The History Day program would like to ask permission to attend the overnight research trip to St. Paul on February 13 and 14, 2017. This is a revised request due to changes in circumstances because Bemidji is no longer able to split expenses.

Total expenses requested:

Bus and Driver @ \$2.00 per mile to St. Paul and back. Approx. 500 miles= \$1000.00

Rooms for advisor and driver @ approx. \$80.00 each

Sub for advisor @ 2 days

The MacMillan Library Funds would reimburse the cost at \$42.00 per student. At this time we are looking at 12 students attending. The requirements of the grant are that we stay overnight, attend a MNHS historical site and submit proper paperwork for reimbursement. We have applied for this grant in the past and the paperwork has never been overly cumbersome.

Students will pay for their rooms and meals.

This research trip is important for the students in that it offers access to library resources we are not able to access in northern Minnesota, access to library support students from the University of Minnesota and access to support from Minnesota Historical Society History Day staff.
