2. Reports, Communications & Public Participation

Cindy Huff and Gavin Harsh from McCook Community Foundation (MCF) were present to address the Board. Cindy is the chair of the MCF Fund, is a long-time educator and is passionate about McCook, kids, and education. MCF has an unrestricted endowment fund of over four million dollars which generates around one hundred thousand dollars annually to give back to the community and area. MCF is looking for partners to assist them in making this a decade for McCook. They are looking innovative ideas to fund and will consider multi-year and large funding requests. Dream Big, Share the Dream. No limits. Looking for impactful grants.

4. Reports from Staff Members and Committees

Tom Bredvick reported that the Finance Committee met to review the budget that is being proposed tonight. And that Mr. Brazell and Mr. Norgaard met with the non-finance committee members to share the same information. The goal of the meeting was to review the budget and provide feedback. The results are in the presented budget.

Loretta Hauxwell reported that the policy committee met. They reviewed the Title IX policy that is being presented for approval tonight. Craig Dickes, Assistant High School Principal was instrumental in putting this policy together. There was a lot of information provided on Title IX and the policy represents the requirements needed for McCook.

5. Board and Administrative Comments

In Business Manager comments Mr. Brazell reported School Board Area Membership Meeting is coming up. Board Members should have received an email with the details.

McCook has been looking at an activity bus with a wheelchair lift. The first one the district looked at was a 2007 MCI with 585,000 miles for a cost of \$146,000 and did not meet our expectations. The next one is a 2015 MCI with 180,000 miles and a cost of \$326,500. This is a much better bus and one we feel confident will be in the fleet for many years. After discussion the board agreed to have this on the agenda for consideration at the October Board Meeting.

Mr. Brazell also discussed the continuation of the Summer Food Service Program (SFSP) that was extended to the end of December. The announcement of the continuation came on Aug 31 after the district had already started school with the regular National School Lunch Program (NSLP). McCook Public Schools will transition back to the SFSP and be able to offer free meals to all students starting on September 21.

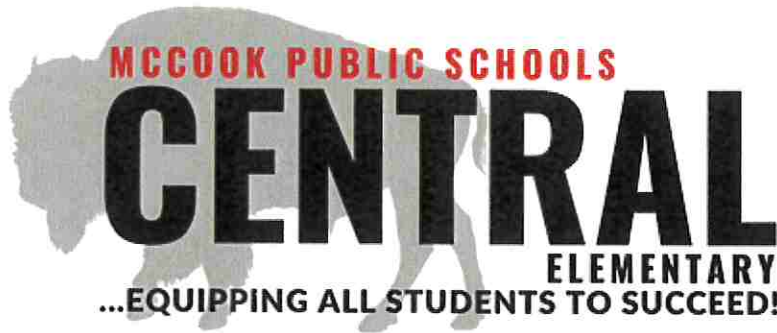

- 1) The district has lined up a certified Orientation and Mobility (O/M) Specialist to work with a sophomore with a visual impairment once a quarter as part of his IEP to help him with cane travel techniques.
- 2) Thanks to Mr. Bednar and Mrs. Jennifer Juenemann for lining up an autism consultant from Oakley, KS to give us some feedback on a needy 4th grade student. The information received has been implemented already and is helping out immediately.
- 3) Thanks to Rachelle Kotschwar for being the DLC program's long term substitute teacher while Samantha Shiers is out on maternity leave. She's done a wonderful job.
- 4) All of the sped teachers are having to write "COVID-19 impact statements" into their children's upcoming IEPs to talk about how the children with disabilities will receive their sped services in the event of another school closure. There needs to be different level of services for the different level of school closures, but we will not be completing all 240ish student IEPs by November like some smaller schools are doing, because of the future ramifications/implications that causes.
- 5) SPED fiscal maintenance of effort will be an interesting issue this spring 2021 to see how NDE handles that concept, considering how many schools were shut down and have lower sped costs as a result of the closure.
- 6) I am finished with 5 out of the 8 smaller ESU 15 districts sped final financial reports...this is a big part of my job with the ESU...it's due by October 31st. Each district takes anywhere from 3-8 hours to complete, and the reimbursement this work helps each district receive is anywhere from approximately \$125K (smaller districts like Hayes Center and Maywood) to \$400K (Chase County).

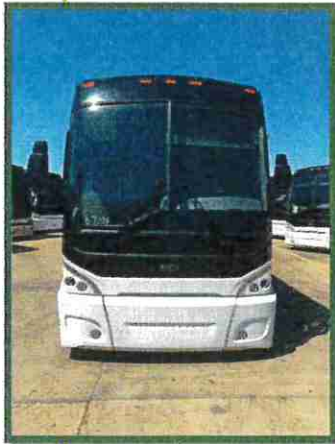
