- 3) Sped teacher file reviews are complete for the year, still have a couple teacher evaluations to complete in the next couple of weeks.

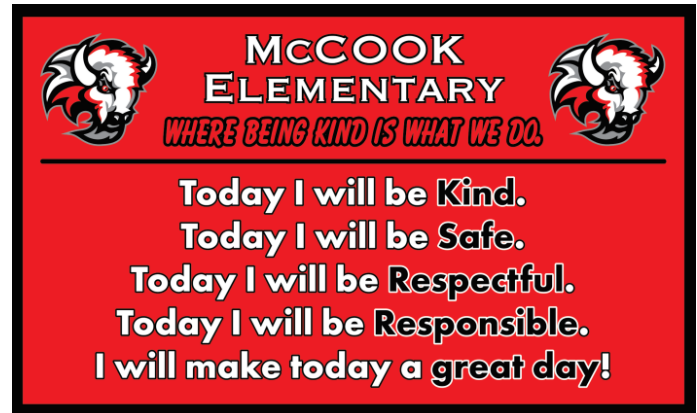
- 4) The annual Targeted Improvement Plan (TIP) has been updated/uploaded onto NDE's website.
