Custodial Cleaning Services RFP

Background Information:

Custodial Cleaning Services RFP Information Item

Over the last several years the Central Texas area has struggled to keep up with the demand for custodial staff. This is mostly accredited to the rapid growth and increase in housing cost in the Central Texas Area. Georgetown ISD has not been immune to the staffing shortages not only in custodial services but in many other support roles. Two years ago Georgetown ISD entered into an agreement with Goodwill to help supply custodial staff in order reduce our open vacancies. This solution was short lived only produced less than 8 total staff members out of which only two became permanent employees and the agreement was ended. Going into the 2021/2022 school year the custodial shortages reached their lowest level with some elementary schools only having one day custodian. To cover the shortages campus staff helped in the daily cleaning process and district has tried several other staffing tactics as mentioned in previous week's board update including the mid-school year pay raises.

As GISD continues to struggle to fill vacancies a district team came together put out a RFP for custodial service at elementary campuses to help cover the cleaning of these campuses for the 2022/2023 school year. This RFP consisted of turnkey operations for the district's 10 elementary schools. This RFP includes staffing, supplies and equipment. This type of service has been successful in other school districts in helping solve the issue of short staffing.

The RFP produced 7 proposals ranging from 1.81 million to 2.7 million per year for the cleaning of all 10 elementary schools. The district's current cost of custodial services for all 10 schools when staffed is 2.25 million per year. The advantages that these professional cleaning companies have over single district run operations is synergy of operating many school districts. They have much larger buying power as they buy in bulk. These companies also have a larger staffing support of other school districts to be able to shift staff around when needed. Their employees pay into Social Security and not TRS as some employee want to pay into Social Security. We present to the Board for Information a copy of the cleaning frequency requirements for the companies that turned in proposals. The district will be reviewing all proposals plus references in order to make a recommendation to the School Board at a future board meeting. We are seeking the best solution to the district for its custodial services.

Background Information:

A law added by Acts 2007, 80th Legislature, requires that school districts disclose the amounts spent on purchasing cooperative fees on an annual basis. Specifically, it states:

Sec. 44.0331. MANAGEMENT FEES UNDER CERTAIN COOPERATIVE PURCHASING

CONTRACTS. (a) A school district that enters into a purchasing contract valued at \$50,000 or more under Section 44.031(a)(5), under Subchapter F, Chapter 271, Local Government Code, or under any other cooperative purchasing program authorized for school districts by law shall document any contract-related fee, including any management fee, and the purpose of each fee under the contract.

(b) The amount, purpose, and disposition of any fee described by Subsection (a) must

be presented in a written report and submitted annually in an open meeting of the board of trustees of the school district. The written report must appear as an agenda item.

(c) The commissioner may audit the written report described by Subsection (b).



Meal Rates for the 2022 - 2023 School Year

Background Information:

This is the time of year were the district approves the meal rates for the upcoming school year. All meal rates are set by the Texas Department of Agriculture (TDA) using their Paid Lunch Equity tool. TDA has given the recommendation of a \$.26 per meal increase with a minimum of a \$.10 per meal increase. We are recommending taking the minimum increase of \$.10 per meal to have the least amount of financial impact on families. This would take the elementary student meals to \$3.00 and the secondary student meals to \$3.25.

Background Information:

From time to time and as requested temporary construction easements are granted to allow limited access to properties owned by GISD. In this case, LMSA Georgetown, LLC has requested temporary and limited access to property adjacent to McCoy Elementary school. This will allow the developer to complete the construction of new roads and the necessary grading to facilitate the expansion of the neighborhood. The last two pages of the easement agreement (Exhibit A) illustrate the exact location of the area of construction and the limits of this easement.
