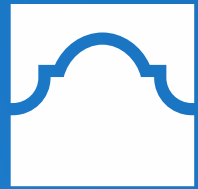

WHAT IS GENERATIVE AI?

DEFINITION

A technology that **creates new content**, such as text, images, audio, or video, when prompted by a user. It learns patterns from large datasets and predicts what to generate next.

LIMITATIONS & RISKS

GenAI does not understand facts the way humans do. It can produce confident-sounding but false responses, referred to as "**hallucinations**." It can also reflect biases in its training data. **Human oversight** remains essential.

HOW IT WORKS

GenAI **analyzes** millions of examples (documents, images, code) to **learn patterns**, then predicts what should come next. Think of autocomplete on your phone, but at a vastly larger scale: it doesn't understand your message, it predicts the most likely next word.

Responsible AI adoption requires governance frameworks, not just technology. Less than 1% of organizations have fully operationalized responsible AI, yet those that do are better positioned to scale safely and build public trust.

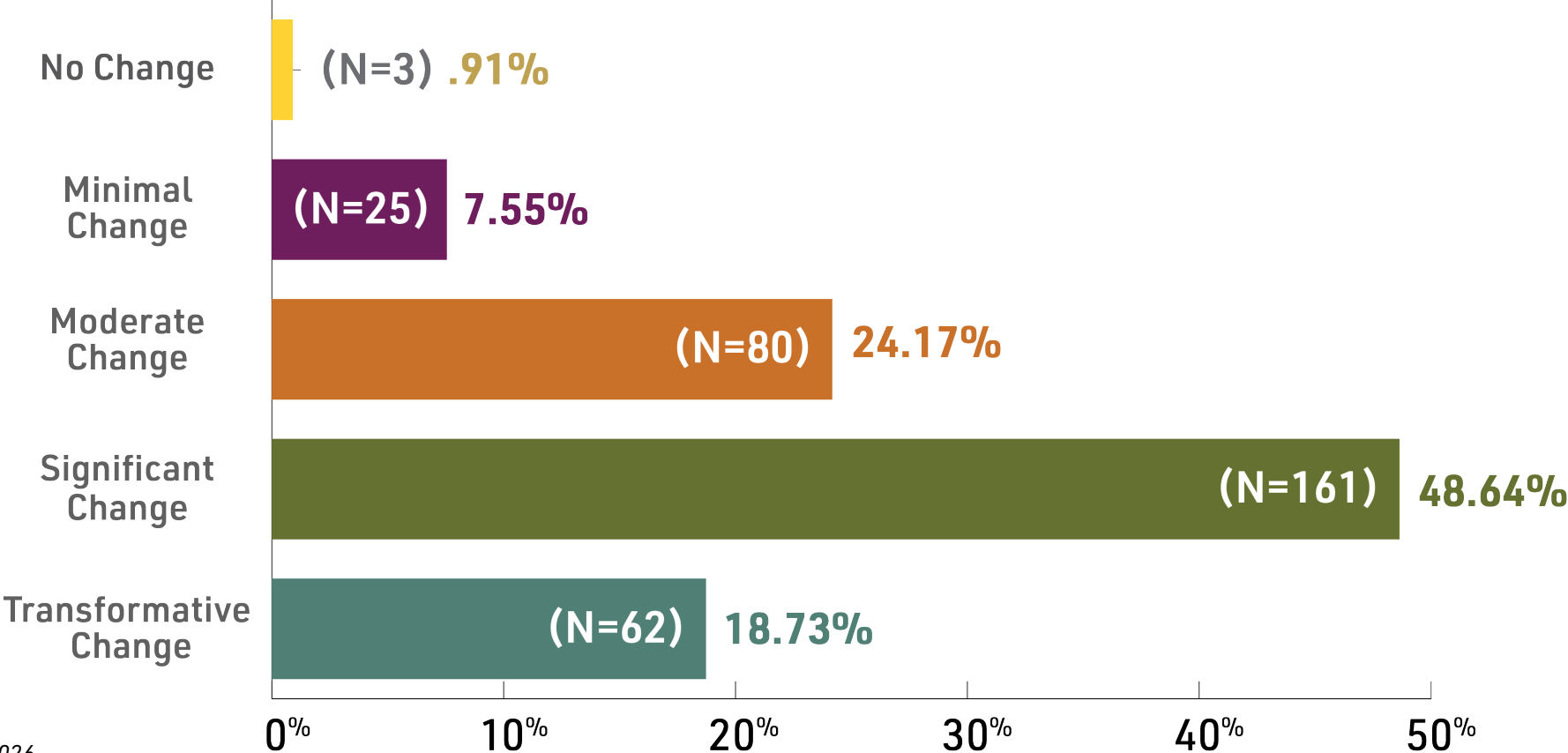

FINDING 1: ANTICIPATED CHANGE TO FACULTY ROLE

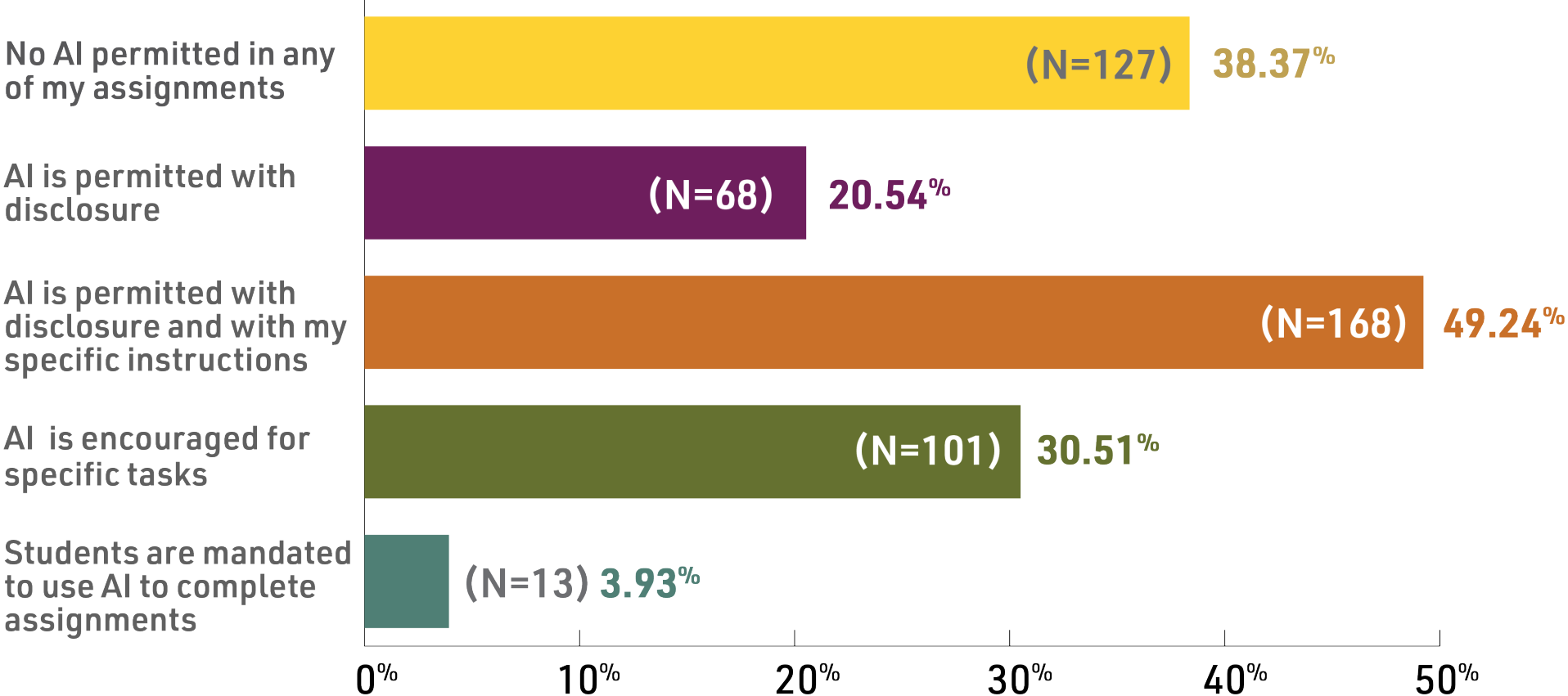
How much change do you think AI will bring to your role as an instructor in the future?

Considering your assignments to your students, in which of the following ways would you prefer to design your assignments? (Total Faculty Respondents: 331)

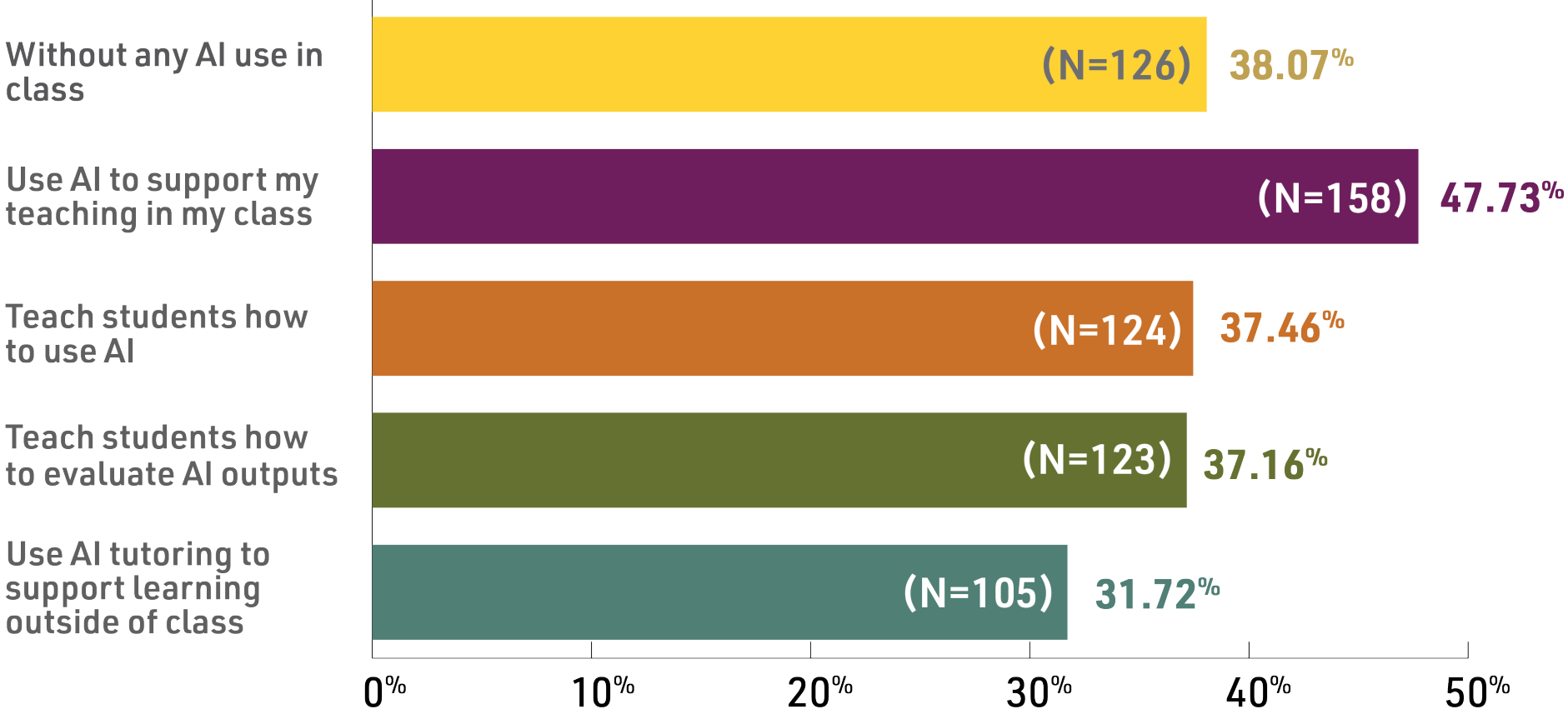

DISTRICT GUIDELINES FOR USES OF GenAI

Seven living principles that frame how community members use GenAI across academic, operational, and research functions.

Transparency

Disclose AI use across academic, operational, and research work.

Privacy & Data

Never expose sensitive or confidential information to public AI tools.

Human Oversight

Decisions affecting individuals are made or reviewed by humans.

Equity & Fairness

Tools must be accessible; biases must be actively mitigated.

Academic Integrity

Properly attribute AI-generated content. Aligns with Code of Conduct.

Shared Responsibility

AI literacy is everyone's job. The District invests in continuous learning.

Disciplinary Context

Faculty retain discretion over whether and how AI is used in their courses.

GenAI-READY SYLLABUS STATEMENTS

One standardized statement per course, plus an open-text section for context. Common district language, faculty discretion intact.

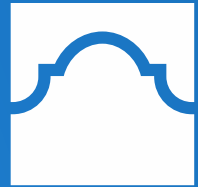

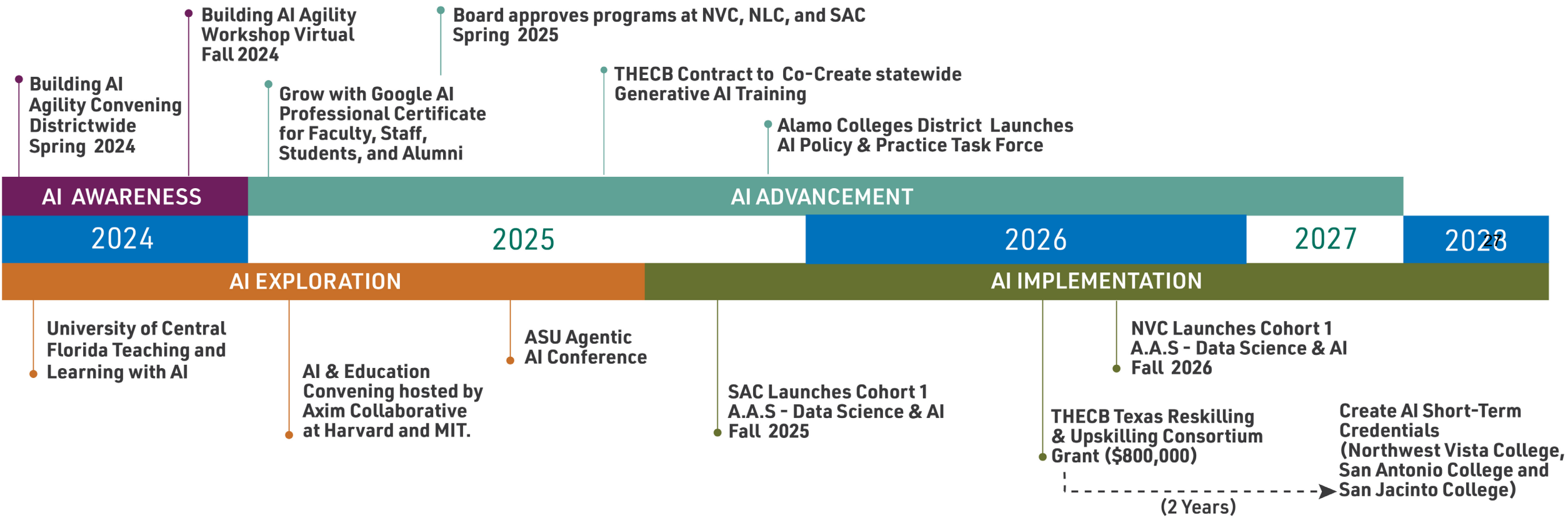

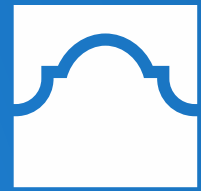

SENATE BILL 1882 PARTNERSHIP

- Alamo Colleges District and San Antonio ISD (SAISD) entered an 1882 Partnership in 2020 for a term of 5 years creating the Alamo Collegiate Network (ACN) through June 2025 to operate Fox Tech HS, Travis ECHS, and St. Philip's College ECHS
- ACD Board of Trustees approved 1-year contract extension that will expire in June 2026

SENATE BILL 1882 PARTNERSHIP

- May 2026: Alamo Collegiate Network Board, following contract developments, recommended moving the extension approval request forward to ACD Board for consideration
- June 15, 2026: a 1-year contract extension drafted by ACN leadership will be considered for approval by SAISD Board of Trustees for the 2026-2027 academic year

SENATE BILL 1882 PARTNERSHIP RECOMMENDATION

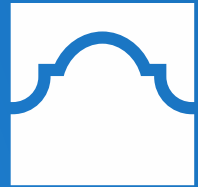
- Recommend extended current contract term for 1 year, until June 30, 2027, with the following exceptions:

MINUTE ORDER

“The Board approves an extension of the In-District Charter Partnership Agreement with the San Antonio Independent School District through June 2027.”

PURPOSE

To extend the term of the agreement.

BACKGROUND

The governing board for the Alamo Collegiate Network (“ACN”) was created pursuant to the In-District Charter Partnership Agreement with the San Antonio Independent School District (“SAISD”). Pursuant to the agreement, ACN operates in-district (SAISD) charters at SAISD’s Fox Tech High School, St. Philip’s Early College High School and Travis Early College High School, essentially managing these schools. The original agreement would have expired June 30, 2025, but the Board approved an initial 1-year extension through June 30, 2026. SAISD has proposed a significantly different form of agreement which will need to be evaluated by Alamo Colleges District for operational and financial sustainability. Therefore, an additional one-year extension of the current agreement with limited amendments approved by the ACN board and the SAISD board is proposed to allow the partnership to continue operating while the terms of a new, multi-year contract can be dd.

AMENDMENT TO AGREEMENT

This Amendment (“Amendment”) to the agreement described below (“Agreement”) is made and entered into between the Alamo Community College District, a political subdivision of the State of Texas (“ACD”) and San Antonio Independent School District (“SAISD”):

Partnership Agreement (Section 1882) dated July 1, 2020

WHEREAS, the parties desire to amend the Agreement, it is hereby agreed as follows.

ARTICLE I - PURPOSE AND EFFECTIVE DATE

The purpose of this Amendment is to extend the term of the Agreement, effective as of June 1, 2026.

ARTICLE II – AMENDMENTS

- 2.1 Parties agree to amend section 16.a of the Agreement to extend its end date to June 30, 2027.
- 2.2 Parties agree to enforce section 8.j of the Agreement for SAISD to retain a 2.274% administrative support fee for the extended term through June 30, 2027.
- 2.3 Parties agree to amend section 8.k)2)a. of the Agreement to provide that SB 1882 Funds received by SAISD will be allocated as follows:
 - a. 60% of SB 1882 Funds will be directed to the partnership schools; and
 - b. 40% of SB 1882 Funds will be paid to ACD in the form of a Management Fee for the partnership.
- 2.4 Parties agree to amend section 9.a to reflect ACD shall receive a management fee (the “Management Fee”) in an amount equal 40% of the SB 1882 Funds received by SAISD.
- 2.5 Parties agree to add section 12.c to state SAISD will fund one above-allocation teacher including salary, benefits and stipend, to facilitate the AAT program at Travis ECHS.

ARTICLE III - RATIFICATION

All other terms and conditions of the Agreement remain in full force and effect.

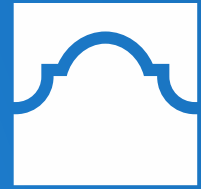

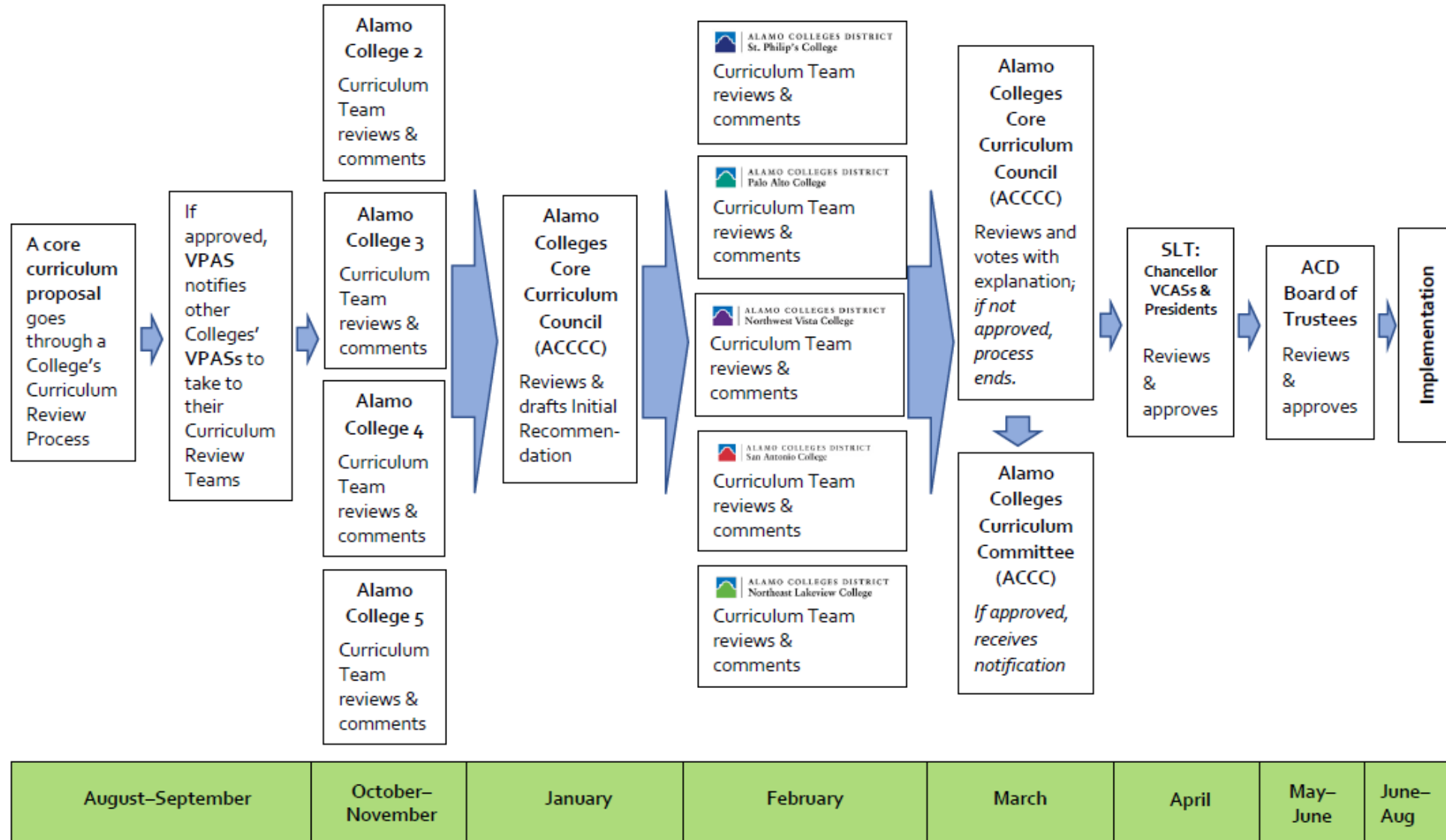

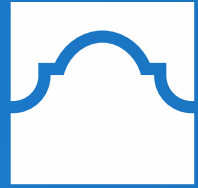


Core Curriculum Revision Process Flowchart & Timeline

"The Alamo Colleges District Board of Trustees hereby approves the submission to the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board and SACSCOC of a new workforce education program of study leading to a Land Surveying Technician Level 2 Workforce Certificate."

PURPOSE

The purpose of this Minute Order is to authorize the President of Northwest Vista College or her designee to submit to the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board a program of study of 37 semester credit hours for the college to deliver a Land Surveying Technician Level 2 Workforce Certificate.

BACKGROUND

The Land Surveying Technician Level 2 Workforce Certificate prepares students for careers in the surveying and geomatics industries. The program provides a solid foundation in surveying methods, geospatial technologies, and land measurement, equipping graduates for immediate employment in entry-level and advancing technician roles. Furthermore, the curriculum aligns with industry-recognized certifications and licensure pathways that support workforce entry and long-term career advancement. These credentials, issued by the Texas Board of Professional Engineers and Land Surveyors, provide a structured pathway from technician-level roles to licensed professional practice.

The program directly addresses workforce needs in the Alamo region. Related occupations are identified on the regional High-Wage High-Demand list, offering a sustainable living wage of approximately \$57,337 annually. Local labor market projections indicate a 12.5% growth from 2022 to 2032, with over 200 annual job postings. Start-up equipment will be secured through grant funding, with steady-state enrollment projected at approximately 100 new students annually.

2. Program Purpose: The purpose of the Land Surveying Technician Level 2 Certificate is to develop a skilled workforce pipeline that meets the growing demand for surveying professionals in the San Antonio–New Braunfels region. The program is designed to provide students with industry-aligned technical training in surveying methods, geospatial technologies, and land measurement, preparing them for immediate employment in entry-level and advancing technician roles.

This program supports regional economic development by supplying qualified talent to industries such as engineering services, construction, and infrastructure development. SUBJECT: **MONTHLY ACTIVITY REPORT**

Please find attached the Alamo Colleges District Police Department’s Monthly CLERY Act activity report through May 2026 and the yearly totals summary page. Please note that the report reflects new CLERY reporting activity categories enacted in 2008 and required beginning in 2009 when a bias motivation is present, including the Theft / Larceny category, which was not part of the previous CLERY reporting requirement; however, it was previously included for informational purposes. None were motivated by bias or hate. The CLERY Act was amended in 2011, effective for reporting year 2011, to include reports received for Simple Assault that are motivated by bias or hate. Simple Assaults are included in this report for information purposes; however, none were motivated by bias or hate. The CLERY Act was amended in 2014 as per VAWA and Campus SaVE Acts, effective 2015, to include reports of Domestic Violence, Dating Violence, and Stalking.

Burglary of a motor vehicle is considered a theft from a vehicle under Uniform Crime Reporting definitions and therefore is included in the Theft category for CLERY purposes. For CLERY reporting purposes the Theft / Larceny category includes all thefts and burglary of motor vehicle reports made to the Alamo Colleges District Police Department and is reported as one total when reported to the Department of Education and published by the Department in its annual report. They have, however, been separated for this report.

Theft totals listed on this report include all thefts of district property and personal property belonging to students, faculty and staff reported to the Alamo Colleges District Police Department.



"The vision of the Alamo Colleges Police Department is To Be The Best in The Nation" while fulfilling its mission of providing a safe environment through a high level of proficiency in which all members of the District community may work, teach, study and learn. This department, in the daily performance of its function, stresses: Service, the protection of life, property and investment, the security of the campuses, and the pursuit of excellence in campus law enforcement and safety.

*The reports below include arrests by being booked into 201 N. Comal (The Justice Intake Assessment Annex), by being issued a citation (other than traffic), or by being detained and released with possible pending charges being filed with the Bexar County District Attorney's Office.

- 1) **NVC (079737 – Criminal Mischief)** On 05/01/2026, an officer was dispatched to the Mount Laurel Hall at Northwest Vista College. Upon arrival, the officer met with an employee who reported graffiti in the men's restroom near room 109. There is no suspect in this incident. Housekeeping removed the graffiti.
- 2) **SAC (079773 – Evading Arrest)** On 05/06/2026, an officer was dispatched to San Antonio College near Courtland and Howard. A female employee reported that her cellphone was taken by an unknown male. The female gave a description of the male, and officers searched the area. The suspect was located and fled away from campus into the Via bus lot. Officers apprehended the male in one of the buses. The phone was recovered, and the female declined to prosecute for the phone theft. The male was transported to the Bexar County Jail and charged with Evading Arrest.
- 3) **SPC (079810 – Theft)** On 05/07/2026, an officer was dispatched to the Campus Police Office at St. Phillip's College. The officer met with a female student who reported that her wallet was stolen. The female stated her mother had contacted her and informed her that a credit card that was in the wallet had just been used at the Valero near campus. Officers went to Valero to obtain surveillance video of any potential suspects. There was no identifiable information that could be attained from the video. In addition to the wallet, there was a key to her vehicle inside the wallet. This case was referred to CID for follow-up. The female was encouraged to contact the banks to get new cards.
- 4) **SPC (079811 – Possession of a Controlled Substance)** On 05/11/2026, an officer was conducting a walkthrough of the Turbon Student Center at St. Phillip's College. The officer observed a male who had recently been involved in a drug incident. The officer knew he wasn't a current student at any Alamo College Campus. The officer approached the male and observed him to be under the influence of some substance. The male was placed in custody and was found to be in possession of a controlled substance. He was arrested and transported to the Bexar County Jail.
- 5) **SPC (079812 – Possession of a Controlled Substance)** On 05/11/2026, an officer was conducting a walkthrough of the Turbon Student Center at St. Phillip's College. The officer observed a male (non-current student) sitting in an area where individuals were vaping. The officer was assisting other officers who had already arrested another individual. This individual was found to be in possession of drug paraphernalia (THC Vape and small yellow baggies). The male was arrested and transported to the Bexar County Jail.
- 6) **SAC (079839 – Possession of a Controlled Substance)** On 05/13/2026, an officer was dispatched to the Fletcher Administration Building at San Antonio College Campus. The officer met with a female employee who reported a suspicious male who was being loud and was disturbing the peace. The male left and was located at the Loftin Center. Officers made contact and found the male to be suffering from mental decompensation. The male was in possession of methamphetamine. Medcomm was notified and the male was transported to The Center for Health Services for psychological evaluation. The methamphetamine was booked into evidence.

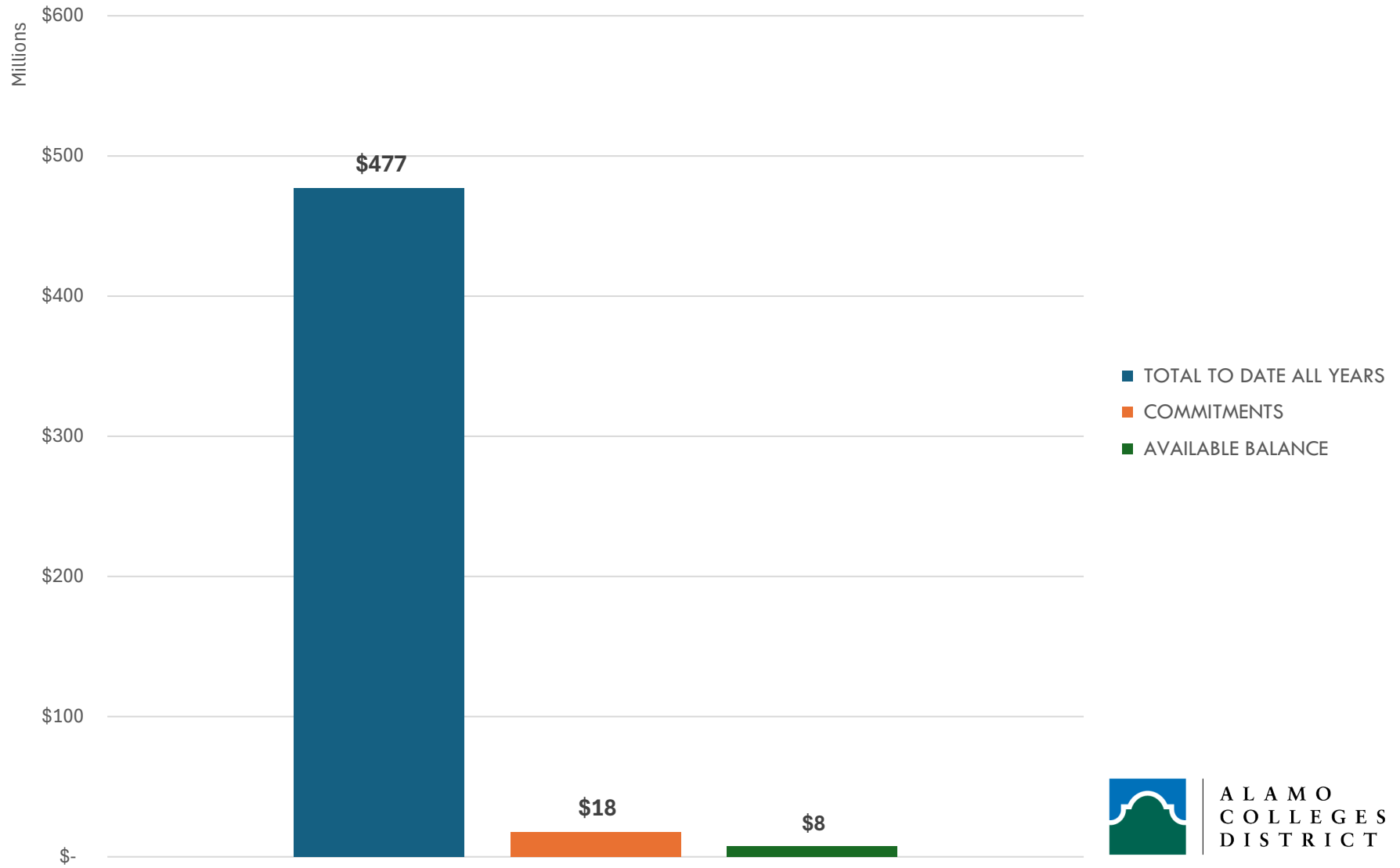

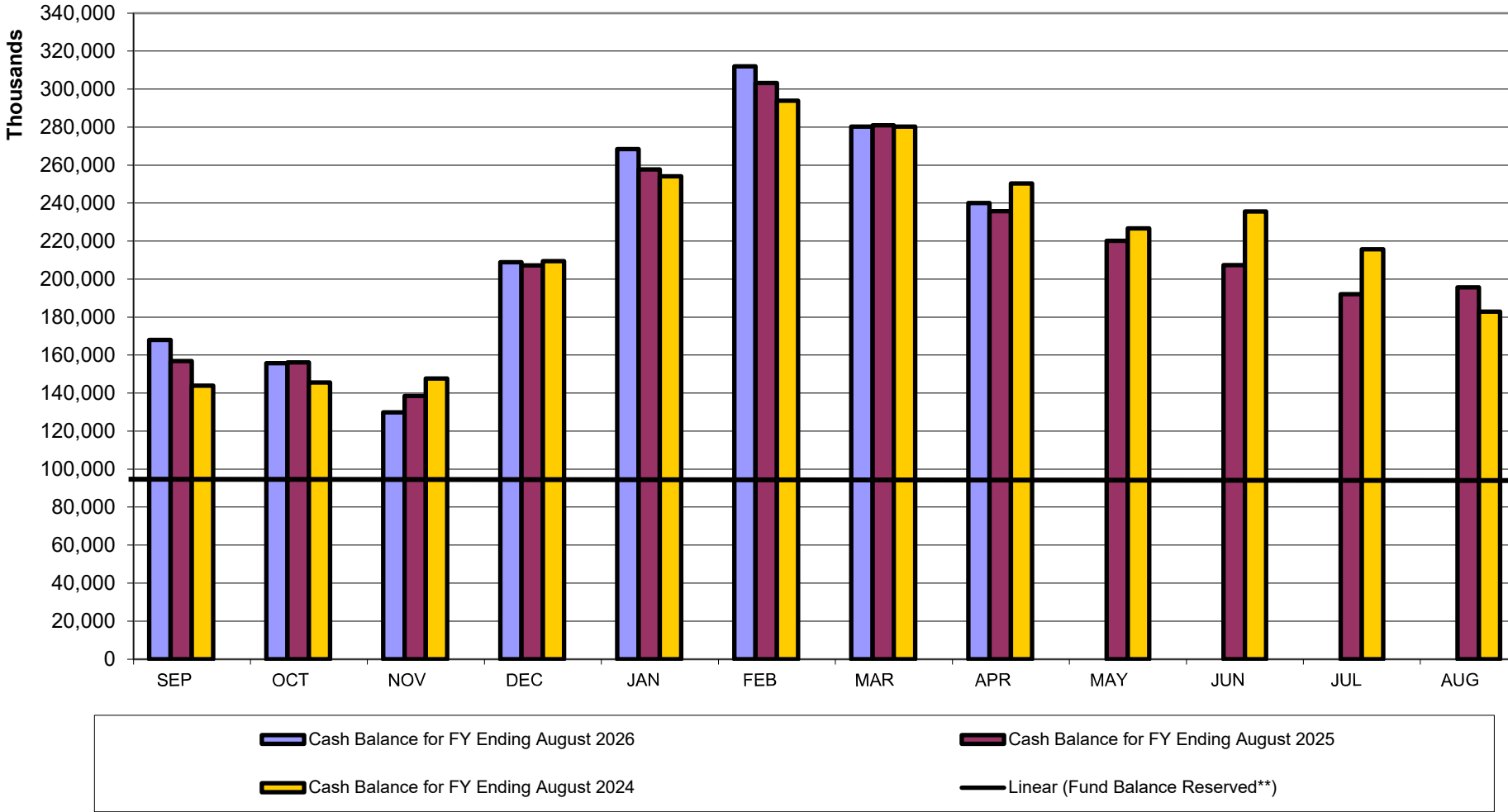

 Through April 2026

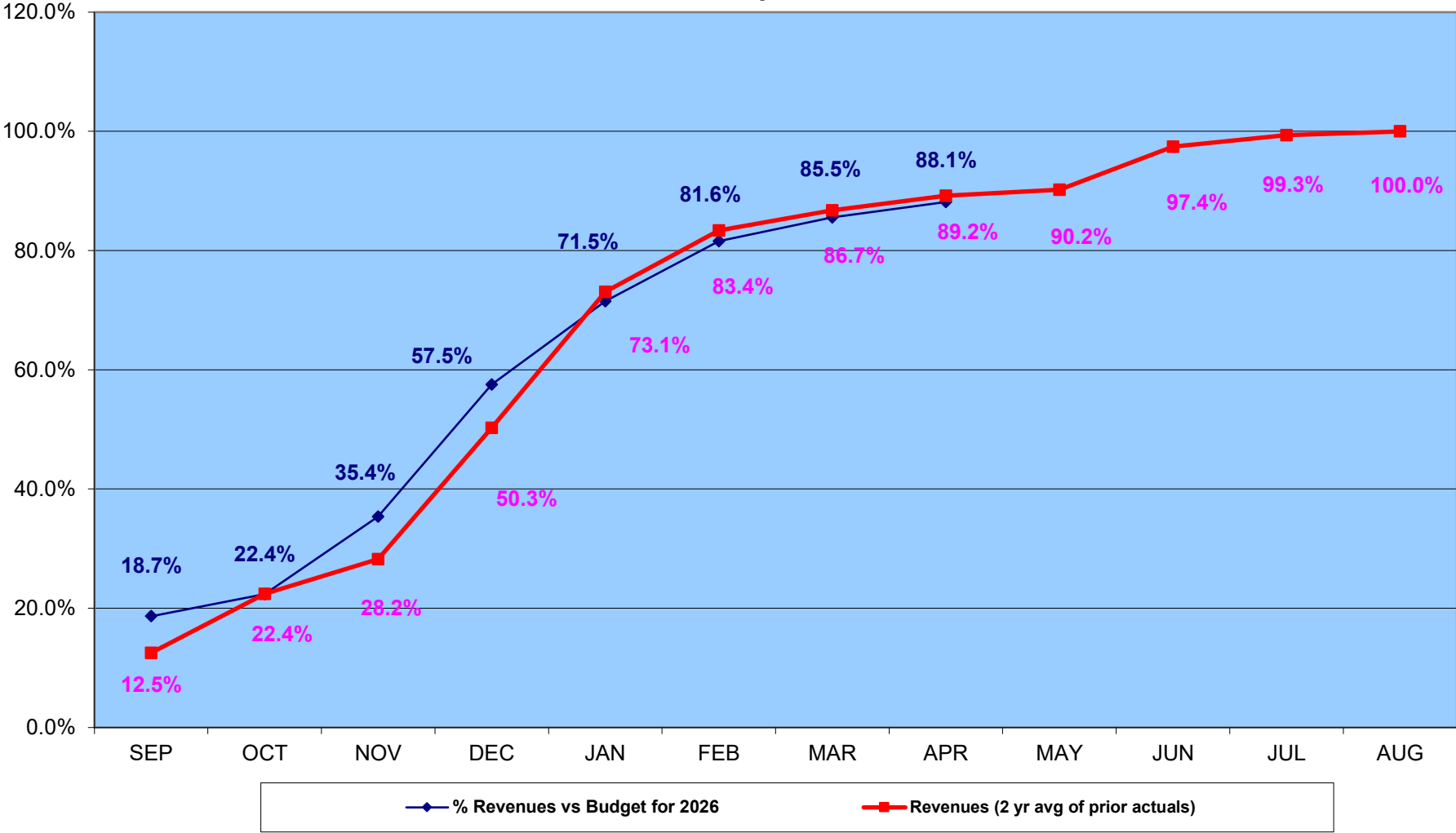

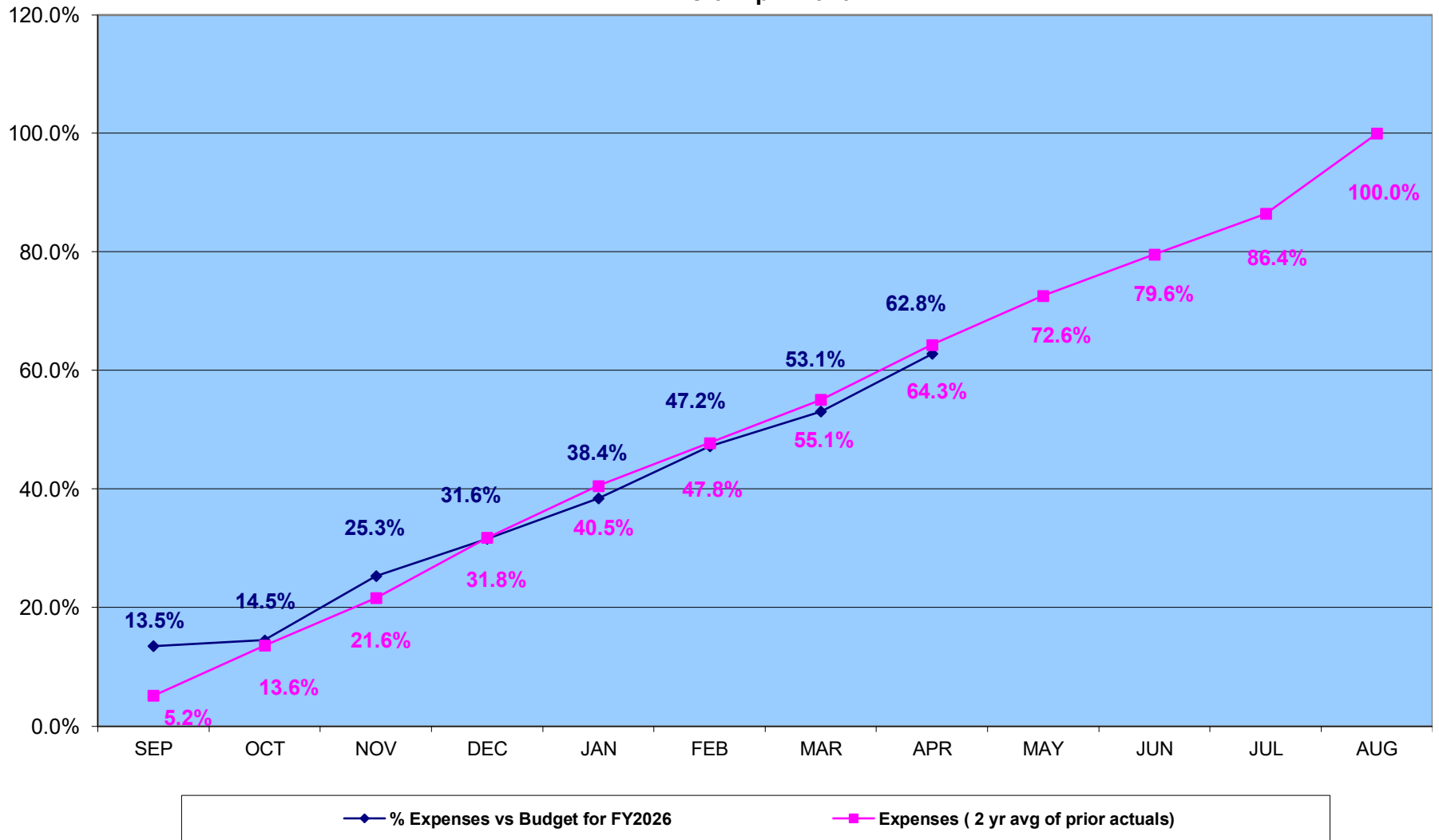

“The Alamo Colleges District Board of Trustees hereby approves the monthly Cooperative Purchase Report as presented.”

PURPOSE

The purpose of this Minute Order is to provide a monthly report of purchases exceeding \$200,000 and any fees charged by the various local, state, and national providers of Cooperative Purchasing (COOP) programs during May of 2026. Not all COOP programs charge fees, and some COOP’s offer cash rebates paid directly to Alamo Colleges. The Purchasing and Contract Administration Department utilizes the COOP programs to gain greater access to goods and services, cost savings through leveraged buying, and reduced administration costs by issuing fewer competitive bids and proposals. The combined buying power of public institutions throughout the State of Texas nationally translates into savings and provides an efficient, cost effective and legal means for providing goods and services to departments throughout the Alamo Colleges in an expedited fashion.

BACKGROUND

Vendor contracts awarded through approved federal, state, or cooperative purchasing agreements are a statutorily approved alternative to competitively procured vendor contracts. Only the following contract purchases require prior Board approval:

- a. Purchases valued at \$200,000 or more in any 12-month period that will result in additional gross square footage (permanent or otherwise) that will require cleaning and maintaining and have at least two utilities present.
- b. Purchases valued at \$200,000 or more in any 12-month period that in the judgment of the Chancellor or Purchasing & Contract Administration would commit the College District or one of the colleges to an entirely new technology that would be pervasive for subsequent years.

For any cooperative purchasing contract valued at \$25,000 or more, Purchasing & Contract Administration shall document any contract-related fee, including any management fee. At least annually, Purchasing & Contract Administration shall present a written report regarding any contract-related fees, including any management fees, to the Board of Trustees at a properly posted open meeting.

Quarterly Market Summary:

During the District's third quarter for fiscal year 2026, the FOMC maintained a cautious, data-dependent stance and left the federal funds rate unchanged at 3.50%–3.75% at both its March and April meetings. Policymakers cited continued economic expansion, a resilient labor market, and inflation that remained above the Fed's 2% target, while emphasizing elevated uncertainty surrounding the economic outlook. Updated economic projections reflected slightly higher expectations for growth and inflation, while ongoing conflict in the Middle East contributed to higher energy prices and increased volatility across financial markets, prompting investors to reassess the timing and magnitude of future monetary policy easing.

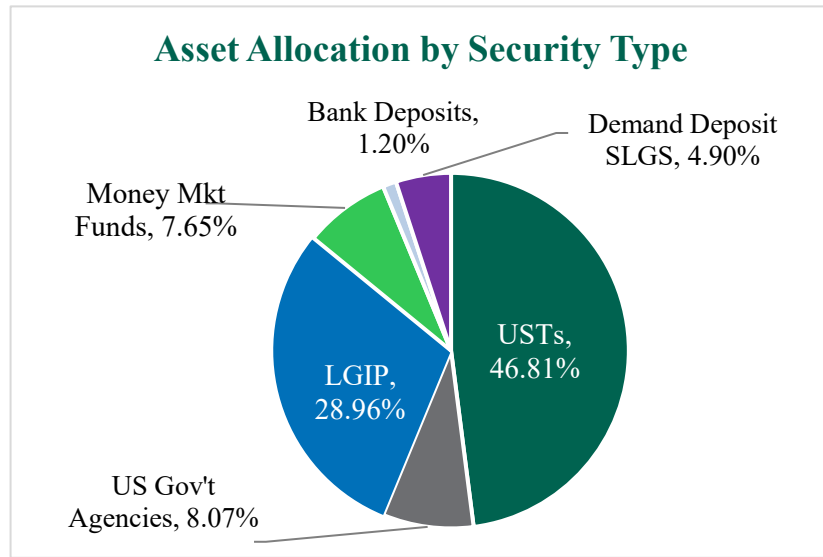
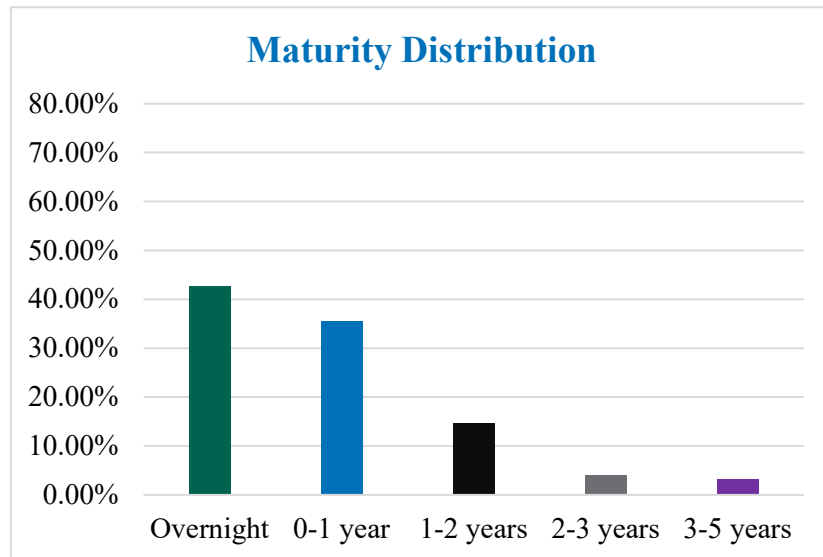

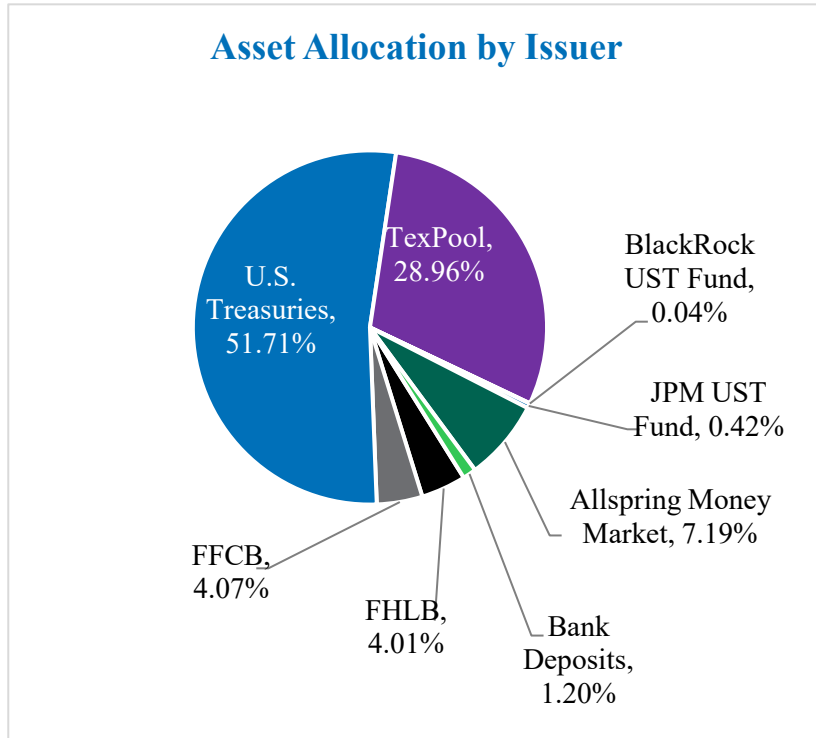
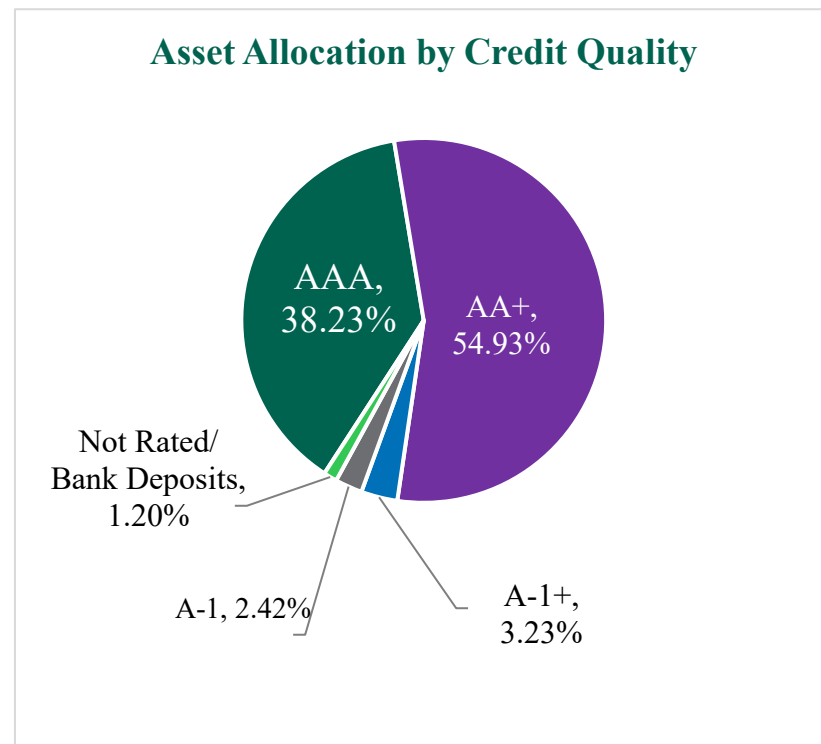

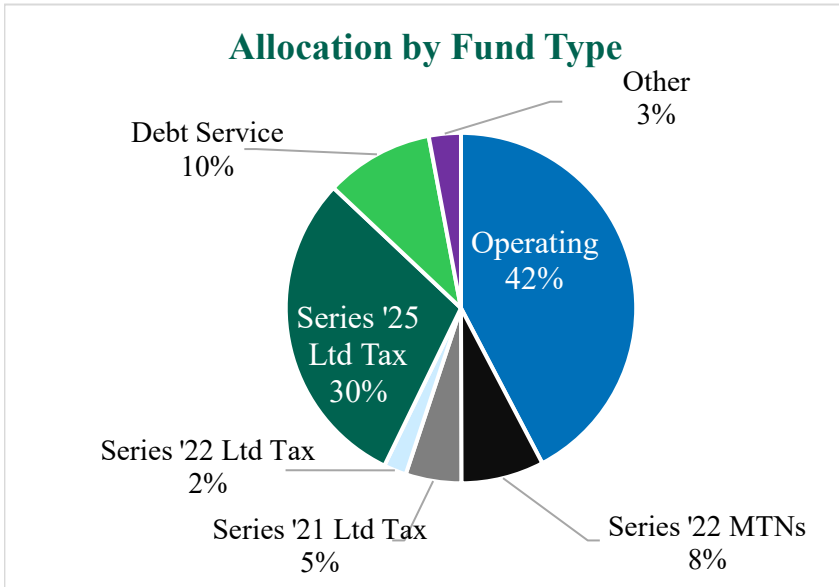
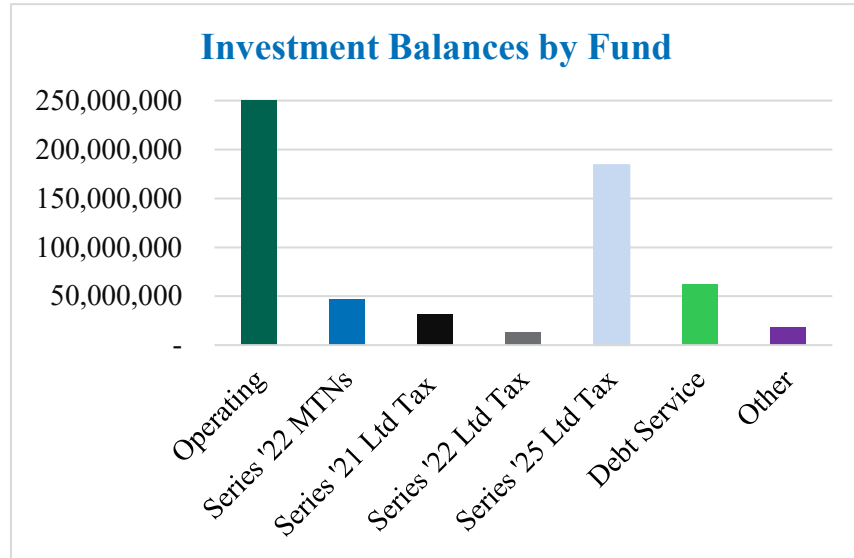

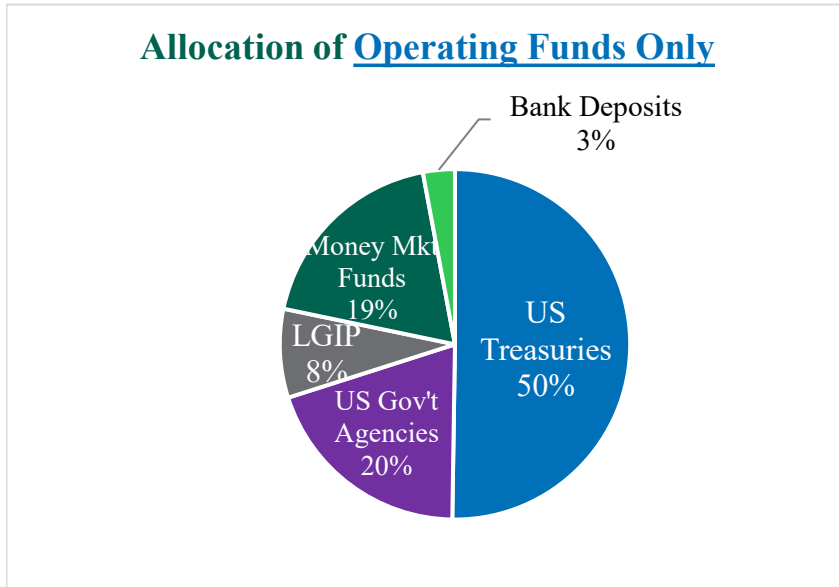

Discussion and Possible Action on FY 2027 Supplemental Employer Contribution for ORP Participants

Presented to the ALAMO COLLEGES DISTRICT BOARD OF TRUSTEES on June 23, 2026.

MINUTE ORDER

“The Alamo Colleges District Board of Trustees hereby approves a supplemental employer contribution of 1.6% for all eligible ORP participants for FY2027.”

PURPOSE

The Texas Legislature has established a FY27 employer contribution requirement of 8.25% for TRS retirement plan participants and a 6.65% for ORP retirement plan participants. Employers are authorized to make additional local supplemental contributions of up to 1.6% for ORP participants for FY27.

The purpose of this minute order is to equalize the Alamo Colleges District employer contribution rate to both retirement plans in FY27, by making a supplemental contribution of 1.6% for each ORP participant. The projected total cost to equalize the contribution rate to both plans is \$413,967 for 235 employees currently participating in ORP.

BACKGROUND

In FY 2012 the Alamo Colleges District Board of Trustees began funding ORP and TRS at the same rate regardless of plan for all employees.

The Alamo Colleges District Board of Trustees approved a 1.6% supplemental contribution for FY26 at a total cost of \$413,803 to ensure its contribution to every employee in ORP and TRS received the same 8.25% employer contribution.

Each fiscal year, the governing board of an institution of higher education may make a supplemental contribution to ORP using any local funds or other sources of funds. A supplemental contribution from the institution may be any amount that is equal to or less than the difference between the amount the state is required to contribute to the benefit of each participant and the maximum supplemental contribution amount. The rate may change yearly and institutions may, instead of funding all participants the same supplemental rate, have two (2) supplemental rates based upon the following criteria:

- Grandfathered participants whose first date of participation in ORP is prior to September 1, 1995, may have one rate of supplemental contribution regardless of any break in service; and
- Non-grandfathered participants whose first date of participation in ORP is on or after September 1, 1995, shall have another rate which will be the same supplemental rate as other participants in this group.

The Teacher Retirement System (TRS) is a traditional defined benefit state retirement program. In 1967, when the Optional Retirement Program (ORP) was created, TRS required 20 years of creditable service to qualify for a service retirement. Because higher education faculty, and administrators have careers which normally involve interstate mobility, it was determined that a more “portable” retirement program option would substantially improve Texas public higher education’s ability to compete for quality employees at the national level.

ORP requires contributions from the employee just like employees who are participants in the TRS plan. An employee may not participate in both TRS and ORP; they must select one plan, if eligible, upon initial hire. Both the employee and the state/employer make contributions to TRS and ORP based on percentages of the employee's salary. The percentages are established by the Texas Legislature.


In accordance with Texas Education Code §54.5031, this letter serves as formal submission of the [Northeast Lakeview College] Student Activity Fee budget, as required by statute.

The total approved Student Activity Fee budget for Fiscal Year 2027 is \$352,617. The attached budget outlines the allocation of funds across student programs, student clubs and organizations, campus activities, and related operational support, consistent with Texas Education Code §54.503, §54.5031, and Alamo Colleges District Board Policy F.2.3 Student Fees.
