How is Engagement different that communication?

- Hot items were the need for mental health care within our schools and where funding will come from for the increased need for SPED programs.

Pain in the APP – Karen Haase and Coady Pruett, KSB School Law

- Nebraska Rev. Statue 28-813
 - Makes sexting (images) a class IV felony for offenders under 19. A class IIIA felony for 19 and up
 - Both punishable
 - Up to 5 years in prison and/or or \$10,000 fine
 - And requires sex offender registration
 - In 4 years the FBI's Sextortion caseload has increase 472%
 - Operation Strikeback (Hong Kong, Philippines and Singapore) 2013-2014
 - Blackmail of sexual information or images
 - Started with complaint from 17 year old male

- 190-195 individuals working 3 separate organized crime groups
- 58 arrests
- More than 100 victims
- Blackmail demands ranged from \$500-\$3000

Funding: Working on a funding plan with Apple utilizing current district resources.

Evidence of progress. We will utilize staff surveys. Staff will be required to present to the whole staff on their implementation of technology.
