- 3.A. Director's Update
- Dr. Dyer provided an update:

3.B. Spotlights

3.B.1. SCOPE Team - Zach Bianucci, Anjali Patel, Om Patel, Mary Grant Woodruff

Dr. Dyer stated that this was his second year as a facilitator for the TSBA SCOPE (Student Congress on Policy and Education) group. Anjali Patel thanked the Board for allowing the team to attend this mock school board event. They connected with students from other school systems. All four motions that were debated passed. Om Patel shared that this improved his debating skills. Zach Bianucci was the debater for his topic - a first for Cleveland High School. Mary Grant Woodruff was unable to attend the meeting. Dawn Robinson said that we've had presidents in the past; she hopes that we will have a president again in the future. Ms. Anna Hutt said that the group discussed the importance of preparation and voicing their opinions. Board members thanked these students for attending.

3.B.2. Engineering Students - Lizandro Alvarez, Bo Bosserdet, Dawson Clark, Justin Douglass

Ben Williams, Engineering Teacher, stated that two years ago the engineering program received a robotic arm from Gestamp, a supplier to Volkswagen. This is one of the nicest robotic training arms in a high school in the nation now. Gestamp also provided an elite level of certification/training; we are one of the only high schools in the country to offer this training. Mr. Williams introduced the students who completed the training: Lizandro Alvarez, Bo Bosserdet, Dawson Clarke, Jonathon Cortez, and Justin Douglas. Ty Baker could not attend.

3.B.3. CHS Patagonia Team - Humanitarian Project
Ben Williams and Anna Hutt shared the experiences of their Spring Break
trip to Argentina. They partnered with a school in Argentina to completely
redesign a greenhouse at a remote boarding school. The trip turned into a
cultural experience with Anna Hutt's planning. The trip included
engineering, broadcasting, and Spanish students. They created a love for
other people and other cultures. Students shared their profound
experiences including making friends, enjoying food, traveling around the

countryside, and sharing music/culture with the Argentinian students. Dr. Dyer showed a slide show that he created. Board members thanked the students for representing Cleveland City Schools.

3.C. Site Committee

3.C.1. *Candy's Creek Cherokee Elementary School Update

Brian Templeton of Upland Design Group presented the proposed interior colors for Candy's Creek Cherokee Elementary School. These were determined from Site Committee input. Each wing will have a different color of red, blue, gold. He showed a rendering of the lobby area with these earth tones.

Progress Update:

Weather has allowed continued progress.

Gym, multipurpose, and stage areas are under roof.

The contractor hopes the last wing will be under roof by fall.

Geothermal should be done in 2-3 weeks; there are 100 wells now.

Raider Blue Academy - Tier 2 Behavior Intervention with Academic Support

Alternative Placement Program - Tier 3 Behavior Intervention with Academic Support. This is the only group housed at the Denning Center.

Board members asked questions. Tom Cloud served on the committee and thanked the group for the hard work.

3.G. *National Teacher Appreciation Week - May 7-11, 2018

By general consent Board approved providing Chick-Fil-A lunches for all employees in honor of National Teacher Appreciation Week, May 7-11, 2018.

3.H. TLN Report

Carolyn Ingram provided an update:

Many bills are still in committees; we do not know if these will move out of committees yet.

Governor Haslam has proposed \$30 million for assessing school safety, increasing resources for SROs, and providing anonomyous ways to report school safety issues.

Teacher licensure law allows ways for out of state teachers to become licensed in Tennessee.

Amendment died today about arming teachers in schools.

Dr. Dyer announced that a second SRO was added to CHS. Thank you to City Council for this. Board members discussed safety issues at schools.
