a. Audio Equipment and Installation, Northern High School Stadium, \$68,488.35

The Project Team recommends to enter into a purchase order with Forte for the procurement of

additional equipment for the stadium at Northern High School to improve the sound quality for event attendees. The purchase and installation totals \$68,488.35 and reflects 2026 REMC consortium pricing.

a. **Snow Removal Services, 2026-27 Contract**

The District went through an extensive request for proposal process soliciting bids for snow removal services for the upcoming 2026-27 winter season. After reviewing the results of the bids, considering the ability of the responding bidders to provide the services requested in the manner and timing needed, checking references, conducting in-person interviews, and presenting a revised contract to address specific areas of performance requirements, ACE Outdoor Services is considered to be the most responsive bidder. Administration recommends the approval of a one-year contract with the option to extend the contract by up to three additional years on a year-to-year basis, at the discretion of the District.
