Bexar County under the Countywide Polling Place Program and other matters in connection with the May 2, 2026 election for Trustee District Nine.

**BACKGROUND:**

On January 20, 2026, the Board called a general election on the Uniform Election Date of Saturday, May 2, 2026 to elect Trustees for single-member Districts 4, 8, and 9, whose terms expire in May 2026. The Board also approved that the Trustee election be conducted by Bexar County under a Contract for Election Services. On March 17, 2026, the Board cancelled the May 2, 2026 Trustee election for Districts 4 and 8 because the incumbents were unopposed and ordered the election to proceed as to Trustee District 9. The Board also approved the execution of the Contract for Election Services with Bexar County and payment required. Bexar County is participating in the Countywide Polling Place Program, implemented by the Texas Secretary of State and authorized by Texas Election Code §43.007, which has the effect of reducing the number of voting sites and election costs and allows voters to vote at any voting site(voting center, polling place) on Early Voting days and Election Day.

Financial: Estimated pro rata share of \$54,855.06 with deposit of \$27,427.53, excluding cost of any runoff election for District 9

**ORDER APPROVING EARLY VOTING AND ELECTION DAY VOTING SITES  
AND OTHER MATTERS IN CONNECTION WITH THE MAY 2, 2026 ELECTION**

**WHEREAS**, on January 20, 2026, the Alamo College Community District Board of Trustees (the “Board”) passed and approved an Order Calling a General Election for May 2, 2026, a uniform election day, to elect Trustees to serve six-year terms for single-member Districts Four (4), Eight (8) and Nine (9) (“Order”); and

**WHEREAS**, the Order specified that Bexar County would conduct the Trustee election under a Contract for Election Services and Early Voting and Election Day polling places (“voting sites”) to be designated by Bexar County would be approved at a later Board meeting; and

**WHEREAS**, by Order signed on March 17, 2026, in compliance with the Texas Election Code, the Board cancelled the May 2, 2026 Election as to District 4 and 8 be cancelled because the candidates were certified as unopposed, and the Election will proceed only as to District 9; and

**WHEREAS**, by Order signed on March 17, 2026, the Board approved the Contract for Election Services with Bexar County, including its execution and payment of ACCD’s pro rata share of expenses in the Joint General Election as determined by Bexar County Elections Administration; and

**WHEREAS**, Bexar County is participating in the Countywide Polling Place Program, which was implemented by the Texas Secretary of State to eliminate county election precinct polling places and establish countywide polling places for elections, including any election held under contract for election services, pursuant to Texas Election Code §43.007, effective September 1, 2025; and

**WHEREAS**, the Countywide Polling Place Program allows a registered voter in Bexar County to vote at any designated polling place in Bexar County and is more cost effective and administratively efficient by reducing the number of voting sites; and

**WHEREAS**, Bexar County, in compliance with the Countywide Polling Place Program, has designated the voting sites for Early Voting and Election Day voting for the May 2, 2026 Joint General Election, and the voting sites, also referred to as Vote Centers, are ready to be approved by the Board.

IT IS, THEREFORE, ORDERED BY THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE ALAMO COMMUNITY COLLEGE DISTRICT AS FOLLOWS:

**Section 1. Contractual Authority.** The Board has the authority, pursuant to Chapter 271 Texas Election Code and Chapter 791 of the Texas Government Code, to enter into contracts for election services with Bexar County, Texas.

**Section 2. Trustee Election for District 9.** Pursuant to Chapter 31 of the Texas Election Code, the Board ORDERS that the May 2, 2026 General Election for Trustee of single-member District 9 proceed and be conducted under the terms and conditions of the Contract for Election Services between Bexar County, Texas and the Alamo Community College District.

**Section 3. Approval of Contracts.** The Board hereby RATIFIES the previously approved Contract for Election Services with Bexar County, Texas. The Board APPROVES that Bexar County conduct the ACCD District 9 Trustee election on May 2, 2026 jointly with other political subdivisions. The Board further APPROVES the expenditure of the District’s pro rata share of the cost of the election as determined by Bexar County.

**Section 4. Early Voting Polling Places and Times.** The Board hereby APPROVES the final Early Voting polling places (“voting sites” or “vote centers”) designated by Bexar County for the May 2, 2026 Joint General Election, as shown on the attachments to this Order. The Board APPROVES Bexar County’s designation of San Antonio College as the only Alamo College to be used as a countywide polling place for early voting. The Board’s prior approval of the other four Alamo Colleges to be early voting sites is WITHDRAWN to comply with the Countywide Polling Place Program. The Board further APPROVES the days and times for Early Voting, established by Bexar County, as shown on the Early Voting Schedule prepared by Bexar County, attached hereto.

**Section 5. Election Day Polling Places.** The Board hereby APPROVES the final Election Day polling places (“voting sites” or “vote centers”) designated by Bexar County for the May 2, 2026 Joint General Election, as shown on the attachments to this Order. The Board APPROVES Bexar County’s designation of San Antonio College and Northeast Lakeview College as the only Alamo Colleges to be used as a countywide polling place for Early Voting. The Board’s prior approval of the other three Alamo Colleges to be early voting sites is WITHDRAWN to comply with the Countywide Polling Place Program. The Election Day polling places will be open from 7 am to 7 pm as required by the Texas Election Code.

**Section 6. Authorization to Execute.** The Chair of the Board is authorized to execute and the Secretary of the Board is authorized to attest this Order on behalf of the Board. The Board APPROVES that the Board Chair is authorized to do and/or delegate to have done all other things legal and necessary in connection with the holding and consummation of the May 2, 2026 Election for Trustee of Single-Member District 9.

**Section 7. Effective Date.** This Order is effective immediately upon its passage and approval.

It is with deep gratitude and pride that the San Antonio College Empowerment Center submits this letter to formally justify the naming of the Empowerment Center's Dream Leadership Center in honor of the Woman's Club of San Antonio.

This spring, the Empowerment Center celebrates 45 years of service, advocacy and impact. Over its span of existence, the department has provided comprehensive services and programs to meet the many unique needs of our target populations with the goal of maximizing opportunities and providing vital resources to at-risk, non-traditional adult learners who often have limited access to education.

Since 2011, the Woman's Club of San Antonio has demonstrated an extraordinary and unwavering dedication to educational access and student success through its generous scholarship and other support of Empowerment Center students. Over the past 15 years, the Woman's Club has donated \$233,000 in scholarship assistance, directly benefiting 233 students. Each scholarship represents not only financial assistance but also belief in the potential, resilience and leadership capacity of our students. Their support has been consistent, even as leadership has changed hands, which is a testament to their dedication to Empowerment Center students.

### MINUTE ORDER

**"The Board of Trustees hereby approves the award of contracts for the purchase of Architectural, Engineering (Civil, Planning and Programming), Master Planning, and Specialty Services shown below in Attachments 1-6 or to the next highest ranked awardees that negotiate fair and reasonable prices and terms acceptable to District counsel, as requested by the Office of the Chancellor for Finance and Auxiliary Services**

### PURPOSE

To approve the purchase of Architectural, Engineering, Master Planning, and Specialty Services from the selected awardees, including, without limitation, for the planning, design, and construction of Alamo Colleges District's 2025 General Obligation Bond Capital Improvement Program (2025 CIP).

Services will be performed, as needed, and based on requirements and funding, on an Indefinite Delivery, Indefinite Quantity (IDIQ) basis District Wide. There is NO guarantee of any work associated with this approval.

Contractors may work on any of the Alamo Colleges District design and construction projects, which include new construction, remodeling, renovations, and/or system upgrades.

For 2025 CIP services the contractors will report to Dr. Sean Maika, Ed. D, Interim Vice Chancellor for Facilities and Facility Services.

It is Alamo Colleges District's intent to contract for services until completion of the 2025 CIP. If at the end of the contract term, services are satisfactory and fees and rates remain unchanged, this minute order authorizes an option to extend the contract for an additional three-year renewal upon mutual consent of the Contractor and Alamo Colleges District.

### BACKGROUND

A notice soliciting a Request for Qualification Statements (RFQ) was advertised in the San Antonio Express News twice over a thirty-day period. Additionally, Purchasing and Contract Administration sent notices to 511 potential Offerors. The 82 qualification statements received by the RFQ deadline were evaluated by a committee representing each College and ACCESS considering the RFQ specifications and requirements. As a result of this effort, the Architectural, Engineering, Master Planning, and Specialty Service Firms in attachments 1-6 are recommended for award based on qualifications and competence.

- **\*NEW\* President's Proposed Budget Request to Congress**
- House and Senate Appropriations Committees have sent guidance to members on how to submit their specific requests (programmatic support, language adjustments, and Community Project Funding requests (earmarks))
- Members of Congress can also submit Dear Colleague Letters supporting programs
  - Focus on Pell Grants
- Appropriators then work to review submissions and build appropriations bills
  - 12 bills are typically used in budget process
- Bill hearings and markups occur between now and September 30
- If bills are NOT passed by both chambers on or before September 30 then a Continuing Resolution must be approved to avoid a government shutdown

Please find attached the Alamo Colleges District Police Department's Monthly CLERY Act activity report through March 2026 and the yearly totals summary page. Please note that the report reflects new CLERY reporting activity categories enacted in 2008 and required beginning in 2009 when a bias motivation is present, including the Theft / Larceny category, which was not part of the previous CLERY reporting requirement; however, it was previously included for informational purposes. None were motivated by bias or hate. The CLERY Act was amended in 2011, effective for reporting year 2011, to include reports received for Simple Assault that are motivated by bias or hate. Simple Assaults are included in this report for information purposes; however, none were motivated by bias or hate. The CLERY Act was amended in 2014 as per VAWA and Campus SAVE Acts, effective 2015, to include reports of Domestic Violence, Dating Violence, and Stalking.

Burglary of a motor vehicle is considered a theft from a vehicle under Uniform Crime Reporting definitions and therefore is included in the Theft category for CLERY purposes. For CLERY reporting purposes the Theft / Larceny category includes all thefts and burglary of motor vehicle reports made to the Alamo Colleges District Police Department and is reported as one total when reported to the Department of Education and published by the Department in its annual report. They have, however, been separated for this report.

Theft totals listed on this report include all thefts of district property and personal property belonging to students, faculty and staff reported to the Alamo Colleges District Police Department.



*"The vision of the Alamo Colleges Police Department is To Be The Best in The Nation" while fulfilling its mission of providing a safe environment through a high level of proficiency in which all members of the District community may work, teach, study and learn. This department, in the daily performance of its function, stresses: Service, the protection of life, property and investment, the security of the campuses, and the pursuit of excellence in campus law enforcement and safety.*

\*The reports below include arrests by being booked into 201 N. Comal (The Justice Intake Assessment Annex), by being issued a citation (other than traffic), or by being detained and released with possible pending charges being filed with the Bexar County District Attorney's Office.

- 1) **SAC (079337 – Assault)** On 03/07/2026, an officer was flagged down at the 1500 block on N. Main. The person was a male (non-student) who stated he was assaulted by a female (unknown). The male was on the corner preaching the word of God. He stated a female pushed him and walked off. Officers attempted to locate the female with no success. The male stated he did not wish to press charges if the female was located. This case is closed.
- 2) **SAC (079353 – Possession of Drug Paraphernalia)** On 03/15/2026, an officer was patrolling and observed a male (non-student) person of interest in a previous case. The officer stopped to speak with the male. During the field interview, the male admitted to having drug paraphernalia on his person. The male was cited and released for Possession of Drug Paraphernalia.
- 3) **SAC (079354 – Possession of Drug Paraphernalia)** On 03/15/2026, an officer was assisting another officer when he observed a male attempting to hide himself behind a tree. The officer stopped the individual and interviewed him. During the interview, the male gave his name. The male was being placed under arrest for possession of stolen credit cards. The male fled from the officer, who pursued him and took him into custody. The male was transported and booked into Bexar County Jail for Fraudulent Use of Possession of Credit or Debit Cards and Evading Arrest.
- 4) **SAC (079384 – Theft)** On 03/18/2026, an officer was dispatched to garage #3 at San Antonio College. Upon arrival, the officer met with a male (contractor), who had been working on construction at the campus. The male stated he parked his vehicle in the garage at approximately 0900 hours and returned at approximately 1719 hours. Upon his return, he observed two pipes hanging from the bottom of his vehicle. Someone had stolen the catalytic converter from his vehicle. There are no suspects for this incident. The case will be forwarded to the Investigations Division.
- 5) **SPC (079394 – Harassment)** On 03/19/2026, an officer was dispatched to the St. Phillip's College Campus Police Office to meet a female (student) who wanted to report harassment from her former boyfriend (student). She stated she did not want to prosecute for harassment. She was asked about other instances, and she refused to give information on previous instances with the boyfriend that occurred away from campus. She was informed of the campus resources. The information was forwarded to SOBI.
- 6) **NVC (079410 – Harassment)** On 03/23/2026, an officer was dispatched to the Northwest Vista College Campus Police Office to meet a female (student) who wanted to report harassment from a male (student). She stated she had informed the male that she is not interested in him. However, the male continued to contact her by phone. Additionally, he has attempted to contact her family members in an attempt to speak to her. She informed her family to block his number. She states the male has not threatened or physically hurt her. This incident has been reported to Student Conduct.
- 7) **SAC (079452 – Assault by Family Member)** On 03/29/2026, an officer was patrolling Garage #2 at San Antonio College. The officer observed two female (non-students) in a verbal argument. One of the females had redness on her face indicative of being struck. The other female began to walk away while the officer was attempting to maintain order. After speaking with the female with the redness on her face, she stated the other female and she were in a dating relationship since 2016. She also stated the other female struck her in the face with a closed fist. The other female was identified and charges will be filed by the Investigations Division. The victim was informed about Victims rights and informed that she can apply for a protective order.

**8) SWC (079482 – Burglary of a Vehicle)** On 04/01/2026, while patrolling Southwest Campus a male (student) wanted to report his vehicle had been burglarized on campus on March 27<sup>th</sup>. The male stated someone had removed a blue backpack. He stated he arrived on the east side of Parking Lot #7 at approximately 1030 hours and returned at noon. Officers did not observe the theft from review of parking lot cameras. There are no suspects in this case.

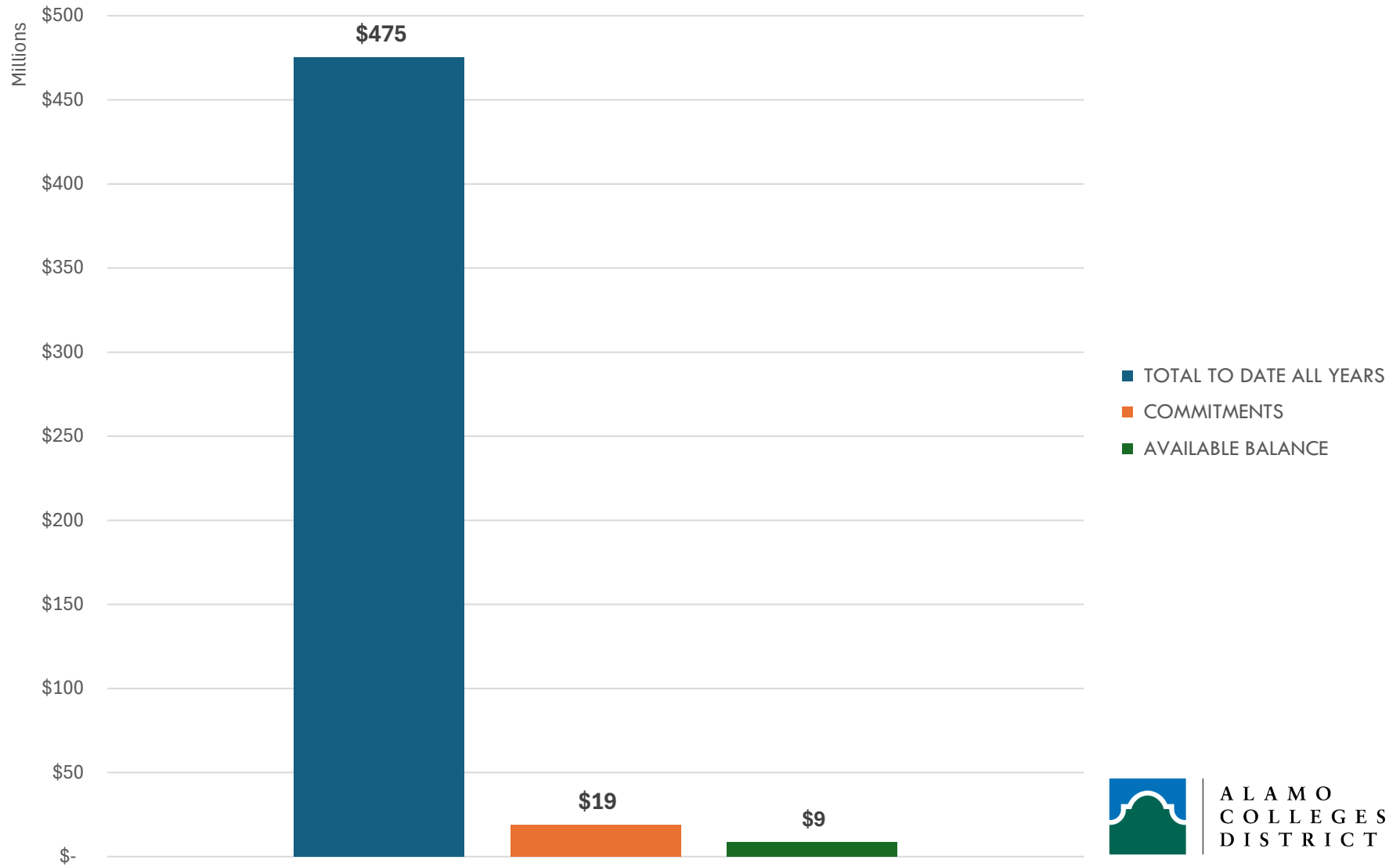

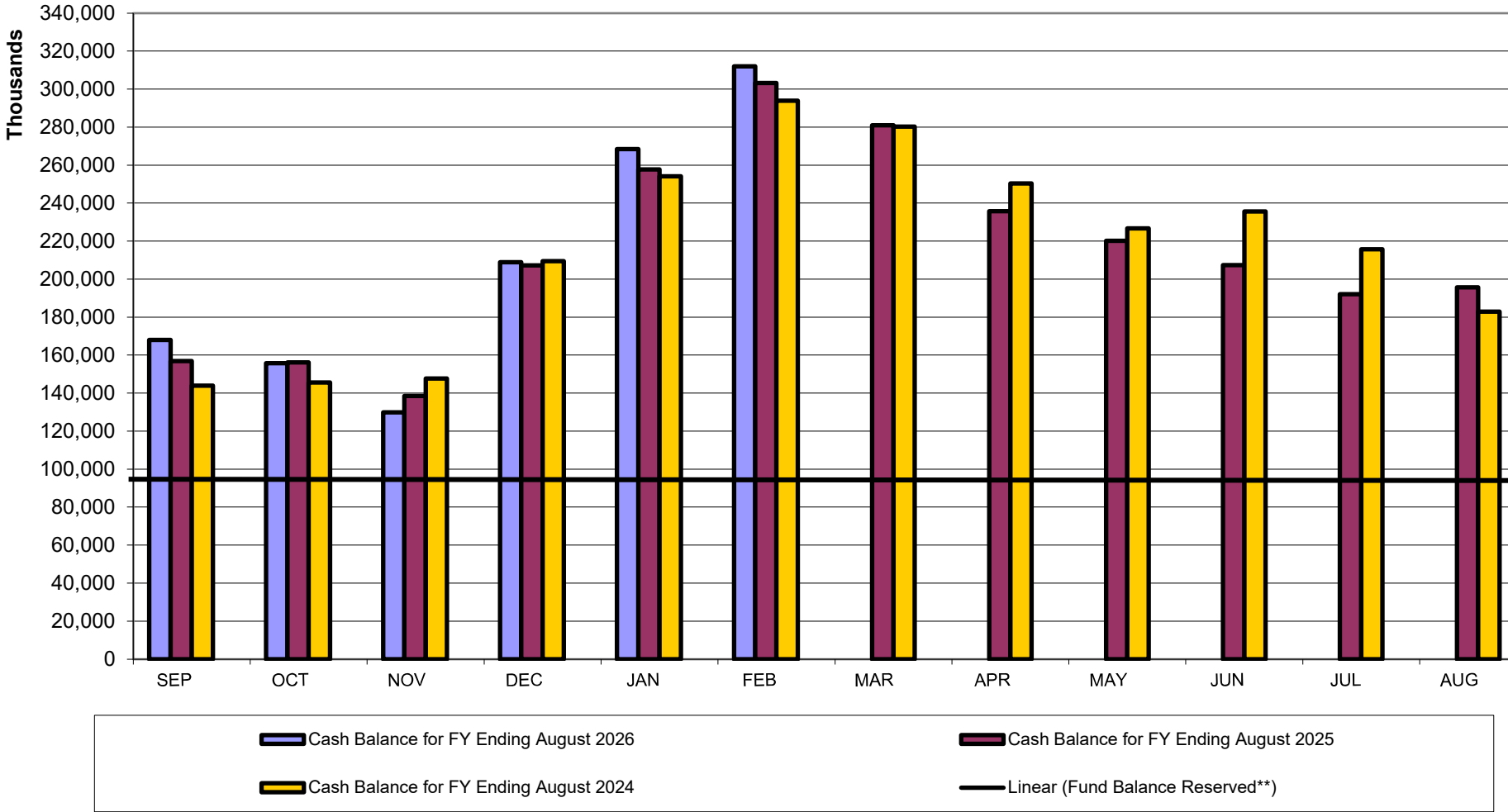

 Through February 2026



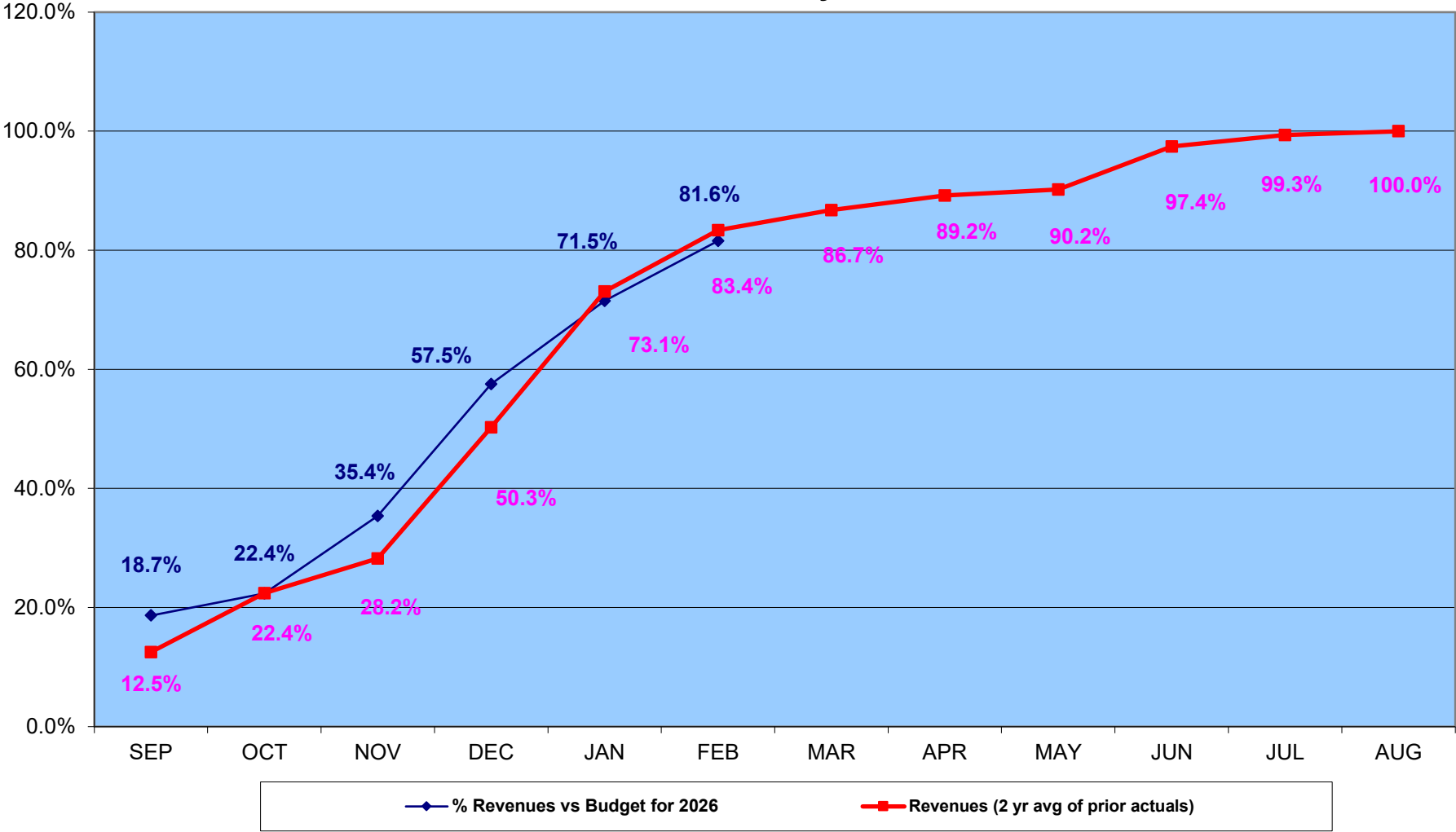

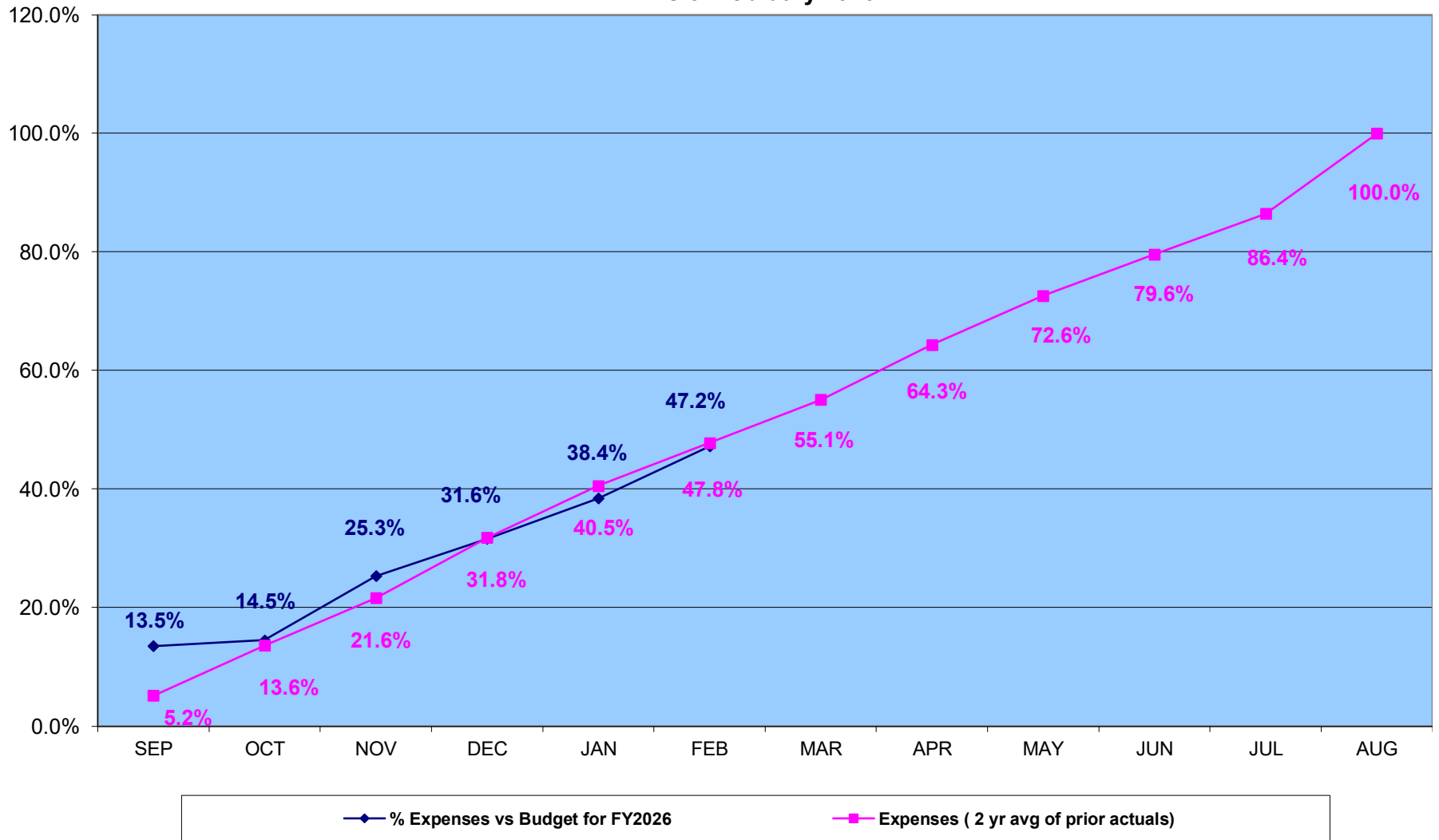

### PURPOSE

The purpose of this Minute Order is to provide a monthly report of purchases exceeding \$200,000 and any fees charged by the various local, state, and national providers of Cooperative Purchasing (COOP) programs during February and March of 2026. Not all COOP programs charge fees, and some COOP's offer cash rebates paid directly to Alamo Colleges. The Purchasing and Contract Administration Department utilizes the COOP programs to gain greater access to goods and services, cost savings through leveraged buying, and reduced administration costs by issuing fewer competitive bids and proposals. The combined buying power of public institutions throughout the State of Texas nationally translates into savings and provides an efficient, cost effective and legal means for providing goods and services to departments throughout the Alamo Colleges in an expedited fashion.

### BACKGROUND

Vendor contracts awarded through approved federal, state, or cooperative purchasing agreements are a statutorily approved alternative to competitively procured vendor contracts. Only the following contract purchases require prior Board approval:

- a. Purchases valued at \$200,000 or more in any 12-month period that will result in additional gross square footage (permanent or otherwise) that will require cleaning and maintaining and have at least two utilities present.
- b. Purchases valued at \$200,000 or more in any 12-month period that in the judgment of the Chancellor or Purchasing & Contract Administration would commit the College District or one of the colleges to an entirely new technology that would be pervasive for subsequent years.

For any cooperative purchasing contract valued at \$25,000 or more, Purchasing & Contract Administration shall document any contract-related fee, including any management fee. At least annually, Purchasing & Contract Administration shall present a written report regarding any contract-related fees, including any management fees, to the Board of Trustees at a properly posted open meeting.



## **Discussion and Possible Action on Engagement of Independent Audit Firm for FY2026 Audit and Review Services**

Presented to the Board Acting as Committee of the Whole on April 14, 2026 and now presented to the ALAMO COLLEGES DISTRICT BOARD OF TRUSTEES for approval on April 21, 2026.

### **MINUTE ORDER**

**“The Board of Trustees authorizes execution of a one-year engagement letter, which is the fourth year engagement under a five-year contract with Clifton Larson Allen, LLP., providing for the purchase of independent financial audit services for the Alamo Colleges District for Fiscal Year 2026 in an amount not to exceed \$328,431 (\$160,083 or 49% covers required Federal and State Single Audits); and the Board authorizes execution of a one-year engagement letter with Clifton Larson Allen, LLP. to provide independent financial review services for San Antonio College, St. Philip’s College, Palo Alto College, Northwest Vista College and Northeast Lakeview College for Fiscal Year 2026 in an amount not to exceed \$60,845 as requested by the office of the Associate Vice Chancellor for Finance and Fiscal Services.”**

### **PURPOSE**

State statute requires an annual audit by independent certified public accountants. The purpose of the independent audit is to provide assurance, based on independent review and testing, that the basic financial statements and accompanying notes are fairly stated in all material aspects in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles applicable to financial audits contained in the Government Auditing Standards. The audit is also designed to meet the requirements of the Federal Single Audit Act Amendments of 1996 and OMB Uniform Guidance “Super Circular” and the State Single Audit related to the Texas Grant Management Standards. This action also provides for additional services required by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools Commission on Colleges (SACSCOC) to provide financial information required under accreditation standards.

### **BACKGROUND**

In May 2023, a contract was awarded providing for the purchase of Financial Audit and Other Attestation Services. By execution of the Services Agreement dated September 2023, Clifton Larson Allen, LLP. was engaged as independent auditors through the August 31, 2027 audits. This contract action authorizes an annual engagement letter to delineate all project deliverables for the FY2026 audit and represents the fourth-year engagement under a five-year contract for independent audit services for Alamo Colleges District. The fees cover up to three (3) major programs under the federal and state single audit requirements. A 3%-5% increase for each year of the five-year contract is permitted.

The amounts shown represent the Alamo Colleges District’s best estimates for a one-year period. The amount paid will be based on the services required and substantially based on the scope of work and the contract prices. The authorizations included in this action begin upon award and terminate March 31, 2027. The Board of Trustees will consider and approve each year separately to renew upon mutual consent of Clifton Larson Allen, LLP. and the Alamo Colleges District.

## **Discussion and Possible Action on Approving an Amendment Extending the Term of the AlamoBOOKS+ Contract with Barnes & Noble College Booksellers**

### **MINUTE ORDER**

**"The Board of Trustees hereby approves the Fourth Amendment to the AlamoBOOKS+ contract with Barnes & Noble College Booksellers substantially in the form attached.**

### **PURPOSE**

To add provisions favorable to the College District and to extend the length of the contract term the AlamoBOOKS+ contract with Barnes & Noble College Booksellers.

### **BACKGROUND**

The Board in May 2021 approved a campus bookstore agreement with Barnes & Noble College Booksellers ("BCNB") which included a leased textbook option. This option was exercised by amendment effective Spring 2022, establishing the AlamoBOOKS+ program providing leased instructional materials directly to students.

The Agreement expires August 31, 2026. The fourth amendment presented for approval extends that term by 5 years, reduces the cost per credit hour from \$19.00 to \$16.50, increases facility rent paid by BNCB from \$177,000 to \$204,000 and increases annual donations by \$255,000, as well making other less significant clarifications and improvements.

**Amendment No. 4 to  
Competitive Procurement Services Agreement

March 1, 2026, this Amendment No. 4 (“Amendment”) to the Competitive Procurement Services Agreement dated August 4, 2021 (“Agreement”) is hereby entered into by and between Alamo Colleges District and Barnes & Noble College Booksellers, LLC (“Contractor”) according to the following terms and conditions. All capitalized terms used but not defined herein shall have the meanings ascribed to them in the Agreement.

1. The parties hereby agree this Agreement is extended for a five-year period from September 1, 2026 to August 31, 2031. The following provisions of this Amendment are effective as of the commencement of the extended term (“Effective Date”)
2. **Prices, Commissions, Rental, Fees, Student Sponsorships.** Payments to Alamo Colleges District under **EXHIBIT A – Project Details - Section 6** of the Agreement is amended by replacing “Rent (\$177,000 annually)” with “Rent (\$204,000 annually)” and “\$14,750” with “\$17,000” in the chart on page 14.
3. **Prices, Commissions, Rental, Fees, Student Sponsorships** under **EXHIBIT A – Project Details - Section 6** of the Agreement is further amended by adding “Foundation Donation” under “Sponsorship” and “\$250,000” under “Annually” in the chart on page 15.

The section is further amended by adding “Donation” under “Sponsorship” and “\$5,000” under “Annually” in the chart on page 15.

4. **Section 6. Prices, Commissions, Rental, Fees, Student Sponsorships** under **EXHIBIT A – Project Details** of the Agreement is further amended by adding the following to the end of subsection (c) under “Other Terms Regarding Payments & Disbursements”:

Contractor will provide an annual **\$250,000** donation for each full Contract Year to the Alamo Colleges Foundation, Inc. to be utilized at the direction of Alamo Colleges District. This \$250,000 donation payment must be received no later than August 31<sup>st</sup> of each full contract year.

Contractor will continue to provide an annual **\$50,000** scholarship donation for each full Contract Year to the Alamo Colleges Foundation, Inc. This \$50,000 scholarship donation payment must be received no later than August 31<sup>st</sup> of each full contract year.

6. **Exhibit A – Project Details - Section 13. First Day® Complete Program, subsection (a)** of the Agreement is hereby amended by adding the following language to the end of the section:

Contractor will continue to work with Alamo Colleges District to explore and/or expand OER in an effort to maintain affordable pricing.

7. **Exhibit A – Project Details - Section 13. First Day® Complete Program, subsection (a)(i)(4)(b)** of the Agreement is hereby amended by deleting such section and replacing it with the following language:

b. Contractor will be responsible for 100% of rental bad debt/collections from students for unreturned rentals. Alamo Colleges District will work with Contractor to encourage those students to resolve their accounts with Contractor in order to maintain the value of the Complete Program. “Bad Debt” is defined as any bad or uncollected debt associated with uncollected or other outstanding charges related to Rental Materials under the Complete Program.

8. **Exhibit A – Project Details - Section 13. First Day® Complete Program, subsection (a)(iv), Included and Excluded Materials** of the Agreement is hereby amended by adding the following new subsection:

3. The following programs, grade years or schools are excluded from the Complete Program: Subscriptions, certificates, study add-ons, and other ancillary materials that impact pricing. The inclusion/exclusion of high school programs, courses and/or students from participation in the First Day® “Complete Program shall be at the discretion of Alamo Colleges District.”

9. **Exhibit A – Project Details - Section 13. First Day® Complete Program, subsection (a)(vi)(1), Financial Terms** of the Agreement is hereby amended within its second paragraph by deleting “\$19 per credit hour” and replacing it with “\$16.50 per credit hour.”

10. **EXHIBIT A – Project Details - Section 12(b)(1)** of the Agreement is amended by the addition of the following sentence. “Exclusivity also shall not apply to instructional materials incorporated within a comprehensive system for student success for achieving licensure for licensed occupations which also include, for example, practice tests.”

11. All payments by Alamo Colleges District to Contractor shall be via ACH or Fedwire and visa-versa.

- 12. The Third Amendment to the Agreement is corrected to change its references to “Exhibit B (SOW)” to “Exhibit A (Project Details).”
- 13. Except as expressly modified above, all other terms and conditions of the Agreement shall remain the same.
- 14. This Amendment may be signed and sent electronically by the parties. All signed counterparts will be deemed originals and together shall constitute the entire Amendment.
- 15. This Amendment is subject to cancellation without penalty by Alamo Colleges District if directed by state authorities following post-execution reporting required by Texas state law.
