The School Board of the Sioux Falls School District 49-5 of Minnehaha County, South Dakota, was called into regular session, pursuant to due notice, on Monday, October 27, 2025, at 5:30 pm in the Instructional Planning Center, 201 East 38th Street, Sioux Falls, South Dakota, with the following members present: Elizabeth Duffy, Dawn Marie Johnson, Gail Swenson, Vice President, Marc Murren, and President, Nan Kelly. DeeAnn Konrad, Community Relations Coordinator, presented **District Demographics report** as follows (MRF #19818):

Engaging coursework, real-world learning experiences, and cutting-edge facilities continue to be the drivers behind what makes a public education in the Sioux Falls School District such an exceptional value. The District holds five priorities at the center of all decisions. Those include Academic Success, Staff and Student Well-Being, Community Engagement, Staff Excellence and the Effective Use of Resources.

While enrollment saw a slight decline over the prior year - down 172 students - the annual snapshot of schools shows an impressive 24,059 students in Kindergarten through 12th grades. Additionally, nearly 900 students, ages 3 through 5, receive preschool and early intervention services to prepare them for the rigors of Kindergarten.

Diversity among students continues its trend of moving 1-2% each year with 45.3% of students reporting a diverse background. Approximately 46.5% of students qualify for the Free/Reduced Price Meal Program. Many more are just missing the federal poverty level and are receiving assistance in paying for meals thanks to generous community donations to the Angel Fund.

Special education needs continue to rise among students with 4,397 students - or 17.6% of the overall population - qualifying to receive additional support in the classroom as outlined by Individualized Education Plans (IEPs). This is up 1.2% from the previous year. Accommodations to ensure equitable access to the learning environment are made available to 2,978 students on 504 Plans. This is nearly 200 more plans than last year.

More than 3,600 staff members support student success in a variety of positions and more than half -1,936 of them - are serving as classroom teachers. Of those teachers, 65% have earned a Master's degree or higher.

Academic measures of success are typically included in this annual report, but due to a delay in student progress reports, those measures will be added as soon as they become available.

Action 39843

Doug Morrison, Director of Data Services, presented the **K12 Fall Enrollment report**, as follows (MRF#19819):

The final enrollment for the 2025-2026 school year, covering Junior Kindergarten through 12th grade, is 24,059 students, 172 fewer than last year and 235 below the initial Day 4 count. Nearly 600 enrollment changes were processed between the initial and final counts, with about 400 students leaving and 200 enrolling. These numbers reflect active enrollments as of September 26, 2025, the last Friday in September.

Kindergarten enrollment is 1,723, down 56 from last year, while Junior Kindergarten increased to 83 students. Grades 1 through 5 dropped by 125 students, as the outgoing

fifth-grade class was larger than the incoming kindergarten cohort. Middle school enrollment increased by 62 students, and high school enrollment declined by 93. Open enrollment grew slightly to 1,033 students.

The opening of Marcella LeBeau Elementary School with 281 students affected enrollment at nearby schools, including Hawthorne, Renberg, and Hayward. The Elementary Immersion Center closed, with students now attending other schools in the district.

Fall funding FTE is 24,136, which is 194 fewer than last year. Overall, enrollment reflects modest shifts across grade levels due to school openings and closures, while middle school and open enrollment continue to grow steadily.

Andrew Engdahl, Director of Information Technology Services **Technology Update report**, as follows (MRF#19820):

The Information & Technology Services (ITS) department continues to strengthen the Sioux Falls School District's technology infrastructure, security, and operational efficiency. The department has made significant progress in modernizing systems and improving service performance. Major accomplishments include implementing multifactor authentication (**MFA**), converting to Microsoft Teams Voice (VoIP), and completing a districtwide network redesign, all designed to enhance reliability and data protection.

These improvements have produced measurable results. The department reduced ticket response times by 18.9% and resolution times by 27.8%, showing improved efficiency while maintaining nearly the same number of support requests as in previous years.

Looking ahead, ITS will continue aligning technology with instructional needs, strengthening cybersecurity, and developing districtwide standards to increase automation and operational consistency, all part of the department's ongoing commitment to a secure and future-ready digital learning environment.



RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTION, DELIVERY AND PERFORMANCE OF (i) A SUPPLEMENT TO A CERTAIN SUBLEASE AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE SCHOOL DISTRICT, AS TENANT, AND THE SOUTH DAKOTA BOARD OF TECHNICAL EDUCATION, AS LESSOR, AND (ii) CERTAIN RELATED MATTERS IN CONNECTION THEREWITH

RECITALS

WHEREAS, SIOUX FALLS SCHOOL DISTRICT NO. 49-5 (the “School District”) is authorized pursuant to law to operate Southeast Technical College, a post secondary vocational technical education college under the general supervision of the South Dakota Board of Technical Education (the “Board”); and

WHEREAS, the South Dakota Health and Educational Facilities Authority (the “Authority”) is authorized pursuant to Chapter 1-16A, South Dakota Codified Laws, to issue bonds to finance the acquisition, improvement, repairing and equipping of post-secondary vocational technical education facilities for lease to and purchase by the Board and/or for use by the School District and other school districts or LEAs authorized to operate post-secondary vocational technical education programs (all such School Districts and LEAs being referred to herein as “Qualified Participating Institutions”); and

WHEREAS, Title 13, SDCL, provides that to secure lease purchase rentals payable by participating institutions and the Board to the Authority, the Board may pledge certain amounts of tuition and other student fees required to be paid to the Escrow Holder for deposit into the Tuition Subaccount; and

WHEREAS, the Authority has established a program (the “Program”) whereby the Board may lease purchase post-secondary vocational technical education facilities from the Authority and sublease such facilities to the Participating Institutions; and

WHEREAS, the Authority and the statutory predecessor to the Board have heretofore entered into a Lease Purchase Agreement dated as of August 1, 1988 as supplemented by various Supplements to Lease Purchase Agreement through and including that certain a Twenty-Second Supplement to Lease Purchase Agreement dated as of May 1, 2022 (collectively, all of the foregoing are referred to as the “Lease”) pursuant to which the Board is leasing with an option to purchase certain facilities the acquisition of which was financed or refinanced with the proceeds derived from the issuance and sale by the Authority of its Vocational Education Program Revenue Bonds of various series (collectively, the “Bonds”) issued pursuant to an Indenture of Trust dated as of August 1, 1988 (the “Original Indenture”) between the Authority and The First National Bank in Sioux Falls, as Trustee (the “Original Trustee”) as most recently amended and supplemented by that certain Twentieth Supplemental Indenture of Trust dated as of May 1, 2022 (collectively, all of the foregoing are referred to as the “Indenture”) between the

Authority and U.S. Bank Trust Company, National Association, as successor Trustee (the “Trustee”); and

WHEREAS, in order to provide a credit against Lease Rentals owed by the Board under the Lease, the Participating Institutions have heretofore entered into a certain Amended and Restated Facility Fee Tuition Collection and Deposit Agreement (the “Collection Agreement”) with the Board, the South Dakota Treasurer (the “Treasurer”) and The First National Bank in Sioux Falls, as Escrow Holder (the “Original Escrow Holder” and, together with the successor Escrow Holder, U.S. Bank Trust Company, National Association, the “Escrow Holder”), providing for the collection of Facility Fees on a current basis and the deposit of such Facility Fees to the Tuition Subaccount (an account of the Treasurer’s maintained with the Escrow Holder); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to a Sublease dated as of August 1, 1988 between the Board and the School District (as heretofore supplemented and amended, the “Original Sublease”), the School District is currently leasing certain improvements described therein from the Board; and

WHEREAS, the Authority proposes to issue one or more new series of refunding bonds (the “Refunding Bonds”) in a principal amount not to exceed \$34,000,000 to refund the outstanding principal amount of the following Bonds of the Authority: (a) the Vocational Education Program Refunding Bonds, Series 2015A (the “Series 2015A Bonds”), (b) the Vocational Education Program Bonds, Series 2015B (the “Series 2015B Bonds”) and (c) the Vocational Education Program Revenue Bonds, Series 2015C (the “Series 2015C Bonds” and together with the Series 2015A Bonds and Series 2015B Bonds, the “Refunded Bonds”); and

WHEREAS, the Series 2015C Bonds were issued in part to finance the costs of a Transportation Technology Center and other campus improvements for use by the School District (the “Refunded Project”) pursuant to the Original Sublease; and

WHEREAS, the issuance of the Refunding Bonds will refinance such Refunded Project and have the result of shortening the term of the Sublease and reducing the aggregate Sublease rentals; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary for the School District to enter into a Supplement to the Original Sublease to adjust the rentals payable thereunder to reflect debt service on the Refunding Bonds (“Supplemental Sublease”); and

WHEREAS, the Refunding Bonds are to be issued pursuant to a new Supplemental Indenture of Trust between the Authority and the Trustee (the “Supplemental Indenture”); and

WHEREAS, the Authority, Board and various other parties will enter into (1) a new Supplemental Lease Purchase Agreement between the Authority and the Board (the “Lease Supplement”), (2) a Bond Purchase Agreement with Baird Securities (the “Original Purchaser”) (the “Bond Purchase Agreement”) and (3) a Continuing Disclosure Agreement (the “Continuing Disclosure Agreement”) in forms substantially similar to those previously used in connection

with the Program, as modified, revised or supplemented to incorporate the terms hereof or otherwise in the manner herein provided or contemplated; and

WHEREAS, the School District has determined it is in the best interest to enter into a supplement the Original Sublease by entering into the Supplemental Sublease (the Original Sublease as amended and supplemented by the Supplemental Sublease and hereafter further amended or supplemented being referred to herein as the "Sublease");

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the School Board of the School District as follows:

THE PROGRAM

1.1 This School District Board finds that it is desirable and expedient to authorize the amendment to the Original Sublease in order to permit the Authority and the Board to issue the Refunding Bonds pursuant to the Supplemental Indenture. By adoption of this Resolution and the execution of the Supplemental Sublease, this School District Board ratifies and confirms the authorization of the imposition, collection and allocation of the Facility Fees for the benefit of the Board, the Authority and the holders from time to time of all Outstanding Bonds as provided in the Amended and Restated Collection Agreement.

1.2 This School District Board hereby authorizes the execution and delivery of the Supplemental Sublease. In addition, this School District Board hereby authorizes, ratifies and confirms that fee title to the land and building in which the Refunded Project is located shall be in the name of the Authority, subject to the rights of parties to the Lease and the Sublease.

1.3 The execution and delivery by the President and the Business Manager, or in their absence any other officer of the School District (collectively, the "Authorized Officers"), of the Supplemental Sublease, any additional or supplemental documents required in connection with any Additional Bonds, the Continuing Disclosure Agreement (if required by the parties) and other instruments described herein (collectively, the "Program Documents"), shall be conclusive evidence of such authorization without any further requirement of approval or authorization from this School Board. The Supplemental Sublease and other Program Documents shall be executed in the name and on behalf of the School District by the Authorized Officers, in substantially the form of previous supplemental subleases for the Program, but with all such changes therein, not inconsistent with law, as may be approved by the officers executing the same, which approval shall be conclusively evidenced by the execution thereof.

1.4 The Authorized Officers, or any one of them, shall be hereby authorized and directed to prepare and furnish to the Trustee, certified copies of all proceedings and records of the School District relating to the power and authority of the School District to execute and deliver the Supplemental Sublease, and certificates as to matters within their knowledge or as shown by the books and records under their custody and control, including a general and non-litigation certificate, any tax certificate and agreement relating to the Refunding Bonds and matters governed by Section 148 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended. Such

certified copies and certificates shall be deemed representations, covenants and agreements of the School District as to the facts, covenants and agreements contained therein.

Sioux Falls School District Academic Report EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Purpose of Report: To inform the School Board about K-12 student assessment data from various sources, including the State Report Card, the Northwest Evaluation Association's (NWEA) Measures of Academic Progress (MAP), National Career Readiness Certifications (NCRC), American College Testing (ACT), and Scholastic Aptitude Test (SAT).

The Sioux Falls School District (SFSD) is dedicated to maximizing student success and uses a range of assessments to measure student achievement. In addition to assessment data, the SFSD monitors attendance, graduation rates, and growth over time.

The data collected through these various assessments reflect positive results. On-time graduation rates outpaced the state and increased by three percentage points to 89%, the highest in the past nine years.

Eight hundred eighteen students from the SFSD (50% of the 2025 graduating class) took the ACT Exam. The SFSD average composite score was 22.5, up from 22.0, and the SFSD continues to outpace both the state and national averages.

The combined College Career and Readiness indicator remained steady at 52%. Achievement scores collected through the South Dakota Assessment were steady, with English Language Arts remaining flat, math increasing by 1%, and science decreasing by 1%. However, student growth in both ELA and math increased by 3% over the prior year and continued its upward trend.

Students learning English as a second language are making steady progress, with 31% either exiting the EL program or on track to exit.

Attendance, which has been a focus of the SFSD, increased by one-half percentage point.

Sioux Falls School District Academic Report

Purpose of Report: To provide the School Board with information regarding the K-12 student assessment information from multiple measures, including the State Report Card, the Northwest Evaluation Association’s (NWEA) Measurement of Academic Progress (MAP), National Career Readiness Certifications (NCRC), American College Testing (ACT), and Scholastic Aptitude Test (SAT).

Priority Area: Academic Success

Explanation: The Sioux Falls School District (SFSD) uses a balanced assessment system to monitor student learning in alignment with the SFSD’s written curriculum. This system collects data from various assessments, all of which are designed with the understanding that the primary goal of education is to maximize student achievement. Assessment involves collecting evidence of student learning to guide informed educational decisions.

The South Dakota Department of Education released the 2024-2025 Report Card on October 24, 2025. The State Report Card provides data for school leaders, policymakers, parents, and the general public.

Graduation Rates

The SFSD achieved an on-time graduation rate of 89%. This rate was the highest in the past nine years, surpassing the state’s rate by three percentage points. In addition, the SFSD continues to support students beyond the traditional four years through the “Completer Rate”, which measures the percentage of students who persist toward earning a diploma or GED. For the 2024-2025 school year, the “Completer Rate” increased one full percentage point to total 90%.

American College Testing (ACT)

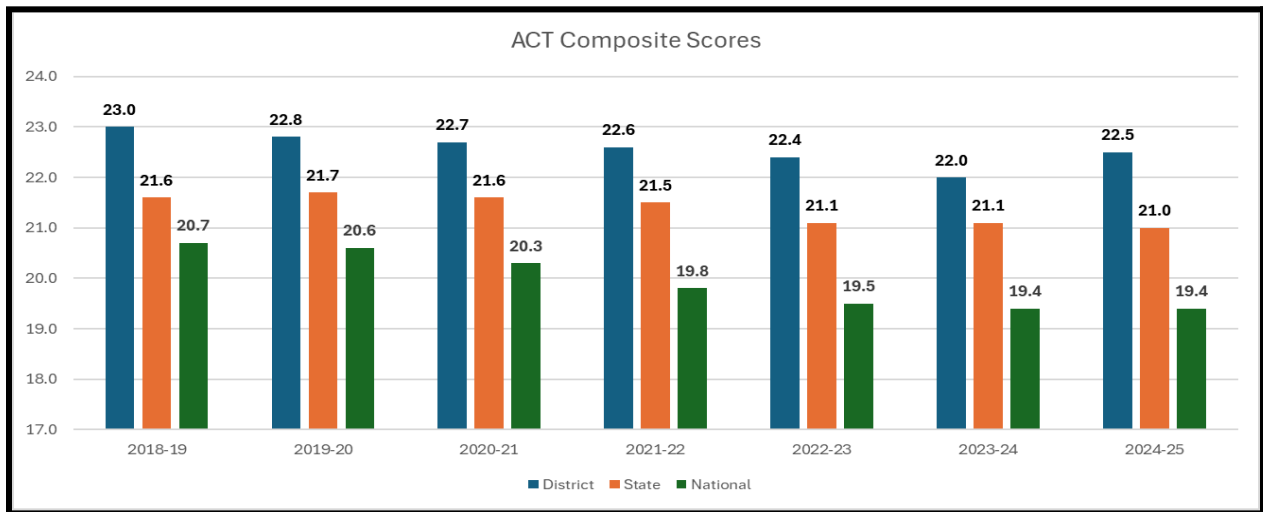
The ACT is a curriculum-based college readiness assessment measuring academic achievement in English, math, reading, and science, with an optional writing component. To ensure it accurately reflects both the skills taught by high school teachers and the skills needed for success in entry-level college courses, the ACT conducts a "National Curriculum Study" every few years. Students can use online interpretive guides to link their scores to specific readiness standards. Each student receives a score for each subject area and a composite score that averages the subtest scores, excluding the optional writing assessment. Sub-scores can be compared to benchmarks that predict a 50% chance

of earning a B or higher in related entry-level college courses or a 75% chance of earning a C or higher in these courses. These benchmarks are listed below:

The data in this report reflect the achievement of the SFSD's graduating class of 2024, as reported by students when they registered for the exam. While most students take the exam for the first time during their junior year, the testing date may vary. Each student's score represents their highest performance, as students may take the exam multiple times on nationally-designated test dates.

Of the SFSD's 2025 graduating class, 818 students (50% of graduates) took the ACT exam, compared to an estimated 58% of graduates statewide. The SFSD's average composite score was 22.5, an increase from 22.0, and remains higher than both the state and national averages.



Scholastic Aptitude Test (SAT)

Additionally, some students elect to take the SAT assessment. Sixty-eight students from the graduating class of 2025 took the SAT assessment. Out of those, 97% met the Evidence-Based Reading and Writing (ERW) benchmark, 82% met the math benchmark, and 82% met both.

College and Career Readiness

The College and Career Readiness indicators are based on the cohort of students who graduated in May 2023, with data reported on a one-year delay. College and Career Readiness combines College Coursework Readiness and Assessment Readiness. Assessment Readiness reflects academic performance on the South Dakota ELA and Math Assessments, the ACT, and the NCRC. Starting with the 2021-2022 Report Card, College Coursework Readiness measures the number of students who earned more than one high school graduation advanced endorsement. Previously, this metric tracked progress toward post-high school credentials through dual credit, CTE concentrator courses (two courses in the same career cluster), or AP coursework. The District receives 0.5 credit for each student meeting the Assessment Readiness criteria and 0.5 credit for achieving a post-high school credential.

In 2024-25, the SFSD's College Coursework Readiness decreased by 1% due to fewer students earning one of the Advanced Graduation Endorsements. The Assessment Readiness indicator also decreased by 1%, primarily due to fewer students achieving Silver or higher status on the NCRC exam. The combined College and Career Readiness remained steady at 52%,

English Language Acquisition

Students pursuing second language acquisition take the ACCESS assessment to measure their English language proficiency. Based on their initial scores, educators place students on a growth curve and expect them to achieve proficiency within five years. The SFSD evaluates its performance against these expected growth curves.

During the 2024-2025 school year, 31% of students who took the ACCESS assessment either exited the program or were determined to be on track, maintaining the same percentage as the previous year.

Advanced Placement and Dual Credit Report EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Purpose of Report: To provide the Sioux Falls School Board with comprehensive information on the District's 2024-25 Advanced Placement Program and Dual Credit participation.

The Sioux Falls School District (SFSD) continues to demonstrate strong academic achievement through its Advanced Placement (AP) and Dual Credit programs, which provide rigorous, college-level learning opportunities for high school students.

In the 2024-25 school year, 1,989 students took 3,577 AP exams, more than half (55%) of all exams taken statewide. The SFSD students achieved an impressive 80% pass rate of three or higher, surpassing both the state (74%) and global (69%) averages. The District offered more than 30 AP courses, allowing students to explore a wide range of academic subjects at an advanced level. To help make those courses accessible, the District subsidized more than 1,000 AP exams for students in financial need. Additionally, participation among students from a variety of backgrounds continues to grow. The College Board recognized 690 SFSD students with AP Scholar distinctions, reflecting their consistent high performance.

Dual Credit participation also increased, with 585 students—10% of all participants statewide—earning college credit through courses approved by the South Dakota Board of Regents in partnership with Southeast Technical College and other postsecondary institutions. Several dual credit courses are now taught by SFSD staff, further expanding access while maintaining high instructional quality.

Together, these programs provide students with meaningful opportunities to engage in challenging coursework and achieve academic excellence.

Purpose of Report: This report provides the Board of the Sioux Falls School District with comprehensive information on the district's 2024-25 Advanced Placement Program and Dual Credit participation.

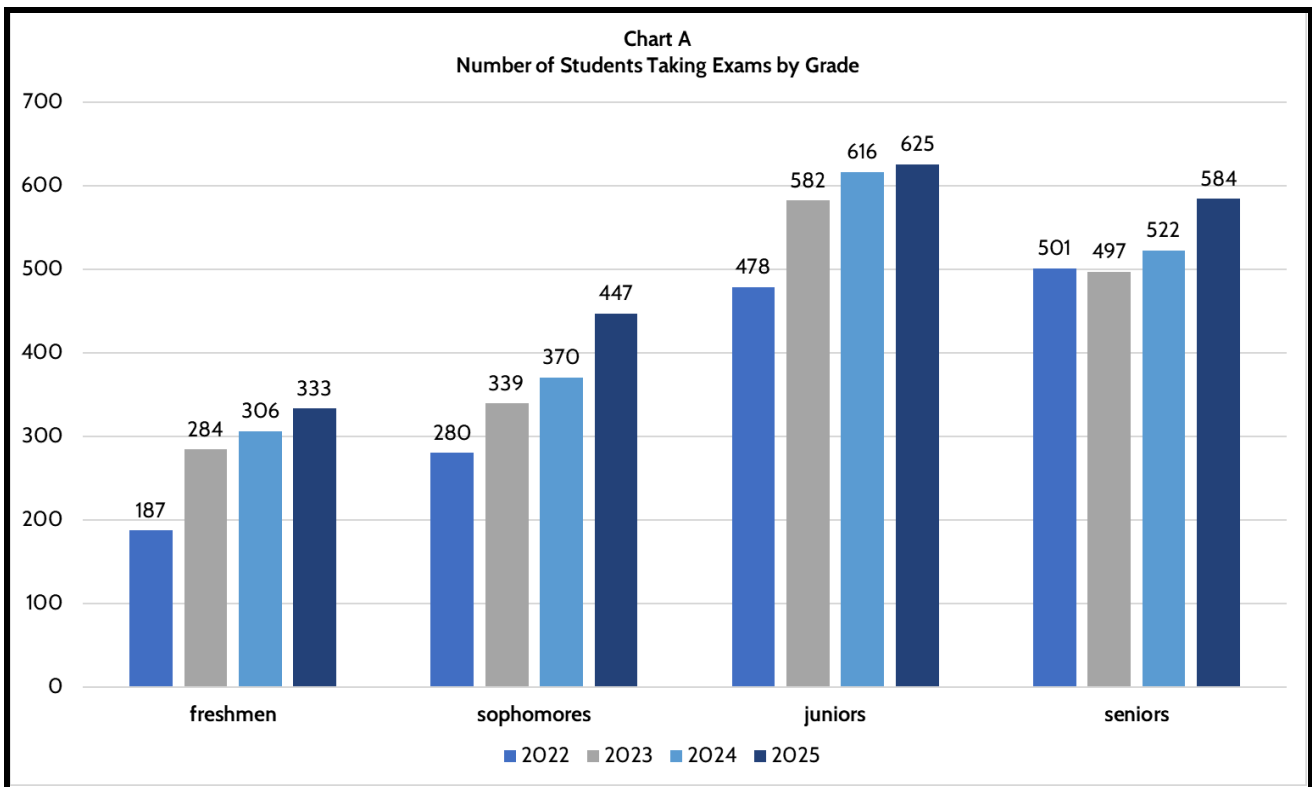
Priority Area: Student Outcomes

Explanation (Advanced Placement): The Advanced Placement (AP) program offers high school students the opportunity to engage in college-level coursework that is both academically challenging and rich in content. As a cornerstone of the district's high school curriculum, AP courses are approved and aligned with the rigorous standards set by the College Board, a non-profit organization dedicated to preparing students for success in college and beyond.

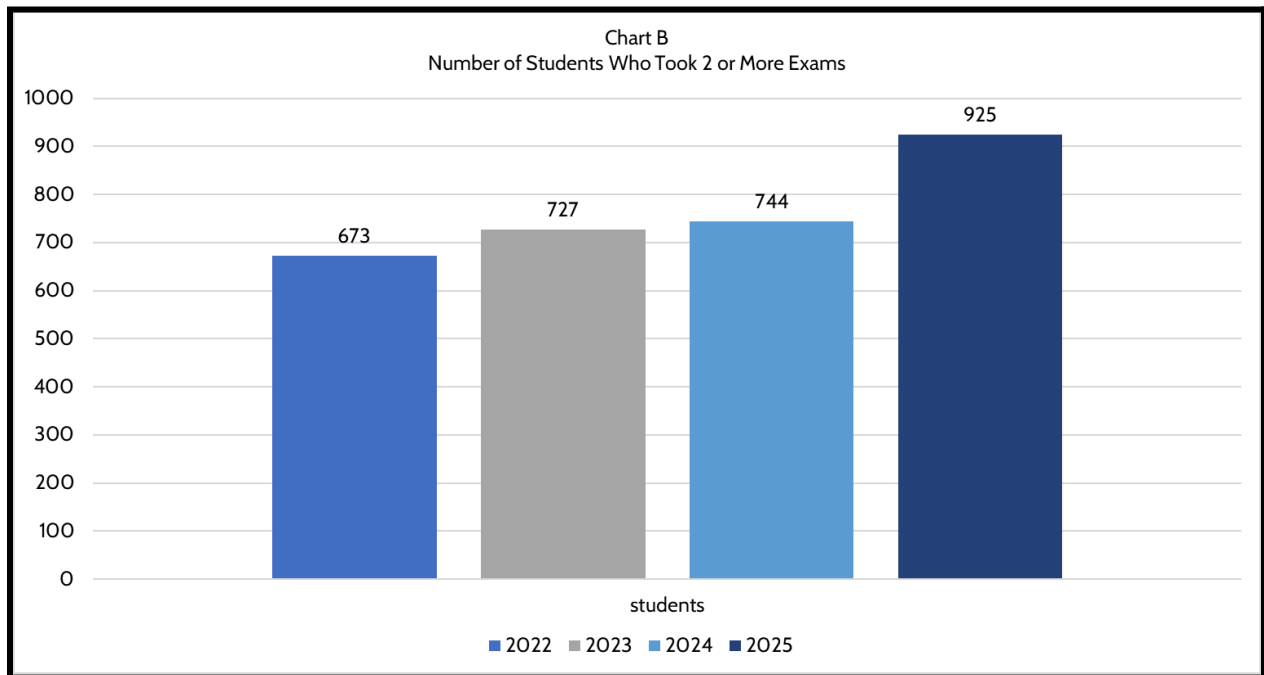
At the end of each AP course, students may take the AP exam, which is also designed and administered by the College Board. Exam scores are reported on a scale from 1 to 5, with a score of 3 or higher considered a passing mark. Colleges and universities determine whether the AP class will transfer as college credit or exempt the student from taking other college courses based on the student's AP exam scores.

Enrollment: During the 2024-25 school year, students had access to various subjects of AP classes, including English, mathematics, social studies, science, fine arts, and world languages. The district offered over 30 distinct AP course options in 2024-25, allowing students to explore a wide range of academic subjects. Specific courses included composition, literature, computer, history, geography, chemistry, calculus, statistics, biology, physics, environmental science, Spanish language, music theory, macroeconomics, government, psychology, research, and studio art. In the 2024-25 school year, 1,989 students took 3,577 AP exams. Students from the Sioux Falls School District accounted for 55% of all AP exams taken in South Dakota.

Chart A below shows the number of exams students took in grades 9-12. Students are encouraged to take at least one AP course during their high school career, with the flexibility to choose from a broad range of subjects that align with their academic interests and post-secondary goals.



All students are encouraged to enroll in at least one AP course during their high school years. A significant number of students choose to take multiple AP exams each year. Chart B below illustrates the number of students who have taken two or more AP exams over the past four years.

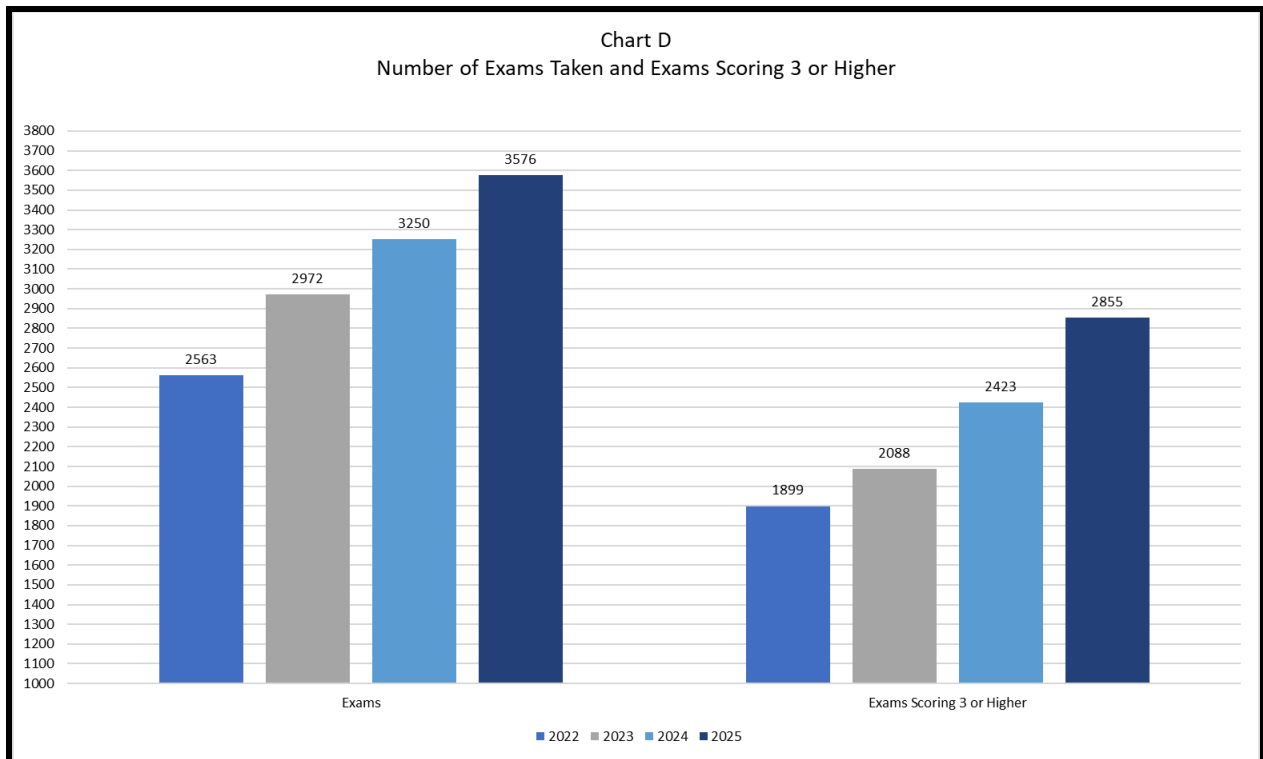

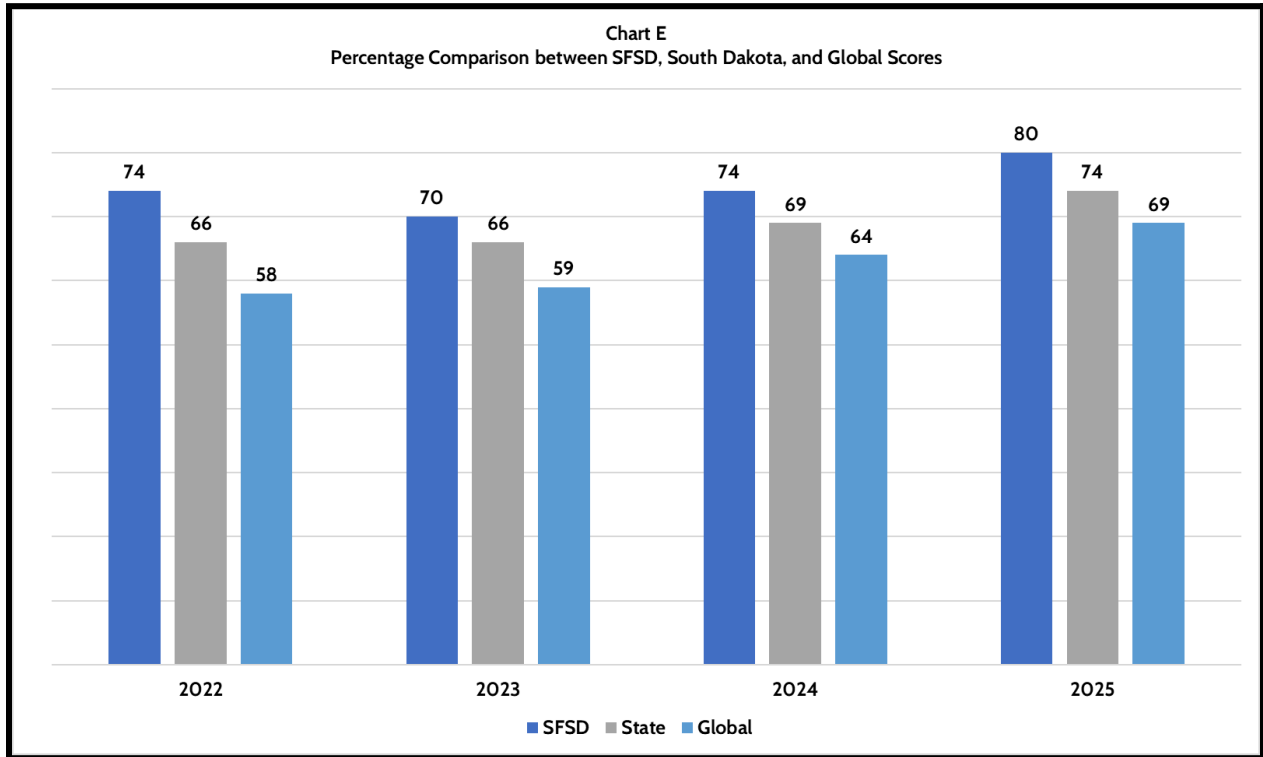

Chart D below shows the number of exams taken over the past four years and the number of that scored three or higher. In the 2024-25 school year, 3,577 exams were administered, with 2,855 achieving a passing score of 3 or above.



In 2024-25, an impressive 80 percent of AP students scored three or higher, a testament to the success of our AP Program. Sioux Falls School District students consistently outperform both state and national averages, with a pass rate of 74 percent for South Dakota and a global pass rate of 69 percent. Chart E below compares AP pass rates over the past four years for the Sioux Falls School District, the state of South Dakota, and global averages, further highlighting our program's success.



The College Board recognizes students with AP Scholar Awards in various categories. In the 2024-25 school year, 690 students in the Sioux Falls School District were honored with AP Scholar Awards. Table 1 displays the number of students who received these awards.

Explanation (Dual Credit): The Sioux Falls School District offers high school students the opportunity to earn college credit by enrolling in dual credit courses, bridging the gap between secondary and higher education. To enroll in these courses, students must meet the eligibility criteria set by the South Dakota Board of Regents or a participating post-secondary institution.

The Sioux Falls School District has taken steps to enhance the accessibility and quality of dual credit options. Several college-level courses are now taught in person by Sioux Falls School District employees. This approach not only ensures a high standard of education but also allows students to interact directly with their instructors.

Additionally, many Career and Technical Education Academy courses provide dual credit opportunities. Students involved in programs such as the Avera Academy or Sanford’s Classrooms to Careers earn dual credit through Southeast Technical College.

Enrollment: Participation in dual credit remains robust, with the growth and evolution of these programs over the past four years underscoring the district's commitment to providing students with diverse and convenient educational opportunities. Dual credit participation among Sioux Falls School District students continues to grow, with 585 students enrolled this year—representing 10% of all dual credit students statewide, up from 8% last year.

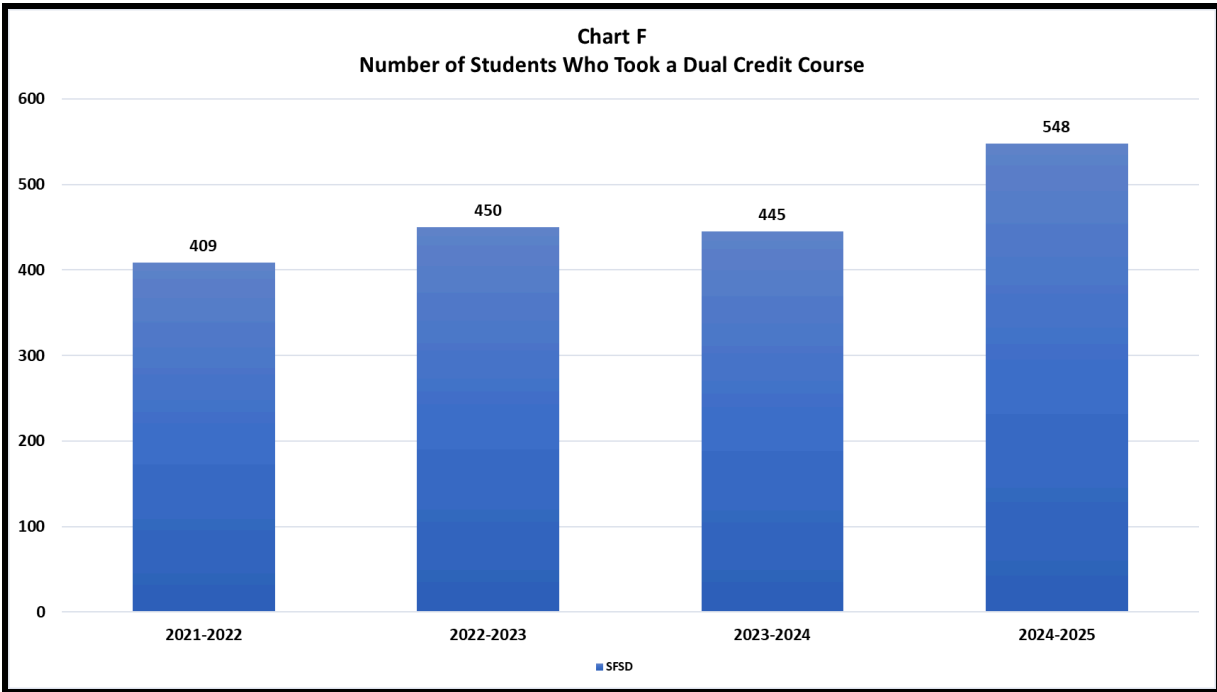
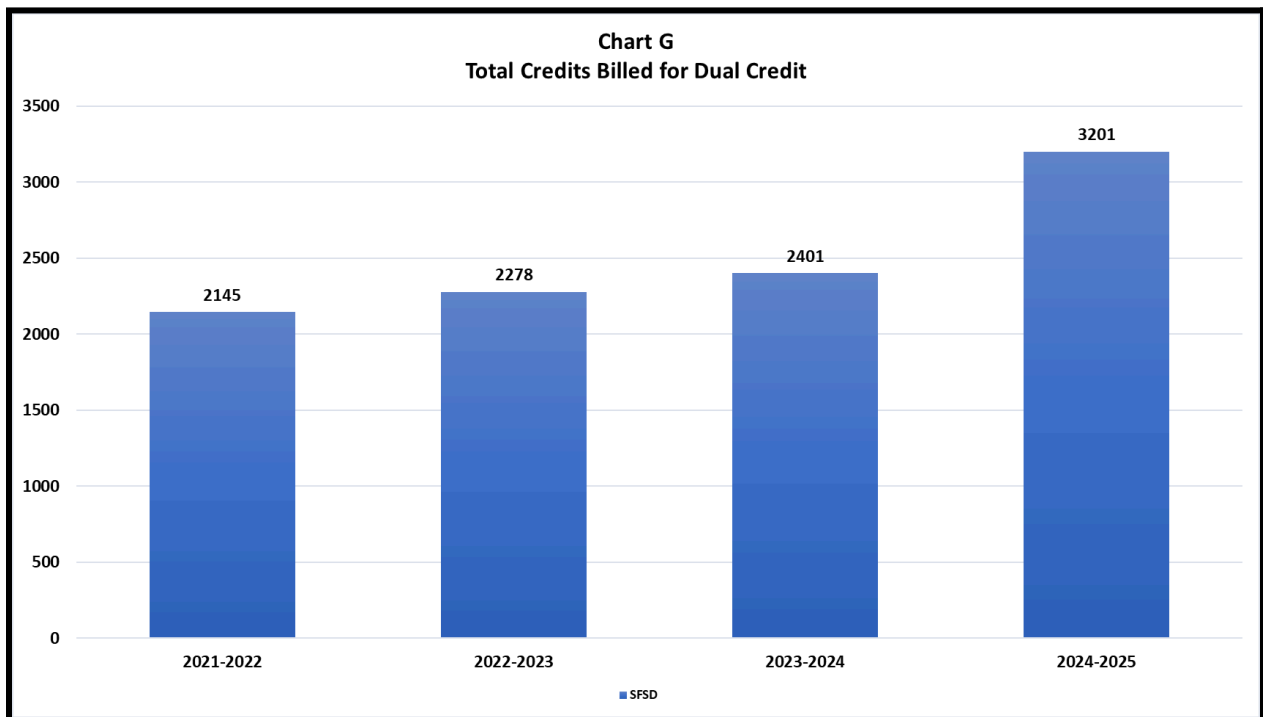


Chart G below shows the number of dual credits billed over the last four years. Both the number of students who participated and the number of credits earned increased.



Costs: The FY25 Advanced Placement incentive budget totaled \$135,720. This funding supports professional development expenses for AP teachers, including attendance at AP conferences and institutes, the purchase of classroom materials to enhance course content, facility rentals during testing, and compensation for test proctors.

In 2025, students were assessed a fee of \$99 for each AP exam and \$129 for the AP Seminar and AP Research exams. The Sioux Falls School District is committed to ensuring that financial barriers do not limit student participation. Students demonstrating financial need are eligible to take AP exams at no cost under the guidelines established by the College Board and the South Dakota Department of Education. Additionally, the district subsidizes exam fees for students who do not meet the formal criteria for fee reduction but still require financial assistance.

In FY25, 496 exams for 278 students qualified for fee reductions through the College Board, while the district funded an additional 528 exams for 305 students.

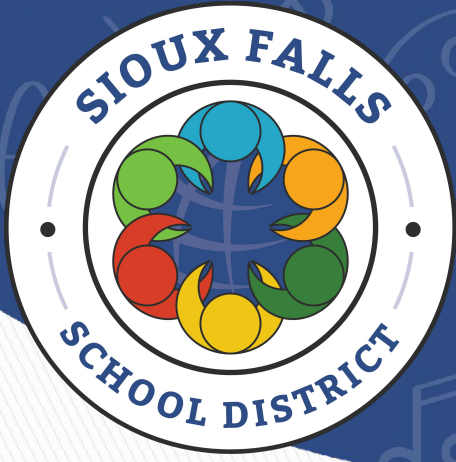
Beyond exam fee support, the district continues to invest in the growth and quality of AP programming by providing resources for implementing new courses, acquiring specialized laboratory equipment, and supporting ongoing professional development for staff.

Committee Participation: The Sioux Falls School District AP Committee meets regularly and includes administrators, AP coordinators, AP teachers, and parents. The committee's primary objective is to promote the AP program and support strong student performance on AP exams.

Summary: The Advanced Placement and Dual Credit Programs allow students to complete rigorous college-preparatory coursework. During the 2024-25 school year, 1,989 students took AP exams in various subjects. Of the 3,576 AP exams administered, 2,855 (80%) scored a three or higher, surpassing both state and global averages. In recognition of their exceptional achievements, the College Board honored 690 Sioux Falls School District AP Scholar Award winners in 2025.

The Sioux Falls School District AP Committee guides the program and discusses strategies to increase student participation in AP courses. The Sioux Falls School District continues collaborating with post-secondary partners to expand dual credit opportunities for students.

Number of Students Taking Exams by Grade

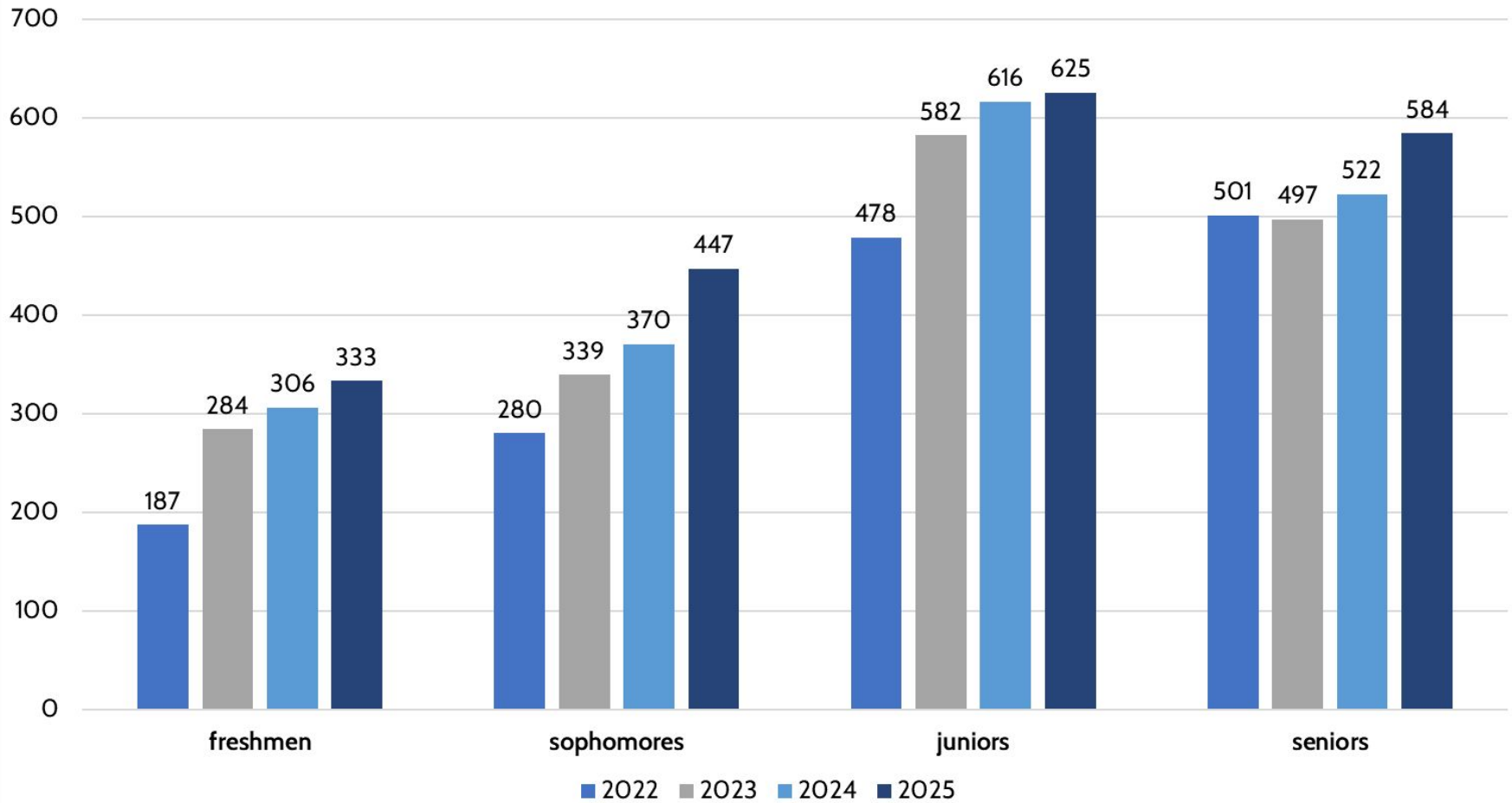

Number of Students Who Took 2 or More Exams

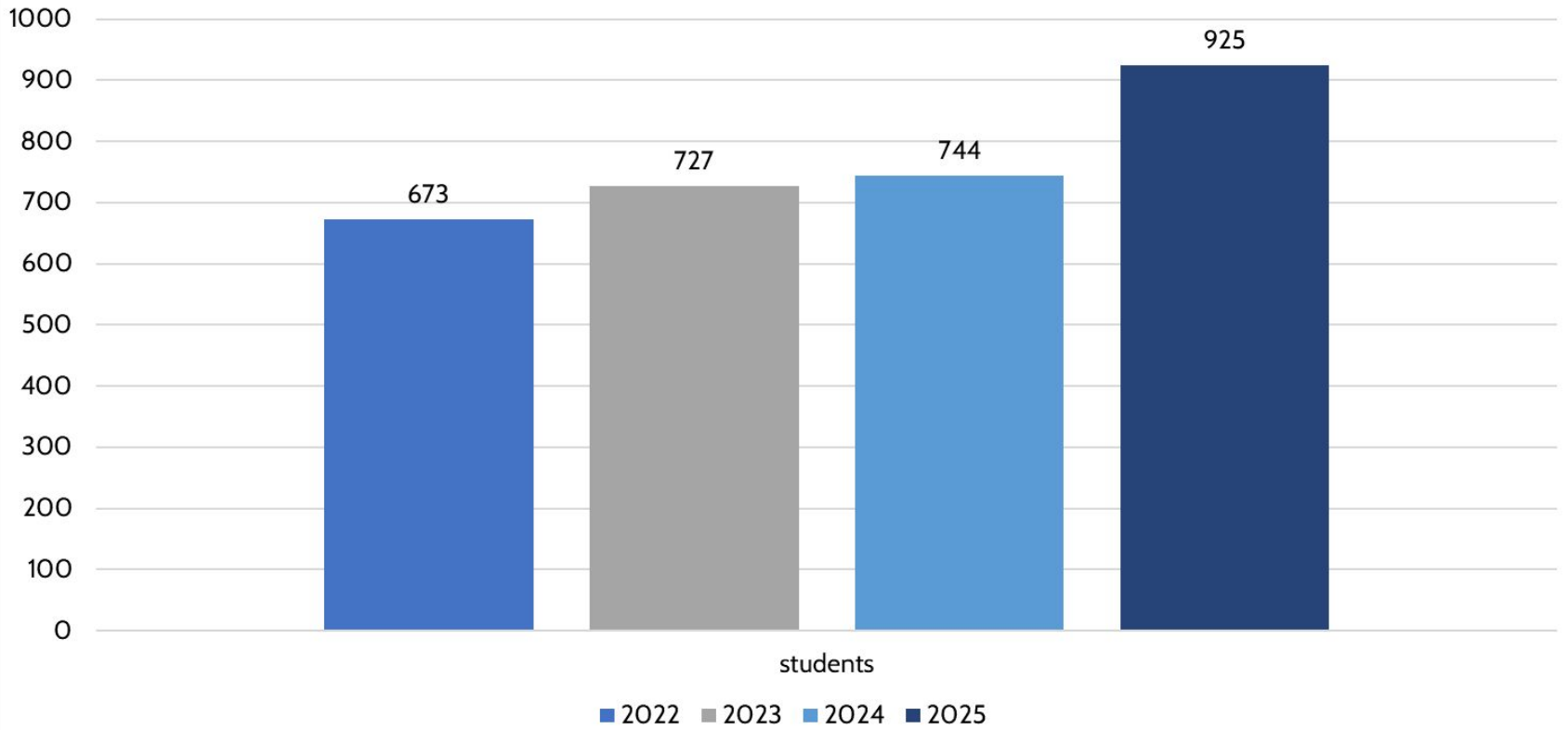


Chart C: Number of AP Students by Race/Ethnicity

Number of Exams Taken and Exams Scoring 3 or Higher

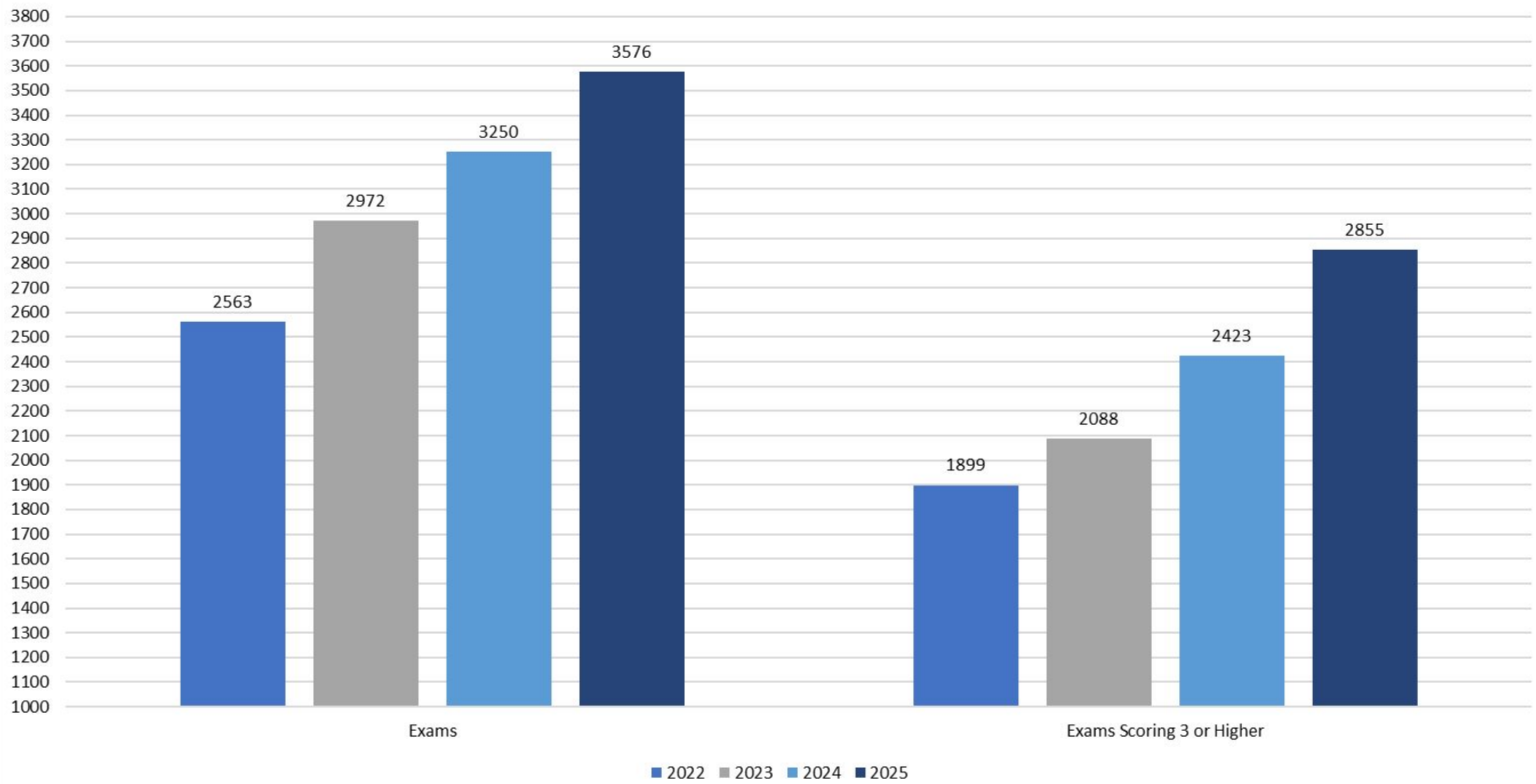
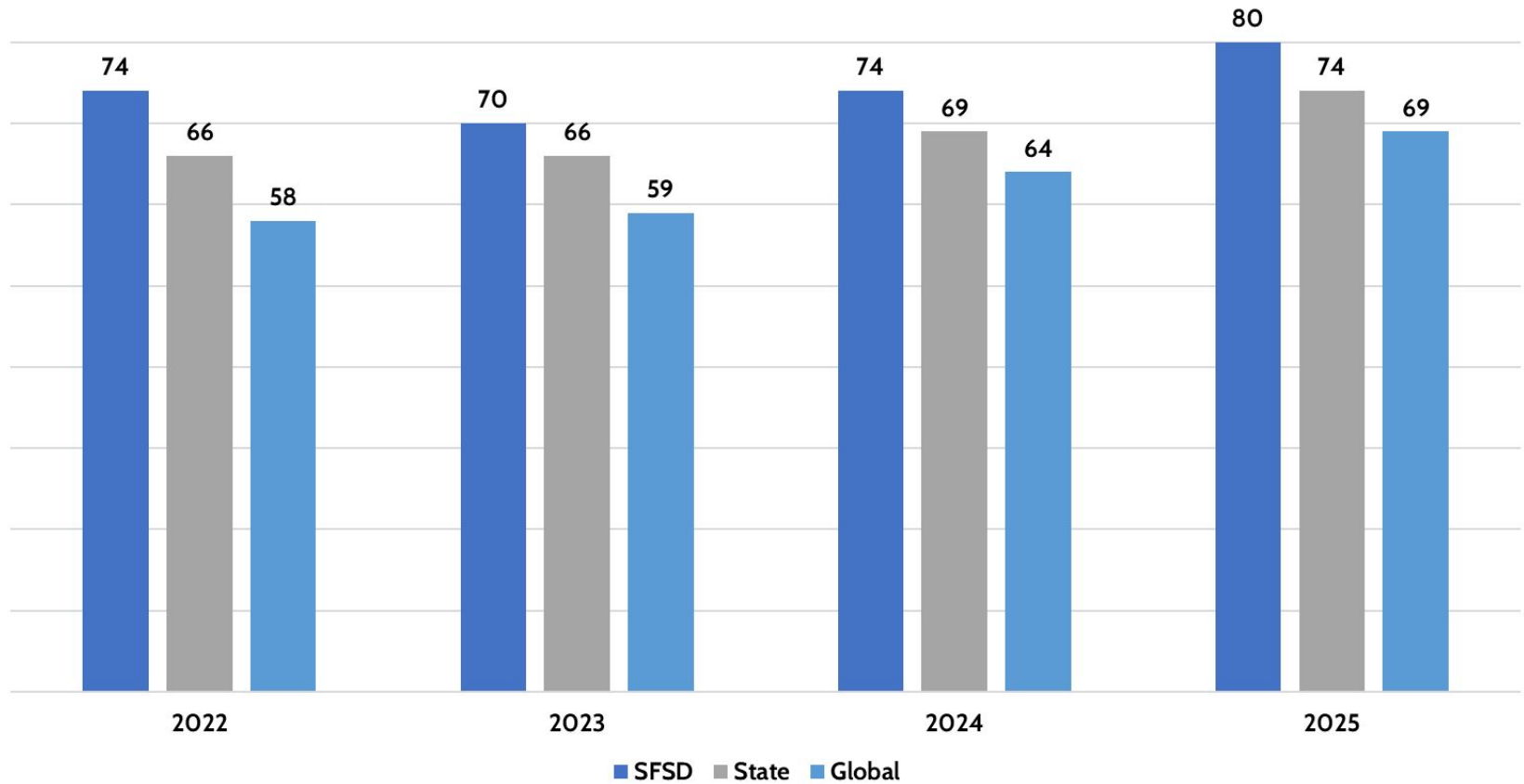

2026 Legislative Priorities Report EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Purpose of Report: To provide an update on the Sioux Falls School District's 2026 legislative priorities and SD Legislative and Gubernatorial property tax initiatives.

The Sioux Falls School District remains committed to advocating for fair, stable, and forward-looking education funding as the 2026 legislative session approaches. Working alongside other large districts in South Dakota, the District has identified four top priorities: securing an annual increase in the state aid formula of at least 3% or the Consumer Price Index (whichever is greater), maintaining a capital outlay funding formula that reflects growth and inflation, promoting consistent property assessment practices that ensure equitable revenue for K–12 schools, and preserving local control in decision-making.

At the state level, the Comprehensive Property Tax Task Force has proposed a major tax relief package aimed at delivering roughly 25% property tax reductions for homeowners statewide. While the plan includes rebates and state spending cuts, several of its nineteen recommendations could negatively impact public schools by restricting financial flexibility, limiting revenue growth, and requiring additional voter approval for district funding measures. In addition, Governor Rhoden has announced a separate property tax relief proposal through an optional half-cent county sales tax.

The District will continue to monitor these developments closely and work with legislators to ensure that any property tax reforms balance relief for taxpayers with the need to sustain strong, high-quality public education in Sioux Falls.

Administrative Recommendation to the School Board: Acknowledge the update on the Sioux Falls School District's 2026 legislative priorities and the South Dakota legislative and gubernatorial property tax initiatives.

2026 Legislative Priorities Report

Purpose of Report: To provide an update on the Sioux Falls School District's 2026 legislative priorities and SD Legislative and Gubernatorial property tax initiatives.

Priority Areas: Academic Success, Well-Being, Community Engagement, Staff Excellence, Effective Use of Resources

Explanation: Each year, the Sioux Falls School District (SFSD) collaborates with other large school districts across South Dakota to identify and advocate for key legislative priorities that directly impact public education. The 2026 South Dakota Legislative Session will feature several important topics affecting school funding, including state aid allocations, capital outlay limitations, and property tax reform proposals. This report outlines the District's legislative priorities, summarizes recent recommendations from the Comprehensive Property Tax Task Force, and highlights proposed initiatives announced by Governor Larry Rhoden.

SFSD Legislative Priorities

- **Support Sustainable Funding:** Advocate for the state aid formula to increase annually by a minimum of 3% or the Consumer Price Index (CPI), whichever is greater.
- **Protect Capital Outlay Resources:** Support the existing capital outlay funding formula, ensuring it continues to address new growth and inflationary costs associated with capital expenses.
- **Promote Fair and Consistent Property Assessment:** Support strengthening and providing consistency to the current system of assessing real property, such that a sound revenue stream is provided to the general fund of K-12 education while retaining equity between the various classifications of property.
- **Preserve Local Control:** Oppose legislation that removes local control from school districts.

State Property Tax Reduction Strategies

After eight meetings held across four cities, the Comprehensive Property Tax Task Force issued a press release (Attachment 2) and detailed recommendations (Attachment 3) outlining a proposed property tax relief program that would deliver approximately 25% in property tax relief, valued at \$348 million, to homeowners. While these recommendations have not yet been drafted into bill form, the proposed framework includes the following components:

- Immediate relief via a \$120 million tax rebate delivered directly to homeowners utilizing collected but unspent tax dollars

- A 5% cut in state government spending, yielding \$123 million in savings directed toward property tax reduction
- Due to the sunset of the current sales tax rate, an additional \$105 million in state sales tax revenue is anticipated. The Task Force recommends preserving the tax relief by directing 100% of these dollars to reduce homeowner property taxes.
- Allocating 25% of future state revenue growth to replace property tax revenue, ensuring long-term sustainability and alignment with state economic growth

Of the nineteen recommendations issued by the Task Force, **six would negatively impact K-12 public schools** by restricting funding flexibility or imposing new requirements on local districts:

- **Recommendation D, Representative Jamison:** Subjects school districts to the same property tax limitations as all other taxing districts, where the annual increase in property tax revenues may not exceed the limit set forth in § 10-12-35, unless an opt-out is approved.
- **Recommendation I, Representative Odenbach:** Repeals authority for school districts to transfer funds from capital outlay to general funds and limits annual capital outlay increases to the lesser of 3% or inflation, removing allowances for growth from annexations and development.
- **Recommendation M, Senator Sue Peterson:** Subject to certain conditions, requires that all school district excess tax levies (opt-outs) must be approved by an election, and applies this requirement to school general fund opt-outs and capital outlay opt-outs.
- **Recommendation N, Senator Sue Peterson:** Decreases the required petition to refer a school district excess tax levy (opt-out) to a vote from 5% of the registered voters in the district to 5% of all voters who voted in the most recent special election of the district and increases the days provided to gather signatures from 20 to 40.
- **Recommendation O, Senator Sue Peterson:** Requires public elections for approval of all capital outlay certificates.
- **Recommendation P, Senator Sue Peterson:** Increases the voter approval requirement for excess levy (opt-out) elections from a simple majority to 60%.

In addition to the Task Force's proposal, Governor Rhoden has announced a separate plan to provide property tax relief through an optional half-cent county sales tax (Attachment 4). If every county were to implement the tax, which is unlikely, the estimated total property tax reduction would exceed \$167 million, with the majority of the relief benefiting homeowners.

Committee Participation: N/A

Summary: The Sioux Falls School District continues to advocate for sustainable, predictable, and equitable funding for public education while opposing measures that limit local authority or reduce financial flexibility.

The proposed statewide property tax reforms and gubernatorial initiatives have the potential to significantly impact K–12 funding, and District administration will continue to monitor developments closely and engage with legislators to ensure the interests of students and staff remain protected.

COMPREHENSIVE PROPERTY TAX TASK FORCE ANNOUNCES RECOMMENDATIONS

PIERRE – The Chair and Vice Chair of the Comprehensive Property Tax Task Force, President Pro Tempore of the Senate Chris Karr and Speaker of the House Jon Hansen, today announced the task force's recommendations to deliver real, lasting property tax relief for South Dakotans through responsible fiscal reform and smarter government spending.

The recommendations to deliver immediate and permanent property tax relief include:

- Immediate relief via a \$120 million tax rebate delivered directly to homeowners utilizing collected but unspent tax dollars.
- A 5% cut in state government spending, resulting in \$123 million in savings which will be applied entirely for homeowner property tax reduction. The task force requested executive branch collaboration to bring about the necessary cuts to deliver relief.
- Due to a "sunset" on the current sales tax rate, South Dakota's sales tax revenues are set to increase by an additional \$105 million. The task force recommended preserving the tax relief, directing 100% of these dollars to reduce homeowner property taxes.
- Allocating 25% of future state revenue growth to replacing property tax revenue, ensuring these changes are permanent, and funds available for property tax relief grow along with South Dakota's economy.

Altogether, the plan represents more than \$348 million in total relief and an approximately 25% cut to homeowner property taxes, coupled with modernization and accountability reforms designed to make government more efficient and accessible.

Said Senator Karr, "This plan provides critical, long-term reforms that finally reduce the burden of property taxes on families while still funding local services and honoring our commitments to seniors and veterans. It's time to make tax cuts a priority for property owners."

"Real tax relief begins with right-sizing government," Representative Hansen said. "Ending the excessive strain of high property taxes on South Dakota homeowners is a top priority, and these recommendations are a big step forward in bringing about needed relief for South Dakotans."

Additional property tax relief recommendations include:

- Expanded tax relief programs for seniors and disabled veterans;
- Election requirements for opt-outs or bond elections;
- Electronic filing for faster, more accessible relief for all taxpayers;
- Directing all video lottery revenue to education to fulfill its original promise and ease the burden on local taxpayers; and
- Limits on public school spending for capital projects.

House Majority Leader Scott Odenbach praised the hard work of all of the task force members.

"Their commitment to this process over the past few months is a testament to their role as representatives of their constituents. I look forward to seeing how both the executive and legislative branches can work together to prioritize tax relief during the 2026 Legislative Session," he said.

Comprehensive Property Tax Task Force: Recommendations to the Executive Board

Recommendation A: Senator Karr

- Increases income limits for the property tax assessment freeze for multi-member households, from \$65,000 to \$85,000
-

Recommendation B: Representative Jamison

- Requires each tax bill to include a URL link and QR code that takes the taxpayer to a website maintained by the Department of Revenue, giving the individual more detail regarding their tax bill, without requiring the county to spend money on extra printing and mailing costs
-

Recommendation D: Representative Jamison

- Subjects school districts to the same property tax limitations as all other taxing districts, where the annual increase in property tax revenues may not exceed the limit set forth in § 10-13-35, unless an opt out is implemented
 - $PropTax_{year\ 2} = PropTax_{year\ 1} + IndexFactor + Growth + TIFexpire + Discretionary + Bonds$
-

Recommendation E: Representative Jamison

- Allows property owners to apply for property tax relief programs online, instead of submitting physical forms to the county, as is currently required
 - Accomplished through a website maintained by the Department of Revenue
-

Recommendation G: Representative Heinemann

- Raises the minimum value of a new structure or addition that qualifies for the discretionary formula from \$30,000 to \$100,000
 - Raises the minimum proportion of taxable value under the discretionary formula to 30%
-

Recommendation H: Representative Odenbach

- Creates a new fund dedicated to state aid to education for school districts' general fund and special education fund
 - Deposits into the state aid to education fund all state lottery revenues that are currently distributed to the state general fund
-

Recommendation I: Representative Odenbach

- Repeals the authorization for a school district to transfer moneys from its capital outlay fund to its general fund
 - Limits annual increases in a school district's capital outlay property taxes to the lesser of 3% or inflation, removing additional increases allowed from annexation, development of property, reclassification of property, the termination of a tax increment financing district, and the application of the discretionary formula
-

Recommendation J: Senator Otten

- Offers a refund of property taxes for those who qualify but did not apply for property tax relief programs for disabled and paraplegic veterans, covering up to the last five years that the individual was eligible but did not apply or receive the relief
-

Recommendation K: Representative Jamison

- Authorizes a municipality to implement a property tax rebate program for owner-occupied property according to criteria determined by the governing body of the municipality
 - Only property taxes imposed by the municipality may be refunded under its program
 - Any applicant that meets the criteria established by the municipality must receive the rebate
-

Recommendation L: Senator Howard

- Reduces the total maximum proportion of all tax increment base values from 10% of all assessed value in the city or county to 2.5% of all assessed value in the city or county
 - Requires that at least 50% of the area within a proposed TIF district be blighted
 - Amends the definition of "blight" by removing a reference to a predominance of open space or a diversity of ownership as possible qualifications
 - Requires the county approve of a TIF district established by a municipality
 - Strikes the authorization of grants provided by the governing body for purposes of the TIF district
 - Requires a special election for TIF districts with an estimated project cost of \$10 million or more
-



Recommendation M: Senator Sue Peterson

- Subject to certain conditions, requires that all school district excess tax levies (opt outs) must be approved by an election
 - Applies to school general fund opt outs and capital outlay opt outs
-

Recommendation N: Senator Sue Peterson

- Decreases the required petition to refer a school district excess tax levy (opt out) to a vote from 5% of the registered voters in the district to 5% of all voters who voted in the most recent special election of the district
 - Increases the days provided to gather signatures from 20 to 40
-

Recommendation O: Senator Sue Peterson

- Requires that all capital outlay certificates issued by a school district must be approved by an election
-

Recommendation P: Senator Sue Peterson

- Changes the vote requirement for excess tax levy (opt out) elections from a simple majority to 60%
-

Recommendation Q: Senator Deibert

- Creates a dedicated fund in the state treasury to replace the property tax portion of local effort for school district general funds and special education funds
 - Any sources of revenue the committee chooses to put toward reducing the general fund and special education levies can be directed into this fund for that purpose.

Recommendation R: Senator Deibert

- Creates a local effort replacement fund in the state treasury, used to replace a proportion of school districts' local effort from property taxes
 - On July 1, 2027, when the sunset date is reached for the sales and use tax rate reduction, deposit into the local effort replacement fund the additional revenue raised by the 0.3% increase from the current tax rate of 4.2%

Recommendation V3: Representative Hansen

- Requests the Executive Branch's cooperation to bring recommendations to the Legislature for a 5% cut to the general fund

Recommendation W: Senator Karr

- Creates a new fund dedicated to providing property tax relief
 - On an annual basis, deposits into the new fund 25% of the annual increase in state revenues from the prior year

Recommendation X: Representative Hansen

- Provides approximately \$120 million of property tax relief through property tax credits of approximately \$500 for all owner-occupied property
 - The credit is funded half through moneys in the housing and infrastructure fund and half through current reserves

Governor Rhoden's Homeowner Tax Relief Proposal

OBJECTIVE

We are not done with our efforts to bring property tax relief to South Dakotans. We need to deliver meaningful property tax relief – an actual property tax CUT for South Dakota homeowners.

Main Points of the Homeowner Tax Relief Proposal:

1. Each county commission would have the option to directly reduce owner-occupied (homeowner) property taxes by replacing the revenue with a county sales tax of up to 0.5%.
2. The funds raised from the optional sales tax would be placed into a Property Tax Reduction Fund at the county level.
3. The use of the optional sales tax would be 100% dedicated towards directly lowering the county property taxes for all homeowners within the county.
4. The property tax reduction would be achieved through a Homeowner Tax Credit, which would be paid out from the Property Tax Reduction Fund.
5. If owner-occupied property taxes in the county are fully offset by the Homeowner Tax Credit, any remaining funds in the Property Tax Reduction Fund must be used to lower property taxes among the other two classes of property: agriculture and other/commercial.

MORE BACKGROUND

Counties:

- This homeowner tax relief option would be referable to a public vote.
- Voters would also have the right to bring an initiated ordinance to impose a county sales tax if the county commission fails to do so.
- For counties that implement the homeowner tax relief, a portion of a homeowner's county tax burden will be shifted to out-of-state visitors who pay a sizable share of sales taxes in many counties.

Dispelling Myths:

- This proposal does not grow local government, as all county sales tax receipts must be reinvested into property tax reduction.
- Since the replacement revenues are coming from sales taxes, this proposal ***does not*** shift the property tax burden onto other classes of property. In fact, other classes may also benefit if the proceeds of the sales tax exceed county owner-occupied property taxes in a particular county.

Administration/Application:

- Advance notice would be required to the Department of Revenue. All sales tax collections would be administered through the existing state process, similar to municipal sales tax administration.
- The county sales tax would apply to all goods and services that are taxable under the municipal & state sales tax. As with municipal sales tax, the county tax would ***not*** apply to excise tax on farm machinery in chapter 10-46E.

Supporting Data of the Homeowner Tax Relief Proposal

ITEMS OF NOTE:

This proposal is optional for each county, meaning the data below is for informational purposes only. The FY2025 Taxable Sales by County are ESTIMATES. The estimates were determined using the following data: FY2025 state sales and use tax, FY2025 municipal sales and use taxes, FY2025 special jurisdictions sales and use taxes, estimated FY2025 state sales tax on farm machinery, and population estimates for cities and counties in the state.

1. The taxable sales reported by each municipality were attributed to the county in which the municipality is located. In cases where a municipality overlaps multiple counties, the taxable amount is allocated using population estimates. *For example, municipal taxable sales for Sioux Falls are split between Minnehaha and Lincoln counties based on an estimate of the population of Sioux Falls that is located within Minnehaha (81%) and Lincoln (19%) counties, respectively.
2. The state and special jurisdiction taxable sales not associated with any municipality (Taxable – Rural) is calculated by taking the total state taxable sales plus the special jurisdiction (tribal) taxable sales less the municipal taxable sales and less the taxable sales from selected farm equipment licenses.
3. The Taxable – Rural amount is allocated based upon population estimates of counties (excluding population estimates of cities that impose a municipal tax).
4. Allocating taxable sales by population is an ESTIMATE because taxable sales may vary by location and the county where taxpayers are selling is not always known.
5. **The County Levy and Owner Occupied (OO) Taxes for County represent the total property tax levies for pay 2025 for property tax funds that are retained by the county.

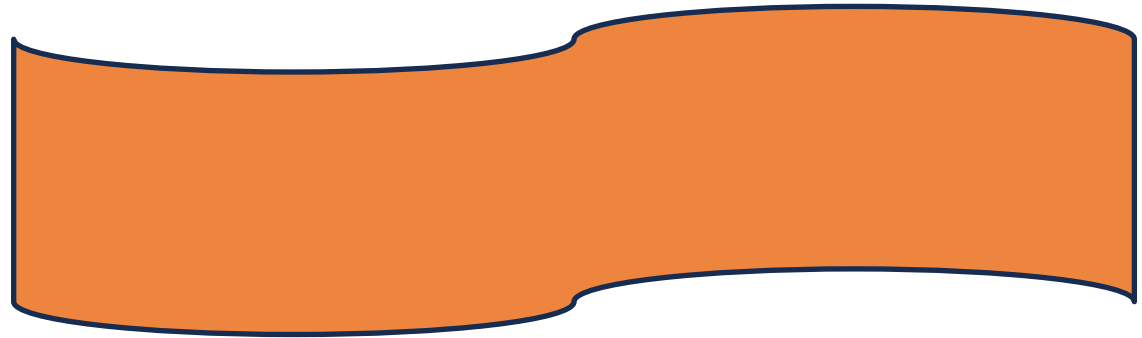

Other Issues Often Raised when Discussing SD Teacher Salaries

Why is SD 41st in Revenues/Student & 49th in Teacher Salary? Is it because Admin costs are so high?

- No, SD spends about the same per pupil on Instruction than Admin, like most of its neighbors (see Blue table).
- SD is a very sparse state meaning its students are spread out over a vast area so there are very few economies of scale. Only ND and Montana are more sparse than SD in the entire US.
- SD is 49th in teacher salaries because like most of its neighbors it is extremely sparse, but unlike all of its neighbors SD's State & Local revenues are in the bottom fourth of all US states. All others but Montana are in the top 27.

Capital Outlay Funding: Growth & Inflation

- Some Legislators during last year's property tax debate on the bill that passed stated:
 - Schools are getting off Scott-free; the 2026 legislation must have an impact on them.
- Fact: Schools' taxing authority on Capital Outlay funds was significantly restricted in 2016 when the Legislature raised the sales tax by a ½ cent to increase teacher salaries (the Pension Fund was also eliminated).
 - The result 8 years later is that the reduction in taxing authority for schools is greater than the increase received from the ½ cent sales tax (\$16.4 million reduction in potential revenue).

Strengthening Real Property Assessment to Ensure a Sound Revenue Stream to K-12 Schools


- **The largest part of school district's budget is the State Aid formula, which is a combination of State Aid and property taxes.**
 - Assessment of property in all counties must be consistent to ensure all schools are treated the same regarding property taxes available to them through the state aid formulas.

Local Control

- Local control is essential to meeting the unique needs of each district's students and communities.
 - Unfunded mandates (from the Legislature or the DOE) limit districts' ability to remain flexible & responsive to those priorities.
 - School board elections give citizens a direct say in how their schools are run. Stripping away local control removes that voice and centralizes power in state agencies and the Legislature.

Press Release

Immediate relief via a \$120 million tax rebate delivered directly to homeowners utilizing collected but unspent tax dollars

A 5% cut in state government spending, yielding \$123 million in savings directed toward property tax reduction

Direct \$105 million of new sales tax (due to sunset of a prior 0.3 cent reduction) to homeowner property tax relief


Allocate 25% of future state revenue growth to replace property tax revenue to ensure long-term sustainability and alignment with state economic growth



The Devil is in the Details

- Nineteen specific recommendations were made to the Legislative Executive Board.
- Six of those 19 recommendations would negatively impact school districts.
 - D, Rep Jamison: Tries to subject schools to the same limits as counties and municipalities
 - I, Rep Odenbach: No transfers from CO to GF and CO only increases the lesser of 3% or inflation.
 - M, Sen Peterson: All school district opt outs are subject to an election.
 - N, Sen Peterson: Decreases petition requirement to 5% of most recent special election and allows 40 days to pass petitions.
 - O, Sen Peterson: Requires elections for all CO certificates.
 - P, Sen Peterson: Requires 60% approval for all opt out elections, presumably including all units of local government.

Rec D: Schools same as all others

- Won't work for the general fund and Sped fund as these levies are equalized across the state.
 - Schools raise what they can locally and the State Aid tops off funding to ensure all districts have the same amount per student.
 - Schools with lower valuation growth via inflation would have to levy more per thousand to receive the same amount of money as schools with higher inflation.
 - Eventually would likely be determined unconstitutional.



- While schools were being underfunded for the last 18 years (see earlier “Big 3” chart), one way the legislature compensated for that was by expanding the ability of schools to use CO funds for GF expenses (although not a great solution as schools end up trading roofs for salaries or education programming, it did give districts options based on their own needs). The Legislature should rectify this long-running imbalance before contemplating going backwards on CO transfers to the GF.
- Schools have already been required in 2016 to reduce their ability to tax for capital outlay by 63.3 million.

- Why only schools? Why not other local units of government? Why not the State?
 - While schools levy the most property taxes, that is not their fault. The Legislature determines how local governments raise taxes, not the local governments. Schools were 58.5% of the property tax bill in 2007 and that has dropped to 56.2% in 2024, so schools haven't been increasing property taxes at a greater rate than other units of government.
 - Over the same period, school taxes increased 3.4% per student per year, all property taxes increased 3.6% per capita per year, and the State sales tax increased 4.5% per capita per year. Perhaps the State should be required to opt out if it exceeds 3% or inflation, whichever is less.

- This appears to be a “Do as I say, not as I do” proposal.
 - The sponsor has an interesting track record on improving access to direct democracy. While Rec N lowers the signature requirements to refer an opt-out to a vote and gives petitioners twice the time to get those signatures, last Legislative Session the sponsor voted to reduce the time for residents to circulate initiative petitions at the state level. The sponsor also voted for every bill she could that sought to make it harder for citizens to put measures on the ballot.
 - What is the rationale for this applying only to schools?
- 

Rec O: Public elections for all Capital Outlay certificates (bonds)

- Schools are already limited in their ability to generate capital outlay dollars.
 - Why would the State want to limit schools' ability to use those funds (within the limit) effectively by borrowing money to conduct a large project, and then pay it back over (up to) 20 years? The State does this all the time with its revenue sources.
 - Legislators should trust the electorate to vote for school board members who will make good decisions.

Governor Rhoden's Proposal

Optional ½ cent sales tax implemented by counties to reduce property taxes

If all counties implemented the tax (not likely), it would generate \$167 million in property tax relief

If the sales tax generates more revenue than taxes paid by homeowners in the county, Ag and Comm property would be reduced by the overage

Both a decision to implement or not implement the tax by a county commission are subject to referral or an initiated ordinance by the voters



Summary

- The Sioux Falls School District continues to advocate for sustainable, predictable, and equitable funding for public education while opposing measures that limit local authority or reduce financial flexibility.
- The proposed statewide property tax reforms and gubernatorial initiatives have the potential to significantly impact K–12 funding, and District administration will continue to monitor developments closely and engage with legislators to ensure the interests of students and staff remain protected.



Administrative Recommendation:

Acknowledge the update on the Sioux Falls School District's 2026 legislative priorities and the South Dakota legislative and gubernatorial property tax initiatives.
