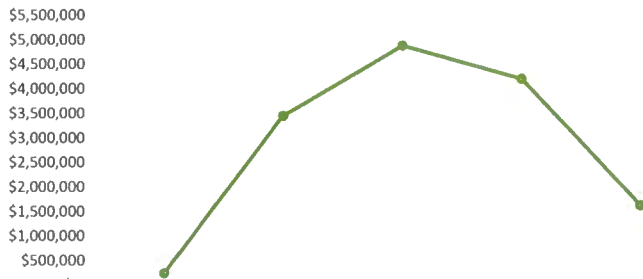

SUBJECT: Consider Board of Trustee approval to participate in the Seamless Summer Option (SSO) Program.

RATIONALE: The 2026 Seamless Summer Option (SSO) will operate from June 1, 2026 to July 31, 2026.

The SSO combines features of the National School Lunch Program (NSLP), the School Breakfast Program (SBP) and the SFSP regulations. The SSO reduces paperwork and the administration burden that is normally associated with operating three different programs.

The objective of the SSO Program is to provide free nutritious meals to all children in our school district during the summer months when schools are generally closed. Our children need nutritious meals to learn, grow, and thrive—even when school is out. Summer sites play a valuable role by offering nutritious meals to children and teens ages 18 and younger and enrolled students with disabilities up to 21 years old.

Children between the ages of 1 and 18 years old may participate in the program. Meals provided through this program are reported to TDA for reimbursement. USDA commodities may be used in the preparation of these meals.

The summer program will be located at Huntsville Elementary, Mance Park Middle School, Huntsville High School, and the Green Hornet route will be Martin Luther King Center (Boys and Girls Club), Eastham-Thomason Park, Huntsville Public Library, Cogan's Grove, University Heights and Riverside Baptist.

The program will run concurrently with summer school. Breakfast will be served from 7:30 a.m. to 8:30 a.m. and lunch will be served from 11:30 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. Information about the program will be posted and advertised on the May menus and in the local media.

The SSO is part of the contract with Sodexo.

GOAL: Maintain standards for technology, and upgrade current technology and infrastructure.

OBJECTIVE: Operate and secure Huntsville ISD's network.

SUBJECT: Consider Board approval for the purchase of new switches, WAPs, UPS, and licensing to support HISD campuses.

RATIONALE: State law requires an approved method for acquisition of goods or services totaling \$50,000 or more for a 12-month period.

Technology solicited competitive bids to replace a subsection of the district's aging network switches, wireless access points (WAPs), and uninterruptible power supplies (UPS), as well as to procure the required licensing for the next five years. This project will be funded through USAC (E-rate) at an 85% discount for eligible items.

The total project cost is \$891,131.92, of which \$34,333.45 is classified as non-E-rate-eligible. Huntsville ISD is therefore responsible for 15% of the E-rate-eligible amount of \$856,798.47, which totals \$128,519.77, plus the \$34,333.45 in non-eligible expenses. This results in a total district cost of approximately **\$162,853.22** of budgeted funds. Based on the approved bid evaluation process, the contract has been awarded to **Netsync Network Solutions**.

RECOMMENDATION: Administration recommends the Huntsville Independent School District Board of Trustees approve for the district to purchase 18 new switches with licensing, 190 new Wireless Access Points with licensing, 62 new UPS', stacking cables and a total of 878 various licensing renewals for existing hardware throughout the District.

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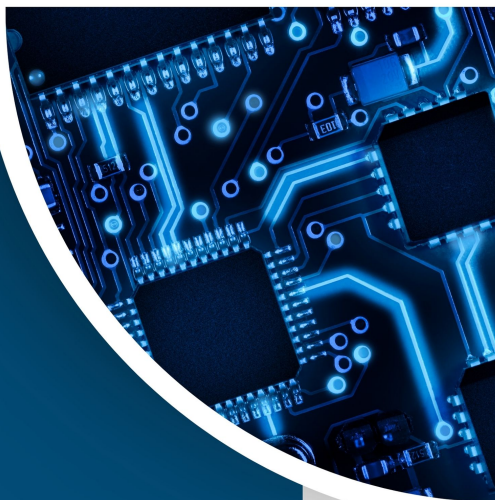

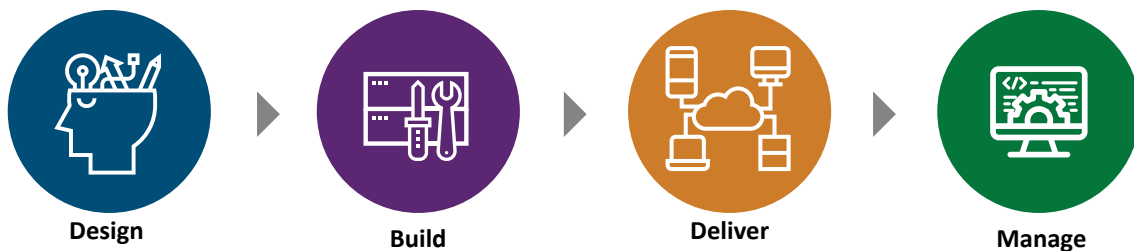

4. Technical Response

Huntsville ISD (“District”), headquartered in Huntsville, TX, requested that Netsync Network Solutions (“Netsync”) submit a statement of work (SOW) outlining District’s upcoming RFP 260006904 - Huntsville ISD project for District’s Request For Proposal (RFP) and FCC Form 470 Application No. 260006904.

The purpose of this project is to configure and install the switches, wireless access points (APs) and UPS units across multiple sites for the Huntsville Independent School District as highlighted in the [Appendix](#).

Exceptions, Clarifications, and Assumptions

The primary focus of this section is to provide any exceptions Netsync took to the original RFP, as well as clarifications around our proposal. This section will also outline any assumptions Netsync made while creating the design.

Netsync has responded to the bid with pricing based on the information provided in the RFP and addendum. Please pay special attention to the exceptions and clarifications outlined below. Also note that the project counts per location are outlined in a table within the [Appendix](#) at the end of this SOW.

- If selected, Netsync will require a review of the design and bill of materials (BOM) in detail with District to verify that all of the components selected meet the project requirements. This will help ensure the equipment list and quantities support the best possible design.
- Netsync will work with District to make sure all assumptions, exceptions, and clarifications listed below and determined during discovery are accepted and agreed upon before final pricing.
- Netsync provided pricing for the specific quantities requested in the RFP. The RFP states that the quantities included are estimates. If additional quantities are needed, then these can be purchased for the unit cost provided within the proposal plus the associated labor to install.
- Multiple outages may occur due to the nature of this project; however, they will all occur at scheduled and approved times.
- Netsync is not responsible for project delays caused by other vendors and/or manufacturing issues that may impede progress of Netsync deliverables.
- Netsync is not responsible for configuration changes on any equipment not specifically stated in the SOW.

Network Implementation

- Netsync assumes all the following will be provided by District unless otherwise noted in the SOW and/or [Appendix](#):
 - All structured, fiber and copper patch cabling.
 - Racks and patch panels.
 - Netsync will require a **breakdown of equipment delivery per site** to properly coordinate logistics and ensure accurate shipment scheduling.
 - Since **switch counts per IDF are currently unknown**, Netsync cannot right-size the **length of stacking cables** until detailed site information is provided. For quoting purposes, Netsync has included the stacking cable sizes to match District’s requirement.

- Netsync is assuming that District will be responsible for providing any necessary patch cables or single mode fiber jumpers.
- Fiber and copper patch cables were not requested as part of this RFP, so have not been included in our proposal.

Wireless Implementation

- If there are any locations that will require mounting the AP higher than 12 feet at any of the other locations, there will be additional charges for a mechanical lift unless District has a lift for use.
- The RFP did not specify any outdoor wireless coverage areas and are not included in this Statement of Work. If it is determined that outdoor wireless coverage is required, Netsync will work with District to determine the appropriate hardware requirements and labor needed to implement and additional project pricing will be provided.
- The RFP did not specify if the AP CW91761 is a replacement project. For this project Netsync assumes this is a fresh install and will not require removal of any old wireless APs.
- The wireless placement design was not created by Netsync, therefore Netsync is not responsible for any design related issues and cannot guarantee coverage in all desired areas. For the ideal design and coverage, Netsync recommends performing a wireless site survey before implementation to create the ideal placement design.
- The RFP did not specify the indoor location specific mounting requirements. An internal antenna AP is typically mounted horizontally on a ceiling grid at approximately 10 feet. For any AP that cannot be mounted in the typical format, there may be a more ideal model of AP, antenna or additional mounting hardware required.
- If awarded, Netsync would like to review all placement locations with District and provide recommendations to help ensure the models purchased support the best possible design. It is District's responsibility to notify Netsync before ordering if any locations exist where APs cannot be mounted in a typical format.
- After wireless LAN (WLAN) system turn-up, there will be a period of RF self-tuning. During this time, District should expect non-optimal coverage, performance, and District connectivity. The expected duration of this self-tuning period should be three to five business days.
- The level of effort in this SOW does/does not cover the implementation of 6Ghz wireless.
- The accuracy of the wireless design is contingent upon the quality and completeness of the floor plans (blueprints or CAD files) and information provided by the customer. This includes, but is not limited to, details regarding special-use areas, physical obstructions, construction materials, and anticipated high-density user zones. Inaccurate or incomplete information may impact the effectiveness of the final design.
- The introduction of the 6 GHz (WiFi6E/WiFi7) band requires careful RF planning and design to ensure optimal performance, coverage, and compliance. Netsync **will not** include 6 GHz as part of this engagement.

UPS and Power Systems Implementation

- Netsync assumes all of the following will be provided for the UPS units:

- District has validated the input and output power connectors for all UPS are compatible with available outlet receptacles and equipment power cord types (110v/208v) electrical power outlets (Plug type)
- The correct type and quantity of power outlets are available in each MDF/IDF. District has requested the correct rack mount hardware for each device.
- District requested extra UPS models that did not have any install location associated. A TBD site has been added to account for the installation of those units

- Prepare a low-level design (LLD) for the planned configurations of all wireless and switching for review and sign-off with District.
- Perform burn-in testing and asset tagging, inventory hardware, upgrade code to District's current version, configure equipment listed in the [Appendix](#) at a Netsync integration center.
- Configure and install access switches as listed in the [Appendix](#).
- Configure and install APs as listed in the [Appendix](#).
- Configure and install UPS units as listed in the [Appendix](#).
- Perform testing and validation of successful implementation.
- Provide up to 2 hours of Day 1 support per site.

Discovery

Note: Netsync will configure the wireless to match District's current configuration. A wireless redesign and/or configuration changes are outside the scope of this project.

1. District will provide Netsync:
 - a. Wireless AP placement diagrams notating clearly:
 - i. New AP placement locations.
 - b. Any necessary floor plans to be used for placement maps within management dashboards.
 - c. API keys to the existing management dashboard.
 - d. Configuration details for existing wireless network.

Note: Netsync assumes this is a fresh install and will not require removal of any old wireless APs.

2. Netsync will work with District to review wireless configurations and security capabilities of the existing environment, including but not limited to:
 - a. Work with District to understand and implement its current IP addressing scheme.
 - b. Review wireless AP naming convention.
 - c. AP configuration (SSIDs, VLANs, security, RF settings, etc.).
 - d. Type of District devices wi-fi generation and capabilities
 - e. Network capacity requirements, performance requirements, accessibility/reliability requirements, infrastructure management, and District management.
3. Netsync will work with District to review the desired placement locations of the requested APs.

Note: The desired AP placement has been previously completed by District. Therefore, RF design is not required or included as part of this SOW.

9. Netsync will determine a wireless test plan with District. District will be responsible for testing applications, services, and end user devices that should be tested before and after cutover.
10. Netsync will review the finalized a project plan and LLD with District before beginning implementation.

Note: District will provide a lift for any locations over 12ft.

Equipment Receipt, Staging, and Delivery

Staging and implementation will only begin with District approval of the Low-Level Design (LLD) document. Staging excludes any uninterruptible power supply (UPS) devices, batteries, and IP-related information. If applicable, Netsync will complete UPS deployment on site at District installation location(s).

1. Netsync will receive equipment in its own facility, unbox equipment, install configurations and test for any anomalies, replace any equipment that does not burn in correctly, notify District of any additional needs that are discovered during the burn-in process, and prepare equipment for delivery to each respective location.
2. Netsync will tag each device with a District asset tag and add to an inventory spreadsheet.
3. Netsync will provide inside-delivery of equipment to each respective location. Netsync may choose to deliver the equipment before installation (no more than three weeks in advance) or bring the equipment at the time of installation. Netsync will not deliver any equipment without prior written approval from District. If District chooses to pre-deliver the equipment, then it will provide a secured location for storage until installation.
4. This location must be accessible to Netsync employees for staging and configuration needs.

Implementation

Implementation will begin only after Discovery and Planning are 100% complete. District representative must be onsite to receive hardware and sign packing slip prior to installation.

Netsync will perform a full implementation at an initial site per the steps outlined below. We will then allow up to two weeks to fully test the configuration settings and make any changes as deemed necessary by District or Netsync. At the end of the test period, the implementation plan will be updated to include any changes found and will be signed off on by Netsync and District to use at all remaining sites. Implementation at the remainder of the sites will begin only after the test site has been completed and the final configuration is signed off on.

Network Switches Implementation

1. Netsync will install the switches listed in the [Appendix](#) into existing equipment rack location or area designated by District.
2. Netsync will configure the Cisco switches to include:
 - a. Patch-in drops and fiber.
 - b. Properly dress cables with Velcro.
 - c. Configure switches based on configuration standards based on LLD.
3. Perform testing:
 - a. Validate testing steps based on District approved test plan.
4. Netsync will decommission existing switches:
 - a. Uninstall existing switches determined during the planning stage.
 - b. Provide an inventory of equipment removed in a data file.
 - c. Box the older equipment and label boxes clearly to note included contents.
 - d. Deliver boxes to a centralized District location.

Wireless Access Point (AP) Implementation

1. Netsync will install and configure the new Cisco Meraki wireless APs to include:
 - a. Mount APs per the AP placement maps created during Discovery.
 - b. Label each AP based on placement location and include placement details in the Inventory spreadsheet.
 - c. Verify APs are registered to the Cisco Meraki Dashboard and functioning correctly.
2. Netsync will place site-specific APs in appropriate locations on outdoor maps.
3. Netsync will perform testing:
 - a. District connectivity to District-designated configured SSID determined in technical discovery.
 - b. All deployed APs join the Cisco Meraki Dashboard (verify with District).
 - c. Radio up/down state of all deployed APs.
 - d. Validate any other testing steps determined during Planning.
 - e. Collect approved and accurate floor plans for each building.

Uninterruptible Power Supply (UPS) Implementation

1. Netsync will install UPS devices into existing equipment racks and secure to rack using two-post rack mount kits.

Note: District will be responsible for providing the correct power outlets in each network closet to power the UPS devices.

2. Netsync will configure the UPS devices, including:
 - a. Connect network devices to UPS.
 - b. Install Network Management Card.
 - c. IP address for management.
 - d. Test and validate each UPS for proper functionality.

Testing and Validation

1. Netsync will perform Testing and Validation as agreed on during the Technical Review and Design meeting.

Knowledge Transfer

Note: Due to the nature of this project, knowledge transfer hours are not included in this SOW.

Project Prerequisites

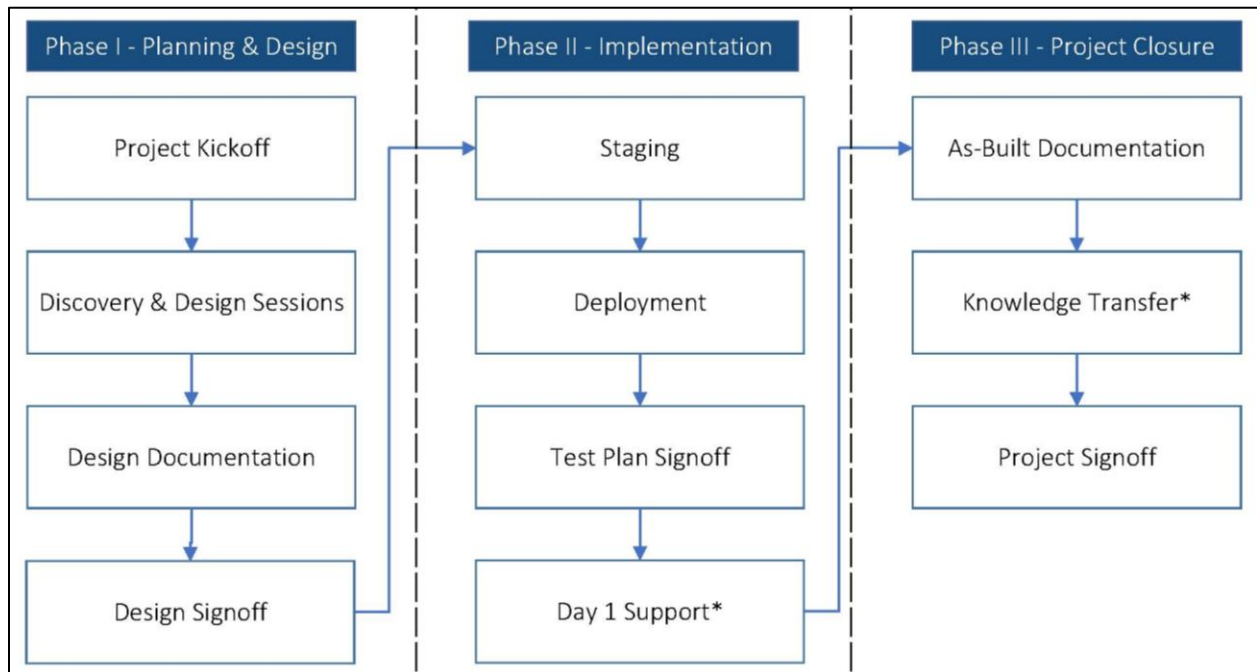
1. District will fulfill cabling requirements, if applicable.

- Ensure that accurate and timely status updates, action items, and scheduled tasks are received by the assigned resource(s) and uploaded as entries to District’s applicable project portal. The PM will ensure status information clearly reaches District to also include milestone updates.
- Lead project meetings with District and the Netsync project team.
- Oversee a quality assurance review of documentation-based deliverables before providing to District.

If such acknowledgement is not received within this period, then all deliverables will be deemed acknowledged and accepted.

Project Risks and Assumptions

1. District will participate in all design and planning sessions and be prepared to sign off on all milestones.
2. District will provide Netsync with full access to the relevant functional, technical, and business resources with adequate skills and knowledge to support the performance of services. If District's only method of providing Netsync remote access is through screen share, then additional fees may apply due to project duration extensions.

It is our goal to finish with professionalism, discipline, relationships, and HIGH EXPECTATIONS of ourselves and others!

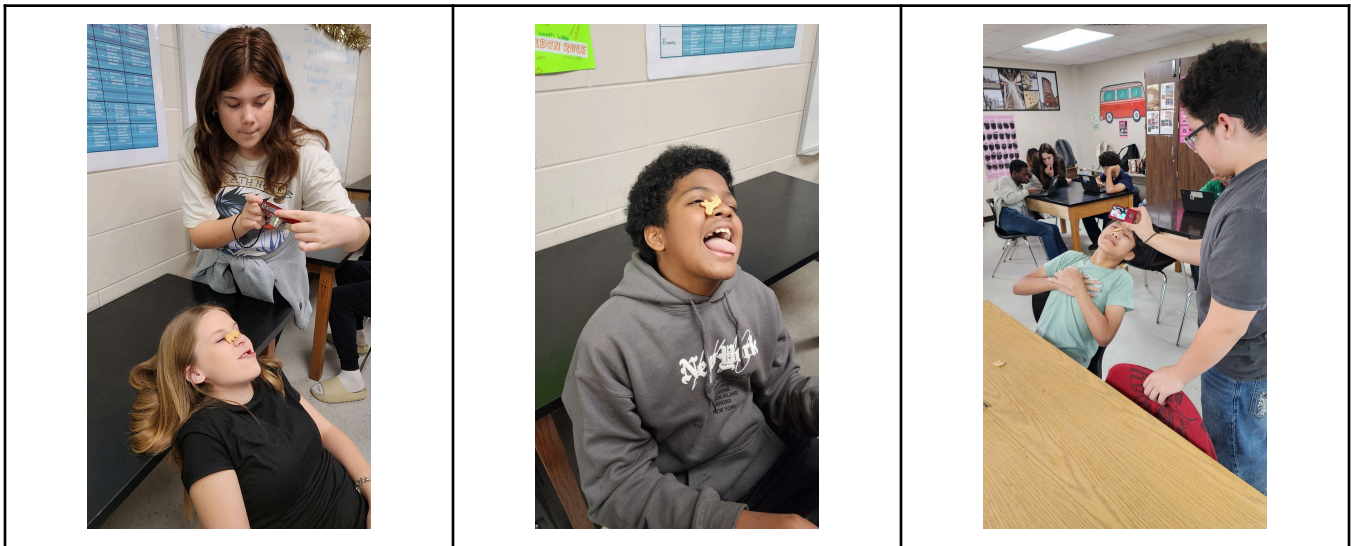
