MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MONTHLY MEETING OF THE BOARD OF EDUCATION OF
ALMA PUBLIC SCHOOLS

A meeting of the Alma Public Schools Board of Education was convened in open and public session on Monday, April 13, 2020, at 7:00 PM in the library at Alma Public Schools.

The roll was called and the following Board members were present: Allen Brugh, Brett Hammond, Scott Prickett, Nick Simonson, and Janna Tripe. All present.

Notice of the meeting was given in advance by publication and notice was given in advance to all members of the Board of Education. The Secretary of the Board maintains a list of the news media requesting notification of meetings and advice notification to the listed media of the time and place of the meeting and the subjects to be discussed at this meeting was provided. Availability of the agenda was communicated in the publicized notice. All proceedings of the Board of Education, except as may be hereinafter noted, were taken while the convened meeting was open to the attendance of the public.

A motion was made by Janna Tripe and seconded by Nick Simonson to approve the consent agenda, which include: minutes from the regular March 9, 2020, meeting; special meeting held March 23, 2020; the General and Activity Financial Reports. After discussion and on roll call vote the Board voted as follows: Scott Prickett: Absent, Janna Tripe: Yea, Allen Brugh: Yea, Brett Hammond: Yea, Nick Simonson: Yea. Passed.

A motion was made by Brett Hammond and seconded by Nick Simonson to approve the receipts, expenditures, and payment of claims from the General Fund for \$427,860.63, Lunch Fund for \$15,403.33, and from Activity Fund for \$15,792.76. After discussion and on roll call vote the Board voted as follows: Allen Brugh: Yea, Brett Hammond: Yea, Scott Prickett: Yea, Nick Simonson: Yea, Janna Tripe: Yea. Passed.

A motion was made by Nick Simonson and seconded by Janna Tripe to approve resolution #41320-1, as drafted by Perry Law Firm, dealing the COVID-19 pandemic. After discussion and on roll call vote the Board voted as follows: Brett Hammond: Yea, Scott Prickett: Yea, Nick Simonson: Yea, Janna Tripe: Yea, Allen Brugh: Yea. Passed.

A motion was made by Nick Simonson and seconded by Scott Prickett to appoint Randy Heckenlively to serve the remainder of the term, that expires December 2022, left vacant by the resignation of Jerry Kovarik. After discussion and on roll call vote the Board voted as follows: Scott Prickett: Yea, Nick Simonson: Yea, Janna Tripe: Yea, Allen Brugh: Yea, Brett Hammond: Yea. Passed.

A motion was made by Scott Prickett and seconded by Brett Hammond to approve the bid from Wilson Flooring that includes 'walk off' carpet in both entry areas, for \$18,094.36, minus tearing out old carpet, which will be done by school personnel. After discussion and on roll call vote the Board voted as follows: Nick Simonson: Yea, Janna Tripe: Yea, Allen Brugh: Yea, Brett Hammond: Yea, Scott Prickett: Yea. Passed.

Discussion items included: elementary class enrollment, staffing needs, and splits for the 2020-2021 school-term; graduation and diploma presentation options; quotes for refinishing the gym floors, and bids for lighting on the football field/track.

Principal Brandyberry reported on our *Grab and Go Meal* program and how distance learning (Alternative Education) is working for Alma students and staff.

Superintendent Davis reported on the *COVID-19* updates, *Legislative Happenings - American Civics Committee*, our *FEMA Application*, *Summer Projects*, *State Aid*, and the *NRCSA Convention*

I believe I possess a degree of bilingualism that few achieve and that also uniquely qualifies me as a High School Spanish teacher to help bridge the gap between these two languages with my students. More than bilingualism, I bring biculturalism into the classroom to a rare degree, as well.

As an experienced pastor and missionary, I believe I additionally bring a number of key skills and abilities that are indispensable, not only to parish ministry, but also to the classroom: motivational skills, communication skills, compassion, emotional intelligence, discipline, pedagogical skills—the list goes on.
