Commencement Ceremony

The district shall conduct a commencement ceremony for members of the senior class at the end of the school year. Participation in the ceremony is a privilege, not a right, and the superintendent or his/her designee may prohibit students who have violated conduct rules from participating in the ceremony as a consequence for the misconduct.

Only those students who have completed all graduation requirements (i.e., completed the required coursework or achieved the goals set in the student's individual education plan) or who have received a certificate of attendance will be allowed to participate in commencement.

Class Rank

Student class rank shall be determined by using a numeric grade point average derived from all classes graded on a numeric basis. To be included in the class ranking, a student must have received a numeric grade for each course in which he/she was enrolled.

Students who transfer into the school district will be eligible to be included in class ranking.

Grade Placement and Academic Credits of Transfer Students

The district will use the criteria outlined below to determine both the grade-level placement and the academic credit awarded to transfer students. The administration is the final decision-maker, and decisions made pursuant to this policy may not be appealed to the board of education.

Transfer from an Accredited School District

A student transferring from an accredited school will generally be placed at the grade level comparable to the placement at the school from which the student is transferring. Temporary placement may be made until a student's records are received to verify the placement.

The student's building principal may place a student into a grade level that is different from the accredited school from which the student is transferring, after considering the following information:

- Student's chronological age
- Previous school experience
- Academic transcript received from the accredited school of origin
- Testing data from the accredited school of origin, including but not limited to, standardized achievement test data, criterion-referenced test data, classroom testing data, and diagnostic test data
- Testing data from any tests or assessments conducted by the school district

All credits awarded to a student by an accredited institution will count toward the applicable graduation requirements for the transferring student.

Transfer From a Non-Accredited School

A student or a parent/guardian of a student who is transferring into the district from a non-accredited school must provide the district with copies of all materials that have been used to provide instruction to the student that the family would like the district to consider in determining the appropriate grade level at which to place the student and the credits to be awarded to the student. The student's building principal will then consider those materials and the following factors in determining the grade level placement for the student:

- Student's chronological age
- Previous school experience

- Materials submitted by the student or family pursuant to this policy
- Testing data from any tests or assessments conducted by the school district

The district will award credit toward graduation for courses taken while the student was in a non-accredited school only if the student can demonstrate mastery of the concepts required for completion of that course. Transcripts will be reviewed; a course summary may be requested and reviewed; and, if needed, mastery will be assessed through standard and nonstandardized testing at the discretion of the administration.

Multiple Enrollments and Re-enrollments In the Same Semester

Students from non-accredited schools who disenroll and then re-enroll in the district multiple times during the same semester will be permitted to resume the grade placement they held at the time of prior enrollment. However, students who fail to attend the required number of days per semester will not be eligible to receive credit for the partial semester of enrollment.

The district will not retroactively award credit for time spent in exempt or non-accredited status.

A student's eligibility to participate in extracurricular activities upon re-entry is subject to all eligibility rules and the district's policies governing extracurricular eligibility.

Placement of International Students.

The district administration, in conjunction with the building principal, will determine the appropriate grade level/credit status of a student transferring from a country other than the US.

Graduation Requirements

Regardless of the school(s) previously attended, a student transferring into the school district in grades 9-12 will be responsible for meeting all graduation requirements to be awarded a diploma from the district.

Flag Display and Patriotic Observances

The district shall display the flags of the United States of America and the State of Nebraska prominently on the grounds of every school building each day that school is in session.

Each building principal shall be responsible for the care and display of the flags at his/her assigned building, and shall adhere to the rules and customs pertaining to the use and display of the flags as set forth in the United States Code.

Each day, at the time designated by the building administrator, staff shall ensure that students in grades PreK-12 will be led in the recitation of the Pledge of Allegiance in the presence of the flag of the United States of America. Pupil participation in the recitation of pledge shall be voluntary. Pupils who elect not to participate shall sit or stand silently and must respect the rights of those students choosing to participate.

Girls Soccer:



Proposal to continue Girl Soccer Co-Op with Louisville. Last season the team consisted of 39 girls, 26 Platteview Girls and 13 Louisville Girls. They were extremely competitive and were able to play all lower level games that hasn't always been possible without the co-op.

No changes are proposed:

- Still Play Under Platteview Name
- Louisville provides a staff member to help coach

PREVIOUSLY WRITTEN:

Louisville does not currently offer girls soccer, and has some students that are interested in playing. They also have a staff member interested in helping coach, so they would pay for an assistant coach as part of their co-op. We would play under the Platteview name. This is attractive to us because we have not been able to have a JV team the last two years, and even had to forfeit a game in the 2023 season because of low numbers and injuries. Coach Hobbs is in full support of co-oping with Louisville.

Boys and Girls Swimming:



Proposal to continue Boys and Girls Swimming & Dive with Bellevue East and West. Last year 3 Platteview students participated.

Previously Written:

Bellevue West is looking to be added to our co-op. The only change for us is that we would rotate practices between Bellevue East and Bellevue West. This is due to low numbers between Bellevue East and West, and we will also probably see a decrease in numbers compared to the last couple of years due to graduating several swimmers from last year. We pay \$3,000 to Bellevue each year in order for our students to have the opportunity to swim with Bellevue Public Schools.
