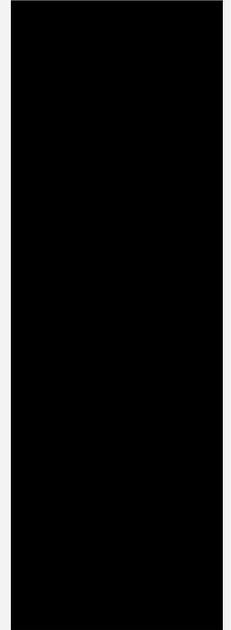

School Board Facilities Summary
1-28-19

- I have been in this role full-time since the first week in September
 - Providing help, support and perspective as needed for the new AD
- Since July 2018 revenue generated through December is \$65,806 (this including ongoing rentals from Resonate Church at West and Barracuda Aquatics at West)
 - New Revenue: \$44,270
- Hosted a day with Ottobock. Ottobock is a German prosthetics company who utilized our track facility for a day of testing for new prosthetics. This is the second year we have done this and it has been done in conjunction with Shakopee resident Aaron Holm and also in partnership with his Wiggle Your Toes foundation.
- 10 day period of time in July we hosted 196 teams for 3 different basketball tournaments. Teams represented 7 different states, Canada and all corners of Minnesota
- In October we hosted a weekend long Cultural Festival that had visitors from around the Region and a musical group that performed all the way from India.
- Two week stretch in October due to unplayable conditions at other schools we hosted 6 post-season Soccer games at Vaughan Field
- For the Second Year in a row, host MSHSL State Quarter-final Football games. This year we hosted two games in November.
- First two weekends in January we had two youth tournaments. Over two weekends hosted 294 teams and 445 games.
- This past weekend just on Saturday we hosted a Youth Dance Clinic, Youth Wrestling Tournament and also hosted the Sub-Section One-Act Play Competition. Then on Sunday hosted a large Youth Volleyball tournament.
- Over the next several months as of today we will hosting events from more basketball and volleyball tournaments to an indoor soccer tournament, Dance Competitions in the Auditoriums, wrestling events, and Taekwondo tournaments.
- Thus far we have not had to do any marketing to generate interest. Everything that has come to us has been word of mouth from folks who have been here previously.
- I would say we are just scratching the surface on our potential in this area. Things have gone quite well thus far but we have plenty of room for growth.



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Proposed Graduation Requirements for Tokata Learning Center

Tokata Learning Center Overview:

The Tokata Learning Center (TLC) is a small, student centered, relationship focused, alternative high school designed to help struggling students overcome challenges that are barriers to a successful school experience. TLC staff recognize that each student and struggle is unique. Therefore, the staff works hard to provide a personalized educational experience that is tailored to meet the individual needs and goals of each student. With flexible scheduling, traditional and self-paced course options, access to comprehensive student supports, and most importantly an understanding, caring, and supportive TLC school staff and community, TLC students who have struggled in mainstream school settings often find renewed hope and engagement in the learning process.

The Tokata Learning Center (TLC) is a state approved area learning center that provides alternative education for students who meet at least one of the following [Minnesota Graduation Incentives](#).

- (1) performs substantially below the performance level for pupils of the same age in a locally determined achievement test;
- (2) is behind in satisfactorily completing coursework or obtaining credits for graduation;
- (3) is pregnant or is a parent;
- (4) has been assessed as chemically dependent;
- (5) has been excluded or expelled according to sections [121A.40](#) to [121A.56](#);
- (6) has been referred by a school district for enrollment in an eligible program or a program pursuant to section [124D.69](#);
- (7) is a victim of physical or sexual abuse;
- (8) has experienced mental health problems;
- (9) has experienced homelessness sometime within six months before requesting a transfer to an eligible program;
- (10) speaks English as a second language or is an English learner;
- (11) has withdrawn from school or has been chronically truant; or
- (12) is being treated in a hospital in the seven-county metropolitan area for cancer or other life threatening illness or is the sibling of an eligible pupil who is being currently treated, and resides with the pupil's family at least 60 miles beyond the outside boundary of the seven-county metropolitan area.

Graduation Requirements:

Historically, the TLC and Shakopee High School (SHS) students have had the same number of required graduation credits and been awarded the same Shakopee High School Diploma. The new SHS graduation requirements are based on the Academy Model with multiple programs of study operating on a block schedule within a large high school setting. While the TLC aligns with the intended vision of the Academy Model (college/career exploration and readiness), the implementation of some of the new SHS graduation requirements is difficult given the TLC's size and structure.

Important Implications:

- An increase of 8 required graduation credits (from 48 to 56 credits) could create a larger credit gap for TLC students (many of whom struggle with credit deficiency), which may impact the TLC/district graduation rates.
- The TLC is struggling to deliver the current 15 required elective credits due to its size and staffing. An increase in three electives adds an additional resource challenge (staffing and capital).
- The new requirements of Freshman Seminar, Financial Literacy, and Program of Study (5 credits) will require the development of new courses and additional resources.

TLC Graduation Requirements Proposal:

- Adjust the SHS total credit requirement from 56 for SHS students to 52 for TLC students (see chart below).

- Continue with the current elective requirement of 15 credits.
- Adjust science sequence to better serve TLC students.
 - New Sequence: Physics, Biology, Environmental Studies
 - This sequences fulfills state science requirements.
 - Without lab space, chemistry is difficult to deliver.
 - Environmental studies will be more experiential and relevant to TLC students.
- Add a program a study that consists of 4 courses (4 credits), which will include standards from Freshman Seminar and Financial Literacy. The proposed program of study sequence would include:
 - TLC Seminar
 - Adulting 101
 - College and Career Exploration
 - TLC Capstone
