Students receive whatever they need to develop to their full academic and social potential, emphasizing that educational well-being is as vital as academic success.



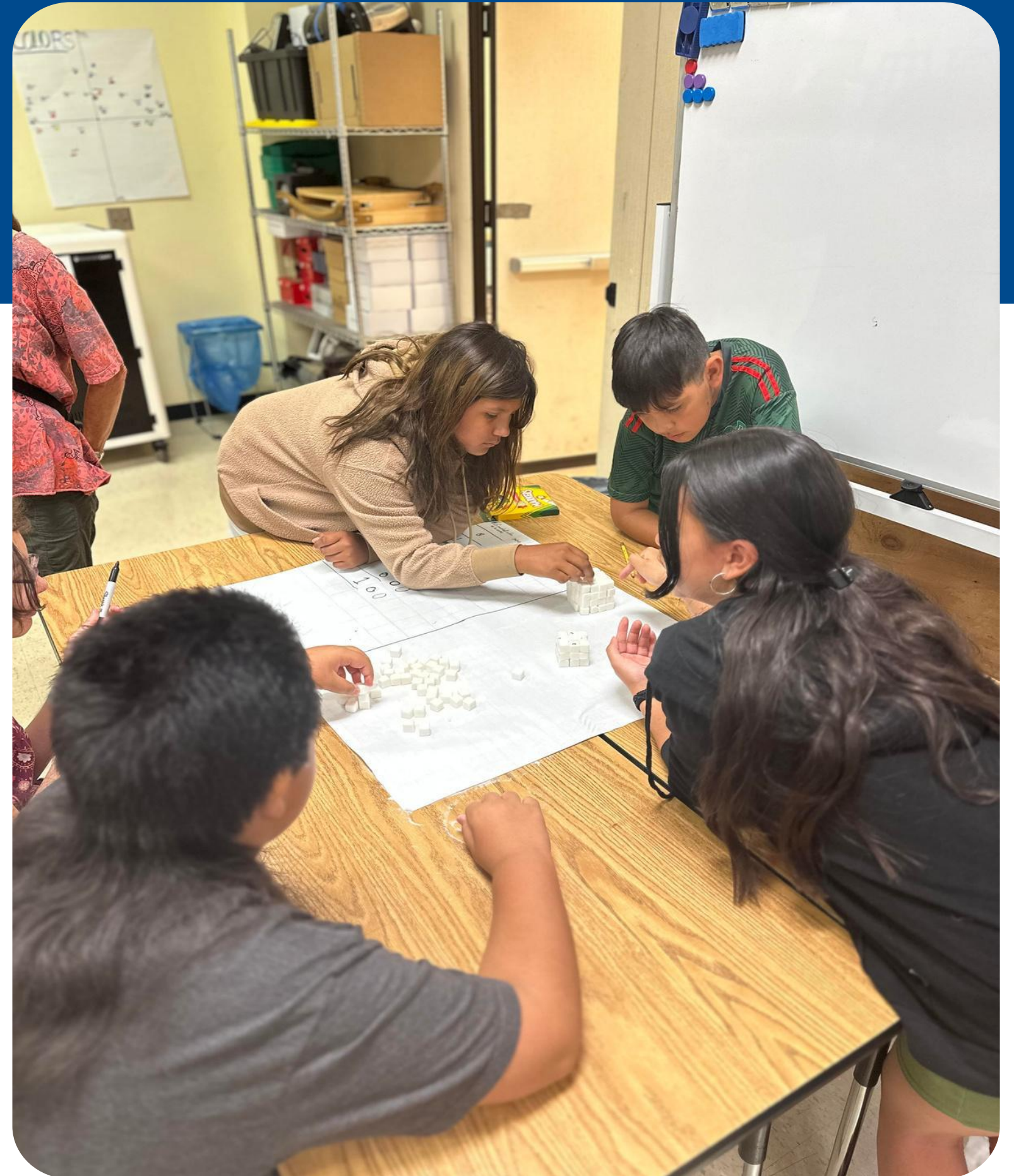

- Agriculture, Food, & Natural Resource Systems



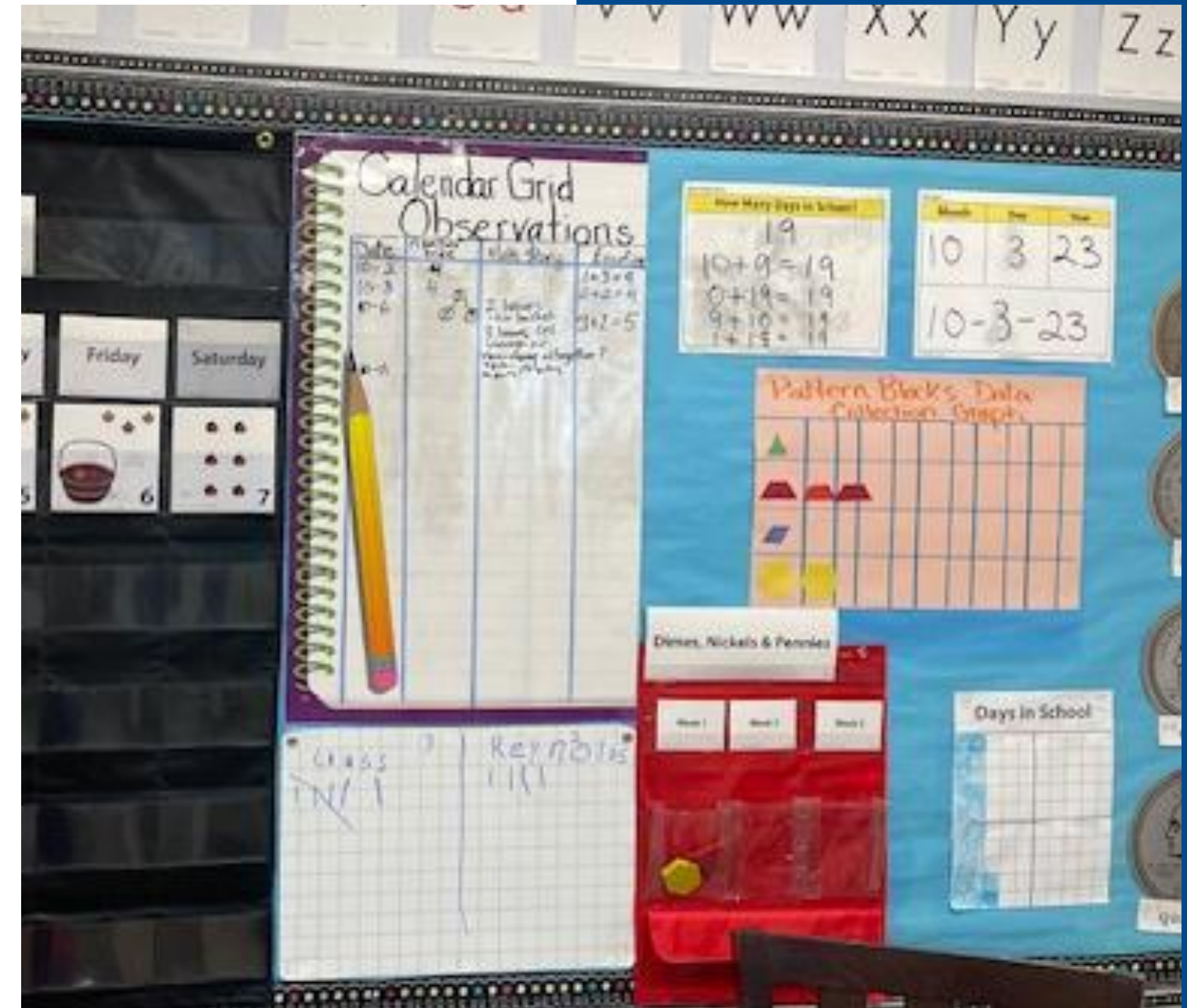

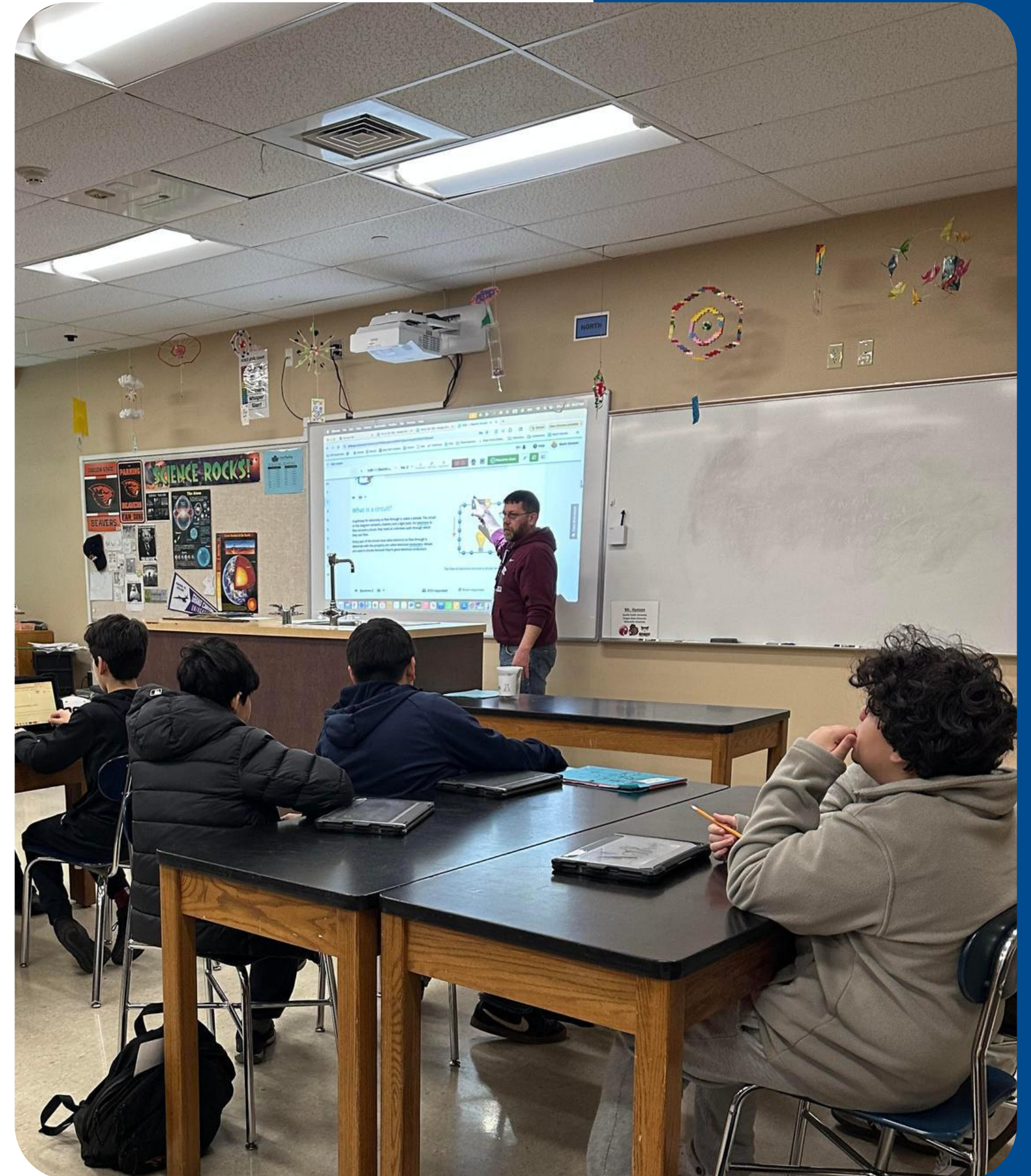
