Special Meeting – November 14, 2012

The Special Monthly meeting of the Bristol Board of Education was held on Wednesday, November 14, 2012, at 7:00 p.m., at the Board of Education Administration Building, located at 129 Church Street, Bristol, Connecticut.

CALL TO ORDER, PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE, MOMENT OF SILENCE

Chairman Wilson called the meeting to order at 7:01 p.m. and invited the audience to join him in reciting the Pledge of Allegiance.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

On motion of Commissioner Morgan, seconded by Commissioner Bourassa, it was unanimously

Committee Reports

Finance Committee

Commissioner Vibert reported that the committee met earlier this evening and they received a detailed summary and reforecast from Mr. Franzi. The Board is currently looking at a possible \$560,000 surplus at the end of the year; however there is risk against that money by way of Transportation and Special Education tuition which could actually put us in the red. Administration is currently working with First Student to find ways to consolidate bus runs; that could save us money. Principals and Department Heads are currently working on their budgets and they should have them back to administration within the next couple of weeks, and we hope to have a draft budget to Commissioners by January at the latest.

Communication and Community Relations Committee

Commissioner Bourassa reported that the committee held a Special Meeting met on October 17th. There was discussion of the Fall Newsletter with a focus on the word "New" – new schools, curricula, Superintendent, Alliance Grant, mentor program, awards and accolades, National Merit Scholar. Rich Gagliardi shared information regarding the redesign of the district and schools websites to be launched in January. The technology committee is meeting regularly to work on redesign; expectations for webmasters will be clearly defined as part of this work.

Personnel Committee

In the absence of Commissioner O'Brien, Commissioner Vibert reported that the committee met a couple of weeks ago and discussed one of the issues that was on the Finance Report this evening. We are looking at a forecast of a \$160,000 deficit in Cafeteria Services. Every year we have transferred money from the General Budget to cover the deficit in the cafeteria budget; the cafeteria budget is a separate budget from the general

budget. Unfortunately we are facing a situation where we will not have funds to transfer. The committee has met with the leadership of Local 2267 and a few things were discussed. The Administration will be going out to bid for privatizing cafeteria services and the leadership of the union will work on ways to save money. The last thing we want to do is privatize; we have valuable, loyal, dedicated employees that work in our school cafeterias however our main business is educating our children and we can no longer afford to subsidize the cafeteria budget. Hopefully we will come up with a solution without having to privatize.

Chairman Wilson informed the Board that since the meeting date changed from last week to this week, Nutmeg Television has provided us with revised viewing information: Comcast Channel 95/AT &T U-Verse uverse Channel 99: Thursday, November 15th at 6pm and Sunday, November 18th at 11am and again at 6pm. Currently the only information on our website is Comcast, we will now list AT &T U-Verse information as well.

Superintendent Report

Dr. Solek informed the Board of the CAPT breakfast at each of the high schools; these events are held to acknowledge students who have achieved high honors on the CAPT tests. We are so proud of the students for their accomplishments. We are also grateful for the administration for putting together such wonderful celebrations. She also announced that there are theater productions at each of the high schools this weekend; she encouraged everyone to attend if they could. Tomorrow is the celebration of the season with the Thanksgiving Feast being held at each of our schools. It is wonderful opportunity to break bread and spend time in our school with the students.

Intramurals Update - Ellen Benham reported that the intramural program had a very successful fall season, we had 400 students participating, with most of them receiving instruction and then playing time. The Fall Jamboree was held October 25th. There were four soccer games, flag football, volleyball and cross country. Our schools are very different; the new K-8 schools and Northeast are not at the same level as Chippens we will address this at the next Jamboree. The winter session will have basketball and we will continue with the ski club, they will tap into the high schools for coaches, as they get out in time to help out. We are also thinking of offering Zumba or aerobics. We will start sign up after the Thanksgiving holiday. Hope to have things running before the Christmas season.

New School Dedications – Dr. Moreau reported that the West Bristol dedication will be held on Saturday, Dec. 8th at 10 a.m. It will be a dedication ceremony and a community open house. Board members and their families are asked to join us at the ceremony. The Greene-Hills dedication ceremony and community open house will be held Saturday, December 15th at 10 a.m.

CABE/CAPSS Conference – Chairman Wilson reported that the CABE/CAPSS Conference will be held this weekend. There is still time to register if they have not done so already, Commissioners can register up until Friday morning.

Geo-Thermal Presentation – Dr. Solek reported that on October 24th, an in depth Geo-Thermal presentation was conducted by Tim Callahan, Building Project Manager. Guests included Governor Malloy, Mayor Ward, DEEP Commissioner Esty, and Board of Education Members. Mr. Callahan gave a tour and spoke about the geothermal system; how it works and the cost savings that it offers the district. The presentation was well received by all that were in attendance.

Middle School Program Update - Denise Carabetta gave an in-depth report regarding the revisions that have occurred at the middle school level. Questions followed regarding any changes or modification in the future, scheduling issues and the music program.

Building Committee Reports

West Bristol School/Forestville School

Dr. Moreau reported that the West Bristol committee met in October. We are down to a punch list there. Thankfully we have funds left in our budget, because we are currently over budget at Greene Hills. We hit more rock when they were excavating the parking lot; they paved the parking lot today. We will open the parking lot the day after Thanksgiving. This is very important because it will change the traffic pattern significantly, parents will now come in and exit on Daley Street. The traffic light at Lincoln will have much less traffic. We are really looking forward to the dedication ceremonies. We will have student tour guides leading groups, and they will be well trained well in advance of the event, so that they can give knowledgeable tours of the buildings. **Questions followed regarding the contingency fund at Greene-Hills.** Dr. Moreau explained that each building had a contingency fund of about 2 million

dollars; we have exhausted the contingency fund at Greene Hills by about \$250,000 yet there is still just over \$400,000 in the fund at the West Bristol project.

Chairman Wilson highlighted a letter to editor regarding the number of contractors that were local. On our project 57% of workers live within 20 miles of Bristol and 34.18% are from Bristol. Some of the contractors were niche type contractors that could only be done by the contractors used. Most spent money here even if they were not from here.

Karen Vibert reported that Dr. Moreau is vying for a chance to kiss Daisy the Pig with several other Board of Education administrators. All proceeds benefit the Imagine Nation Museum.

Karen Hintz reported that she voted at Greene-Hills and while there, she heard people talking about how they loved the school. She also attended the light project meeting at Bristol Eastern, she reminded everyone that all are welcome, and they would like community involvement in this project.
