SUBJECT: EMPLOYEE DISCRIMINATION AND HARASSMENT

I. Board Directive

The Board of Education is committed to providing an employment environment that is free from unlawful harassment and other forms of unlawful discrimination based upon race, color, sex, pregnancy, childbirth or pregnancy-related conditions, religion, national origin, age (if the individual is 40 years of age or older), disability, sexual orientation, or gender identity. It is the intent of this policy to prohibit discrimination or harassment against any individual or class of persons specifically enumerated as protected under the Civil Rights Acts of the United States and the Utah Anti-Discrimination Act ([UCA §34A-5-101](#) et seq.). It is not the intent of this policy to broaden coverage beyond those classifications specifically protected by federal or state statutes. The responsibility for policy regarding employee discrimination and harassment is delegated to the District Administration.

II. Administrative Policy

This policy is adopted to assist Jordan School District employees in moving toward a workplace that is free of unlawful discrimination or harassment. It is the policy of Jordan School District to provide fair, expeditious and uniform procedures for investigation and resolution of claims of unlawful discrimination or harassment.

A. Definitions

1. Clearly Offensive Conduct: That conduct, be it verbal or nonverbal, which when perceived in its overall context, would be taken by a reasonable person, similarly situated, to be strongly objectionable.
2. Complainant: A person who files a written or oral complaint about unlawful discrimination or harassment.
3. Compliance Officer: Person or persons designated by the Superintendent to receive and process complaints of unlawful discrimination or harassment (harassment or discrimination based on membership in a protected category, i.e. race, color, sex, pregnancy, childbirth or pregnancy-related conditions, religion, national origin, age (if the individual is 40 years of age or older), disability, sexual orientation or gender identity).
4. Demeaning or Derisive Behavior: Unlawful behavior which substantially lowers the status, dignity or standing of another individual, or which insults or otherwise belittles or shows contempt for another individual.
5. Disability: An individual's physical or mental impairment that substantially limits one or more major life activities, a record of such an impairment, or being regarded as having such an impairment.
6. Discrimination: Unlawful Conduct, including words or gestures and other actions, which adversely affects an employee's working environment or results in disparate treatment based upon membership in a protected category (i.e. race, color, sex, pregnancy, childbirth or pregnancy-related conditions, religion, national origin, age (if the individual is 40 years of age or older), disability, sexual orientation or gender identity). Discrimination does not include referral to or use of regular District Administration processes relating to employee evaluation and discipline.
7. Harassment: A form of discrimination that includes unlawful conduct of an offensive nature that is demeaning or derisive or occurs substantially because of the employee's membership in a protected category (i.e. race, color, sex, pregnancy, childbirth or pregnancy-related conditions, ethnic

~~background, religion,~~ national origin, ~~religion, sex, creed,~~ age (if the individual is 40 years of age or older), ~~citizenship,~~ disability, sexual orientation or gender identity) and which creates a hostile work environment. Harassment may include but is not limited to any of the three categories listed below:

- a. Generalized Harassment: Includes intentional behavior directed at an entire group that is based on demeaning or derisive stereotypes, and is severe enough that it creates a hostile working environment.
Examples include comments or jokes, physical gestures or visual displays such as posters, etc.
 - b. Individually Targeted Harassment: Includes intentional, criminal or non-criminal behavior that is targeted at an individual or particular members of a group, which can be verbal, physical or visual that is severe enough or pervasive enough that it adversely affects the working environment. Examples include negative or offensive comments, jokes, suggestions or gestures directed to an individual's or group's race, ethnicity or national origin.
 - c. Criminal Harassment: Harassing behavior that violates state or federal criminal statutes.
Examples include criminal assault, sexual assault, rape, criminal mischief, stalking, arson or trespass.
8. Respondent: A person named in a discrimination or harassment complaint as having engaged in or being responsible for a discriminatory or harassing act or omission.
9. Retaliation: Any form or sanction, restraint, coercion, discrimination, harassment, or adverse treatment against a person because that person has asserted, or has assisted another person to assert, a discrimination or harassment complaint in either a formal or informal manner with the District, or with any state or federal agency, or because that person has testified, assisted or participated in any manner in an investigation, proceeding or hearing related to a discrimination or harassment complaint.
10. Sexual Harassment: All complaints of sexual harassment should be directed first to the Title IX Coordinator for a preliminary jurisdictional review. If the complaint falls under Title IX jurisdiction, it shall be addressed through policy AA452 — Title IX Sexual Harassment. If it does not fall under Title IX jurisdiction, the complaint shall be dismissed for purposes of Title IX and directed back to Human Resources for investigation pursuant to this policy.
A Sexual harassment is a form of sex discrimination. It consists of unwelcome sexual advances, requests for sexual favors, and/or other verbal or physical conduct of a sexual nature that is based on one or more of the following conditions:-
- a. Submission to such conduct is made either explicitly or implicitly as a term or condition to work benefit.
 - b. Submission to or rejection of such conduct by a co-worker is used as the basis for decisions affecting the work environment.
 - c. Such conduct has the purpose or effect of unreasonably interfering with an employee's work performance or creating an intimidating, hostile, or offensive working environment.
 - d. Sexual harassment includes:

- 1) Hostile Environment: The three levels of hostile environment are the same as those listed ~~above in 7. a.-c. for other harassment~~; e.g., generalized harassment, individually targeted harassment, and criminal harassment.
- 2) Harassment ~~that which~~ culminates in a tangible action that alters the conditions of the working environment (previously called quid pro quo).

B. Complaint Procedure

1. The following options are available for those who believe they are victims of discrimination or harassment, or who witness such acts:
 - ~~a. Seek to resolve issue directly with the accused.~~
 - b.a. Seek to resolve issue through a supervisor or administrative personnel.
 - e.b. Report the concern by calling the District Non-Compliance Hotline or completing the form on the [District Non-compliance webpage](#).
 - ~~d.c.~~ c. Register a formal complaint with the District Compliance Officer who will initiate an initial assessment and possible investigation.
2. Any employee who knows of a violation of this policy ~~is expected to must~~ report such conduct to a supervisor, administrator, or the District Compliance Officer, ~~or the Superintendent's designee~~.
3. The initial allegation of discrimination or harassment may be submitted either ~~orally verbally~~ or in writing to the immediate supervisor/administrator. A complaint made to the District Compliance Officer ~~or Superintendent's designee~~ must be in writing.
4. ~~Complaints to the District compliance officer must be made within 180 calendar days after the date of the alleged act of discrimination or harassment. The Board has the right to extend the 180 day deadline if circumstances are warranted.~~

C. Investigative Procedures

1. Initial Assessment: When any complaint is filed under this policy or when a complaint is referred through this policy from the Title IX Team, an initial assessment is conducted to determine whether the reported conduct falls under the scope of this policy.
 - a. This assessment involves a preliminary review of the details provided in the complaint to decide if the alleged conduct, if proven true, would constitute a violation of this policy.
 - i. If the alleged conduct would not (even if proven true) constitute a violation of this policy, the matter will be dismissed in favor of Human Resources assistance, such as mediation or other policy involvement.
 - ii. If the alleged conduct would constitute a violation of this policy, the matter will be assigned for investigation.
2. If an investigation reveals evidence of criminal conduct, the matter will be referred to local law enforcement for criminal investigation. The District will conduct its own internal investigation independent of law enforcement officials to determine whether District policy was violated.

- 32. All investigations will be treated with discretion to protect the privacy of those involved. All efforts will be made to treat the information as confidential; however, absolute confidentiality of all information obtained through an investigation cannot be guaranteed.
- 43. The ~~accused-respondent (person alleged to have engaged in the reported conduct)~~ may not contact the complainant during an investigation without the permission of District ~~and the complainant~~.
- 54. When conducting investigations, the District ~~Ceompliance Oefficer or Superintendent's designee~~ shall disclose his/her role as a neutral investigator rather than an advocate for any party. The extent of the investigation will be determined, among other factors, by the nature and severity of the charges.
- 65. An investigation shall be completed with fairness and reasonable speed, typically within 30 working days of receipt of the complaint, unless extenuating circumstances require a longer period.
- 76. After the conclusion of the investigation, the District ~~Ceompliance Oefficer or Superintendent's designee~~ shall provide all parties a written disposition of the complaint.
- 87. The parties will then have 10 working days to provide written responses to the report and have them considered by the District ~~Ceompliance Oefficer or Superintendent's designee~~.

D. **Disciplinary Procedures**

Any employee who has been found in violation of this policy will be subject to the following disciplinary procedures:

- 1. A first substantiated offense, if minor in nature, will result in a written reprimand to be entered in the employee's personnel file. Should the first offense be determined to be of a serious nature, the employee will be subject to disciplinary action up to and including termination in accordance with District Policy [DP316 NEG – Orderly Termination Procedures](#).
- 2. A second substantiated offense shall result in disciplinary action up to and including termination in accordance with District Policy [DP316 NEG – Orderly Termination Procedures](#).

E. **Retaliation**

Retaliation under this policy is prohibited. Individuals found to have engaged in retaliatory conduct will face disciplinary action, up to and including termination in accordance with District Policy [DP316 NEG – Orderly Termination Procedures](#).

F. **Records**

Records of all discrimination or harassment complaints shall be maintained by the District. Information gathered, developed, and documented in the investigation will be classified as a protected record.

G. **Outside Reporting Procedures**

Nothing in this policy shall prohibit a person from filing a discrimination or harassment claim with Utah Anti-Discrimination and Labor Division (UALD) or the Equal Opportunity Commission (EEOC). If an employee pursues a claim of discrimination or harassment, he/she should be aware that Utah is a “dual filing”

President Miller presided and conducted. The Board of Education met in a study session to discuss the following:

A. Proposed Changes to Administrative Policy AA440 *Library Media Selection and Review*

Dr. Michael Anderson said Policy AA440 was revised according to Board member recommendations. He invited further discussion about the policy.

Brian Barnett asked about accountability for sensitive materials being found in a school library. Dr. Godfrey explained that elementary reading selections are chosen by District personnel and a library media specialist is responsible for the selection of books in the school library at each secondary school. Regular trainings are provided for these employees to guide them in the criteria and selection process.

President Miller noted all policies are expected to be followed by employees and discipline measures would be taken should an employee subvert the policy.

Darrell Robinson said Policy AA440 is a good District policy that aligns with state law.

Lisa Dean said this policy was put in place because of new law, but she expressed frustration that it has a far reach and limits control at the school level.

President Miller said this item will be open for public comment, discussion and a vote in the subsequent General session.

B. New Administrative Policy AA453 Use of Personal Electronic and Communication Devices (Cellphone Policy)

President Miller said this item is on the Business Meeting agenda for public input and a vote.

Lisa Dean expressed her desire to help schools remove the distraction of cellphones in classrooms. She requested follow-up on 1) the schools participating in pilot programs and 2) funding for pouches. Mr. Dunford agreed, saying Policy AA453 is a good starting point, but will need to be updated and revised in the future.

Marilyn Richards reiterated she is in favor of a bell to bell cellphone ban on all levels.

Darrell Robinson said the policy needs to be consistent and could be revised later. He advocated for an education component.

Niki George expressed satisfaction with Policy AA453 and requested Policy AA414 *Student Conduct, Dress, and Appearance*, specifically the section regarding “digital citizenship”, be revised to align with the new cellphone policy. It was agreed to add this item to a future Board meeting agenda for discussion. Ms. George also expressed the desire for secondary to have the same consequences outlined as the elementary level and Mr. Barnett agreed.

Communication with parents during the school day was discussed. Ms. George asked if District emails could be opened so parents could email their child during the school day. Dr. Godfrey said it might be too cumbersome to delineate which emails could be allowed and which ones should be blocked for individual students.

In response to a question about students with special needs, Dr. Godfrey said administration will make sure all staff is aware of students with exceptions. Dr. Anderson added that the Administrator of Schools will be included in those discussions.

Mr. Barnett questioned the impact of cellphones on student learning and the following was mentioned:

- The distraction of phones infringing on learning time
- Extra time for teachers and students outside of regular school hours to re-teach or remediate
- Cellphone survey results show teachers, parents, and students agree that phones are a distraction in the classroom

Dr. Godfrey said it is important to measure the impact of reduced cellphone use. He said the intent of this policy is to improve the quality of life for teachers, reduce student anxiety, hopefully impact academic outcomes, and address social emotional wellness.

Dr. Godfrey said he will look into the email issue for communicating with students during the school day and see what other districts are doing.

C. Nutrition Services Overview

Katie Bastian introduced Dietician Katie Cole and Farm to School Partner Margo Ward, who were invited to share a presentation and answer questions about the National Farm to School program. She highlighted the three areas of focus with this program: education, procurement, and school gardens.

Ms. Bastian named local farm partners and specified the items they provide schools for summer meals, Farm to School Day, and Apple Crunch Day (held in October). She highlighted the following ways Jordan students benefit from local produce:

- JATC South Greenhouse and Garden – a hydroponic system used to grow vegetables that were distributed to school cafeterias

- Junior Master Gardener Program (JMGP) – an international 4-H youth program started at Majestic and Columbia Elementary Schools, which offers horticultural and environmental science education

Ms. Ward explained the JMGP aligns with state core standards and is offered to third graders, who will continue with the program through sixth grade when they will receive their certificate.

Ms. Cole mentioned other products Jordan utilizes that are locally produced, namely: milk, bread from local bakeries, and beef from Snowden Meats.

Ms. Bastian explained all meals meet federal nutrition standards and added that “smart snack” vending is also provided at schools. She said although federal guidelines require students to take all five food components, food waste is being reduced as more popular options are being offered.

D. Reporting Required by Utah Code 53G-6-11-110

Bryan Veazie explained the differences between HB 420 and Title IX reporting requirements regarding interscholastic sports, noting there are twelve girls sports and ten boys sports that were included. Three sports were not gender designated: baseball, cheer, and football. He highlighted the fact that overall participation rates are very similar (within 8.40% of each other) for boys and girls in gender-designated sports. Bingham High School and Riverton High School were the only two secondary schools that had a gender participation gap during the 2023-24 school year and these gaps will be addressed by focusing efforts to expand and promote girls sports programs.

The report also included spending devoted to gender-designated sports; and the practice and game facilities used for each sport at every secondary school.

Due to the time constraint, it was decided to discuss agenda item E in a subsequent study session following the special business session.

At 6:23 p.m., the meeting adjourned. The general session started at 6:37 p.m.

No members of the public signed up to address the Board regarding non-agenda items and no audience members accepted the invitation to speak.

II. **General Business – Consent Agenda**

A. **Motion to Approve Consent Agenda Items**

1. **Minutes**

Minutes of the Board of Education meetings held August 27, 2024; September 6, 2024; and September 10, 2024, were presented to the Board of Education for approval.

2. **LEA Specific Licenses**

It was recommended that License and Endorsement Applications submitted by educators be approved (Administrative Rule R277-301-7).

3. **Teacher and Student Success Act (TSSA) 2025-26 Plan Framework**

The Jordan School District Board of Education Teacher and Student Success Act (TSSA) Framework for 2025-26 was presented to the Board for formal approval.

MOTION: It was moved by Lisa Dean and seconded by Marilyn Richards to approve Consent Agenda items A1 through A3, as recommended. The motion passed with a unanimous vote.

B. **Motion to Accept Consent Agenda Items**

1. **Expenditures**

Expenditures for the month of August 2024 were provided to the Board of Education.

2. **Financial Statement**

The financial statement through August 31, 2024, was provided to the Board of Education. A copy is attached at the conclusion of these minutes. (Attachment 1)

3. **Personnel – Licensed and Education Support Professionals**

Personnel changes for the month of August 2024 were provided to the Board of Education.

4. **Recommendation to Issue Certificates for Home Instruction**

It was recommended that the students whose parents have filed affidavits pursuant to Utah Code 53G-6-204 shall be issued certificates excusing them from attending public school.

5. **Non-Compliance Report**

MOTION: It was moved by Marilyn Richards and seconded by Lisa Dean to accept Consent Agenda items B1 through B5, as recommended. The motion passed with a unanimous vote.

President Miller requested moving to Special Business on the agenda to accommodate those present who wished to give public comment regarding those items. She said the Board would return to Bid Recommendations following the Special Business Items. All agreed.

IV. **Special Business**

A. **Recommendation to Approve Proposed Revisions to Administrative Policy AA440 *Library Media Selection and Review***

Dr. Michael Anderson explained House Bill 29 outlines a process to remove both subjective and objective sensitive materials from schools and Policy AA440 aligns with this state law. He said if three or more districts or charter schools remove a book from a school, it triggers a statewide removal of that material.

President Miller called for a motion on Policy AA440.

MOTION: It was moved by Darrell Robinson and seconded by Brian Barnett to approve Proposed Revisions to Administrative Policy AA440 *Library Media Selection and Review*.

Public Comment

No patrons signed up to address the Board regarding this Special Business item and no patrons accepted the invitation to speak.

Lisa Dean said she will vote to approve this policy as it is in compliance with House Bill 29. She wanted to go on record as stating she is frustrated that the legislature has removed local control on this issue and is allowing parents from other schools and the State Board of Education to decide for local schools what is to be prohibited.

Darrell Robinson thanked the ad-hoc committee, Dr. Anderson, Carolyn Gough, and Teaching and Learning staff for their work on this policy.

President Miller called for a vote on the motion to approve Proposed Revisions to Administrative Policy AA440 *Library Media Selection and Review*. The motion passed unanimously.

A copy of Administrative Policy AA440 is attached at the conclusion of these minutes (Attachment 2)

B. **Recommendation to Approve New Administrative Policy AA453 *Use of Personal Electronic and Communication Devices***

President Miller said the current cellphone policy was discussed in January and the Board found it was not effective. An outside entity was hired to do a survey of teachers, parents, and students and the data was clear that cellphones are a concern. Results showed 87 percent of parents, 91 percent of teachers, and 70 percent of students felt that cellphones should be restricted in classrooms.

Dr. Anderson said Policy AA453 specifies personal electronic devices will not be allowed during the school day for elementary students and during class time for secondary students. There are consequences outlined for each level and exceptions to the policy are expected and will be made by principals in consultation with Administrators of Schools.

President Miller called for a motion on Policy AA453.

MOTION: It was moved by Niki George and seconded by Darrell Robinson to approve New Administrative Policy AA453 *Use of Personal Electronic and Communication Devices*.

Public Comment

Clareen Arnold, a patron, spoke in favor of a cellphone ban, but said enforcement is key and there needs to be help for teachers who administer consequences.

Angela Sharp, a parent, said she was representing approximately 500 parents who signed a petition requesting an all-day cellphone ban for students. She urged the Board to take a proactive approach to include secondary schools in an all-day ban.

Diana Bruening, a parent, thanked the Board for the creation of a “sensible” cellphone policy. She praised their work on the policy and comprehensive research.

Debra Needles, a parent, expressed concern about accommodating students with special needs who may need a cellphone in class.

Maya “Ivy” Needles, a student, said the cellphone restrictions being followed in her class are already working. She advocated for continuing with classroom or school policies.

Amanda Thomas, a teacher, said she appreciates the cellphone policy, although she does not want the responsibility or liability associated with enforcement.

Kimberly Moore, a parent, spoke against a cellphone policy, saying cellphones assist in holding adults accountable for what happens in a classroom.

Jill Myler, a patron said other states are finding success in a bell to bell cellphone ban using pouches to store the devices. She spoke in favor of a phone free policy for both elementary and secondary students.

Heather Hardle, a parent, spoke against an all-day ban of cellphones. She said not having a phone can be a safety issue for students.

Sarah Bennett, a community member, said First Amendment rights should be protected. She spoke against a cellphone policy and suggested the importance of educating students on proper cellphone use.

President Miller invited Mr. Larsen, business administrator, to read comments submitted to boardcomments@jordandistrict.org from the following individuals, whose comments are summarized below:

Zanna Bruening, Amy McKasson, and Andrea Hinojosa all expressed support of the new cellphone policy. Rosanna Kerr, Eliza Pidcock, Amelia Bowles, and Travis Ferrin each recommended a less-restrictive policy.

The Board allowed for one final in-person public comment from the following individual:

Sam Gill, a student, spoke against a Districtwide cellphone policy. He said students should be allowed to use phones during class time.

Board Discussion

Lisa Dean said cellphones in school is a complicated issue. She said she agrees with a bell to bell ban and is concerned about the pressure on teachers to enforce a policy without a schoolwide device to store phones.

Brian Barnett said he feels the draft cellphone policy strikes a good balance between family and government roles in restricting phones. He advocated for teachers to enforce this policy, which he said would be refined at a later date.

Niki George gave a reminder that the Board has agreed to fund and pursue the following pilot programs for cellphones: pouch storage devices, a bell to bell ban, and lockers. She said she would prefer secondary consequences align with elementary consequences in the policy, but she

will support it as it is written. She said she wants teachers to know they are supported as they implement policy guidelines.

Marilyn Richards said she will vote against the current policy as she prefers a bell to bell cellphone ban at all levels. Mr. Dunford agreed.

Darrell Robinson spoke in favor of the current cellphone policy, saying that although it is a good step, the Board will continue to study the issue. He encouraged all educators to enforce the policy and educate about it.

President Miller expressed appreciation to Board members for making difficult compromises to come to agreement on the current policy. She called for a vote on the motion to approve New Administrative Policy AA453 *Use of Personal Electronic and Communication Devices*. The motion passed with a vote of four to three as follows:

Lisa Dean, Salt Lake County Parks and Rec liason, said the free My County Rec Pass is being extended to three and four year olds in Salt Lake County.

President Miller said the USBA will be holding a meeting September 25, 2024 and a policy webinar on October 7, 2024 at 11:00 a.m.

President Miller reported on the Jordan Education Foundation (JEF) National Day of Service that commemorated 911, where many organizations partnered with the Foundation to provide weekend meal and snack kits for students. She said applications are now being taken for Foundation Grants for teachers.

President Miller said she neglected to mention that the effective date on the cellphone policy would be the beginning of fall quarter. All agreed the policy would be effective on that date - October 29, 2024. She also mentioned there will be a Parent University on October 15, 2024 to educate parents about the new policy.

At 8:30 p.m., President Miller declared the meeting adjourned and announced that the Board would return to study session.

President Miller presided and conducted. The Board of Education met in a study session to discuss the following:

A. Enrollment Forecast and Housing Continuum Discussion

Dr. Michael Anderson acknowledged the Planning and Enrollment department for their work on this five-year enrollment forecast, which includes demographic trends and schools to watch (with increasing or declining enrollment).

Planning and Enrollment Consultant Scott Festin shared a presentation about growth trends in Jordan including demographic and enrollment shifts. He said the District is experiencing declining enrollment and pointed to declining fertility rates, housing market volatility, and shifts in enrollment due to other educational options.

Mr. Festin highlighted schools to watch with increasing enrollment, which include the following: Antelope Canyon Elementary School, Aspen Elementary School, Sunset Ridge Middle School, and Herriman High School. Schools to watch with declining enrollment include: Blackridge Elementary School, Butterfield Canyon Elementary School, Foothills Elementary School, Joel P. Jensen Middle School, and Oquirrh Hills Middle School.

Mr. Festin introduced information on the Housing Continuum and Building Plan Considerations, which include ten year trends and an aggregate of feeder systems. Possible frameworks for future building or closing of schools, remodeling, and/or boundary changes were presented including cost and disruption considerations.

Dr. Anderson recommended a boundary change for Aspen Elementary School for the 2025-26 school year as an immediate consideration. This would necessitate a 30-day notification for the following elementary schools: Aspen, Bastian, Oak Leaf, Butterfield Canyon, and Herriman.

Board boundary priorities were also discussed and Darrell Robinson requested a school capacity percentage chart without portables. President Miller requested showing the capacity with six portables for those schools that are currently using portables.

Mr. Dunford suggested using existing funds to begin construction of an elementary school in the Wood Ranch area. He also suggested two more schools be considered and notified of a potential boundary change: Bingham High School and Herriman High School.

All agreed with notifying the five elementary schools in Herriman and with notifying the two high schools mentioned. It was suggested to have the Finance Committee bring back recommendations for building and remodeling schools. In addition, the following items were assigned to staff to bring back to a future Board meeting:

- 1) Boundary options for Aspen Elementary School
- 2) Boundary options for Bingham and Herriman High Schools
- 3) Recommendations for renovation of West Jordan High School
- 4) An analysis of enrollment capacity based on no portables/six portables as mentioned earlier
- 5) An updated Enrollment and Capacity Workbook
- 6) A proposal for addressing the seismic needs of Westvale Elementary School

B. Discussion on Potential Revisions to Administrative Policy AS94 Student Discrimination and Harassment

Dr. Michael Anderson explained that since the Board recently passed Policy AA452 *Title IX Sexual Harassment*, two other Board policies (one for students and one for employees) need to be updated to align with Policy AA452. A revised version of Policy AS94 was shared which complies with Title IX and offers new definitions including supportive measures for students involved in Title IX claims.

Melissa Flores, General Counsel, said this is a tiered approach to conduct. She clarified that Title IX contains an umbrella definition of "Hostile Environment" and Policy AS94 language will allow for addressing some situations using Code of Conduct, instead of Title IX, measures. President Miller requested small wording changes to this item and Ms. Flores said she will make the suggested revisions.

Ms. Miller noted the revised policy will be brought back to the October 29, 2024 meeting for more discussion and possible vote.

C. Discussion on Potential Revisions to Administrative Policy DP358 Employee Discrimination and Harassment

Dr. Michael Anderson said administration worked with Human Resources to align this policy with Policy AA452.

Brian Barnett asked about Freedom of Speech rights in regards to this policy. Melissa Flores clarified that although every individual has this Constitutional right, it does not protect a person from consequences for their words or actions.

President Miller said Policy DP358 will be added to the October 29, 2024 agenda for a possible vote.

Dr. Anderson thanked Ms. Flores for her hard work on Title IX policy and matters.

D. Discussion on Potential Revisions to Administrative Policy AA419 Student Conduct, Dress, and Appearance

Dr. Michael Anderson said Ms. George recommended reviewing and updating Policy AA419 to align with Policy AA453 *Use of personal Electronic and Communication Devices* (Cellphone Policy). He asked for suggestions on updating item II.B.d regarding Digital Citizenship.

The following changes were suggested:

- Under section D.1., insert the following wording “school issued electronic devices” (to include Chromebooks).
- Under item B.2., remove the word “any” from the sentence “any use of an electronic device...”
- Adding the word “taking” to item B.3. regarding “sharing, using, or communicating pornographic images.”

Niki George suggested adding information about appropriate use of artificial intelligence (AI) to this policy and it was decided to have the Teaching & Learning department review the policy and recommend further changes.

Board members discussed plagiarism and the need for a Districtwide policy. Most expressed the desire for teachers to continue to address this in disclosures. Dr. Godfrey said he will discuss plagiarism and the Code of Conduct with administrators and bring their feedback to the Board.

Dr. Godfrey welcomed any Board member to contact him if they have information about a possible policy enforcement issue.

E. Procedure for Filling Vacancy on Board

As President Miller is a current candidate for the State House of Representatives, she declared her intent to submit her resignation as a Board of Education member November 6, 2024 if she is elected. She noted there will be a new Board member to replace Marilyn Richards who is not seeking another term and possibly other new Board members elected. She requested moving forward with the process to appoint another Board member in her stead by November 26, 2024 and all agreed.

The interview process was briefly discussed and Board Attorney Paul Van Komen said President Miller may choose to vote on her replacement. It was noted the new Board member would start in January of 2025.

A potential timeline was proposed, including the following:

Public notice – November 12, 2024
Candidate applications due – November 17, 2024
Candidate interviews and selection – November 26, 2024
New Board member training – December, 2024
Oath of Office – January 7 or 14, 2025

It was suggested to add wording to the application noting the candidate may attach a resume and that after the application is submitted, the candidate shall have no contact with current Board members.

The Board decided to notify households in Ms. Miller’s precinct of the vacancy by email and ParentSquare, if possible.

F. Discussion on Parent University Regarding New Cellphone Policy

President Miller announced a Parent University meeting about the new cellphone policy on October 15, 2024 at 6:00 p.m. at JATC South. She asked for input regarding the agenda.

Dr. Godfrey said staff has prepared a short video presentation with an overview of the new policy. He said there will be time to answer questions and provide information about resources regarding safe cellphone use.

Darrell Robinson requested more research about appropriate cellphone use, however Board members agreed not to pursue this idea at the present time.

G. Discussion on Conflicts of Interest, State Auditor Risk Assessment Suggestions, and USBE Finance Training

Bryce Dunford said there were two items on Jordan's State Auditor Risk Assessment that were not checked and the Finance Committee wanted to inform the Board of what it would take to complete these items.

Business Administrator John Larsen presented information about the following items to the Board:

- 1) A new state law (Utah Code section 67-16-16) requiring board member disclosure of conflicts of interest every year
- 2) USBE board rule requiring board member training every two years
- 3) State Auditor Fraud Risk Assessment suggestions:
 - a. Ethical behavior commitment by board members and employees
 - b. State Auditor training for school board members
- 4) USBA recommended training for board members

Mr. Larsen shared a possible ethical behavior statement for Board members and employees to sign, noting it could be revised. He said the Finance Committee suggests reviewing the trainings along with Policy GP103 *Board Members' Principles of Operation: Conduct & Ethics* and New Board Member Orientation.

President Miller recommended adding the Conflict of Interest Statement, Ethical Statement, and USBE Training to Policy GP103. Niki George recommended updating the Appendix - Guidelines for New Board Member Orientation to include information on Master Board Certification and State Auditor Training.

Mr. Van Komen added that there are new provisions regarding Conflicts of Interest, but Board members would only need to make a declaration if they apply. It was decided to add these to the New Board Member Checklist.

H. Board Member, Committee, and Superintendent Reports and Comments

Niki George, Government Relations Committee Chair, reported on Legislator Day in the Classroom, noting that the following legislators visited local schools: Cheryl Acton, Candice Pierucci, and Jordan Teuscher. Mr. Dunford and Mr. Barnett said they appreciated the opportunity provided for legislators to visit with students in a smaller setting. Ms. George said the committee will continue to work on facilitating these experiences. She asked if Board members wanted to provide a Legislative Breakfast again this year, and all agreed. The Committee will decide on possible dates.

Lisa Dean, Jordan Ethnic Advisory Committee (JEAC) liaison, announced a Community Night on March 12, 2025 for families and employees.

Darrell Robinson said the Jordan Parent Advisory Committee (JPAC) intends to hold two meetings this year: one in January or February and the other in late spring. He gave a reminder of the Juniper Elementary School Dedication on November 19, 2024 at 6:00 p.m.

Bryce Dunford said the Licensed Employee Advisory Committee (LEAC) will meet after the Strategic Plan is finished. Ms. Miller requested information on the terms for current committee members and Mr. Dunford said he will provide this at the October 29, 2024 study session along with information on LEAC elections.

The Board Bulletin was mentioned and “An Introduction to New Board Members” was suggested as a topic for the next issue.

President Miller said the Jordan Education Foundation is getting ready for Christmas for Kids. She announced the JEF will not be hosting an Economic Summit this year.

In regards to USBA news, President Miller noted New Board Member Institute will be held December 7, 2024 in Provo. She gave a reminder that Master Board Certification is due December 1, 2024. She explained the USBA website, including how to find policy webinars and information on current legislation.

Dr. Godfrey said he enjoyed the middle school Unified Soccer event. He expressed gratitude for the efforts of those that hosted the event and for the great participation.

MOTION: At 9:25 p.m., it was moved by Lisa Dean and seconded by Brian Barnett to go into closed session. The motion passed with a unanimous roll call vote.

SUBJECT: STUDENT DISCRIMINATION AND HARASSMENT

I. Board Directive

Jordan School District is committed to providing an educational environment that is free from illegal harassment and other forms of discrimination based upon sex, race, color, ethnic background, national origin, religion, gender, creed, age, citizenship, or disability. The Board, therefore, delegates to the District Administration responsibility for establishing policy regarding student discrimination and harassment.

II. Administrative Policy

No student or employee of the Jordan School District may engage in illegally harassing conduct that creates a hostile learning environment for students or staff of the district. It is the policy of Jordan School District to provide fair, expeditious and uniform procedures for investigation and resolution of claims of illegal harassment or discrimination.

A. Definitions

1. Clearly Offensive Conduct: That conduct, be it verbal or nonverbal, which when perceived in its overall context, would be taken by a reasonable person, similarly situated, to be strongly objectionable.
2. Complainant: A person who files a written or oral complaint about illegal harassment.
3. Compliance Officer: Person or persons designated by the Superintendent to receive and process complaints of discrimination.
- ~~4. Confront: To have a face to face discussion and/or contact regarding specific matters.~~
- ~~5.4.~~ Demeaning or Derisive Behavior: Behavior which substantially lowers the status, dignity or standing of another individual, or which insults or otherwise belittles or shows contempt for another individual.
- ~~6.5.~~ Disability: An individual's physical or mental impairment that substantially limits one or more major life activities, a record of such an impairment, or being regarded as having such an impairment.
- ~~7.6.~~ Discrimination: Conduct, including words or gestures and other actions, which adversely affects a student's learning environment or results in disparate treatment based upon their immutable characteristics such as sex, race, color, ethnic background, national origin, religion, gender, creed, age, citizenship, or disability.
- ~~8.7.~~ Harassment: Unwelcome conduct of an offensive nature that is demeaning or derisive or occurs substantially because of ~~the~~ race, color, ethnic background, national origin, religion, gender, creed, age, citizenship or disability and which creates a hostile educational environment. Harassment shall include one or more of the three levels described below. If conduct is clearly offensive, only one incident may be necessary to establish harassment:
 - a. Level One—Generalized Harassment: Includes intentional behavior directed at an entire group ~~which that~~ is based on demeaning or derisive stereotypes, and is so severe or pervasive that it creates a hostile learning environment.
Examples include comments or jokes, physical gestures or visual displays such as posters, etc.

- b. Level Two—Individually Targeted Harassment: Includes intentional, non-criminal behavior ~~which~~ that is targeted at an individual or particular members of a group, which can be verbal, physical or visual that is so severe or pervasive that it adversely affects the learning environment.

Examples include negative or offensive comments, jokes, suggestions or gestures directed to an individual's or group's race, color, ethnic background, national origin, religion, gender, creed, age, citizenship or disability~~race, ethnicity or national origin.~~

- c. Level Three—Criminal Harassment: Harassing behavior which violates state or federal criminal statutes.

Examples include criminal harassment, criminal assault, sexual assault, rape, criminal mischief, stalking, arson, or trespass.

- 8. Respondent: A person named in a discrimination complaint as having engaged in or being responsible for, a discriminatory act or omission.

- 109. Retaliation: Any form or sanction, restraint, coercion, discrimination or adverse treatment against a person because that person has asserted, or has assisted another person to assert, a discrimination complaint in either a formal or informal manner with the District, or with any state or federal agency, or because that person has testified, assisted or participated in any manner in an investigation, proceeding or hearing related to a discrimination complaint.

- 104. Sexual Harassment: Matters pertaining to sexual harassment that do not meet the definition outlined in Jordan School District's Title IX Sexual Harassment policy or otherwise do not occur in an educational program or activity or do not occur against a person within the United States, will be referred by the Title IX Coordinator to the appropriate school administrator for investigation and adjudication under this policy after the case is officially dismissed under the District's Title IX Policy.

~~A form of sex (gender) discrimination. It consists of unwelcome sexual advances, requests for sexual favors, and/or other verbal or physical conduct of a sexual nature that is based on one or more of the following conditions.~~

- ~~a. Submission to such conduct is made either explicitly or implicitly as a term or condition to educational benefit.~~
- ~~b. Submission to or rejection of such conduct by a student is used as the basis for decisions affecting the student's educational program.~~
- ~~e. Such conduct has the purpose or effect of unreasonably interfering with a student's educational performance or creating an intimidating, hostile, or offensive learning environment.~~
- ~~d. There are two types of sexual harassment:~~
 - a. i. Sexual Misconduct: Unwelcome sexual actions or conduct either non-physical or physical, that is offensive to the sensibilities of any person, including sexual advances, lewd gestures, and words or other communication of sexual nature, that has the effect of threatening or intimidating the person against whom such conduct is directed, but does not meet the definition of sexual harassment under the District's Title IX Sexual Harassment policy.

~~b. Hostile Environment: The three levels of hostile environment are the same as those listed for other harassment; e.g., generalized harassment, individually targeted harassment, and criminal harassment. 6. Discrimination: Conduct, including words or gestures and other actions, which adversely affects a student's learning environment or results in disparate treatment based upon their immutable characteristics such as sex, race, color, ethnic background, national origin, religion, gender, creed, age, citizenship, or disability.
7. Harassment: Unwelcome conduct of an offensive nature that is demeaning or derisive or occurs substantially because of race, color, ethnic background, national origin, religion, gender, creed, age, citizenship or disability and which creates a hostile educational environment. Harassment shall include one or more of the three levels described below. If conduct is clearly offensive, only one incident may be necessary to establish harassment:
 - a. Level One—Generalized Harassment: Includes intentional behavior directed at an entire group that is based on demeaning or derisive stereotypes, and is so severe or pervasive that it creates a hostile learning environment.
Examples include comments or jokes, physical gestures or visual displays such as posters, etc.
 - b. Level Two—Individually Targeted Harassment: Includes intentional, non-criminal behavior that is targeted at an individual or particular members of a group, which can be verbal, physical or visual that is so severe or pervasive that it adversely affects the learning environment.

Examples include negative or offensive comments, jokes, suggestions or gestures directed to an individual's or group's race, color, ethnic background, national origin, religion, gender, creed, age, citizenship or disability.

- c. Level Three—Criminal Harassment: Harassing behavior that violates state or federal criminal statutes.

Examples include criminal harassment, criminal assault, sexual assault, rape, criminal mischief, stalking, arson, or trespass.

- 8. Respondent: A person named in a discrimination complaint as having engaged in or being responsible for, a discriminatory act or omission.
- 9. Retaliation: Any form or sanction, restraint, coercion, discrimination or adverse treatment against a person because that person has asserted, or has assisted another person to assert, a discrimination complaint in either a formal or informal manner with the District, or with any state or federal agency, or because that person has testified, assisted or participated in any manner in an investigation, proceeding or hearing related to a discrimination complaint.
- 10. Sexual Harassment: Matters pertaining to sexual harassment that do not meet the definition outlined in Jordan School District's [Title IX Sexual Harassment policy](#) or otherwise do not occur in an educational program or activity or do not occur against a person within the United States, will be referred by the Title IX Coordinator to the appropriate school administrator for investigation and adjudication under this policy after the case is officially dismissed under the District's [Title IX Policy](#).

Sexual Misconduct: Unwelcome sexual actions or conduct either non-physical or physical, that is offensive to the sensibilities of any person, including sexual advances, lewd gestures, and words or other communication of a sexual nature, that has the effect of threatening or intimidating the person against whom such conduct is directed, but does not meet the definition of sexual harassment under the District's [Title IX Sexual Harassment policy](#).
- 12. Hostile Environment: Unwelcome conduct directed toward a particular person or persons, based in whole or in part upon protected status (race, color, ethnic background, national origin, religion, gender, creed, age, citizenship or disability), that is unwelcome, severe, pervasive or objectively offensive, that it interferes with the target person's academic pursuits or participation in school/District-sponsored activities. A hostile environment is one that a reasonable person in similar circumstances and with similar identities would find hostile, intimidating, or abusive and objectively offensive. An isolated incident, unless sufficiently severe, does not constitute a hostile environment.

B. Complaint Procedure

A. Definitions

1. Clearly Offensive Conduct: That conduct, be it verbal or nonverbal, which when perceived in its overall context, would be taken by a reasonable person, similarly situated, to be strongly objectionable.
2. Complainant: A person who files a written or oral complaint about unlawful discrimination or harassment.
3. Compliance Officer: Person or persons designated by the Superintendent to receive and process complaints of unlawful discrimination or harassment (harassment or discrimination based on membership in a protected category, i.e., race, color, sex, pregnancy, childbirth or pregnancy-related conditions, religion, national origin, age (if the individual is 40 years of age or older), disability, sexual orientation or gender identity).
4. Demeaning or Derisive Behavior: Unlawful behavior which substantially lowers the status, dignity or standing of another individual, or which insults or otherwise belittles or shows contempt for another individual.
5. Disability: An individual's physical or mental impairment that substantially limits one or more major life activities, a record of such an impairment, or being regarded as having such an impairment.
6. Discrimination: Conduct, including words or gestures and other actions, which adversely affects an employee's working environment or results in disparate treatment based upon membership in a protected category (i.e., race, color, sex, pregnancy, childbirth or pregnancy-related conditions, religion, national origin, age (if the individual is 40 years of age or older), disability, sexual orientation or gender identity). Discrimination does not include referral to or use of regular District Administration processes relating to employee evaluation and discipline.

7. Harassment: A form of discrimination that includes unlawful conduct of an offensive nature that is demeaning or derisive or occurs substantially because of the employee's membership in a protected category (i.e., race, color, sex, pregnancy, childbirth or pregnancy-related conditions, religion, national origin, age (if the individual is 40 years of age or older), disability, sexual orientation or gender identity) and which creates a hostile work environment. Harassment may include but is not limited to any of the three categories listed below:
 - a. Generalized Harassment: Includes intentional behavior directed at an entire group that is based on demeaning or derisive stereotypes, and is severe enough that it creates a hostile working environment.
Examples include comments or jokes, physical gestures or visual displays such as posters, etc.
 - b. Individually Targeted Harassment: Includes intentional, criminal or non-criminal behavior that is targeted at an individual or particular members of a group, which can be verbal, physical or visual that is severe enough or pervasive enough that it adversely affects the working environment. Examples include negative or offensive comments, jokes, suggestions or gestures directed to an individual's or group's race, ethnicity or national origin.
 - c. Criminal Harassment: Harassing behavior that violates state or federal criminal statutes.
Examples include criminal assault, sexual assault, rape, criminal mischief, stalking, arson or trespass.
8. Respondent: A person named in a discrimination or harassment complaint as having engaged in or being responsible for a discriminatory or harassing act or omission.
9. Retaliation: Any form or sanction, restraint, coercion, discrimination, harassment, or adverse treatment against a person because that person has asserted, or has assisted another person to assert, a discrimination or harassment complaint in either a formal or informal manner with the District, or with any state or federal agency, or because that person has testified, assisted or participated in any manner in an investigation, proceeding or hearing related to a discrimination or harassment complaint.
10. Sexual Harassment: All complaints of sexual harassment should be directed first to the Title IX Coordinator for a preliminary jurisdictional review. If the complaint falls under Title IX jurisdiction, it shall be addressed through policy [AA452 — Title IX Sexual Harassment](#). If it does not fall under Title IX jurisdiction, the complaint shall be dismissed for purposes of Title IX and directed back to Human Resources for investigation pursuant to this policy.
Sexual harassment is a form of sex discrimination. It consists of unwelcome sexual advances, requests for sexual favors, and/or other verbal or physical conduct of a sexual nature that is based on one or more of the following conditions:
 - a. Submission to such conduct is made either explicitly or implicitly as a term or condition to work benefit.
 - b. Submission to or rejection of such conduct by a co-worker is used as the basis for decisions affecting the work environment.
 - c. Such conduct has the purpose or effect of unreasonably interfering with an employee's work performance or creating an intimidating, hostile, or offensive working environment.

- d. Sexual harassment includes:
 - 1) Hostile Environment: The three levels of hostile environment are the same as those listed above in 7. a.-c.; e.g., generalized harassment, individually targeted harassment, and criminal harassment.
 - 2) Harassment which culminates in a tangible action that alters the conditions of the working environment (previously called quid pro quo).

B. Complaint Procedure

- 1. The following options are available for those who believe they are victims of discrimination or harassment, or who witness such acts:
 - a. Seek to resolve issue through a supervisor or administrative personnel.
 - b. Report the concern by calling the District Non-Compliance Hotline or completing the form on the [District Non-compliance webpage](#).
 - c. Register a formal complaint with the District Compliance Officer who will initiate an initial assessment and possible investigation.
- 2. Any employee who knows of a violation of this policy must report such conduct to a supervisor, administrator, or the District Compliance Officer.
- 3. The initial allegation of discrimination or harassment may be submitted either verbally or in writing to the immediate supervisor/administrator. A complaint made to the District Compliance Officer must be in writing.

C. Investigative Procedures

- 1. Initial Assessment: When any complaint is filed under this policy or when a complaint is referred through this policy from the Title IX Team, an initial assessment is conducted to determine whether the reported conduct falls under the scope of this policy.
 - a. This assessment involves a preliminary review of the details provided in the complaint to decide if the alleged conduct, if proven true, would constitute a violation of this policy.
 - i. If the alleged conduct would not (even if proven true) constitute a violation of this policy, the matter will be dismissed in favor of Human Resources assistance, such as mediation or other policy involvement.
 - ii. If the alleged conduct would constitute a violation of this policy, the matter will be assigned for investigation.
- 2. If an investigation reveals evidence of criminal conduct, the matter will be referred to local law enforcement for criminal investigation. The District will conduct its own internal investigation independent of law enforcement officials to determine whether District policy was violated.
- 3. All investigations will be treated with discretion to protect the privacy of those involved. All efforts will be made to treat the information as confidential; however, absolute confidentiality of all information obtained through an investigation cannot be guaranteed.

SUBJECT: EMPLOYEE DISCRIMINATION AND HARASSMENT

4. The respondent (person alleged to have engaged in the reported conduct) may not contact the complainant during an investigation without the permission of District.
5. When conducting investigations, the District Compliance Officer shall disclose his/her role as a neutral investigator rather than an advocate for any party. The extent of the investigation will be determined, among other factors, by the nature and severity of the charges.
6. An investigation shall be completed with fairness and reasonable speed, typically within 30 working days of receipt of the complaint, unless extenuating circumstances require a longer period.
7. After the conclusion of the investigation, the District Compliance Officer shall provide all parties a written disposition of the complaint.
8. The parties will then have 10 working days to provide written responses to the report and have them considered by the District Compliance Officer.

D. Disciplinary Procedures

Any employee who has been found in violation of this policy will be subject to the following disciplinary procedures:

1. A first substantiated offense, if minor in nature, will result in a written reprimand to be entered in the employee's personnel file. Should the first offense be determined to be of a serious nature, the employee will be subject to disciplinary action up to and including termination in accordance with District Policy [DP316 NEG – Orderly Termination Procedures](#).
2. A second substantiated offense shall result in disciplinary action up to and including termination in accordance with District Policy [DP316 NEG – Orderly Termination Procedures](#).

E. Retaliation

Retaliation under this policy is prohibited. Individuals found to have engaged in retaliatory conduct will face disciplinary action, up to and including termination in accordance with District Policy [DP316 NEG – Orderly Termination Procedures](#).

F. Records

Records of all discrimination or harassment complaints shall be maintained by the District. Information gathered, developed, and documented in the investigation will be classified as a protected record.

G. Outside Reporting Procedures

Nothing in this policy shall prohibit a person from filing a discrimination or harassment claim with Utah Anti-Discrimination and Labor Division (UALD) or the Equal Opportunity Commission (EEOC). If an employee pursues a claim of discrimination or harassment, he/she should be aware that Utah is a “dual filing” state, which means that a complaint filed with the UALD will be forwarded to the EEOC. An employee has 180 calendar days from the alleged date of discrimination or harassment to file a claim with the UALD.

- a. Generalized Harassment: Includes intentional behavior directed at an entire group that is based on demeaning or derisive stereotypes, and is severe enough that it creates a hostile working environment.

10. Sexual Harassment: All complaints of sexual harassment should be directed first to the Title IX Coordinator for a preliminary jurisdictional review. If the complaint falls under Title IX jurisdiction, it shall be addressed through policy AA452 — Title IX Sexual Harassment. If it does not fall under Title IX jurisdiction, the complaint shall be dismissed for purposes of Title IX and directed back to Human Resources for investigation pursuant to this policy.

4. ~~Complaints to the District compliance officer must be made within 180 calendar days after the date of the alleged act of discrimination or harassment. The Board has the right to extend the 180 day deadline if circumstances are warranted.~~

C. Investigative Procedures

1. Initial Assessment: When any complaint is filed under this policy or when a complaint is referred through this policy from the Title IX Team, an initial assessment is conducted to determine whether the reported conduct falls under the scope of this policy.
 - a. This assessment involves a preliminary review of the details provided in the complaint to decide if the alleged conduct, if proven true, would constitute a violation of this policy.
 - i. If the alleged conduct would not (even if proven true) constitute a violation of this policy, the matter will be dismissed in favor of Human Resources assistance, such as mediation or other policy involvement.
 - ii. If the alleged conduct would constitute a violation of this policy, the matter will be assigned for investigation.
2. If an investigation reveals evidence of criminal conduct, the matter will be referred to local law enforcement for criminal investigation. The District will conduct its own internal investigation independent of law enforcement officials to determine whether District policy was violated.

- 32. All investigations will be treated with discretion to protect the privacy of those involved. All efforts will be made to treat the information as confidential; however, absolute confidentiality of all information obtained through an investigation cannot be guaranteed.

D. **Disciplinary Procedures**

Any employee who has been found in violation of this policy will be subject to the following disciplinary procedures:

- 1. A first substantiated offense, if minor in nature, will result in a written reprimand to be entered in the employee's personnel file. Should the first offense be determined to be of a serious nature, the employee will be subject to disciplinary action up to and including termination in accordance with District Policy [DP316 NEG – Orderly Termination Procedures](#).
- 2. A second substantiated offense shall result in disciplinary action up to and including termination in accordance with District Policy [DP316 NEG – Orderly Termination Procedures](#).

E. **Retaliation**

Retaliation under this policy is prohibited. Individuals found to have engaged in retaliatory conduct will face disciplinary action, up to and including termination in accordance with District Policy [DP316 NEG – Orderly Termination Procedures](#).

F. **Records**

Records of all discrimination or harassment complaints shall be maintained by the District. Information gathered, developed, and documented in the investigation will be classified as a protected record.

G. **Outside Reporting Procedures**

Nothing in this policy shall prohibit a person from filing a discrimination or harassment claim with Utah Anti-Discrimination and Labor Division (UALD) or the Equal Opportunity Commission (EEOC). If an employee pursues a claim of discrimination or harassment, he/she should be aware that Utah is a “dual filing”

Jordan District schools are to provide a safe, positive, inclusive and healthy in-person or virtual educational environment where academic learning, personal development, and accomplishment can flourish. Part of the educational process is learning self-discipline and appropriate behavior. Therefore, it is the philosophy of the Jordan School District Board of Education to enforce all Utah laws related to conduct on school premises and school buses and to see that students are taught to preserve public property including all school facilities and equipment.

The Board also recognizes that dress and appearance seriously affect the behavior of students attending school or school sponsored activities and may also impact health, sanitation and safety conditions. Because experience has demonstrated that the learning atmosphere is improved when students both look and act appropriately, the Board hereby authorizes establishment of standards of student conduct, dress, and appearance. The Board delegates to the Administration responsibility to see that each school adheres to the conduct, dress, and appearance standards established in the provisions of this policy in a consistent manner. Further, all District and school staff members shall have a share of responsibility in seeing that these standards are implemented and enforced in classrooms, in school buildings, on school grounds, on school buses, at school activities, and other occasions as appropriate. With the approval of district administration and the School Community Council, schools may make minor changes and/or adaptations to the dress and appearance standards in order to address local needs. Schools should seek input from various stakeholder groups.

II. Administrative Policy

The Administration shall implement Board philosophy according to the following administrative policy provisions:

A. Definitions

1. “Conduct” means the act, manner, or process in which a person behaves on a particular occasion or in a particular context.
2. “Disruption” means any action, disturbance, problem, or reaction which materially or substantially interrupts an event, activity or process, or causes school personnel to lose the attention of the students, to modify or cease any instruction or school activity, or to deal with student confrontations or complaints.

1. Conduct, dress and appearance are to adhere to the provisions in this policy and be appropriate for a ceremony of this nature.
2. Graduates are expected to wear the prescribed cap and gown without alterations.
3. Graduates will be allowed to wear recognized items of religious or cultural significance in a dignified manner.
4. Formal, semi-formal, or customary dress attire is appropriate for a commencement ceremony.
5. School issued and approved tassels, sashes, pins, hoods, cowls, mantles, cords, insignias, or medals signifying achievement, honor, participation, membership, or recognition may be worn.

Virtual graduation commencement ceremonies or events are school sponsored activities. Student conduct, dress, and appearance standards are contained in II.A-C above and are under the direction of the school administration.
