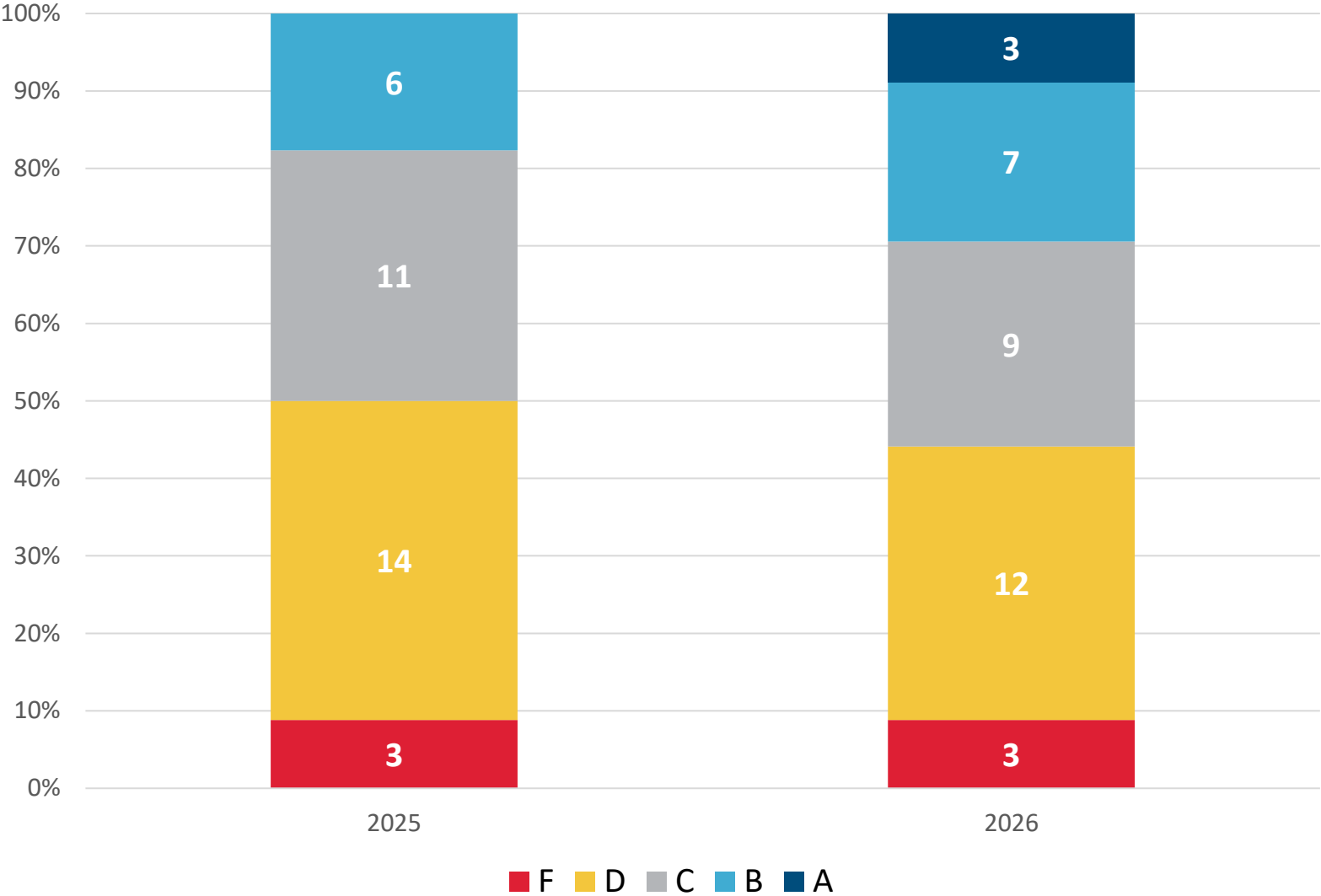

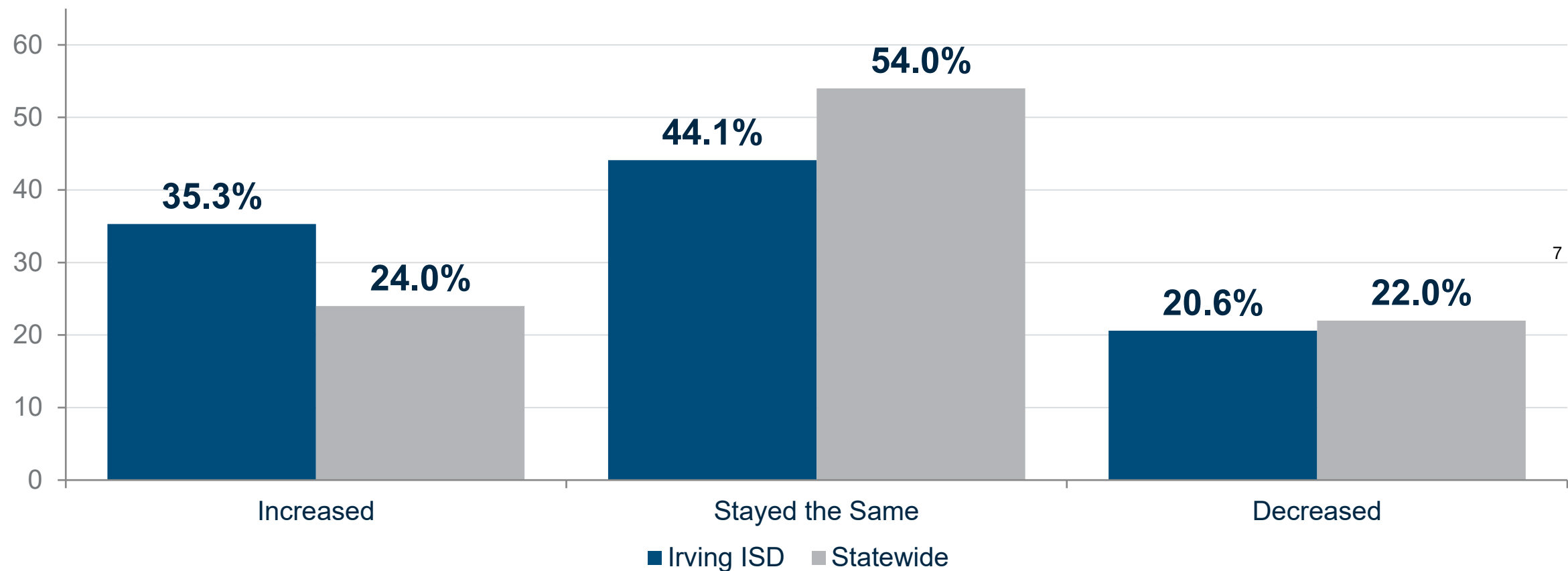
A-Rated Campuses

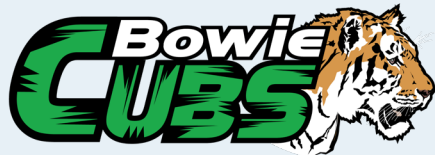
Three Campuses Posted the Largest Rating Jumps in the District

Three Campuses Moved From a D to an F Rating



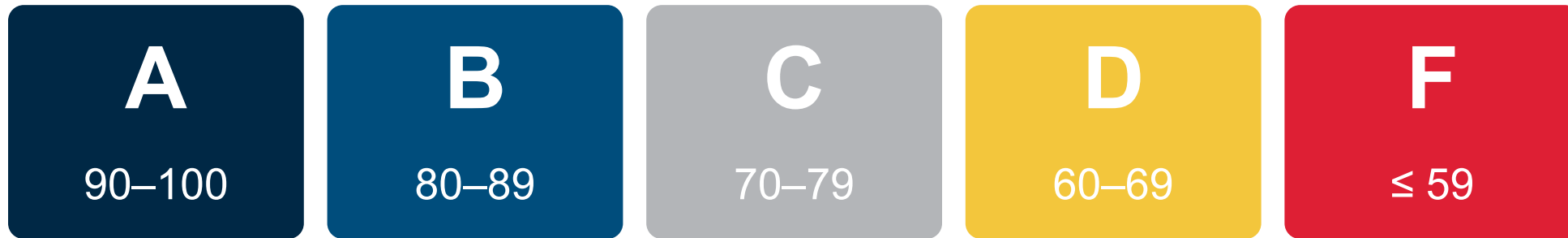

Texas rates every district and campus A through F each year, on a 0–100 scale score.

Overall Score = Better of Domain 1 or 2 (×70%) + Domain 3 (×30%)

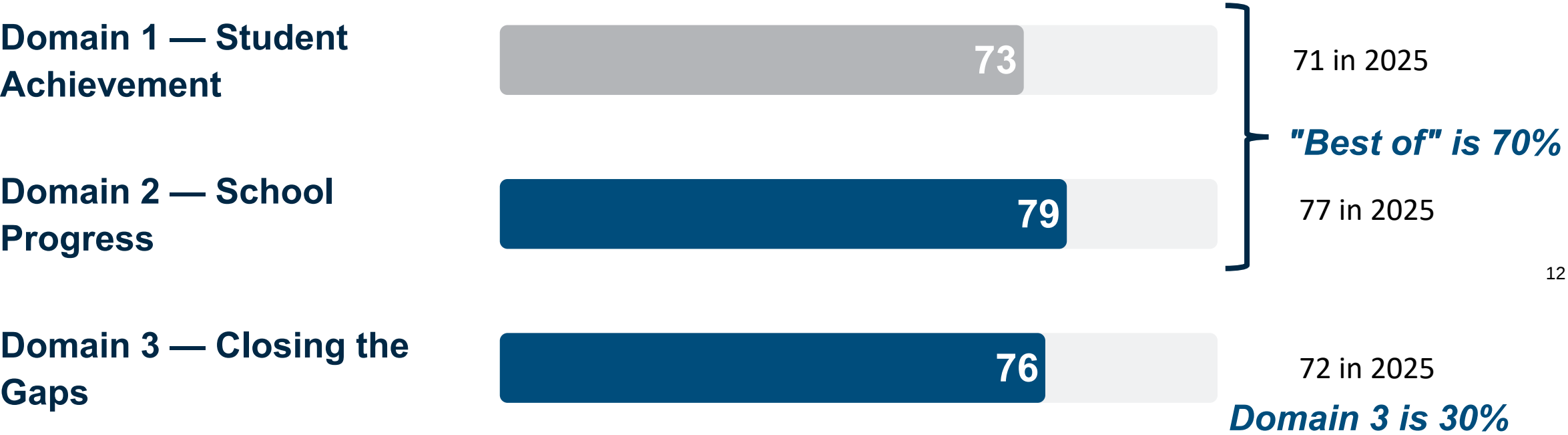

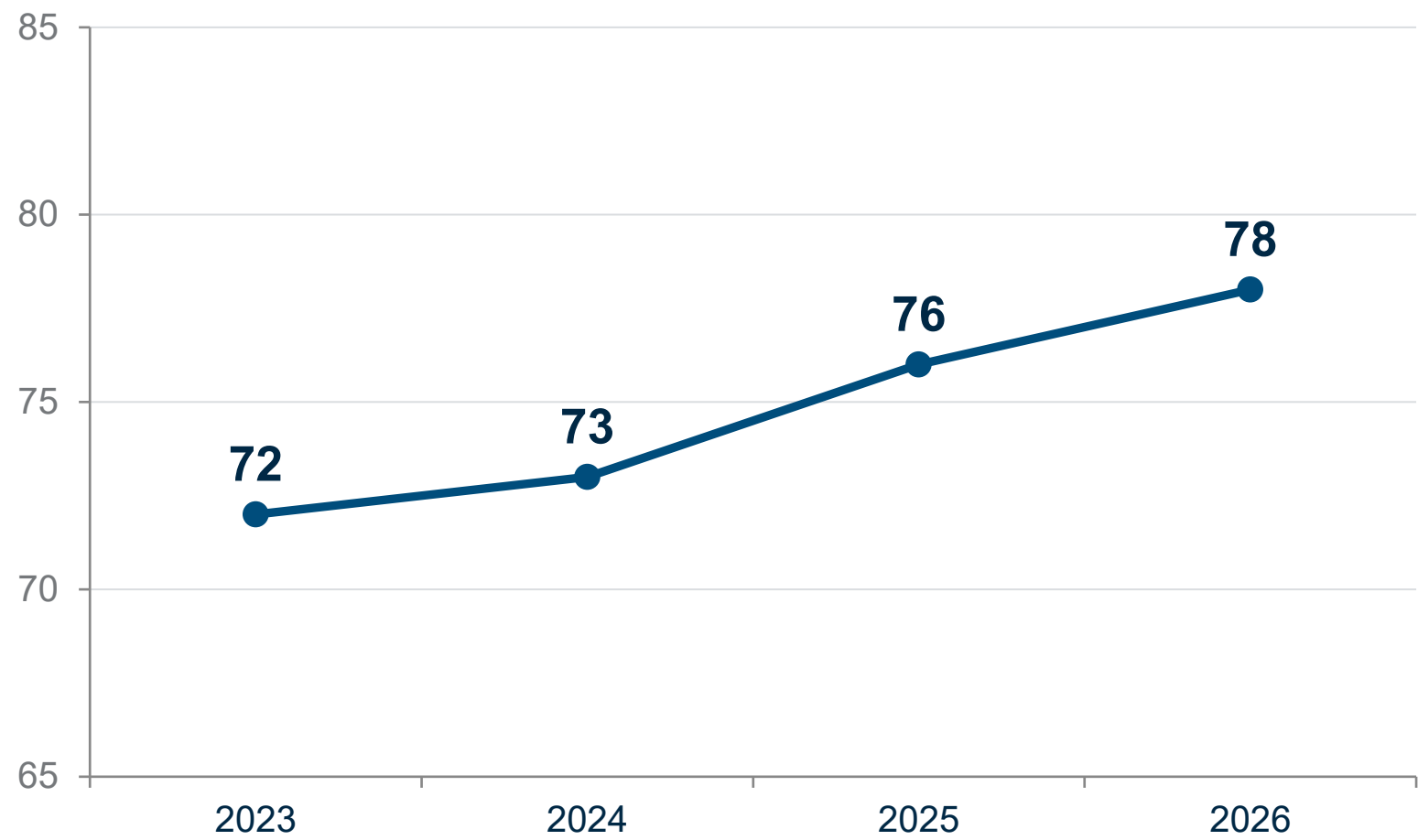

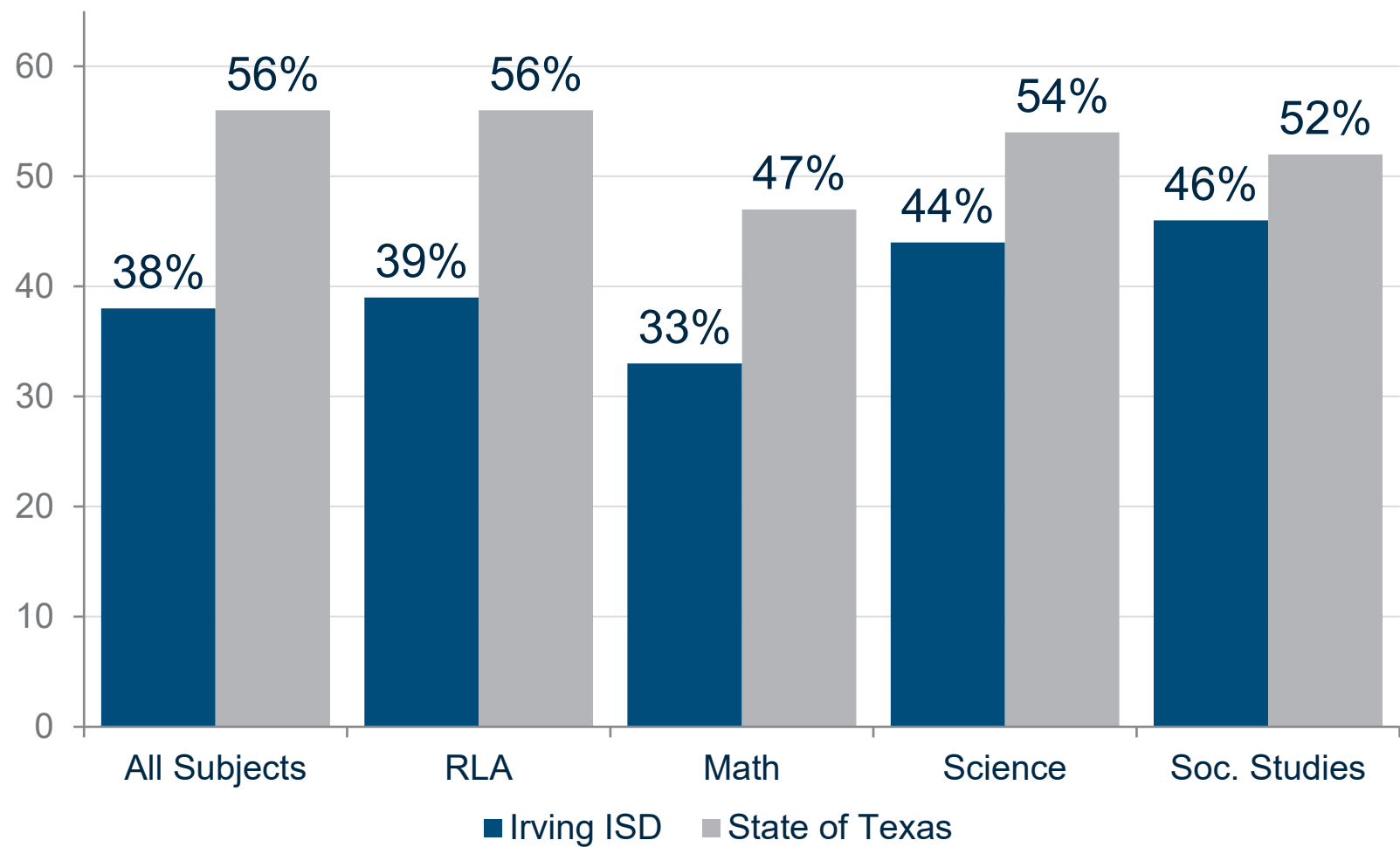

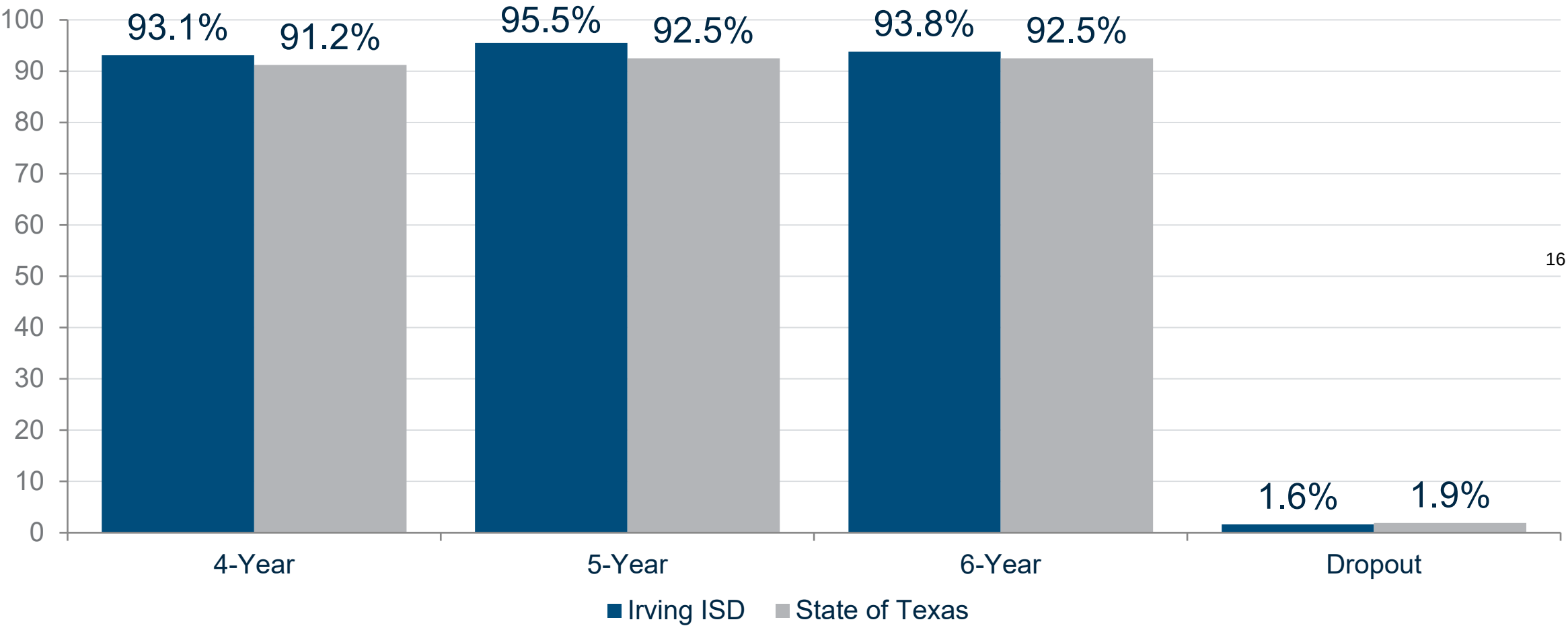

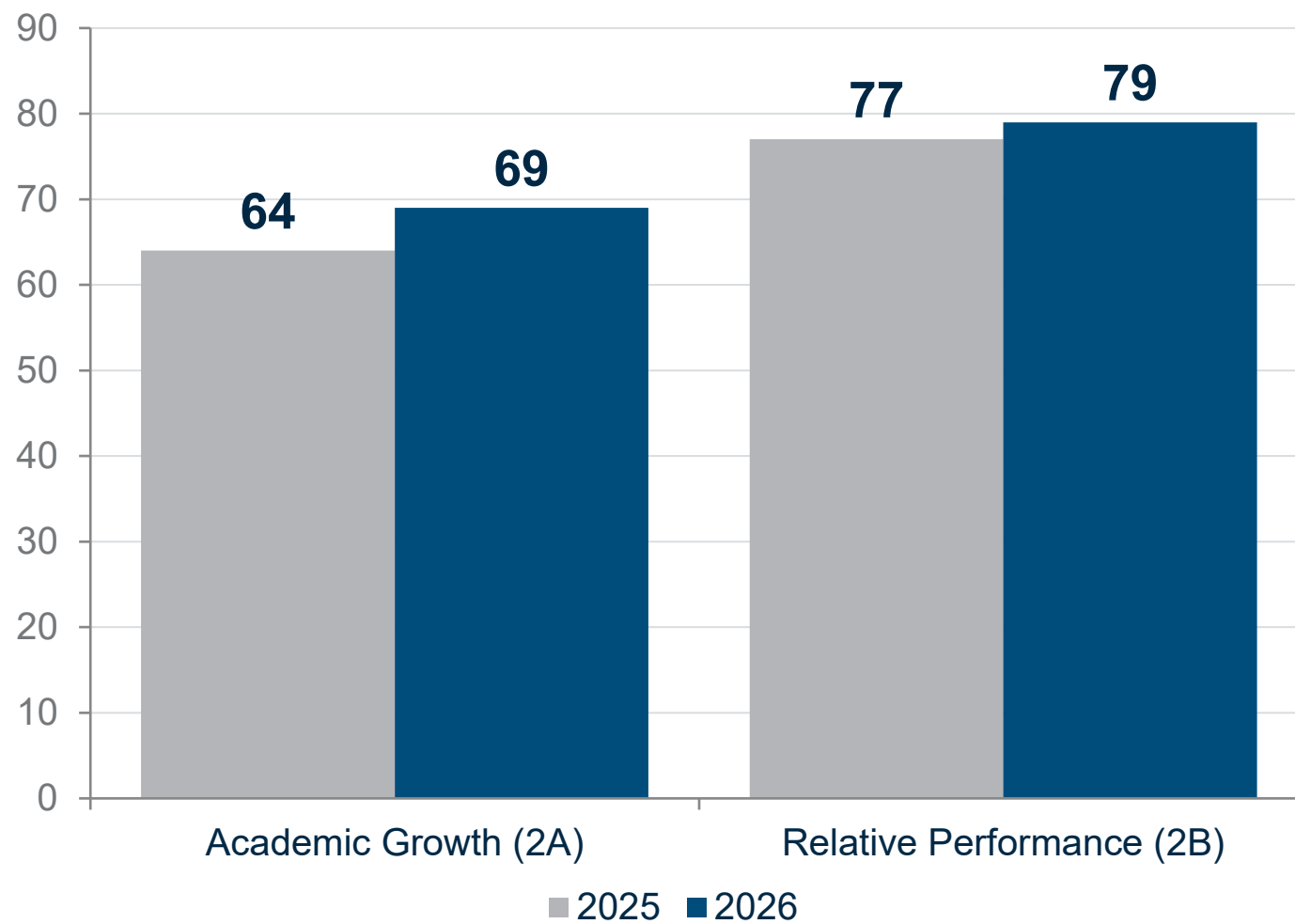

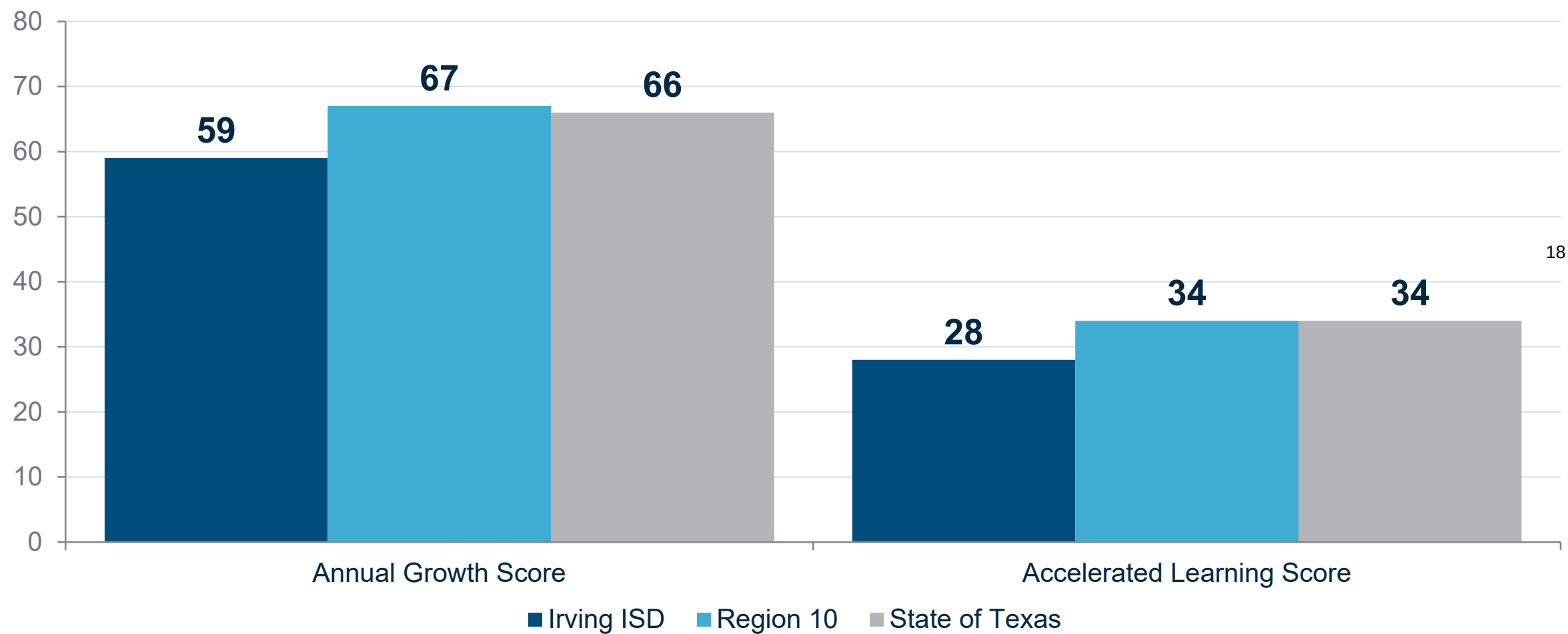

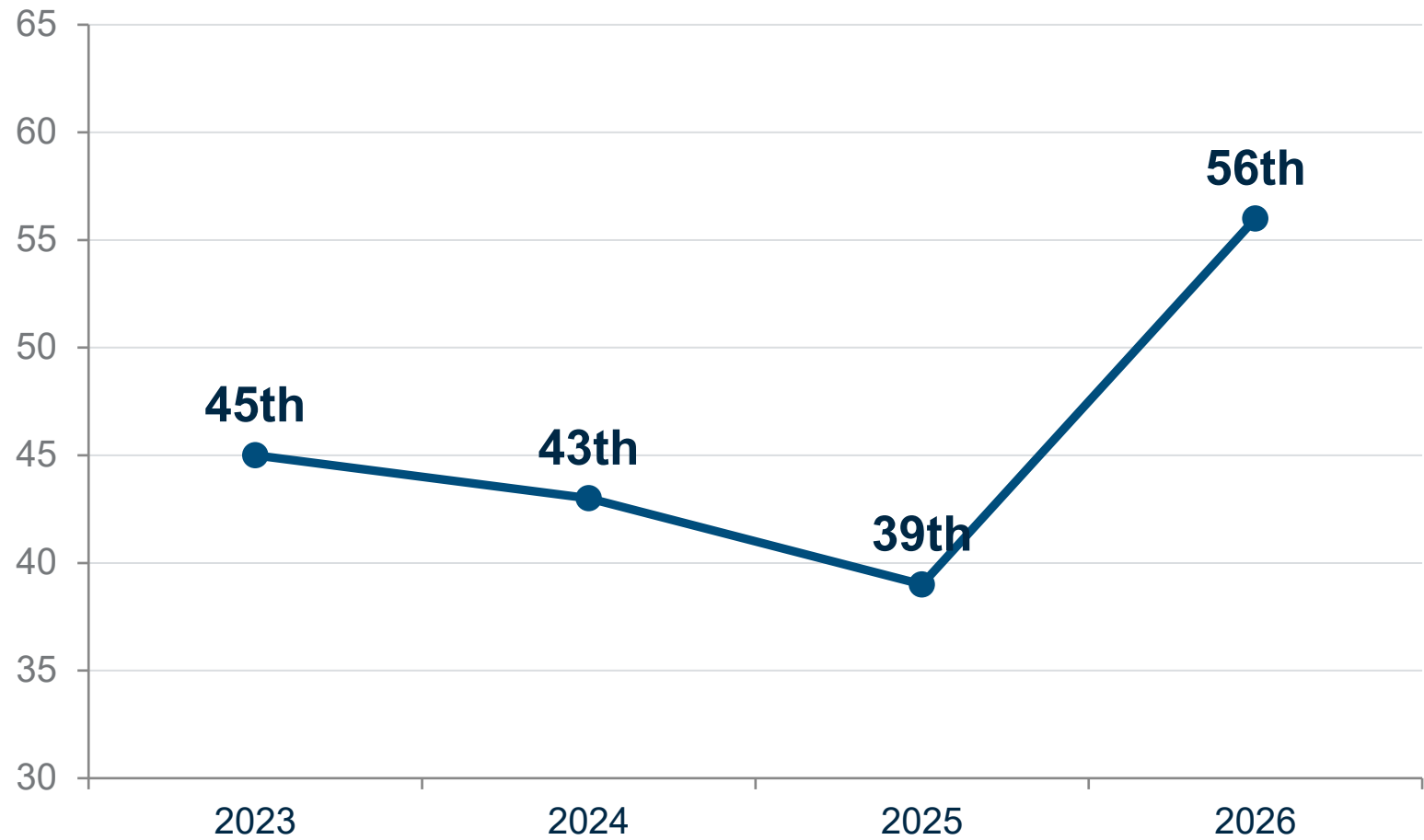

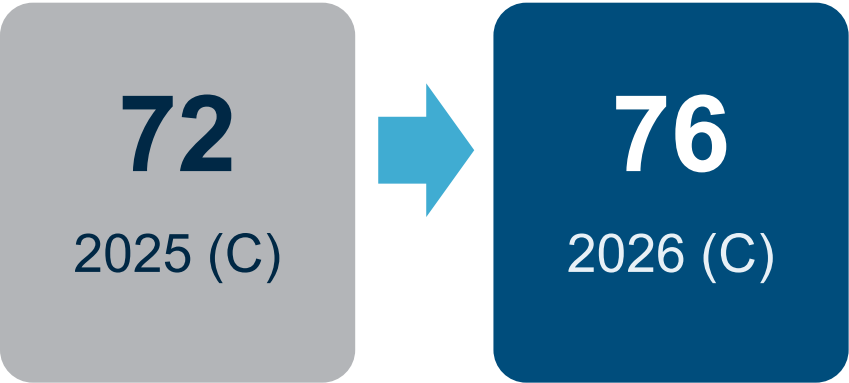

Elements of Domain 3

Element	What it measures
Academic Achievement Status	Percent of each student group at Meets Grade Level in reading/language arts and mathematics
Growth Status	Year-over-year academic growth for each group (graduation ²⁰ rate status at high school)
English Language Proficiency Status	Progress of emergent bilingual students toward English proficiency on TELPAS
Student Success Status	Combined STAAR performance with college, career, and military readiness and graduation outcomes
Student Groups Evaluated	Race/ethnicity groups plus high-focus groups: economically disadvantaged, emergent bilingual, special education, and highly mobile students

SUMMARY OF 2026 RESULTS

Where Irving ISD Outperformed

- 35.3% of campuses improved their rating, vs. 24% statewide.
- CCMR: 96.2% vs. 85.6% statewide.
- Graduation outperformed the state at the 4-, 5-, and 6-year marks, with a lower dropout rate.
- Relative Performance moved from the 39th to the 56th percentile among similar campuses statewide.
- STAAR Meets Grade Level+ rose from 35% to 38%; Masters rose from 11% to 14%.

SUMMARY OF 2026 RESULTS

Areas of Growth

- STAAR Meets Grade Level+ trails the state by 18 points (38% vs. 56%).
- STAAR Masters Grade Level trails the state by 10 points (14% vs. 24%).
- Academic Growth (Domain 2A) is a D rating in both 2025 and 2026 (64→69).
- Student Achievement (Domain 1, 73) is the highest opportunity for growth.
- 16 of 18 rated elementary campuses are identified as School Improvement.
- Hispanic and American Indian students are student groups that remain as areas of opportunity district-wide.
