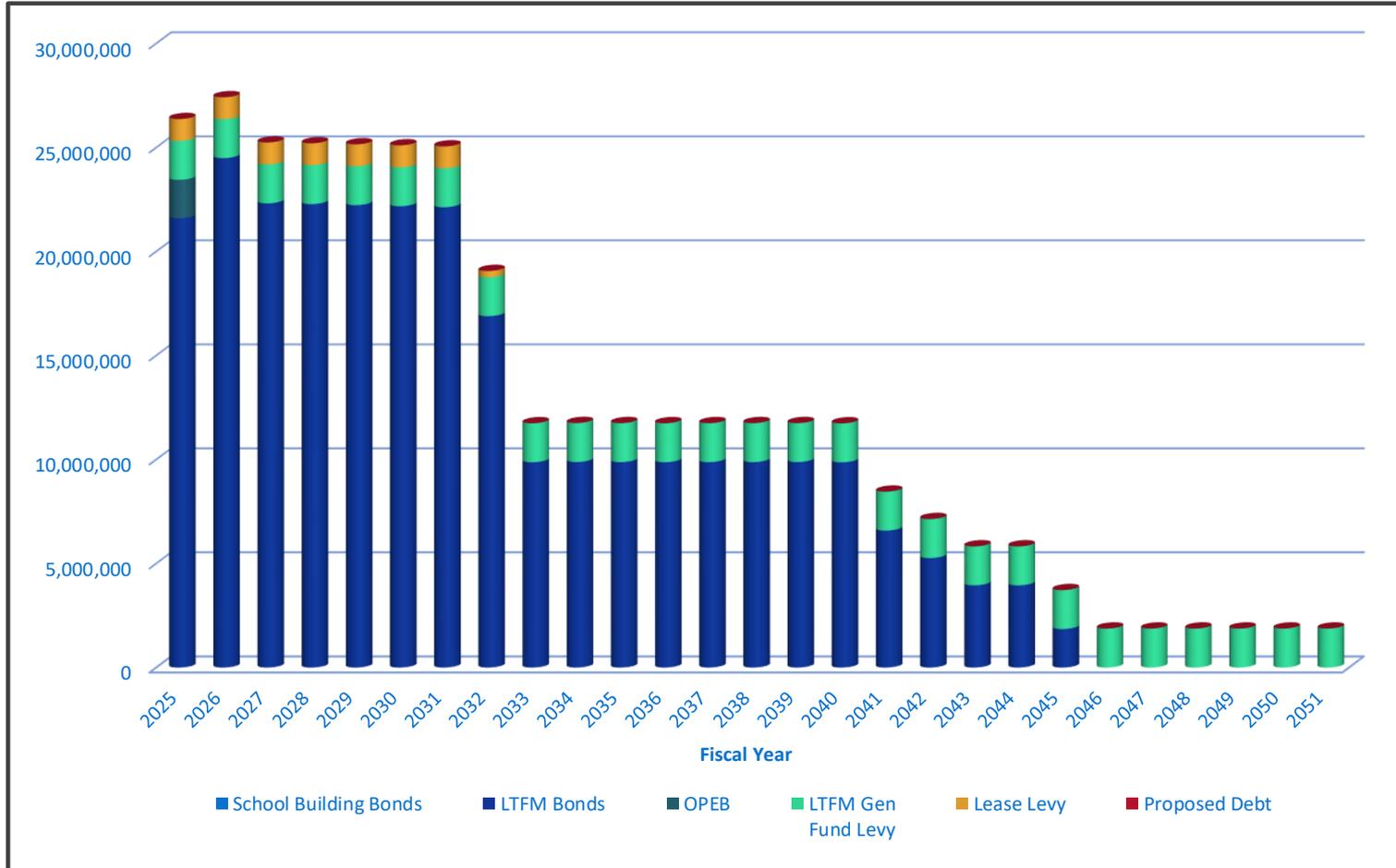

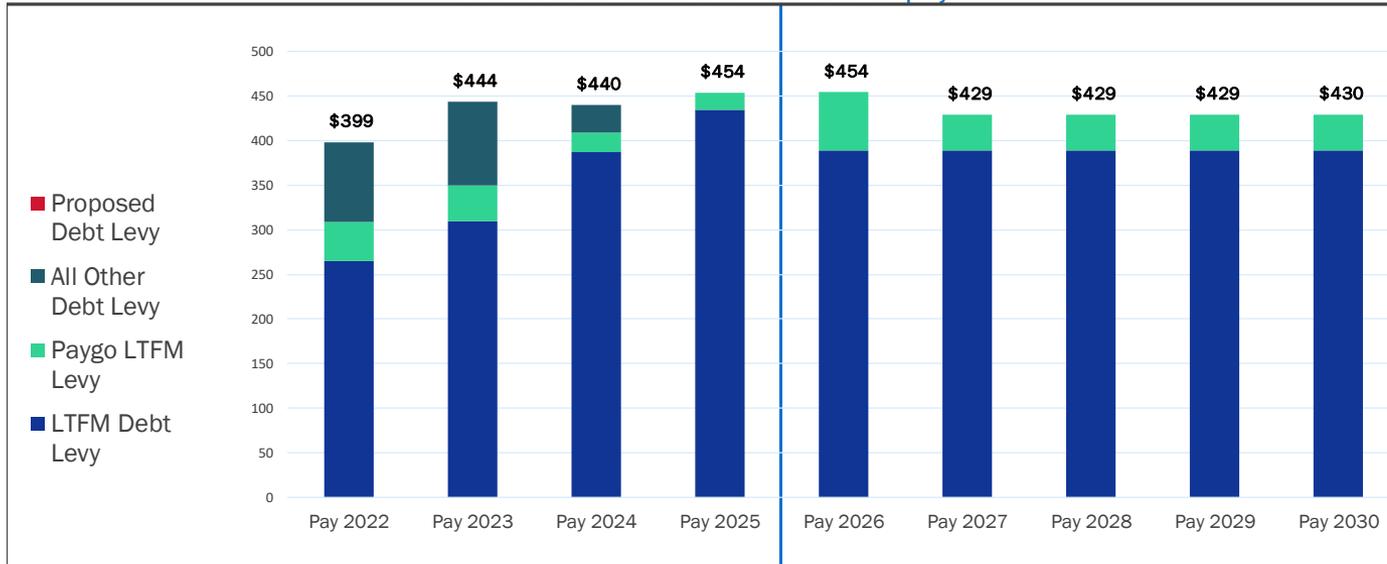
- ▶ Increase Paygo LTFM Funding
 - ▶ Levy could be increased to \$4,172,500 from \$1,872,500 to maintain current tax levy
 - ▶ Would provide additional maintenance funds for FY 2027
 - ▶ Every additional \$1 million added to the levy would create a tax impact of \$22 on an average home valued at \$330,000

Debt Management

- ▶ District has some bonds that are currently “callable” which allows them to be paid off early.
- ▶ The District could explore increasing the levy for Pay 2026 to payoff outstanding LTFM bonds early to save interest expense.

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FAC Recommendation

- ▶ FAC held discussion on this topic on May 13 meeting
- ▶ Recommendation to increase LTFM Paygo amount to keep levy neutral for FY 2027 (Pay 2026)

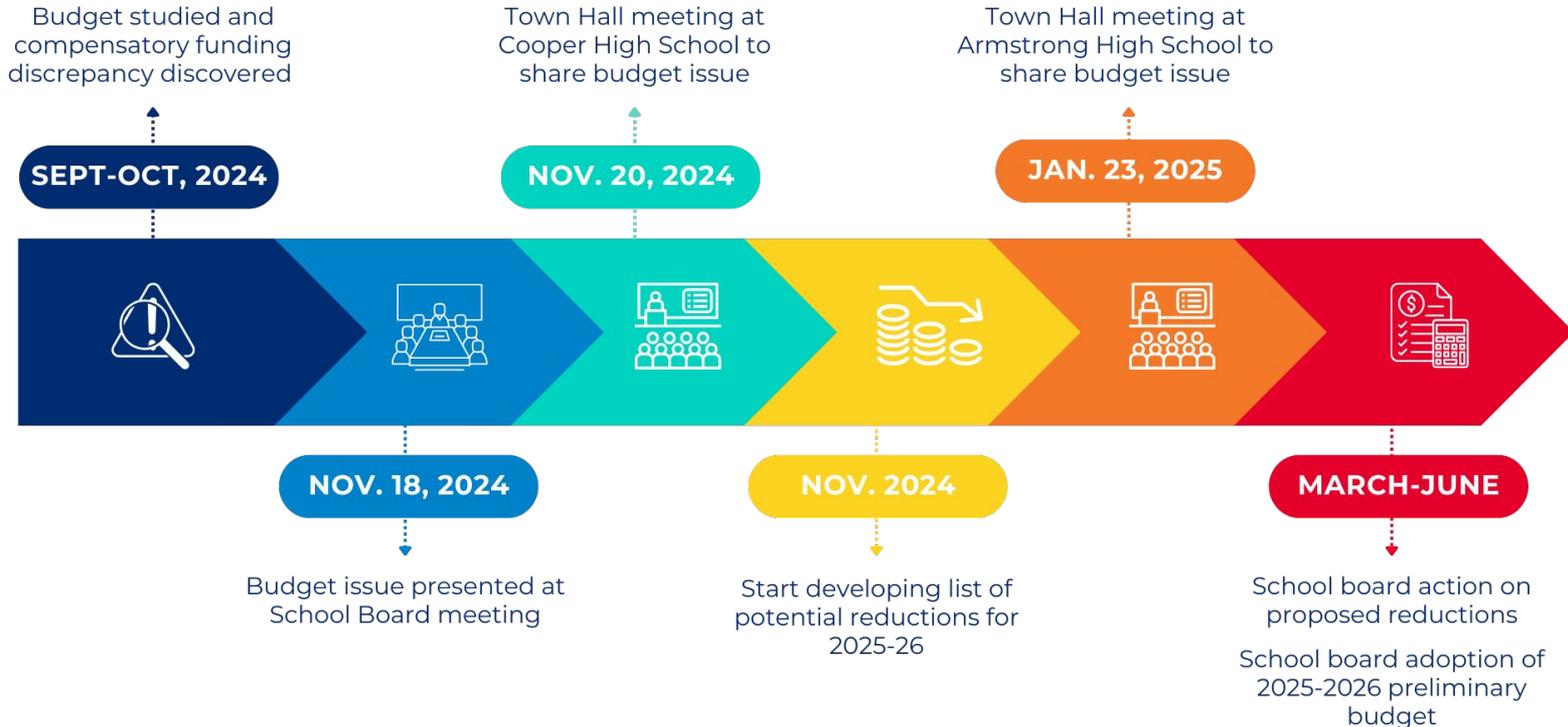

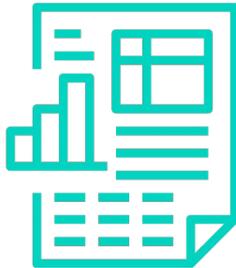

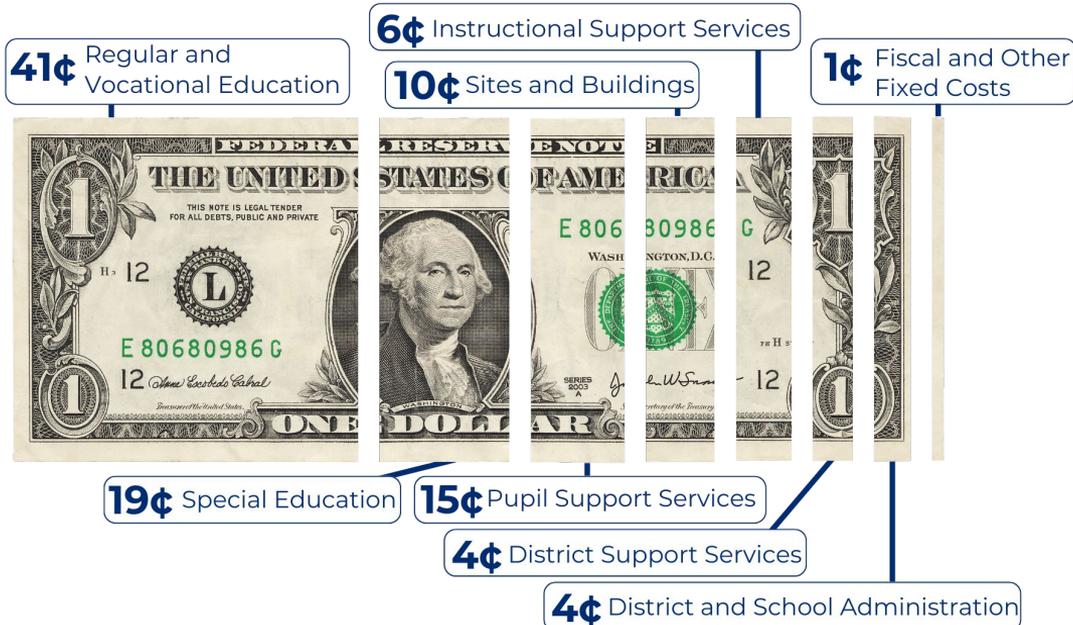

101 LEGAL STATUS OF THE SCHOOL DISTRICT

I. PURPOSE

A primary principle of this nation is that the public welfare demands an educated and informed citizenry. The power to provide for public education is a state function vested in the state legislature and delegated to local school districts. The purpose of this policy is to clarify the legal status of the school district.

II. GENERAL STATEMENT OF POLICY

- A. The school district is a public corporation subject to the control of the legislature, limited only by constitutional restrictions. The school district has been created for educational purposes.
- B. The legislature has authority to prescribe the school district's powers and privileges, its boundaries and territorial jurisdictions.
- C. The school district has only the powers conferred on it by the legislature; however, the school board's authority to govern, manage, and control the school district, to carry out its duties and responsibilities, and to conduct the business of the school district includes implied powers in addition to any specific powers granted by the legislature.

III. RELATIONSHIP TO OTHER ENTITIES

- A. The school district is a separate legal entity.
- B. The school district is coordinate with and not subordinate to the county(ies) in which it is situated.
- C. The school district is not subservient to municipalities within its territory.

IV. POWERS AND AUTHORITY OF THE SCHOOL DISTRICT

- A. Funds
 - 1. The school district, through its school board, has authority to raise funds for the operation and maintenance of its schools and authority to manage and expend such funds, subject to applicable law.
 - 2. The school district has wide discretion over the expenditure of funds under its control for public purposes, subject to the limitations provided by law.

3. School district officials occupy a fiduciary position in the management and expenditure of funds entrusted to them.

B. Raising Funds

1. The school district shall, within the limitations specified by law, provide by levy of tax necessary funds for the conduct of schools, payment of indebtedness, and all proper expenses.
2. The school district may issue bonds in accordance with the provisions of Minn. Stat. Ch. 475, or other applicable law.
3. The school district has authority to accept gifts and donations for school purposes, subject to applicable law.

C. Property

1. The school district may acquire property for school purposes. It may sell, exchange, or otherwise dispose of property which is no longer needed for school purposes, subject to applicable law.
2. The school district shall manage its property in a manner consistent with the educational functions of the district.
3. The school district may permit the use of its facilities for community purposes which are not inconsistent with, nor disruptive of, its educational mission.
4. School district officials hold school property as trustees for the use and benefit of students, taxpayers, and the community.

D. Contracts

1. The school district is empowered to enter into contracts in the manner provided by law.
2. The school district has authority to enter into installment purchases and leases with an option to purchase, pursuant to Minn. Stat. § 465.71 or other applicable law.
3. The school district has authority to make contracts with other governmental agencies and units for the purchase, lease or other acquisition of equipment, supplies, materials, or other property, including real property.
4. The school district has authority to enter into employment contracts. As a public employer, the school district, through its designated representatives, shall meet and negotiate with public employees in an appropriate bargaining unit and enter into written collective bargaining agreements with such employees, subject to applicable law.

E. Textbooks, Educational Materials, and Studies

1. The school district, through its school board and administrators, has the authority to determine what textbooks, educational materials, and studies should be pursued.
2. The school district shall establish and apply the school curriculum.

F. Actions and Suits

The school district has authority to sue and to be sued.

101.1 POLICY - NAME OF THE SCHOOL DISTRICT

I. PURPOSE

The purpose of this administrative procedure is to clarify the name of the school district.

II. GENERAL STATEMENT OF POLICY

Pursuant to statute, the official name of the school district is Independent School District No. 281. However, the school district is often referred to by other informal names. In order to avoid confusion and to encourage consistency in school district letterheads, signage, publications and other materials, the school board intends to establish a uniform name for the school district.

III. UNIFORM NAME

- A. The name of the school district shall be Robbinsdale Area Schools.
- B. The name specified above may be used to refer to the school district and may be shown on school district letterheads, signage, publications and other materials.
- C. In official communications and on school district ballots, the school district shall be referred to as Independent School District No. 281, Robbinsdale Area Schools, but inadvertent failure to use the correct name shall not invalidate any legal proceeding or matter or affect the validity of any document.

102 **POLICY** - EQUAL EDUCATIONAL OPPORTUNITY

I. **PURPOSE**

The purpose of this policy is to ensure that equal educational opportunity is provided for all students of the school district.

II. **GENERAL STATEMENT OF POLICY**

- A. The policy of the school district is to provide equal educational opportunity for all students. The school district does not **unlawfully** discriminate on the basis of **one or more of the following**: race, color, creed, religion, national origin, sex, gender, marital status, parental status, status with regard to public assistance, disability, sexual orientation, or age. The school district also makes reasonable accommodations for disabled students.
- B. The school district prohibits the harassment of any individual for any of the categories listed above. For information about the types of conduct that constitute violation of the school district's policy on harassment and violence and the school district's procedures for addressing such complaints, refer to the school district's policy on harassment and violence.
- ~~C. This policy applies to all areas of education including academics, coursework, co-curricular and extracurricular activities, or other rights or privileges of enrollment.~~
The school district prohibits discrimination of students with a disability, within the intent of Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 ("Section 504"), who need services, accommodations, or programs in order to receive a free appropriate public education. For information as to protections that may apply pursuant to Section 504 and the school district's corresponding procedures for addressing disability discrimination complaints, refer to the school district's policy on student disability nondiscrimination (Policy 521).
- ~~D. Every school district employee shall be responsible for complying with this policy conscientiously.~~
The school district prohibits sexual harassment discrimination of any individual on the basis of sex in its education programs or activities. For information as to the protections that apply pursuant to Title IX and school district's corresponding procedures and processes for addressing sexual harassment and discrimination, refer to the school district's policy on Title IX sex nondiscrimination (Policy 522).
- ~~E. Any student, parent, or guardian having a question regarding this policy should discuss it with the appropriate school district official as provided by policy. In the absence of a specific designee, an inquiry or a complaint should be referred to the superintendent.~~
The school district shall provide equal opportunity for members of each sex and to

members of all races and ethnicities to participate in its athletic program. In determining whether equal opportunity to participate in athletic programs is available for the purposes of this law, at least the following factors shall be considered to the extent that they are applicable to a given situation:

- whether the opportunity for males and females to participate in the athletic program reflects the demonstrated interest in athletics of the males and females in the student body of the educational institution;
- whether the opportunity for members of all races and ethnicities to participate in the athletic program reflects the demonstrated interest in athletics of members of all races and ethnicities in the student body of the educational institution;
- whether the variety and selection of sports and levels of competition effectively accommodate the demonstrated interests of members of each sex;
- whether the variety and selection of sports and levels of competition effectively accommodate the demonstrated interests of members of all races and ethnicities;
- the provision of equipment and supplies; scheduling of games and practice times;
- assignment of coaches; provision of locker rooms;
- practice and competitive facilities;
- and the provision of necessary funds for teams of one sex.

- F. This policy applies to all areas of education including academics, coursework, co-curricular and extracurricular activities, or other rights or privileges of enrollment.
- G. Every school district employee shall be responsible for complying with this policy.
- H. Any student, parent, or guardian having a question regarding this policy should discuss it with the appropriate school district official as provided by policy. In the absence of a specific designee, an inquiry or a complaint should be referred to the superintendent.

103 - COMPLAINTS: STUDENTS, EMPLOYEES, PARENTS, OTHER PERSONS

I. PURPOSE

The school district takes all concerns or complaints by students, employees, parents or other persons seriously. If a specific complaint procedure is provided within any other policy of the school district, the specific procedure shall/will/must be followed in reference to such a complaint. If a specific complaint procedure is not provided, the purpose of this policy is to provide a procedure that may be used.

II. GENERAL STATEMENT OF POLICY

- A. Students, parents, employees, or other persons may report concerns or complaints to the school district. While written reports are encouraged, a complaint may be made orally. Any employee receiving a complaint shall advise the principal or immediate supervisor of the receipt of the complaint. The supervisor shall make an initial determination as to the seriousness of the complaint and whether the matter should be referred to the superintendent.
- B. A person may file a complaint at any level of the school district; i.e., principal, **human resources, union stewards**, superintendent or school board. However, persons are encouraged to file a complaint at the building level when appropriate. **Reference materials (harassment and violence report form and bullying incident form)**
- C. Depending upon the nature and seriousness of the complaint, the supervisor or other administrator receiving the complaint shall determine the nature and scope of the investigation or follow-up procedures. If the complaint involves serious allegations, the matter shall promptly be referred to the superintendent, who shall determine whether an internal or external investigation should be conducted. In either case, the superintendent shall determine the nature and scope of the investigation and designate the person responsible for investigation or follow-up relating to the complaint. The designated investigator shall ascertain details concerning the complaint and respond promptly to the appropriate administrator concerning the status or outcome of the matter.
- D. The appropriate administrator shall respond in writing to the complaining party concerning the outcome of the investigation or follow up, including any appropriate action or corrective measure that was taken. The superintendent shall be copied on the correspondence and consulted in advance of the written response when appropriate. The response to the complaining party shall be consistent with the rights of others pursuant to the applicable provisions of Minnesota Statutes chapter 13 (Minnesota Government Data Practices Act) or other law.

III. PROCESS

The superintendent is directed to develop complaint procedures for existing policies of the School

District that meet the state requirements established in law or rule.

2024-25 Robbinsdale Q-Comp Annual Report

Q-Comp is a school improvement model that focuses on teacher effectiveness and student achievement.

It provides monetary incentives to reward teachers for working toward raising student achievement.

The three components of our plan I am reporting on are: school improvement goals, professional learning communities, and the teacher review process. In addition, I will share findings from our Annual Review that was completed in May.

School Improvement (Site) Goals

- In Robbinsdale we write site goals based on the results of the MCA & Fastbridge assessments. SMART goals are set using reading or math data.
- Site goals were set in September and submitted by October 1st
- MCA data becomes available August 2025. At that time goal attainment will be reviewed and verified.

Professional Learning Communities (PLCs)

PLCs are collaborative work teachers engage in to improve classroom instruction to increase student achievement.

- PLCs met weekly in person or virtually from September 2024 through May 2025
- PLCs wrote annual SMART goals focused on increasing student achievement. These goals are aligned to building site goals.
- PLC goals are approved by administrators.
- Our PLCs have performance pay tied to PLC participation and goal attainment.
- Interview data from the Annual Review and Survey Data revealed:
- Educators understand purpose, goals, size, composition, meeting time and goal setting in PLCs.
 - Teachers gave examples of how PLC work impacts instruction and how it connects to classroom practice
- **Survey responses to “How has your instructional practice changed as a result of your PLC Work?”**
 - “It helps to set short goals within our PLC group to focus on each week and then see the results of our teaching based upon our goal.”
 - “It has changed drastically, the best PLC I have ever had. Loved having a group of educators who had a drive to work towards a thing. Catalyst plc was the best idea ever!”
 - “I am better at understanding how to determine the needs of students and set a baseline.”



Peer Review

All staff are observed or evaluated. Administrators evaluate all probationary educators three times a year. Peer Coaches observe continuing contract staff twice a year with the exception of the summative evaluation. Summative evaluations (also referred to as high cycle evaluations) are conducted by administrators once every three years with continuing contract educators

- The Robbinsdale teacher review process involves three, live, 45 minute observations in addition to a 30 minute pre-conference and 30 minute post conference
- Feedback is provided using the 2022 Charlotte Danielson Framework for Teaching
- Educators set professional growth goals. These goals are observed and/or discussed during every observation cycle
- The percentage of educators who were awarded performance pay by meeting proficiency standards is not yet available
- During the Annual Review/Survey, educators shared how reflecting on an observation improves classroom practice
 - “I recognize the importance of relationships even in a small group pull out setting.”
 - “I have gained more strategies and confidence in trying new methods to engage my learners. I appreciate the reflection talking through lessons and ideas with a trusted and knowledgeable peer teacher/coach affords.”
 - “My feedback helped me to use a better system for documentation and data collections and I feel more prepared to start the next school year.”

In summary, our coaching model continues to focus on supporting teachers to improve instruction. Data from 2024-25 provides insight into student achievement that we can build on. We will continue to modify and adjust our Q-Comp plan as needed. The Q-Comp Annual Review focuses on implementation and compliance to our Q-Comp plan. It helps identify successes and areas for improvement. All buildings must be reviewed once every four years. The review took place from April 23rd to May 1st - six buildings/programs were interviewed and a [survey](#) was sent to all educators. Teams interviewed a variety of PLCs using the scripted protocol provided by MDE. The data from the review will be used to modify and adjust our plan for years to come.

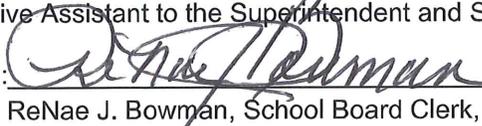

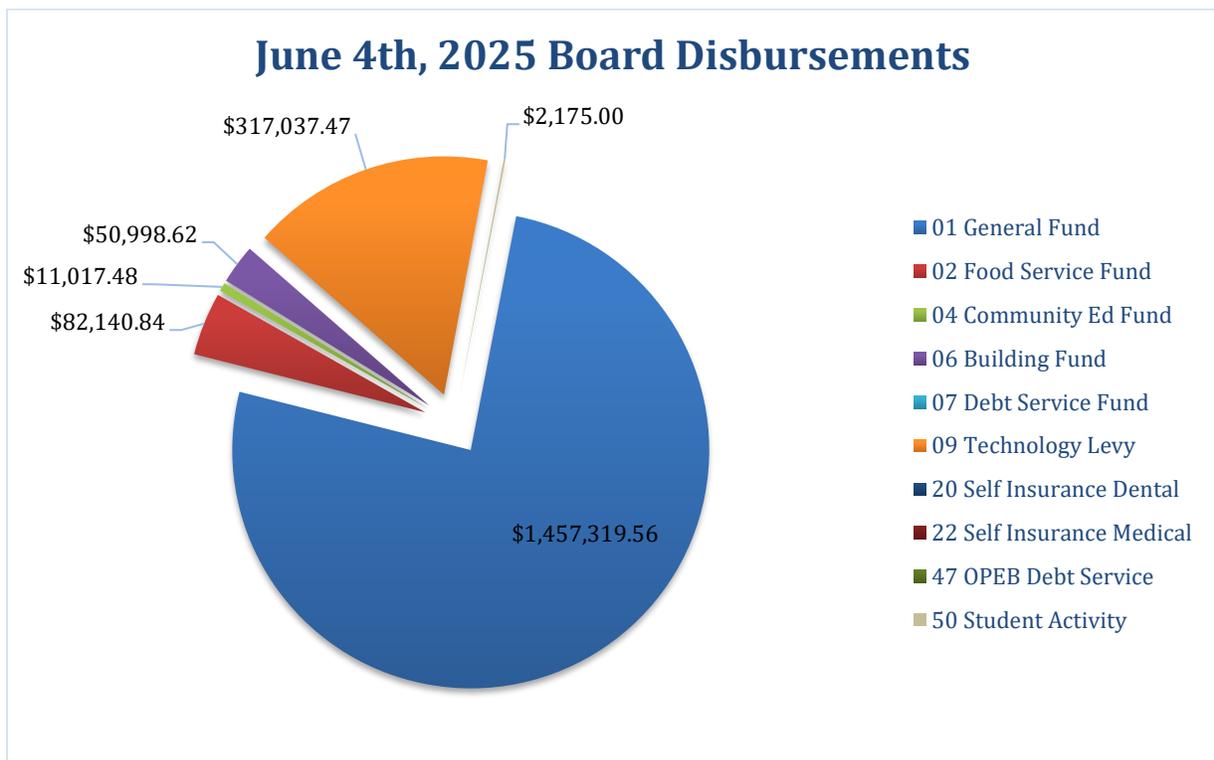
