What is curriculum?

- Pinar (2019) explains that it is:
 - Prescription- all students that take a course have access to the same learning
 - Course of Study- takes students from “A to Z”
 - Experiential- creates a learning experience
- Ladson-Billings (1995), Muhammad (2020) and others specify that it should encourage intellectualism, relationship-building, and lived experiences.

What curriculum is NOT?

- Lesson plans
- Lectures
- Textbooks/ books
- Only the voice of the teacher or curriculum designers
- Only from one perspective
- Facts without experiences

Rationale for Project

- The study of civics is a critical element of a public school education- “democratic education” or “democratic core” (Beane & Apple, 2007).
- Civics is a requirement for graduation.
- There have been recent, rapid changes to fundamental institutions in the United States.
- We needed to explore new resources and texts, and update the standards.

Changes to New Map- Civics

- Use a new model- *Open Up Resources*- to design templates for the map and units.
- Designed four units and modeled the course after AP Government and Politics.
 - Increased comprehensiveness, complexity, and depth.
- Updated overarching themes.
- Added Authentic Application Tasks (AATs) to all units.
- Aligned academics to SEL.
