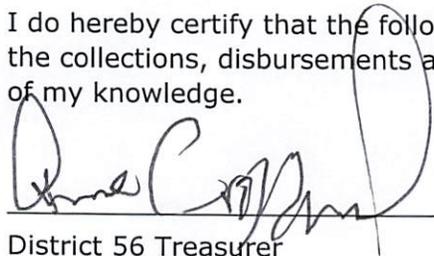

In Math, we are in year two of implementing *HMH Into Math*. Teachers have been collaborating closely with ESU 4 as part of the Math Acceleration Project, focusing on lesson structure, questioning strategies, and data-driven instruction. We will continue this work on Friday during our PLC. Additionally, our work through the CLSD grant is in full swing, FCMS staff are actively working to improve literacy outcomes. Our team is working closely with DMG (District Management Group) to refine intervention structures and strengthen data interpretation practices. Continuous Improvement

Career Academy:

- FCHS students are enrolled in 146 college courses this fall.
- 54% of seniors and 56% of juniors are taking at least one college course
- By taking these courses through FCHS, students save BIG. The total cost of the classes to our students is \$19,300. If these students took the exact same classes on SCC's campus or after they graduate the cost would be \$53,874. If they took these classes at the state colleges the total cost would be \$142,350. (Peru, Wayne, Chadron) If they took these same classes at UNL the cost would have been \$207,174 dollars.
- When you couple the savings to families along with the fact that by starting to take college classes in High School Falls City families are saving even more money. By taking classes in High School, these students will complete a degree faster if they decide to pursue a degree. That means less room and board and entering the job market at an accelerated rate.
- We currently have students taking classes in the following subjects through SCC. We had students drop 10 classes from the original 146 (this is common). The number of students in each class as of 10/9/25 is behind each class:
