The Seward City Council met at 7:00 p.m. on Tuesday, June 15, 2021, with Mayor Joshua Eickmeier presiding and City Clerk Derek Bargmann recording the proceedings. Upon roll call, the following Councilmembers were present: Ellen Beck, Sid Kamprath, Jessica Kolterman, Karl Miller, Chris Schmit, John Singleton, Jonathon Wilken. Councilmembers Absent: Alyssa Hendrix. Other officials present: City Administrator Greg Butcher, City Attorney Kelly Hoffschneider.

ADMINISTRATIVE ITEMS

1. CONSIDERATION OF THE SEWARD COUNTY E911 INTERLOCAL BUDGET

Andrew Matney, Seward County E911 Director, presented the budget for the next fiscal year of operations. The budget provided to the Council on June 11th indicated an approximate 6.21% increase, mainly due to previously unknown contractual obligations executed by former E911 administration. Mr. Matney distributed and discussed an updated budget with revisions to lower the increase to 2.97%. Big revisions in the budget were elimination of the Assistant Director position, in which savings were budgeted to create a new dispatch position and improve compensation in existing positions.

Upon Council discussion of pay and retention of dispatchers, Mayor Eickmeier inquired about the comparability study completed two years ago. Mr.

Matney believes the issue with retention is lack of competitiveness with surrounding entities for longevity compensation. Mr. Matney opined that the issue of comparable pay to peer entities will be critical to review closely for the dispatcher positions in the near future to ensure effective continued operations.

Darrell Zabrocki, Seward County Commissioner (in audience), provided an update regarding the wages of dispatcher positions. The County has approved a 2% increase for County employees and at the comparability study to occur next year, dispatcher wages will be closely reviewed. Per Councilmember Kamprath's inquiry, Councilmember Singleton provided a breakdown of the funding sources of the E911 program. Councilmember Singleton spoke on the challenges that may come from a large increase in dispatcher wages regarding the funding entities and approvals needed—a funding source could opt out if they do not agree.

Councilmember Schmit queried about the use of the sinking funds and if it has a special designation. Mr. Matney stated the sinking fund is more for emergency rather than for designated use.

Councilmember Singleton and Mr. Matney described the need for continued comparability with neighboring counties and that systems will need to be updated in the near future.

Councilmember Singleton moved, seconded by Councilmember Kolterman, to approve the Seward County E911 budget, with amended 2.97% increase.





B. A "STOP" sign shall be installed at the northeast corner of the intersection of 1st Street and Jackson Street, directing westbound vehicular traffic on Jackson Street to stop before entering the intersection with 1st Street.

C. A "STOP" sign shall be installed at the southwest corner of the intersection of 2nd Street and Jackson Street, directing eastbound vehicular traffic on Jackson Street to stop before entering the intersection with 2nd Street.

D. A "STOP" sign shall be installed at the northeast corner of the intersection of 2nd Street and Jackson Street, directing westbound vehicular traffic on Jackson Street to stop before entering the intersection with 2nd Street.

E. Appropriate "STOP" signs shall be erected, maintained and enforced directing the traffic on such streets accordingly.

RESOLUTION NO. 2021-

WHEREAS, Section 382-4.4 of the City Code of the City of Seward, Nebraska provides that the City may, by Resolution, set aside any street, alley, public way, or portion thereof where the parking of a particular kind or class of vehicle shall be prohibited, or where the parking of any vehicle shall be prohibited and

WHEREAS, it is necessary or desirable to restrict the parking of vehicles at certain places on certain streets hereinafter designated in the City of Seward, Nebraska:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SEWARD, NEBRASKA THAT:




Figure 1. Proposal to convert two existing parking stalls to compact car only stalls

1. The parking of motor vehicles will be limited to "Compact Vehicles Only" and no vehicle prohibited from parking thereon shall stand or be parked adjacent to the curb of said street, alley, public way, or portion thereof longer than a period of time necessary to load and unload freight or passengers at the following designated location:

a. Beginning at the west curb line of 5th Street at the northeast corner of the intersection of said 5th and Seward Streets, thence east fifty-eight (58) feet and consisting of two (2) diagonal off-street parking spaces on the north side of said Seward Street, as depicted on the attached "Figure 1".

2. The above designated parking spaces shall be indicated by a sign which is in conformance with the most current edition of the Highway Administration Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices for streets and highways and such other appropriate lines and markings shall be placed at said locations as are authorized by the City Code of the City of Seward, Nebraska.

3. All previous resolutions in conflict with the resolution as they relate to the above described locations are hereby revoked.

- Preparing yearend estimates for Department Heads/Budget.
