WAHOO AIRPORT AUTHORITY

May 14, 2026

The Wahoo Airport Authority, in accordance with agenda posted at City Hall, Post Office and First Bank of Nebraska, met in regular session at the Wahoo Public Library. Chairperson Brian Homes called the meeting to order at 4:30 PM. Homes indicated the Open Meetings Law was located on the west wall for the public's use. The following board members answered roll call: Homes: Present, Lawver: Present, Schmit: Present, Virgl: Present, Landry: Present. Also in attendance were Paul Taylor, airport maintenance, Alexa Hazelton, Kirkham-Michael.

Airport Engineer Alexa Hazelton spoke to the bid opening for the 2026 Hangar Project. She indicated that the state may have additional AIP money to allocate to this project. Once that amount is known then we will know how much we would need for additional grants or leading. FAA is expecting to have grants to sponsors by July 1. Scree Tech, the bid winner, would like to start building in the fall of 2026

She also reported that a structural engineer will be at the airport in the coming days to evaluate planned updates to the hangar doors. And plan in hand walkthrough for the taxiway improvement project was held on 5/15/26.

Conversations was had regarding the Authorities' decision to allow the Omaha Soaring Club to utilize the airport during the time that the Blair Airport is closed for construction. Jared Storm commented that during spray season there are 9-11 planes. He said he "Wants the Airport to understand the risk that they are taking."

Eric Hineman from the Glider club, answered questions that were brought up. Trevor Corey, Representative from the Blair Airport was also present. During conversations it was noted that the David City airport will also be closed this summer for construction so that will likely led to increased congestion.

Walker Ludke offered to let the soaring club utilize his pad to tie down aircraft outside of the month of July.

Paul Taylor spoke to the need to purchase jet fuel. Currently, it costs us \$6.50 for Jet A fuel.

A motion was made by John Virgl, seconded by Michael Lawver to approve the claims submitted for payment and acceptance of the prior month's back reconciliation.
